Dear Mayor Mahoney and Commissioners Piepkorn, Gehrig, Grindberg, and Strand:

I am writing to request an extension of the provisions of FMC § 25-1512(A)(2) requiring that alcohol be sold at the licensed premises for the Class A Alcoholic Beverage License No. 10 (the "License") owned by Firebox LLC ("Firebox"). Section 25-1512(A) addresses termination, suspension, and revocation of licenses and requires the following:

- A. Any license issued under the provisions of this article shall automatically terminate:
 - 2. When the licensee, for any reason, ceases business at the licensed premises, except as permitted in accordance with § 25-1507(H) of this article. Business shall be deemed to have ceased upon occurrence of any of the following:
 - a. When no sale of alcoholic beverages occurs on the licensed premises for a period of at least 30 consecutive business days; or
 - b. When alcoholic beverages are not sold on the licensed premises on at least 15 of any 60 consecutive business days; or

provided, however, upon written request of the licensee, the commission, in its discretion and for good cause shown, may extend the date upon which business shall be deemed to have ceased.

This is Firebox's forth extension request. At its August 13, 2018, meeting, the City Commission granted a six-month extension to Firebox until February 28, 2019.

Firebox purchased the License in October 2015. When it purchased the License, Firebox intended to operate a business at the Meadowlark Building in downtown Fargo, 503 7th Street North. After acquiring the License, Firebox decided that a bar at that location would not be economical. It began trying to transfer the License to a new licensee.

Since August 2018, Firebox has continued its efforts to sell the License. On November 7, 2018, Firebox retained the services of NAI North Central as a broker to assist in locating an interested buyer. In January 2019, Firebox negotiated a sale of the license to a potential buyer. Firebox has drafted transaction documents and is awaiting comments to those documents from the potential buyer. Firebox has also received a second proposal to sell the license to another potential buyer, which may be an option if the current negotiated sale does not close.

Firebox requests the date upon which business is deemed to have ceased be extended for a sixmonth period until August 31, 2019. Firebox has shown good cause for the extension. An additional extension would allow the parties to finalize transaction documents and the buyer to apply for a transfer of the license.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between Lonna Askland Rinke, the identified owner of the property located at 1213 El Cano Drive South, Fargo, North Dakota hereinafter "Seller", whether one or more, and the CITY OF FARGO, a North Dakota municipal corporation, hereinafter "City" or "Buyer",

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Seller is the owner of real estate situated in the County of Cass and State of North Dakota described as follows:

- 4. <u>Salvage</u>. Seller shall be allowed to remove from the property personal property, appliances, washer and dryer, and other property not permanently affixed to the structure. Seller shall remove and install all items in a professional manner, and if necessary engage a professional licensed contractor. Seller agrees to remove all salvage and install all replacement items prior to giving City possession of the property.
- 5. <u>Abstract</u>. Seller shall furnish Buyer an abstract of title to the subject property and Buyer shall pay for the cost of continuation of said abstract to a recent date. Said abstract must show good and marketable title in Seller free and clear of all liens and encumbrances (other than those that will be handled at closing).
- 6. <u>Taxes and Utilities</u>. Taxes and installments of special assessments for the year of closing shall be prorated between the parties to the date of closing based upon current total true value as calculated by the County of Cass, ND, as of the date of closing. Prior year taxes and assessments must be paid by Seller in advance of closing.

- 7. <u>Deeds</u>. Seller shall sign warranty deeds prepared by Buyer. Buyer will take title as follows: City of Fargo, North Dakota, a municipal corporation.
- 8. <u>Closing Date and Transfer of Possession</u>. Closing shall take place at a time and date to be agreed by the parties, but not later than April 30, 2019. The City shall take possession of the real estate no later than the last day of the month of closing, unless other arrangements have been made. If City does not take possession on the date of closing, \$1,000 will be required of Seller at closing and retained until such time as the possession of the property is secured by the City in satisfactory condition. Seller agrees the \$1,000 deposit may be forfeited if the property is not delivered in satisfactory condition.

A separate Occupancy Agreement may be entered into between the parties should Seller desire to continue to reside in the dwelling longer than the end of the month of closing. If Seller elects to occupy the premises beyond the end of the month of closing, rent shall be paid to the City in the amount of \$1,000/month beginning on the 1st day of the month following closing. 2% of the purchase price shall be retained until such time Seller vacates the premises and remits the garage door openers and keys to the City. In no event shall Seller occupy the property later than April 30, 2019, unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing with not less than 30 days' notice.

If Seller vacates the property prior to closing, the end of the month of closing, or prior to the expiration of the time period contained in an Occupancy Agreement, Seller shall immediately notify Buyer so that appropriate measures can be taken to secure the premises.

- 9. <u>Warranty</u>. Seller provides no express warranties on the subject property. Buyer understands and agrees that the property is a used home and is being purchased "AS IS". Buyer shall make any inspection it deems necessary concerning the condition of said used home.
- 10. <u>Inspection and Photographs</u>. Seller agrees to allow City to enter the Premises for purposes of inspection, including but not limited to asbestos testing and mitigation.

Background:

Last July, the City Commissioners were updated at an Informational Meeting on the need for additional flood mitigation projects within the City to accommodate a 37-foot flow thru town with the proposed Diversion in place. At that meeting, staff indicated that they would not be seeking approval from the City Commission on these projects until a decision on the Diversion Authority's Plan B project application was made by the Minnesota DNR, which was recently approved by the MN DNR on December 27, 2018.

With this approval, City staff would like to start the development of these additional flood mitigation projects. To start developing these projects, staff would like to issue a RFP for consultant services to assist in neighborhood outreach, design, construction administration and inspection of the projects.

Previous contracts for consultant services involved selecting one consultant per neighborhood area but instead of selecting different consultants for the five neighborhood areas, staff would recommend the selection of one consultant. This is primarily due to the importance of having consistent messaging to all of the affected property owners throughout the project development and the similarities of the areas, which will result in efficiency in design by having one consultant work on all of them. Another aspect that was considered in making this recommendation is that the size of these projects are not the same size as previously completed projects in other areas of the City, therefore we believe the scope and size of this proposed RFP is reasonable.

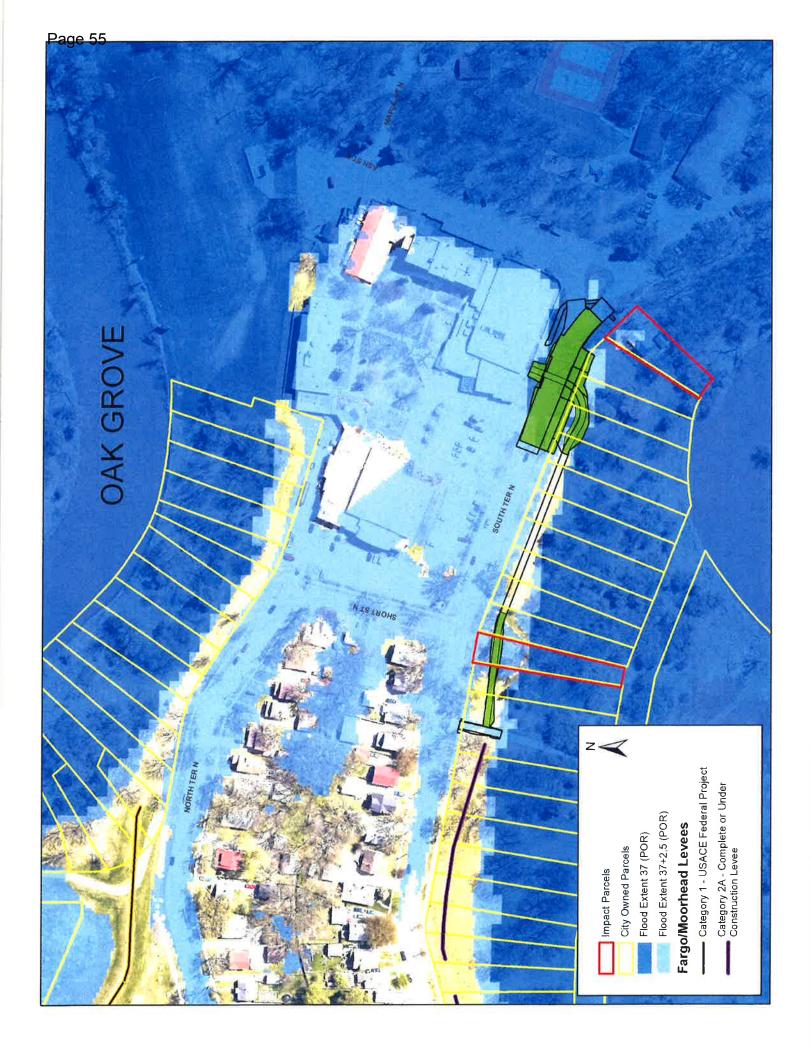
Attached with this memo are maps of the five neighborhood areas, which include the conceptual projects that will be further studied and developed as a result of this RFP.

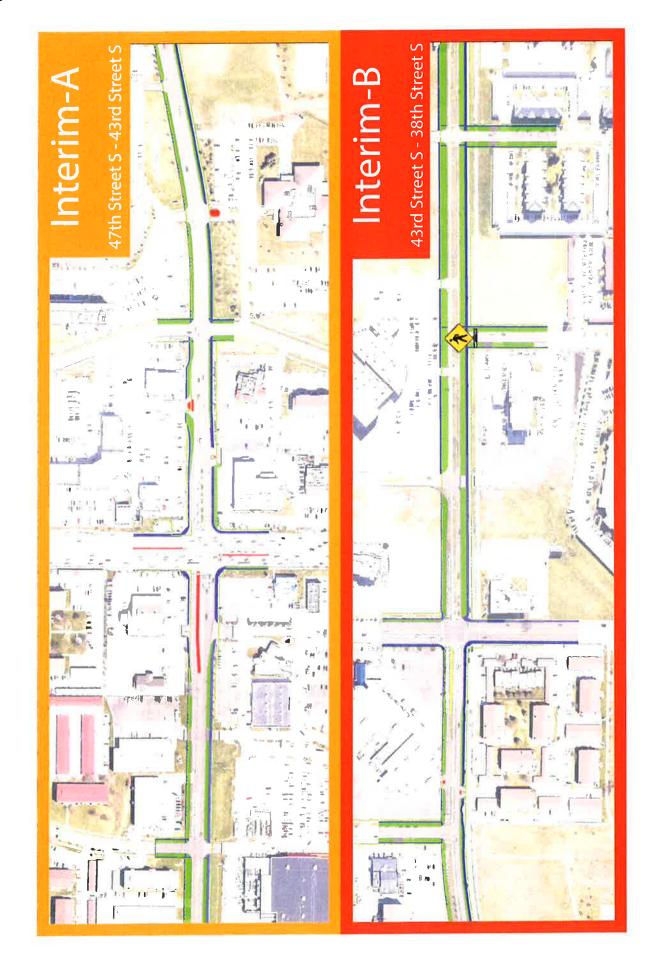
The 17th Avenue South Corridor Study is very near completion, with an anticipated completion date of April 1, 2019. We plan on holding a final Public Input Meeting in early March to show the public what is being recommended for installation as part of the Corridor Study. The study looked at four segments essentially; 5th Street to University, University to 25th Street, 25th Street to I-29, and I-29 to 45th Street. The last stretch in the corridor study had short-term recommendations and longer-term recommendations. Timing is everything, and as part of our Pavement Management Program, we have planned on completing an asphalt seal coat project on 17th Avenue South this summer from I-29 to 45th Street, among other areas Citywide. We would like to complete the pavement marking modifications with this project as recommended in the Corridor Study as a short-term traffic safety modification. It would re-stripe the existing 4-lanes to a 2+1 with a center left turn lane, and it would create a 2nd westbound left turn lane at 45th Street.

The corridor study isn't officially adopted yet, but this portion of the study has been well vetted and isn't controversial as to its recommendations. The area where we need to do some additional outreach is between 25th Street and I-29, and we plan on doing that over the next 6 weeks.

Recommended Motion:

Approve re-striping 17th Avenue South between 42nd Street and 45th Street to a 2+1 configuration, a short-term traffic safety modification, and include it as part of the Citywide Asphalt Seal Coat Project being bid on March 20, 2019.

The encroachment area was built as part of the original construction in 1930 and extends approximately 12'-4" along the length of the building's east façade and has a depth of 10'-8" below grade. The encroachment space serves as critical function area of the Black Building and ScanDesign building (one property). 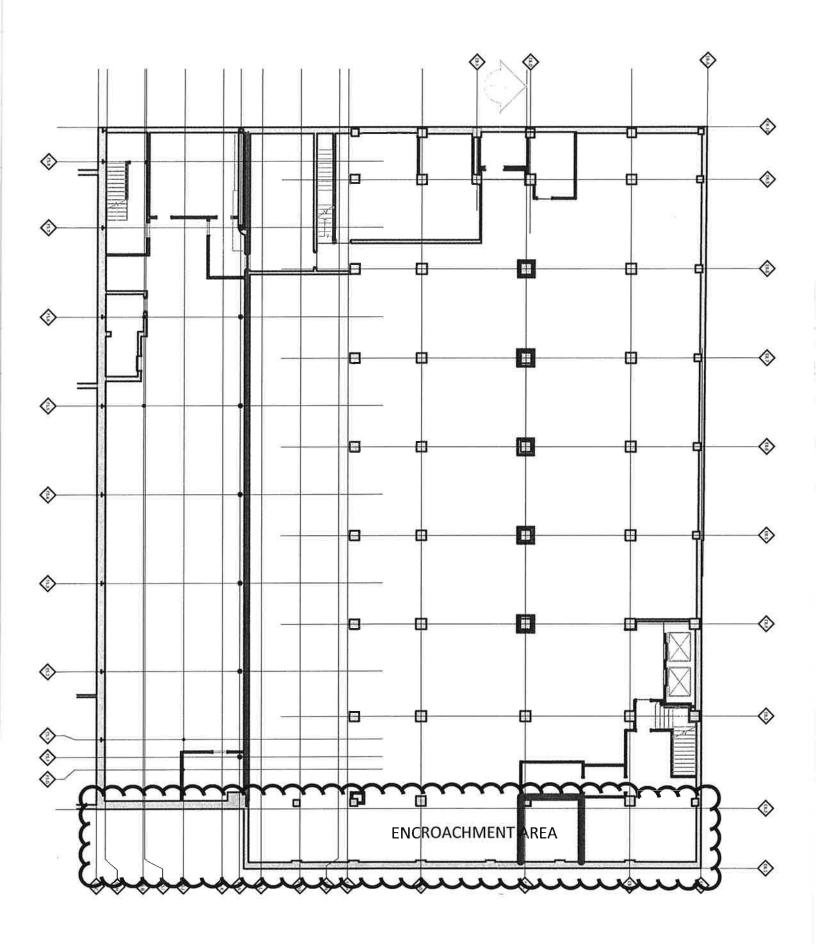
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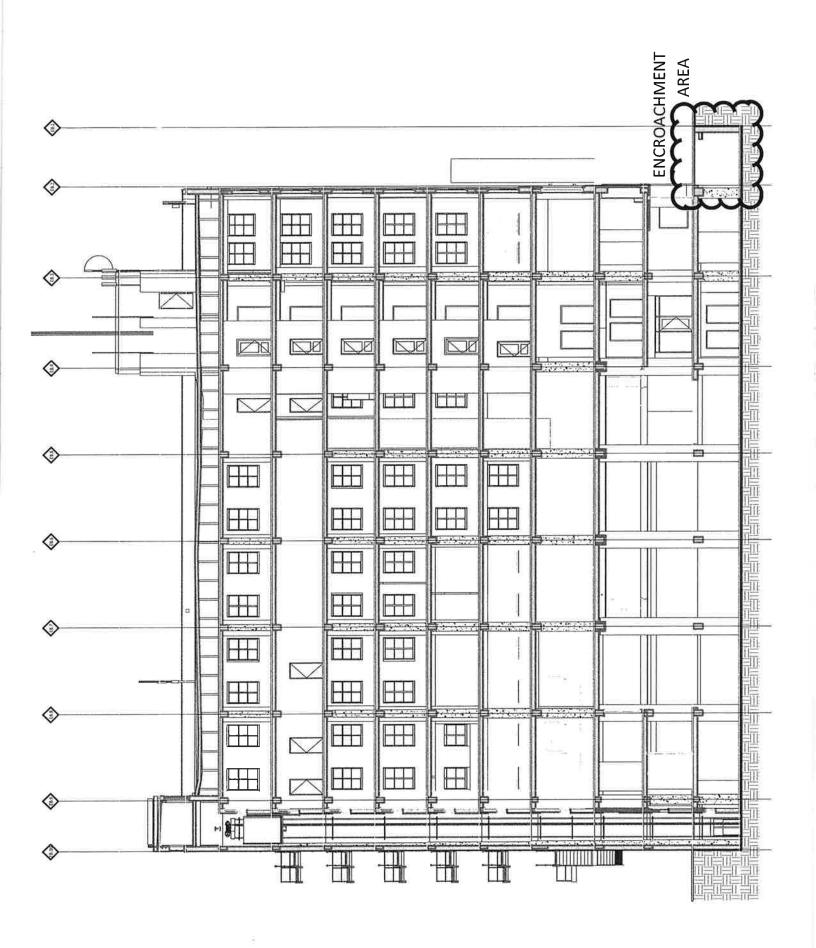

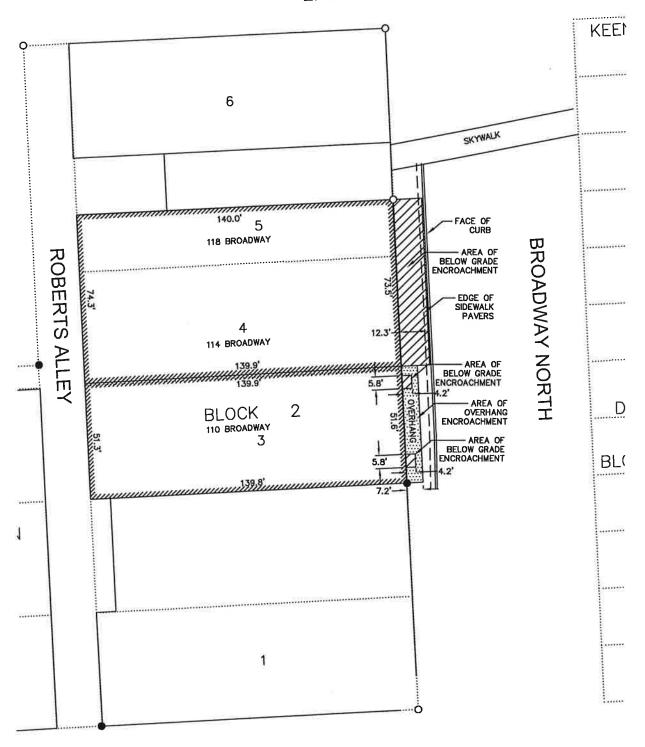

ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo has approved such encroachment; and,

WHEREAS, DFI Black Building has agreed to execute this agreement required by City to permit private facilities to encroach on public right-of-way.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. DFI Black Building is hereby granted the right to encroach and use a portion of the right-of-way of the above-mentioned, said encroachments being for the purpose of housing the fire pump, water service, gas service, boilers, water heaters, and control panels, and said encroachments to consist of (1) an approximate 12.3° wide by 73.5° long encroachment in the public right-of-way adjacent to Lots 4 and 5, and (2) two (2) encroachments approximately 5.06° wide by 6.47° long encroachment in the public right of way adjacent to Lot 2, as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- 2. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that DFI Black Building will be solely responsible for the repair or replacement of any public property which may be damaged or destroyed as a direct or indirect result of the use of the public right-of-way for constructing, repairing or reconstructing the basement space.
- 3. DFI Black Building agrees that it will, during any use of said public right-of-way, use due care to protect city streets, utilities and all other public property, minimize disruption to pedestrian travel, in accordance with MUTCD Standards and Specifications; and that upon discontinuance of use, DFI Black Building will restore and replace all public property to its present condition.

- 4. DFI Black Building shall be solely responsible for the inspection, repair and maintenance of the encroachment during the period of time the encroachment remains in the City right-of-way.
- 5. To the fullest extent permitted by law, DFI Black Building agrees to further hold the City harmless against any and all expenses, demands, claims or suits for damages or injury of any kind that may be brought against the City, its officers, agents and employees, its property, streets, sidewalks, and any other municipal improvements arising from DFI Black Building's encroachment area by reason of the use of the public right-of-way as aforesaid. DFI Black Building further agrees to pay any and all costs the City incurs to enforce this indemnity provision, including attorney's fees. DFI Black Building also agrees to provide to City a certificate of insurance, naming the City as an insured and indicating acceptance by its insurer of its obligation to defend and hold the City harmless as hereinabove stated.
- 6. This agreement is personal to DFI Black Building and shall terminate upon sale, transfer or assignment. Subsequent owners may request permission to encroach, and enter into a separate agreement with City. City shall not withhold permission to encroach under the terms herein without due cause. The non-transferability of this Agreement is intended to assure the existence of the necessary insurance by the responsible party.
- 7. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that this agreement and permission to encroach is given subject to any limitation on the authority of City to grant such permission, which may now or hereafter exist.
- 8. It is specifically understood and agreed that the City retains authority to operate and maintain existing above ground and underground municipal facilities in the encroachment area. It is further understood and agreed that within two hundred seventy (270) days' written notice from

the City, DFI Black Building shall remove the underground facilities and equipment as directed by City, allowing the City to re-take and to use the public rights-of-way. In the case of an emergency, as determined by City, the City may request the work be done immediately or within less than thirty (30) days. If DFI Black Building fails to remove, relocate or restore, or otherwise comply with the direction of the City Engineer regarding the encroachment, the City may cause the work to be done, and the costs thereof shall be a lien against the property. The City's request to remove, relocate, or restore the encroachment will be in the City's sole discretion, but shall not be arbitrary or without reason.

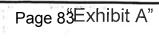

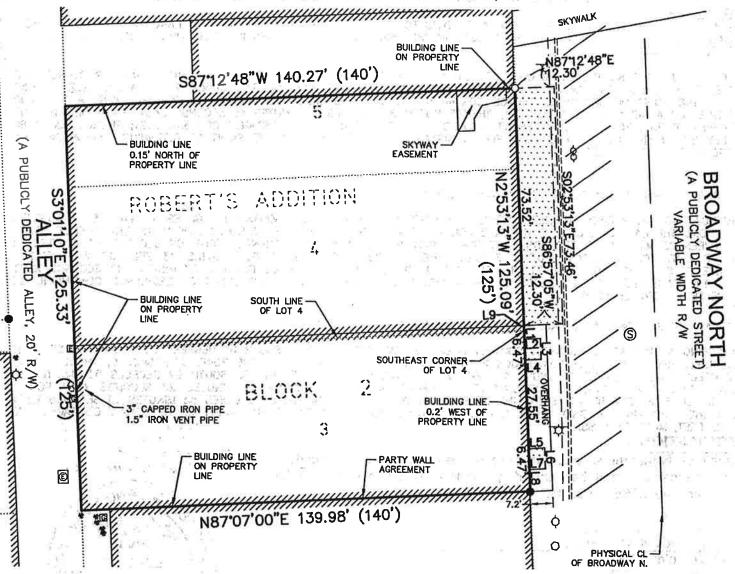
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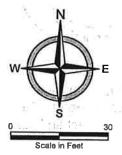

This Amendment, made and entered into between DFI Dillard, L.L.C., a North Dakota limited liability company ("Developer") and the City of Fargo, a municipal corporation ("City"), is for the purpose of providing access to Developer's property located in Fargo, North Dakota (the "Development Property") and amends and revises that Agreement dated December 12, 2018, attached hereto as Exhibit A. All terms and conditions of the existing agreement shall remain in full force and effect unless revised herein.

- 1. Developer shall be permitted to use the public right of way in such a manner as described in attached Exhibit B. Specifically, Developer shall be permitted to exercise control over the city right of way adjacent to the intended construction activity on the Development Property, under certain terms and conditions.
- 2. Developer shall be allowed 7' of public right away in the Roberts Alley adjacent to the Dillard building as shown on Exhibit B. A 12' driving lanes must be maintained at all times.

Right of Way Use Agreement

This Agreement, made and entered into between DFI Dillard, L.L.C., a North Dakota limited liability company ("Developer") and the City of Fargo, a municipal corporation ("City"), is for the purpose of providing access to Developer's property located in Fargo, North Dakota (the "Development Property"), described below. For good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. Developer holds all right, title and interest in the Development Property, specifically:

LOT SEVEN AND EIGHT, IN BLOCK THREE, OF ROBERTS' ADDITION, TO THE CITY OF FARGO, SITUATE IN THE COUNTY OF CASS AND THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, EXCEPT THAT PART OF SAID LOT EIGHT, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SAID LOT EIGHT; THENCE NORTH 09'42'09" EAST, ASSUMED BEARING, ALONG THE WEST LINE OF SAID LOT EIGHT FOR A DISTANCE OF 30.82 FEET; THENCE NORTH 87'03'22" EAST FOR A DISTANCE OF 160.26 FEET TO THE EAST LINE OF SAID LOT EIGHT; THENCE SOUTH 03°02'23" EAST ALONG SAID EAST LINE FOR A DISTANCE OF 30.32 FEET TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SAID LOT EIGHT; THENCE SOUTH 87"08'32" WEST ALONG THE SOUTH LINE OF SAID LOT EIGHT FOR A DISTANCE OF 167.06 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING.

LOTS TWENTY-FIVE THROUGH TWENTY-SEVEN, OF S.G. ROBERT ADDITION TO THE CITY OF FARGO, SITUATE IN THE COUNTY OF CASS AND THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA

All of the foregoing is located in the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota.

- 2. Developer shall be permitted to use the public right of way as stated herein, as modified from time to time by written agreement of the parties hereto. Specifically, Developer shall be permitted to exercise control over the city right of way adjacent to the intended construction activity on the Development Property, under certain terms and conditions as stated herein.
- 3. Developer shall be allowed to close the pedestrian travel path as shown on Exhibit A but will establish a minimum 5' protected pedestrian travel path during non-construction hours (Monday thru Friday, 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM) until April 15, 2019.

Following the April 15, 2019 the Developer shall be allowed to modify the pedestrian travel path by establishing a 5' minimum' protected pedestrian travel path, to City Engineer satisfaction.

- 4. Modification of Roberts Street shall be permitted in that Developer shall be allowed to utilize the parking lane on the east side of Roberts Street adjacent to the Development Property. Modifications shall require at least 5 days' notice and approval. Developer shall provide City Engineering a traffic control plan in advance of closure. Developer shall amend or modify the traffic control plan as directed by City Engineering. 14' driving lanes must be maintained at all times.
- 5. Developer shall be responsible for all private utilities impacted by the construction activities, and shall notify the utility provider of proposed impacts. Developer shall be solely responsible for contracting with the private utility providers, and for payment to all parties involved. City shall have no responsibility for the reestablishment of private utility disruptions caused by Developer's construction activities.
- 6. Developer may utilize said portion of the City right-of-way only for the temporary redirection of traffic, sidewalk closure, and boulevard use until July 1, 2019. Any request for extension must be made at least one month prior to the expiration of this Agreement in order to allow City adequate time to consider the request.
- 7. Developer must remedy any unsafe or unsatisfactory condition due to the use of the City right of way, as determined by City in its sole discretion. If concerns persist, and no remedy can be agreed upon, City may require Developer to vacate the City right of way use permitted herein and return the roadway to its pre-existing condition, including striping.
- 8. Developer shall be responsible for providing appropriate internal site lighting in order to deter entrants, and is further responsible for the general cleanliness and appearance of the site. Developer is solely responsible for site security, and is responsible for securing the site at all times.

- 9. Developer hereby grants to City a right of entry and access to the Development Property, in the event City must enter the work space to remedy a public safety concern, provide fire protection to the site and adjoining properties, or for any reason as determined in City's sole discretion. Developer agrees and understands that City is not responsible for construction delay or conflicts occasioned by the City's need to protect the public under any circumstances. City agrees to make reasonable attempt to contact the Developer and its Construction Manager prior to City entry to the construction site, except in case of emergency as defined by City.
- 10. Developer shall be responsible for documenting the condition of the impacted public facilities, including but not limited to the street lights, sidewalk, and roadway. Documentation, including pictures of these elements, must be submitted to City prior to commencement of any construction activity in the public right of way. Developer will, during any use of City public right of way, use due care to protect City streets, utilities and all other public property and private utilities occupying the public right of way.
- 11. Developer shall be responsible for the repair or replacement of the condition of the City right of way and any public property which may be damaged or destroyed as a direct or indirect result of the use of the City right of way as permitted in this Agreement. Developer shall be responsible for restoring or reconstruction the City infrastructure, including all roadways, curbs, and gutters to prior to construction condition.
- 12. Developer accepts all maintenance responsibility for the street, curb, adjoining green space and all other City infrastructure which may be impacted by this Agreement. Developer shall undertake all maintenance activities, including sweeping, snow removal and hauling, along the right of way and within the construction site, all to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works.
- 13. Developer shall provide supplemental snow removal in and around the site, and shall be required to haul or remove snow from the affected area at the direction of the Director of Public Works or City Engineer of City.
- 14. At its discretion, the City may terminate this agreement should it view the public infrastructure or public health to be at a greater risk than is acceptable to the City. City shall give Developer thirty (30) days' notice to vacate the right of way if such condition is found to exist. However, in the event of an emergency, as determined in the sole discretion of City, City may immediately terminate Developer's use of the public right of way and direct Developer to restore the right of way to the City's control.
- 15. Notices required by this Agreement shall be given as follows:

Developer agrees that failure to secure acceptance from City of the restored infrastructure and improvements may result in the establishment of a special assessment district, consisting solely of the Development Property, for the purpose of financing the completion of the work to City's approval standards. City will levy special assessments against the Development Property to recover all costs of the Project, in accordance with Chapter 40-22 of the North Dakota Century Code.

 Developer waives its right to protest the resolution of necessity for the improvements for which such resolutions are required pursuant to North Dakota Century Code section 40-22-17, and specifically consents to the construction of the improvements and to the assessment of cost thereof to the Development Property. Developer further waives its right to protest the amount, benefit or any other assessment attribute related to the work completed by the City. Project costs which may be assessed against the Development Property include all costs of completing the work required in accordance with the terms of this agreement.
 - 17. Developer agrees to hold the City harmless against any and all expenses, demands, claims or losses of any kind that may be sustained by City, its officers, agents and employees, its property, streets, sidewalks, or any other municipal improvements by reason of the use of the public right of way. Developer agrees to secure liability insurance for at least \$500,000, and name City as an additional insured on such policy. Developer shall provide a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the City's insured status in advance of any construction activity in the right of way.
 - 18. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties that this Agreement is given subject to any limitation on the authority of City to grant such permission, which may now or hereafter exist.
 - 19. This Agreement will be construed and enforced in accordance with North Dakota law. The parties agree any litigation arising out of this Agreement will be venued in District Court in Cass County, North Dakota, and the parties waive any objection to personal jurisdiction.
 - 20. The failure or delay of City to insist on the performance of any of the terms of this Agreement, or the waiver of any breach of any of the terms of this Agreement, will not be construed as a waiver of those terms, and those terms will continue and remain in full force and effect as if no forbearance or waiver had occurred and will not affect the validity of this Agreement, or the right of the City to enforce each and every term of this Agreement.

- 21. If any court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision or part of this Agreement is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, that portion will be deemed severed from this Agreement, and all remaining terms and provisions of this Agreement will remain binding and enforceable, and the parties' obligations under this Agreement will remain binding and enforceable.
- 22. This Agreement, together with any related documents, as well as any amendments to those agreements and documents, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties regarding the matters described in this Agreement.
- 23. Any modifications or amendments of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties to this Agreement.
- 24. It is specifically agreed between the parties that this Developer Agreement may be recorded.
- 25. The City and Developer wish to work together to provide an acceptable finished product. Developer shall provide a deposit in the amount of \$3,000 to cover any and all expenses that may be incurred by City as a result of Developer's work in the right of way. These funds will be used by City for items such as street lighting, snow removal, and debris cleanup in the construction impact area within the right of way that are not timely remedied by Developer, or the finished product is unsatisfactory.

When a corrective measure is required by the City, City will notify Developer by phone and email. Generally, City will request Developer remedy the identified deficiency within 3 days, or less in the event of an emergency. However, in the event the finished product is unacceptable, City and Developer agree to negotiate an appropriate time frame to remedy the identified deficiency. If City incurs the expense, the amount of deposit shall be reduced accordingly. If at any time the amount of the deposit is reduced to less than \$1,000, Developer shall replenish the deposit to \$3,000. Any deposit remaining at the end of the construction project and acceptance by City of the return of the right of way to City shall be refunded to Developer.

The Finance Committee is committed to advancing fiscal policies that help provide improved oversight and control over our financial matters. The use of inter-fund loans is a financial practice used by the City of Fargo in the past; however, presently we have not promulgated a financial policy that helps us navigate decisions about the use of inter-fund loans.

The Governmental Finance Officers Association recommends the adoption of fiscal policies to help institutionalize practices and protocols that are sustainable.

Historically speaking, the City of Fargo used inter-fund loans to construct the Newman Outdoor Baseball stadium, assisting the Parking Authority with timely repairs, and the Neighborhood Revitalization Initiative initial startup funding.

The Finance Committee is pleased to bring forward a new policy that helps describe how inter-fund loans are managed. They approved use of inter-fund loans from the Enterprise Funds to finance the acquisition of a building and equipment for the Border States facilities for the Police Department.

Suggested Motion:

The Finance Committee recommends approval of the attached inter-fund loan policy and request use of inter-fund loan for a portion of the Border States facility acquisition already approved by the City Commission.

City of Fargo Inter-Fund Loan Policy February 25, 2019

The Government Finance Officers Association recommends policy adoption of best business practices where applicable to help institutionalize policy and procedures for various financial functions.

In governmental accounting inter-fund loans can be advantageous and less costly that using traditional methods of accessing capital for various projects.

The City adopts the following policy to provide the appropriate level of authority and approval in using inter-fund loans with the goal of providing funding flexibility when needed to assure that:

- 1) Authorization is granted at an appropriate level of control
- 2) Inter-fund loans are allowed to help provide capital resources that may be necessary to initiate a project based upon the facts and circumstances in the most efficient and cost effective manner. Reasonable assumptions shall be used when considering the use of an inter-fund loan
- 3) The fund granting the loan is repaid on fair and reasonable terms and conditions
- 4) The fund receiving the loan has the ability to repay the loan based upon the terms approved

Inter-Fund Loan Policy Mandatory Requirements:

- The Finance Committee will review and approve inter-fund loans up to \$3 million. No further approval is required.
- The City Commission will approve all inter-fund loans in excess of \$3 million.
- Terms will include a reasonable repayment period.
- Inter-fund loans will not amortize longer than the economic life of the class of assets funded by the interfund loan.
- Interest will be accrued on loans approved and will be incorporated into the annual budget for the fund granting the loan (receiving) and the fund receiving (paying). Interest will be set at 100 bps below the ten-year U.S. Treasury index and will be adjusted periodically by the Finance Department. The Finance Committee has the authority to adjust the interest rate up or down based upon changes in market conditions.
- Fund granting inter-fund loans shall maintain and appropriate level of cash reserves to comply with fund balance policies or prudent management of cash reserves.
- Funds receiving inter-fund loans shall have the financial capacity to repay loans on a timely basis and should dedicate future revenues as needed to assure that future budgets are not negatively impacted.

Terry Ludlum, Solid Waste Utility Director, presented the attached Task Order from Wenck Associates for consultant engineering work related to SW19-01 Cell #19 Construction and Current Landfill Partial Closure Project.

Within the 2019 Solid Waste budget are funds for the next phase of the proposed 20-year landfill reclamation and reuse project. Project SW 1901 is a cell construction project at the former landfill and a concurrent partial closure project at the current landfill. The budgetary estimate of \$2,700,000 includes the Cell #19 construction, and partial closure of approximately 8-10 acres at the current landfill.

The Task Order Scope of Services has been divided in to three phases:

Phase 01	Design, Specifications, Bidding Assistance	\$ 21,2	440
Phase 02	Project Management / Construction	\$ 52,6	520
Phase 03	Construction Quality Assurance Oversight	\$ 78,4	110
Phase 04	Construction Documentation Report	\$ 6,6	<u>600</u>

The major cost component is the on-site personnel requirement. Wenck is proposing to have a field technician onsite for approximately 55 hours per week for 12 weeks. Industry standards for similar engineering services are typically 8 to 10% of construction costs; Wenck's proposed cost is approximately 5.9%.

Given that the proposal falls within industry standards and that the overall project costs are within the parameters of 2019 Solid Waste budgeted amount, Solid Waste staff recommended moving forward with the proposed task order.

Construction and Partial Closure Project

Within the 2019 Solid Waste budget are funds for the next phase of the proposed 20-year landfill reclamation and reuse project. **Project SW 19-01** is a cell construction project at the former landfill and a concurrent partial closure project at the current landfill as shown on the attached map. Specifically, the budgetary estimate for the construction of Cell #19 is \$2,100,000, and partial closure of approximately 8-10 acres at the current landfill is estimated at \$600,000. Please note that these budgetary costs include proposed engineering fees estimated at 10% of project costs.

Attached for your reference is a proposed **Task Order from Wenck Associates** for engineering services related to Project SW 19-01. The **Scope of Services** has been divided in to four phases with associated task costs as shown below:

As provided within the proposal, the major cost component is within **Phase 03** and is the on-site personnel requirement. The project is estimated to take approximately twelve (12) weeks to complete, with Wenck proposing to have a field technician onsite for approximately 55 hours per week for the 12 weeks.

Please note that the hourly projections are estimates and that Wenck will only charge for actual onsite hours. Onsite hours will be logged on a daily basis for billing and project tracking.

Industry standards for similar landfill project management and construction oversight are typically 8 to 10% of construction costs; Wenck's proposed cost is approximately 5.9% of the anticipated construction cost.

Given that Wenck's proposal falls within industry standards for similar projects and that the overall project costs are within the parameters of the 2019 Solid Waste budget, staff recommends approval of the attached proposed task order for Project SW19-01, Cell #19 Construction and Partial Closure Project.

Landfill Task Order Between the City of Fargo and Wenck Associates, Inc.

Description: As requested, Wenck Associates, Inc. will complete the design, bidding assistance, project management/coordination, construction oversight and construction documentation of Cells 19 and a partial closure project. This project will consist of design work associated with the cell and closure and will follow the permitted design of the facility. Construction of this cell will allow for additional airspace for waste disposal operations and reduce the amount of open area with the landfill closure portion of this project.

Scope of Services:

Phase 01 - Design, Specifications, Bidding Assistance

Wenck will complete design of the cell to comply with federal, State and current permit regulations and offers the necessary flexibility of operations for staff. Wenck will also provide bidding assistance to the City for the project. Specific activities that will be performed during the design phase are as follows:

- 1. Perimeter grade layout to control surface water, base grade design that complies with current permit requirements.
- 2. Design of cell access for landfill operations and customers.
- 3. Design of gravity leachate collection system, pumping system and forcemain layout.
- 4. Design of electrical services for the pumping system.
- 5. Design of tie-in to provide a contiguous liner system with adjacent cell.
- 6. Perimeter access road layout and design.
- 7. Determine closure area boundary (estimated to be 8-10 acres).
- 8. Establish top of waste grade, and final cover grade within closure area.
- 9. Determine required surface water controls for closure area.
- 10. Communicate with NDDH on any necessary changes from proposed permitted layout.
- 11. Prepare plans and specifications.
- 12. Prepare cost estimate for construction.
- 13. Provide bidding assistance to the City.
- 14. Answer bidder questions as they arise.

Phase 02 - Project Management/Coordination

Rodney Ambrosie will provide certification of the completed project for regulatory approval, Client Manager Randy Hanson and Project Engineer Kyle Ambrosie will handle the administrative role for the project. They will be responsible for managing the project budget and weekly updates along with the following items:

1. Conduct a Pre-construction meeting.

- 2. Coordinate all project activities with the contractor and the City of Fargo.
- 3. Oversee construction oversight personnel during construction activities.
- 4. Perform weekly progress meetings with on-site personnel and City staff.

5. Review and reply on submittals.

6. Assist with preparation of necessary change orders.

- 7. Be available by telephone should any questions come up during construction when on-site observer is not present.
- 8. Ensure project is completed per federal, state, and current solid waste permit requirements.

9. Verify quantities to be used in determining contractor payments.

- 10. Ensure all materials are properly handled when encountered; cover soils placed properly, excavation sideslopes maintained, minimum and maximum grades, etc.
- 11. Provide final certification to North Dakota Department of Health (NDDH).

Phase 03 - Construction Quality Assurance Oversight

Construction oversight/CQA will be completed to ensure project is constructed to federal, state and current permit regulations. Wenck will provide a field technician who will observe the performance of the contractor and organize and maintain the necessary information required to document the construction. The field technician will also work closely with the contractor's surveyor to establish survey control for the contractor and to document grades.

Specific activities that will be performed during construction are as follows:

General

- For the days, our observer is on site, observation of contractor progress and equipment on site.
- 2. Daily records for the days our observer is on site.

3. Keep construction photograph log.

4. Collect required soil and synthetic liner samples.

- 5. Work with surveyor to establish survey control and document as-built locations and grade.
- 6. Document quantities.

General Embankment

- 1. Coordinate field nuclear density tests to assure proper compaction.
- Monitor construction to ensure proper grades are being met.
- 3. Coordinate survey documentation requirements with contractor's surveyor.
- 4. Coordinate with soils laboratory.

Cell 19 Clay Barrier Placement

- 1. Coordinate field density and moisture content testing by nuclear methods to determine moisture content and densities of the clay liner.
- 2. Collect thin-wall Shelby tube samples for laboratory determination of permeability. (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 3. Collect bag samples of the clay liner for laboratory determination of Standard Proctor, Atterberg limits, grain size distribution, and USCS classification (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 4. Coordinate the survey documentation requirements with contractor's surveyor.

5. Coordinate with soils laboratory.

60-mil HDPE Geomembrane Installation

- 1. Inventory and review of roll certifications.
- 2. Observe panel placement.
- 3. Monitor trial welds (startup weld).
- 4. Observe panel seaming.
- 5. Observe seam testing.
- 6. Observe geomembrane repairs.
- 7. Sample collection for destructive testing (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 8. Compile test results of laboratory and field testing.

Granular Drainage Layer Installation

- 1. Provide observation of the installation of the granular drainage layer, to ensure there is no un-repaired damage to the HDPE liner.
- 2. Collect samples for laboratory determination of permeability, grain size distribution, and USCS classification (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 3. Coordinate with soils laboratory.
- 4. Document the thickness of the granular drainage layer.
- 5. Coordinate survey documentation requirements with the contractors' surveyor.

Leachate Collection System Installation

- 1. Collect samples of the aggregate for grain size analysis (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 2. Observe placement and document thickness of the aggregate.
- 3. Monitor and document HDPE pipe fusion and installation.
- 4. Monitor and document the pumps and controls installation.
- 5. Monitor and document the electrical installation.
- 6. Forcemain installation and connection to sanitary sewer.
- 7. Riser vault installation and associated piping.

Closure Construction

- 1. Confirm top of waste elevations.
- 2. Monitor and document placement of 3 feet of cover soils.
- 3. Coordinate field density and moisture content testing by nuclear methods to determine moisture content and densities of the cover soils.
- 4. Collect bag samples of the cover soil material for laboratory determination of Standard Proctor, Atterberg limits, grain size distribution, and USCS classification. (testing to be completed by third party laboratory).
- 5. Monitor and document placement of subsoil and topsoil.
- 6. Coordinate the survey documentation requirements with contractor's surveyor
- 7. Coordinate with soils laboratory.

Wenck has planned for a 12-week construction duration and to have a field technician available for 55 hours per week during the construction period.

PHASE 04 - CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTATION REPORT

Wenck will prepare a construction documentation report for Cell 19 and Partial Closure Construction, which includes key personnel, soil testing data, geomembrane testing data, survey documentation, as-built drawings, photographs, and information collected during construction observation. A narrative describing the construction sequence that summarizes the daily field notes will be included rather than the actual field notes. Asbuilt drawings will consist of revised design drawings that have been marked with construction record details/modifications and not entirely redrafted. Wenck will be working with the contractor's surveyor for grade documentation and will rely on them to provide the necessary grade documentation.

The documentation of the construction will be completed as the project progresses. This will allow a prompt submittal of the documentation report to the NDDH, as well as the City. We acknowledge that a timely submittal of activities at the site is imperative for City of Fargo review. The documentation report will consist of:

- 1. Summary of construction noting any special circumstances or deviation from contract plans and specifications;
- 2. Summary of quality assurance testing and procedures; (Wenck assumes this information will be available from others for inclusion in the report);
- 3. Survey documentation;
- 4. Construction photos; and
- 5. Record drawings.

The report will contain a summary statement certifying the facility was constructed per the approved plans, specifications, and permit. A professional engineer registered in North Dakota will sign the summary statement. Wenck will provide copies of the documentation report, for review and approval of local, county and state regulators. Wenck assumes that three copies of the report will be sufficient.

Associated Fees:

Wenck has prepared a detailed breakdown of the estimated hours and fees associated with this project and are included on the attached table. The rates provided are on an hourly basis with no increase due to overtime. It is assumed that the hours associated with this proposal are accurate for the estimated design requirements and a construction period of 12 weeks. Third party laboratory costs will be billed directly to the City.

The work will be completed per our current contracted rates. The estimated cost will not be exceeded without prior approval. Wenck will carefully monitor costs and advise the City of Wenck's budget status as part of weekly progress updates. The billing is based on an hourly basis for hours worked.

Wenck Associates, Inc. estimates the level of effort to complete this work to be approximately \$158,870.

Jim Hausauer, Wastewater Utility Director, presented the attached Change Order #2 from Master Construction for Project WW1402-10. If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local. The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows and sanitary sewer backups within the Broadway Interceptor service area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding. To accomplish this reduction in hazards, the project included three main components:

- **Structure Improvements:** This will include modifications to sanitary Lift Station (LS) #1, LS #2, and the West Side Interceptor Overflow.
- Broadway Relief Force Main: This will include the construction of 22,000' of force main from LS #1/LS #2 and will convey wet weather flows to the WWTP or wastewater stabilization ponds (WWSP).
- **WWTP Effluent Force Main Rehabilitation**: This will include the rehab of 2,000 ft of the existing 30" ductile iron Effluent Force Main from the WWTP to the stabilization ponds.

Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project

Background

If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local.

The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows and sanitary sewer backups within the Broadway Interceptor service area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding. To accomplish this reduction in hazards, the project included three main components:

- 1. Structure Improvements: This will include modifications to sanitary Lift Station (LS) #1, LS #2, and the West Side Interceptor Overflow Improvements.
- 2. **Broadway Relief Force Main**: This will include the construction of 22,000' of relief force main from LS #1 & LS #2 and will convey wet weather flows to the WWTP or wastewater stabilization ponds (WWSP).
- 3. **WWTP Effluent Force Main Rehabilitation**: This will include the rehab of 2,000 ft of the existing 30" ductile iron Effluent Force Main from the WWTP to the stabilization ponds.

The Broadway HMGP Project has been divided into multiple segments (12) with some installed in conjunction with previously scheduled projects (water main replacement & street rehab) and some led by the Wastewater Utility.

Segment 10

The original design that was submitted in the HMGP Application, included modifications to the Effluent Pump Station (EPS) and the installation of a gravity sewer from the end of the Broadway Force Main to the modified EPS. During design, concerns about slope stability along the river, caused city staff to investigate potential alternatives. The City currently has an ordinance related to river setback requirements associated with Limited Development Zones (LDZ) and Minimal Development Zones (MDZ), with the EPS and the gravity sewer being within each of these zones. The preferred alternative, which is identified as Segment 10, was to proceed with an extension of the Broadway force main along the south side of the WWTP and connect to the existing Effluent Force Main. From this point, wet weather flows will be conveyed from Lift Stations 1&2 through the Effluent Force Main to the WWSP.

Enclosed please find three (3) copies of Change Order No. 2 for the above-referenced project for your review and approval. This Change Order pertains to the following changes to the project:

- Item #1 4" Plug Valves -- Broadway Force Main: 4-inch plug valves are necessary in order for the ARV's to be installed. Due to Segment 2 providing a deduct for the two 4-inch plug valves, Master has supplied and installed these along with the ARV and goosenecks in the Segment 2 ARV Vaults. The supply and install quote from Master is \$640 per each, resulting in an overall contract increase of \$1,280.00.
- Item #2 Additional Cost for Materials and Labor: Due to the water main, on the south side of the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), not having a valve on the line to isolate the WWTP, this was required to be installed to allow the WWTP to continue daily operations. Master installed a valve on the line to isolate the, and installed a valve and the ACP watermain pipe with new PVC pipe. Change Order Instructions

A. **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This document was developed to provide a uniform format for handling contract changes that affect Contract Price or Contract Times. Changes that have been initiated by a Work Change Directive must be incorporated into a subsequent Change Order if they affect Price or Times.

Changes that affect Contract Price or Contract Times should be promptly covered by a Change Order. The practice of accumulating Change Orders to reduce the administrative burden may lead to unnecessary disputes.

If Milestones have been listed in the Agreement, any effect of a Change Order thereon should be addressed.

For supplemental instructions and minor changes not involving a change in the Contract Price or Contract Times, a Field Order should be used.

B. COMPLETING THE CHANGE ORDER FORM

Engineer normally initiates the form, including a description of the changes involved and attachments based upon documents and proposals submitted by Contractor, or requests from Owner, or both.

Once Engineer has completed and signed the form, all copies should be sent to Owner or Contractor for approval, depending on whether the Change Order is a true order to the Contractor or the formalization of a negotiated agreement for a previously performed change. After approval by one contracting party, all copies should be sent to the other party for approval. Engineer should make distribution of executed copies after approval by both parties.

Attached, please find an amendment to AE2S Task Order #3 for an expanded scope of Instrumentation and Control (I&C) services with no change in cost related to the Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) project. Water Utility staff is requesting approval of Amendment No. 1 to Task Order #3. The I&C services (Task Order #3) for the MWTP project are under budget with the equipment startup and controls programming mostly complete. Introduction

Attached, please find a proposed task order with AE2S for Warranty Phase Services and Operations Support related to Membrane WTP (MWTP) operation. This should be one of the last significant phases of the MWTP project construction, start-up, and optimization. Record drawing development is the highest cost task in the proposal. Task Order #17 is in the total amount of \$499,800. The MWTP project is being paid for through State Water Commission (SWC) grant funding and through a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan administered by the North Dakota Public Finance Authority (PFA) and North Dakota Department of Health (NDDH).



Picture of the valves and piping for the Suez Microfiltration/Ultrafiltration (MF/UF) membrane process. This process removes particles from water prior to Reverse Osmosis. In addition, the MF/UF process attains significant EPA credit toward pathogen removal.

The following provides a brief summary of the engineering services requested under the attached task order proposal:

Record Drawing Development: The highest cost task in the proposal is developing record drawings. The record drawings are important for troubleshooting, future plant/campus modifications and other needs in the future. Lack of accurate record drawings can result in significant issues during future construction or repairs. Inaccurate drawings created some problems, additional construction costs, or near-misses on the WTP campus during the time period of MWTP construction. For the Task Order #17 proposal, it is estimated at about 2 hours of engineering time per drawing to create the record drawings. There are 850 drawings for the MWTP.

Operational Support: The operation of the MWTP along with the lime softening plant is complex relative to most water treatment facilities. At this time, nearly all systems have been started-up. However, it will take some time and data collection to optimize the MWTP processes to be the most cost efficient. In addition, Water Utility staff is busy with other infrastructure design and construction projects such as regional water service facilities, raw water resource development, water distribution facility maintenance, and residuals handling planning. Water Utility staff has asked AE2S to provide operational support in the MWTP for much of 2019 to help manage the overall work load for the Water Utility and give the MWTP needed attention. Water Utility staff has requested engineers with lower billable hourly rates for much of the operational assistance.

Warranty Period Coordination: MWTP equipment has a 1-year warranty period for most items. The warranty engineering services will assist Water Utility personnel with warranty repair items and communications with contractors. This includes warranty items for process, electrical, instrumentation and controls, structural, architectural, and civil/site related components.

Continuation of Construction and Start-up Services: Water Utility staff requested construction engineering services beyond the budgeted and scheduled Substantial Completion for the project. These services have been carried through final completion with the three contractors: General, Mechanical, and Electrical.

This Scope of Services provides the services to support the coordination of warranty items, development of record drawing, and assistance with treatment system operation. Phase 063 - Construction Phase Services - Duration Extension

Troy Hall, Water Utility Director, presented the attached memo related to change orders for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction with Alberici Constructors, Inc. (ACI), the General Contractor, and Wrigley Mechanical, Inc. (WMI), the Mechanical Contractor. The total proposed cost increase is \$203.223.11. In the change order proposals, there are 34 listed changes between ACI and WMI. The highest cost item relates to chemical feed system changes needed to operate the new water plant. This is the final change order for the ACI, the General Contractor. ACI is also requesting a project time extension of about 7 weeks, which is reasonable on a 39-month project and due to unexpected equipment issues at startup. Water Utility staff recommends approval of these change orders and will help close-out the ACI contract. Finished water from the new plant will be delivered to customers soon, but customers have been receiving some Reverse Osmosis water from the MWTP for several months.

Water Utility staff thinks that all of the changes are in the best long-term interest of the City of Fargo. The overall status of cost change orders was discussed at the Utility Committee meeting for MWTP construction. After some research inquiring about comparable projects, Water Utility staff suggests that the industry average for cost change orders is an increase of about 3% to 5% of the bid price at completion. If the currently proposed contract changes are approved, the cost change orders for the MWTP will total an increase of 4.79% from the original bid price. However, only 3.47% is attributed to errors/omissions and other minor changes typical in a construction project. The other 1.32% of changes were implemented related to capacity increases with West Fargo water service and a project contribution from Black & Veatch. Water Utility staff also suggests that we are at a reasonable level for overall cost change orders at this point and are nearing the end of construction.

After bidding, contracts were approved on April 27, 2015, for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction to the three prime contractors as follows:

There have been previous change orders for this project approved by the Utility Committee and City Commission. Water utility staff is recommending additional changes to two of the three contracts at this time. A letter of explanation from AE2S and change order forms are attached.

After bidding, contracts were approved on April 27, 2015, for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction to the three prime contractors as follows:

As part of this change order, the General Contractor is requesting a time extension. The contractor was allowed about 39 months for Substantial Completion. Substantial Completion was attained in under 41 months, partially due to membrane breakage issues at start-up that likely resulted from faulty staining equipment. Also, equipment was added during the project to help serve West Fargo with drinking water.

MWTP Project Status Related Change Orders and Overall Cost

The MWTP is a large, complicated, and expensive project for the City of Fargo and its water service customers. As such, it is normal for projects of this nature to have adjustments that result in cost change orders. Since the MWTP exceeded \$100 million in bid prices, the following is intended to help provide perspective for this project compared to the cost impacts of change orders commonly seen in the industry.

While it may be difficult to find exact comparators to the MWTP project, the following are typical observations and goals for change order cost increases in the industry at project completion:

- Industry average: 3% to 5% of bid price
- Typical Project Goal: <2% of bid price
- Excellent Project: <1% of bid price
- Percentages for change order costs reflect (1) Errors & Omissions and (2) Owner Requested

Change Order (CO) statistics for MWTP project in percentages:

- Prior to Current CO Recommendations: 4.59%
- Adjusted Value Prior to Current CO Recommendations: 3.27%
- After Current CO Recommendations: 4.79%
- Adjusted Value After Current CO Recommendations: 3.47 %
- Total Adjusted Value Dollar Amount: \$1,369,585 (Different funding source)
 - o Generator Switchgear West Fargo: \$137,816.00 (previously approved CO)
 - o 7th Reverse Osmosis Train West Fargo: \$1,068,769.00 (previously approved CO)
 - o Black & Veatch contribution to HVAC Changes: \$163,000

Since the MWTP construction project is approaching completion and through a number of the higher risk project components for change orders, Water Utility personnel think the project is at a reasonable position from a change order perspective. 'Value Engineering' and teamwork between contractors, City staff, and consulting engineers has been an important factor in containing costs. The 'Value Engineering' for the foundation system was an important item for cost savings in the project, reducing the contract price by nearly \$300,000 early in construction.

Related to cost change orders, some higher risk project components include:

- Utility Infrastructure Rerouting (removal from excavation/construction areas) Complete
- Mass Excavation (unforeseen underground conditions) Complete
- Foundation (Pile) Installation Complete
- Major Equipment/Treatment Process Submittals Complete
- Concrete for Lower Level & Main Level Complete
- Building Structural Steel, Exterior Brick, and Roof Complete
- Process Piping, Building Electrical, and Mechanical Systems Nearly Complete
- Exterior Landscaping, Paving, and Site Work Complete

Startup process equipment has been in progress for several months. The MWTP is nearly operational as of February, 2019. At this time, the General Contractor is finished, off-site, and ready for project close-out. WTP staff is working on online instrumentation data quality to avoid any regulatory issues in finished water. The goal is to be producing finished water out of the MWTP prior to spring runoff. Construction, at this time, mostly consists of some electrical installation and modifications. There are heating issues in some rooms in the MWTP. Consulting engineers, the mechanical contractor, and WTP staff are working on these issues. The heating issues are essentially unrelated to the ability to treat water in the new MWTP.

A complicating factor for the MWTP construction is the agreement in July, 2015, to provide drinking water to West Fargo. With the addition of West Fargo, Water Utility staff needs to gauge what design adjustments should be recommended for the MWTP, looking at the best long-term interest of the City and customers. These adjustments in most cases will be cost increases. Two significant cost changes attributed to West Fargo water service have previous approval – 7th Reverse Osmosis train and electrical switchgear. Costs for the two changes were funded by State Water Commission regionalization grant funding and infrastructure sales tax (Fund 450). Please be aware that there is annual water sales revenue from West Fargo.

Enclosed please find four (4) copies of Change Order No. 22 for the above referenced project for your review and approval. This Change Order pertains to the following changes to the project:

- 1. Storm piping modifications were made which resulted in the deletion of two storm manholes (STMH-1 and STMH-6).
- 2. Sample piping modifications were needed om multiple sample lines and water quality panels, including added sample ports at each sample pump, additional sample lines to the spectrophotometer in the water quality lab, added piping from the RO sample line to the operator lab and the Admin. Area Humidifier, added sample drains in the RO CIP and Neutralization Areas, modified inlet and outlet connections on the water quality panels in the water quality lab, and modification to the process drain header in the water quality lab.
- 3. Piping modification were made on multiple pressure gauge and pressure transmitter locations, including adding pressure gauges on both raw water lines, changes to the piping assembly for approximately fourteen pressure transmitters adding sample connections and flushing capability, and adding 1.5-inch flushing taps on the raw water jet mix piping in four locations.
- 4. The dry chemical system required additional modifications and clarifications to address inconsistencies after the removal of the temporary dry chemical system causing delays to the installation and operation of the permanent system which resulted the temporary piping to be moved, modified, repairs/replaced, and monitored for an extended period of time.
- 5. The total amount allocated for allowances was not completed used resulting in a deduct for the balance of the remaining cash allowance.
- 6. The chem feed pump heads on five chemical feed pumps were replaced with higher pressure units to allow the pumps to discharge into the process lines operating at, or above, 30 psi. During initial operation it was found that the sodium hydroxide feed pumps were operating at a higher pressure than the pumps were capable of due to the viscosity of the chemical. The sodium hydroxide lines were replaced with larger diameter test pipes and then later replaced with the larger permanent tubing to the three feed points
- 7. The hardware for door 8150A, between the garage and dry chemical area, will be changed so the west leaf is inactive so it does not block the stairs on the north side of the door.

8. The hold-open arms will be removed form the door closures on the fire doors to meet Building Code requirements.

9. The ammonia injection points in the existing WTP will be relocated and tapping saddles will be added at each of the three locations. A sample tap will also be added on the softening basin effluent line, prior to the ammonia injection point.

10. A humidistat will be added on the soda ash system to aid in the control of the humidifier.

11. The terminal blocks in the PLC's supplied by Suez for the UF system and associated chemical feed panels were replaced with J4 terminal blocks. This work was performed by JDP as an added cost to their contract and this corresponding deduct to Alberici's contract is provided as a result of Suez covering the costs to switch the terminal blocks.

12. The pump seal on one of the solids collection pumps (SLP-2001) will be replaced due to the

seal water being turned off to the pump.

13. The operating level electrical room and server room will be sealed along the roof deck as required to operate the clean agent fire suppression system that was added to both rooms.

14. The cover for the future lime silo will be sealed along the edge, between the metal cover and the concrete floor, to fully separate the conditioned space below from the nonconditioned space on the operating level of the dry chemical storage area.

15. The designed air gap between the filtrate wet well and the pretreatment basin was formed with rigid insulation. Flashing was added over this gap and exposed rigid insulation per

Building Code requirement.

- 16. Additional trouble shooting was needed on a few samples pumps to determine the cause of low sample flow. The sample pumps were ultimately replaced by the City, but this added cost is for the contractor's labor associated with the additional pump troubleshooting/testing.
- 17. The exterior rain barrel sprinkler piping will be modified as requested by the City to include a drain connection on each rain barrel.
- 18. Soffit flashing will be installed along the brick ledge of the existing WTP building in the Mechanical/Blower Room to conceal the rough exposed bottom of the brick ledge.
- 19. The storage racks for the temporary guardrails used in the UF area was modified and relocated to the membrane storage room.
- 20. A PVC pipe stilling wall will be installed in the EQ Basin in an effort to reduce the variation on the water surface and provide a smoother level reading for the UF system operation.
- 21. Masonry infill was needed to close the openings for the removed temporary electrical work and on the west side of the building exterior to close the openings originally planned for future rain barrel locations.
- 22. The RO concentrate sample piping was modified to relocate the sample point upstream to the horizontal section of process pipe to reduce the issue of air in the sample when taking the sample from the vertical section of process pipe. A spare tap was also added for a future pressure transmitter.

23. Flanges were added in the 10-inch RO CIP line north of RO skid 1 to allow for the section of CIP pipe to be removed during membrane element removal from RO skid 1.

24. A drain was added to the finished water jet mix section of stainless steel pipe.

25. The requirement for push-to-test lights on the dry chemical control panel and in place the programming will have the ability to test lights as an option on the control screen. This change resulted in a deduct for the project.

- 1. A unit heater was added in the RO room near the north window to aid in heating the area due to the anticipated north wind hitting the large window.
- 2. The storm drain pipe for future rain barrels was removed from the wall and the openings in the west wall were sealed.
- 3. Linear heat detection will be added in the dry chemical area. The linear heat detection is a more maintenance friendly heat detection system that will be used in lieu of the standard heat/smoke detectors which would require routine replacement in locations that are 30 feet or more above the floor.
- 4. Multiple changes were made to the building control system including the addition of a vent fan hand control station, additional sensor in the Men's Locker Room, modification to AHU 7 for winter operation, and addition of an emergency shutoff outside of the chemical room.

The LPA

- a. Will pay 10 percent of the cost of rights of way and easements acquired for the project; and
- b. Will pay 10 percent of the total cost of all items which are determined eligible for funding participation. This total cost will include the actual construction cost plus 10 percent for the preliminary and construction engineering; and
- c. Will pay 100 percent of the construction costs plus 10 percent for the preliminary and construction engineering of all items as requested by the LPA for items determined to be non-participating or ineligible for federal aid. This work includes waterlines, watermain, sanitary sewer, and landscaping structural soils.
- d. Will pay 100 percent of the project incentive for early completion of the project.

LPA Obligation:

- 1. The LPA will pay to NDDOT as the work progresses or when completed its share of the total cost of the project as defined above.

Jim Hausauer Wastewater Utility Director presented attached memo and Change Order #3 from ICS, Inc. for Improvement District NR-17-B1. If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local. The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows (SSO's) and backups within the Broadway Interceptor Service Area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding.

Historically, the sanitary Lift Station (LS) 1 & 2 service areas (SA) have experienced issues with wet weather flows during extreme rain events and flooding, which exceeded the capacity of the existing lift stations and Broadway Interceptor. The NR-17-B improvements include the construction of new wet weather lift stations that are attached to the existing sanitary lift station 1 and 2. Along with the new construction, improvements/replacement of various components within the existing lift stations are to be included with this improvement district. Change Order #3 consists of the following items:

- 1. Both LS #1 & #2 construction sites had Xcel transformers that needed to be relocated before excavation. Xcel completed the relocation two months later than initially planned. This delay pushed a large portion of the concrete work into the winter months, resulting in added costs. The costs include added labor to complete the work in cold conditions, heating of the excavation and work areas, and material & labor needed to construct winter protection over the work area. The delay also includes a time extension of 82 days. \$182,405.68
- 2. During construction it was discovered that the new opening in the roof of LS #1 will require additional structural support for the existing roof. Structural beams will be added around the new opening and extend to the existing walls to provide necessary support. \$13,600.00

- 8. During bypass planning, the City requested that a hole be cored into the existing LS #2 manhole for installation of a level transducer to monitor the bypass pumping process. \$1,070.00

Background

If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local. The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows and sanitary sewer backups within the Broadway Interceptor Service Area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding. To accomplish this reduction in hazards, the project will include three main components:

- 1. **Structure Improvements:** This will include modifications to sanitary Lift Station (LS) #1, LS #2, and the West Side Interceptor Overflow Improvements.
- 2. **Broadway Relief Force Main**: This will include the construction of 22,000' of relief force main from LS #1 & LS #2 and will convey wet weather flows to the WWTP or wastewater stabilization ponds (WWSP).
- 3. **WWTP Effluent Force Main Rehabilitation**: This will include the rehab of 2,000 ft of the existing 30" ductile iron Effluent Force Main from the WWTP to the stabilization ponds.

Historically, sanitary Lift Station (LS) 1 & 2 service areas (SA) have experienced issues with wet weather flows during extreme rain events, which exceeded the capacity of the existing lift stations and the Broadway Interceptor. The NR-17-B improvements include the construction of new wet weather lift stations that are attached to the existing sanitary lift stations 1 & 2. Along with the new construction, improvements/replacement of various components within the existing lift stations are to be included with this improvement district.

Change Order #3

- 3. The gate valve on the wet well pump discharge line was initially located below the access hatch which did not allow for the valve extension nut to extend to the concrete surface. The valve was moved further down the pipe which required modification to the valve stem extension to reach the concrete surface at the new location.
- 4. The bypass pumping was changed during construction to discharge to the existing force main in lieu of the planned storm sewer bypass location. This change resulted in an increase to the required discharge pressure for the bypass pumps leading to a change in pumps as well as a change in the discharge piping material and configuration.
- 5. The existing 36-inch RCP influent pipe extended into the wet well and had to be cut flush with the wall to allow for installation of the new slide gate over the existing influent pipe.
- 6. The existing wet well surface was uneven and required the slide gate frame to be grouted in place to provide a water tight seal between the slide gate and the wet well wall.
- 7. The bypass pumping was changed during construction to discharge to the existing force main in lieu of the planned storm sewer bypass location. This change resulted in an increase to the required discharge pressure for the bypass pumps leading to a change in pumps as well as a change in the discharge piping material and configuration.
- 8. The existing access hatch was located directly in line with the new slide gate actuator stand. The access hatch was removed and replaced with a hatch further west on the wet well cover and concrete was poured back in place to provide a solid base for the new slide gate actuator stand.
- 9. During bypass planning for WS2 it was requested that a hole be cored into the existing manhole for installation of a City owned level transmitter to aid in monitoring the bypass pumping process.

- 10. The area of existing removed asphalt was larger than shown on the plans. The submitted proposal accounts for the balance of the additional asphalt added at the WS2 site.
- 11. A tee was added to the drain piping into the wet well for the pump room sump pump to connect to and also discharge back into the wet well.
- 12. The original power strips for the three overhead hoists were exposed copper tracks which could be susceptible to corrosion in the lift station environment. Two of the hoists operate on a beam extending out of the building where the power track would interfere with the exterior doors. To remove the interference with the exterior doors and eliminate the exposed copper track the tracks will be replaced with power cords and power reels will be installed at the two hoists that operate through the exterior doors.

This letter is to provide updates as requested per your email dated August 22, 2018. Information contained in this letter are in conjunction with or add to previous correspondence on this issue.

Communications with Xcel:

I have not included all the communication about the transformer but I have included correspondence that help show what transpired.

- O July 25, 2017; The first communication between ICS and Xcel related to this projected occurred. Communication was by phone between Gary Beeter and Travis Lill and was captured in an email from Gary Beeter to Eric Bye and Dan Shirek. Travis didn't know anything about the project but indicated a 4-week timeframe to move the transformers.
- o August 11, 2017; Travis Lill with Xcel informed JPD and ICS that the City hadn't turned in the paperwork for the transformers which pushed the relocate out into mid-September.
- o August 14, 2017; ICS received an email from AE2S stating that Xcel won't be able to relocate the transformer by LS2 until early October.
- September 13, 2017; Eric Bye with ICS emails Ben Julson with AE2S stating that he tried to get the transformer relocation date moved up but Travis Lill informed him there was still no work order or payment from the City for that site.
- September 13, 2017; Ben Julson with AE2S emailed to Eric Bye with ICS stating that that he had spoken to Travis Lill and the work order was being prepared/processed by Xcel and the invoice(s) will be sent to the City.

We are willing to share other communications if necessary but the delay was not caused by communication between any contractor and the utility company. The delay was a result of the City not turning in the paperwork so the utility company could schedule the work.
