Graphic Novel Reorganization

Are you looking for a graphic novel? We've made it easier for you! The Children's Graphic Novel Collection at the Main Library has been relabeled to help you find your favorites. **We have relabeled this collection so that the books are in alphabetical order by the character's name, series, or title.** The Children's Graphic Novels were previously in alphabetical order by the author's last name. Using the author is effective for a majority of our collections, but unfortunately in our graphic novel collection we noticed that this way of labeling items sometimes separated books in a series or made it difficult to find a book when browsing. We believe that it will be easier for children to find what they are looking for with our new labeling system.



For instance:

- Do you want to read Dog Man (character)? Dog Man is now shelved under D for Dog Man.
- How about My Little Pony (series)? My Little Pony is now shelved under M for My.
- What about *Smile* (title) by Raina Telgemeier? *Smile* is now shelved under S for *Smile*.

& 17! We will be switching over to this new way of labeling graphic novels at the branch libraries in the next few months. 




