> Maria - if you do go into the food court, you could work with West Acres to set up an area that would be where alcohol consumption is allowed. We have nothing prohibiting alcohol there, but West Acres might have concerns. If you can work that out we could just do a license transfer to the new location. I'd need to see the floor plan to understand how alcohol will be controlled.

> Are the people buying the building going to operate a restaurant? If so they might want to transfer the license to them. We don't issue refunds on the initial issuance fee. If you do keep the license and reopen within a year or so you could transfer the license to the new location. I think it would be good for you to request a time to let the license sit until you decide what you are going to do. If you'd like to do that I need a request from you that I can bring to the City Commission. You would need to request an exemption from Fargo Municipal Code 25-1512, it requires continuous use of the license to keep it active.

SUBJECT: Parking Services RFP Award (RFP 18193)

DATE: July 26, 2018

The Auditors Office along with Fargo Police and Interstate Parking conducted an RFP for Parking Services to include parking enforcement for on street, off street, permit management and collections processes. We received responses from Duncan Solutions, Passport, T 2, Municipal Citation Solutions and IPS Group. After an initial review three proposals were eliminated from further consideration due to cost, past history and use of technology. On site interviews and demonstrations were conducted with Duncan Solutions and Passport.

The City of Fargo has been using Duncan Solutions for 10 years to process parking tickets and handle collections for on street parking tickets. For three years, Interstate Parking has managed the City of Fargo off street parking lots and ramps and manage the parking permit program utilizing Passport for issuing tickets. In the interest of efficiency and to update technology the City of Fargo would like to award one provider the contract moving forward.

Although both companies would provide the services needed, the staff reviewing the demonstrations felt Passport was easier to use and more intuitive. Duncan operates in a module environment in which tickets are issued in one module and payment processing is in a different module. With Passport all functions are within an app and a smart phone is sufficient hardware.

Recommended Motion:

Move to award Parking Services RFP (RFP 18193) to Passport Labs Inc. and direct the Auditor's Office to negotiate the contract, contract to be presented for approval before Sept 30, 2018.

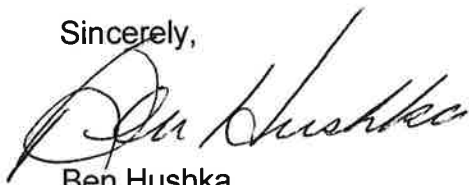
Chapter 57-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code provides for a property tax exemption for certain types of improvements made to existing buildings.

AMENDMENT TO PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT

On or about August 15, 2017, the State of North Dakota, acting through its North Dakota Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Division (State) and City of Fargo d/b/a Fargo Cass Public Health (Vendor) entered into an Agreement to increase access to treatment, reduce unmet treatment needs, and reduce overdose-related deaths through the implementation of evidence-based prevention, treatment, and recovery activities.

The parties agree that certain parts of that Agreement and Amendment A should be changed:

1. The Term of the Agreement is changed from August 15, 2017, through June 30, 2018, to August 15, 2017, through April 15, 2019.
2. **PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT
KINDRED PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT**

Whereas the Kindred Public School District hereinafter referred to as District, has agreed to purchase the services described in the "Scope of Service" (Attachment A); and

Whereas, Fargo Cass Public Health, 1240 25th Street South, Fargo, North Dakota 58103-2367 hereinafter referred to as Provider desires to provide the services described in the "Scope of Services" (Attachment A):

Now, therefore the District and the Provider enter into the following:

I. TERMS OF CONTRACT

The term of this contract shall be for school year 2018-2019, beginning on July 1, 2018 and ending on June 30, 2019. This contract may be renewed for subsequent school years by written agreement of the parties. Provided, that either party may terminate this contract at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice to other.

II. TERMINATION

In the event the agreement is terminated, the termination shall be without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of either party for services provided prior to such termination.

III. SCOPE OF SERVICE

The Provider agrees to provide services in accordance with documentation in this contract.

IV. COMPENSATION

1. The District agrees to reimbursement for service in accordance with the agreed upon charges in this contract (Attachment B). The billing will occur monthly, at the previously determined rate of 63 percent for the district and 37 percent for the provider. The hours to be billed will include the scheduled nursing time, any annual or sick leave taken by the nursing personnel and holiday pay as determined by the City of Fargo.
2. The provider will attempt to get substitute nursing coverage, when the regularly scheduled nurse is on an extended leave.

V. CHANGES

No change or amendment to this agreement may be made unless made in writing signed by the parties.

VI. NO GRANT OF AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT ON BEHALF OF THE DISTRICT

No part of this agreement shall be construed to grant to the Provider any authority to contract for on behalf of or incur obligations on behalf of the District.

VII. AUTHORITY TO SUBCONTRACT

The Provider may subcontract with qualified providers of services, provided that any subcontract must acknowledge the binding nature of this agreement and incorporate this agreement, together with its attachments. The Provider agrees to be solely responsible for the performance of any subcontractor.

VIII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The Provider is performing the duties under this agreement as an independent contractor. No part of this agreement, or the arrangements made by the parties to perform this agreement, shall be construed as creating an employer/employee relationship.

IX. COPYRIGHT

The District reserves a right to copy or reproduce any materials created or produced, by the Provider, in performance of this agreement except with confidential information.

X. AGREEMENT CONSTITUTES CONTRACT

This agreement shall constitute the entire contract, between the parties, for performance of the Scope of Service. There are not other agreements, either verbal or written, that alter or affect this agreement.

XI. PROVIDER ASSURANCES

The Provider agrees to comply with the applicable provider Assurances hereto attached, on Attachment C.

XII. INTEGRATION AND MODIFICATION

This contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Provider and the District. No alteration, amendment or modification in the provisions of this agreement shall be effective unless it is reduced to writing signed by the parties and attached hereto.

XIII. COLLATERAL CONTRACTS

Where there exists any inconsistency between this agreement and other provisions of collateral contractual agreements which are made a part of this agreement by reference or otherwise, the provisions of this agreement shall control.

XIV. ACCESS TO RECORDS

Fargo Cass Public Health and the North Dakota State Health Department, and their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to the books, documents, paper and records of the District which are pertinent, as determined by Fargo Cass Public Health, to this contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcripts.

XV. RETENTION OF RECORDS

The Provider agrees to retain financial and program records.

XVI. CONFIDENTIALITY

The Provider will not, except upon the written consent of the recipient's or their responsible parent, guardian, or custodian, use or cause to be used any information concerning such individual for any purpose not directly connected with the District or the Provider's responsibilities with respect to services purchased hereunder. The District acknowledges their role in abiding by the adherence to FERPA regulations relative to educational records confidentiality in order to protect student privacy. The consequences of failing to comply with FERPA must be borne by the School District and not Fargo Cass Public Health.

XVII. APPLICABLE LAW

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.

XVIII. CAPTIONS

The captions or heading in this agreement are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope of intent of any provisions of this agreement.

XIX. EXECUTION AND COUNTERPARTS

This agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, all of which shall constitute but one of the same instrument.

XX. AMENDMENTS

The terms of this agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented, or amended, in any manner whatsoever, except by written instrument signed by the parties.

XXI. NOTICES

All notices, certificates or other communications shall be sufficiently given when delivered or mailed, postage prepaid, to the parties at their respective places of business as set forth in the preamble to this agreement or at a place designated hereafter in writing by the parties.

XXII. SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST

The provisions of this agreement shall be binding upon and shall insure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns.

XXIII. SEVERABILITY

The parties agree that any term or provision of this contract is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or in conflict with any law, the validity of the remaining terms and provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the contract did not contain the particular term or provision held to be invalid.

XXIV. WAIVER

The failure of the District to enforce any provisions of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the District of that or any other provision.

XXV. MERGER CLAUSE

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification or change of terms of this agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties. Such waiver, consent, modification or change, if made, shall be effective only in modification or change, if made, shall be effective only the specific instance and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements, or representatives, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this agreement. Provider, by the signature below of its authorized representative, hereby acknowledges that the Provider has read this agreement, understands it and agrees to be bound by its terms and conditions.

XXVI. INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

The District hereby agrees to indemnify and hold the Provider, its officers, agents, employees, and members, harmless from any and all claims, demands and causes of action which may be asserted against the Provider as a result of the rendering of any of the services by the Provider which are described in this Agreement. The obligation of the District under the terms of this provision shall include the duty to provide a legal defense of such claims; provided that this provision shall not be construed to require reimbursement of any legal expenses incurred by the District, without prior written approval of the District.

XXVII. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Provider shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work to be done under this agreement.

XXVIII. NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Provider makes available all services and assistance without regard to race, color, national origin, religion, age, sex, or handicap, and is subject to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1975 as amended. Persons who contract with or receive funds to provide services for Provider are obligated to abide by the provisions of their federal laws. PURPOSE: The purpose of this partnership is to share expertise, time, energy, and economic resources to coordinate and provide a comprehensive health program in our school community.

GOALS: The goal of this program is to provide Public Health School Nurse services to all components of the Kindred Public Schools health program: education, environment and services.

- A. Improve the student and family access to community health services.
- B. Improve the early identification, referral, and follow-up of students experiencing unresolved health problems.
- C. Determine the current compliance rate for follow-up on health screening results and on immunization requirements.
- D. Improve the students' access to basic health services at school for first aid symptom management and medications.

OBJECTIVES:

The Public Health School Nurse is a liaison between education and health care and will provide a link between the school, home and community. The nurse will:

- A. Manage health care in the school health program
The nurse will participate in planning, implementation, and evaluation of the program.
- B. Deliver health services
The nurse will deliver health services to the client system using systematic processes to assess needs, plan interventions, and evaluate outcomes so that high-level wellness can be achieved. The nurse will also monitor follow through related to health referrals.
- C. Advocate for the health rights of children
The nurse will act as an advocate for the health rights of children and their families both within the school and between the school and community.
- D. Provide health consult for individuals and groups
The nurse will provide health counseling and guidance for the client system on an individual basis or within a group setting.
- E. Provide health education
The nurse will participate in health education program activities for children, youth, school personnel, and the community.

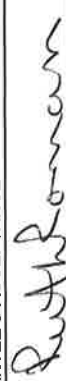

BlueConnect is available to customers of Blue Cross Blue Shield North Dakota (BCBSND) health and dental insurances. In addition, customers must offer at least one voluntary benefit. We plan to offer a short-term disability plan. The City of Fargo Finance Committee approved the utilization of BlueConnect at the July 9, 2018 meeting.

BlueConnect provides 24/7 access to benefit information and enrollment options for employees. BlueConnect will provide an enhanced employee experience and create substantial efficiencies in benefit administration.

The platform provides a powerful tool for annual benefit enrollments and new hire benefit enrollments. Employees will be able to log in to BlueConnect, review their current elections and make any necessary changes to their enrollments. The platform then sends their enrollment data to our benefit vendors, eliminating the need for benefit applications to be faxed or emailed to various vendors. In addition, BlueConnect has the ability to send the data to our payroll system and populate benefit deductions in employee records, reducing or eliminating the need for manual entry.

On or after August 1, 2018 the City of Fargo will submit a request to HUD for the release of CDBG and HOME funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL-93-383) as amended, to undertake the following projects:

AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS

- **Housing Rehabilitation** – CDBG (\$222,846) and HOME funds (\$501,607) will be used to rehabilitate older owner-occupied homes in Fargo for low-to-moderate income households; locations to be determined.

- **Special Assessment Assistance** – CDBG funds (\$15,000) will be used to assist lower-income households in Fargo with special assessments; locations to be determined.

DOWNTOWN PROJECTS

- **Downtown Slum and Blight Projects** – CDBG funds (\$100,000) will be used for projects within the downtown area that will address façade improvements and removal of slum and blighted conditions located in Census Tracts 5.02, 5.01, 6, 7, 8.02, and 8.01.

FACILITIES/CAPITAL

- **Fraser, Ltd. Project** – CDBG funds (\$17,850) will be used to support facility upgrades to the common area of an Independent Living Program house, which provides housing for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who need assistance with daily living activities, located at 2574 Arrowhead Road South. The total project cost is estimated at \$17,850.
- **Rape and Abuse Crisis Center** - CDBG funds (\$60,000) will be used to improve the safety/security at the center, located at 720 4th Avenue North and adjoins 315 8th Street North. The total project cost is estimated at \$120,000.
- **Rebuilding Together** - CDBG funds (\$55,000) will be used to support housing rehab of affordable owner-occupied housing; locations to be determined.

Mahoney in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Fargo to use HUD program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Fargo's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Fargo; (b) the City of Fargo has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD at 1670 Broadway Street, Denver, CO, 80202. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.

After our review of the bid submittals we recommend Western Specialty Contractors (Western) bid be selected as the General Contractor for the referenced restoration project for the garage total prices of:

- Civic Center Ramp \$238,788.00
- GTC Parking Garage \$101,732.00
- Island Park Ramp \$145,557.00 (Corrected by adding \$2,000)

We do not recommend accepting Alternates.

There were two responsive bids from Western and Gast Construction (Gast). Typically, an effective competition amongst bidders is reflected by receiving at least three bids. However, prices and the engineer's estimate were within 3% of each other, an indication of receiving competitive prices.

There were errors in the bids, reference attached Bid Summary spreadsheet and highlighted yellow cells, with a significant portion of Gast's bid incorrectly multiplying the unit quantity by the unit cost.

There was an error in the bid table, in Section 00 4100, "Bid Forms," the allowance for plumbing work in Island Park Ramp was missing. It was supposed to be \$2,000. Western showed a blank, and Gast placed a unit cost multiplying by an unknown unit quantity.

Gast, with our mathematical corrections, was \$3,007.82 higher than Western.

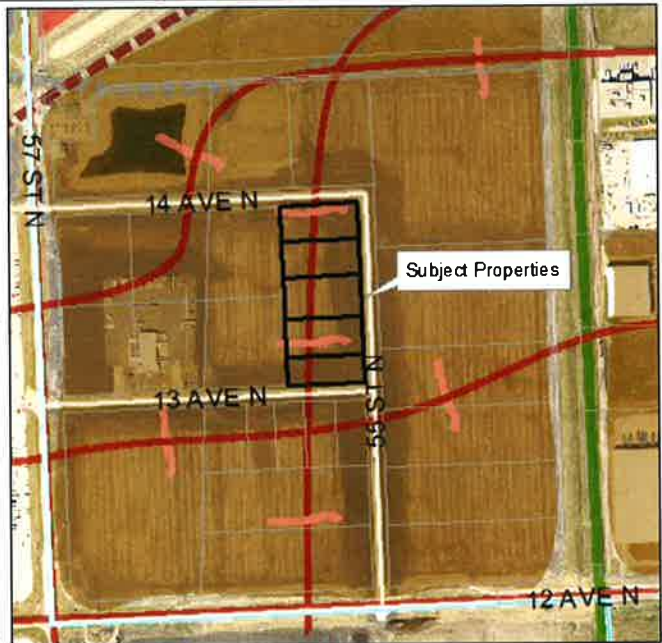

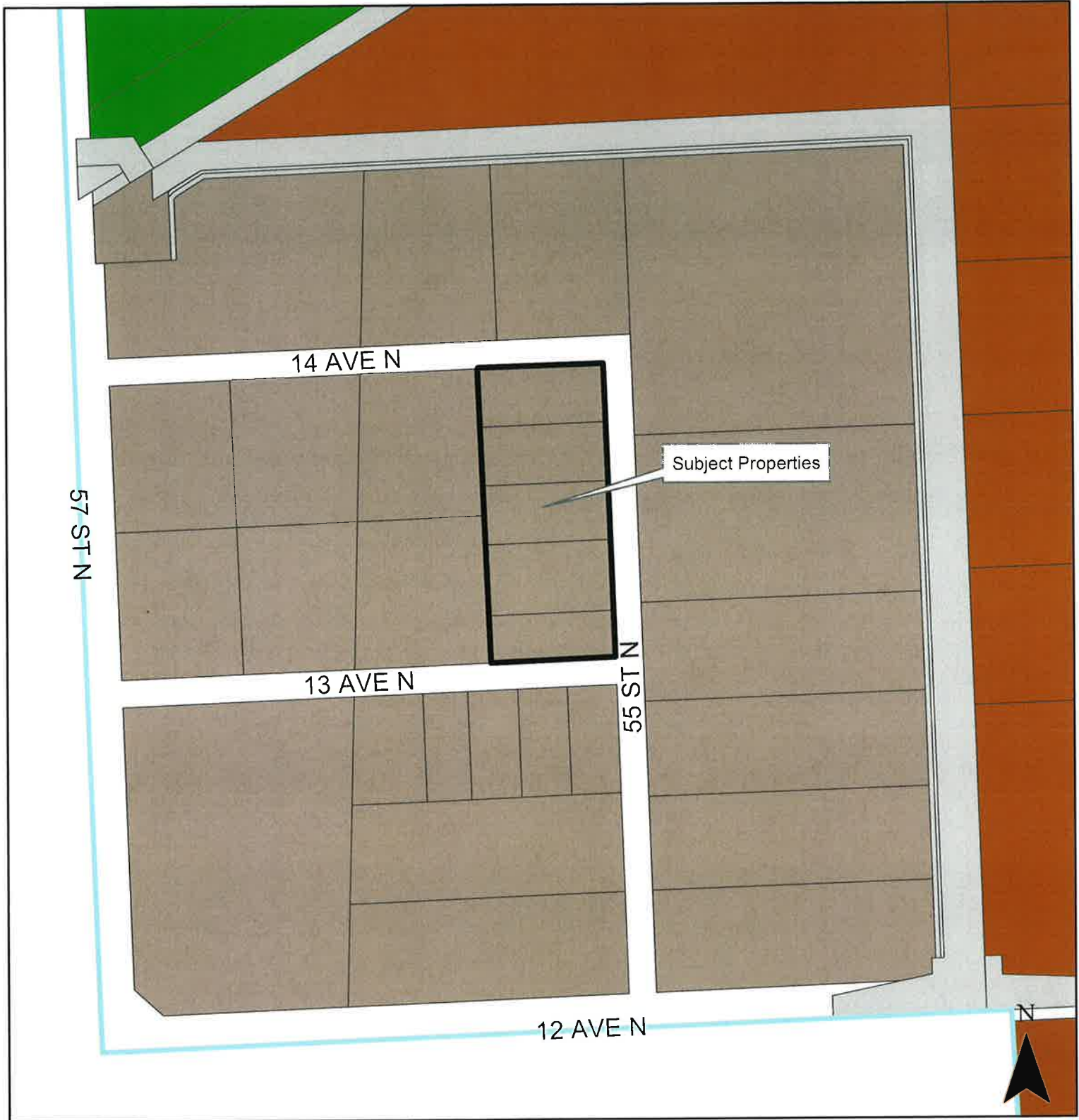

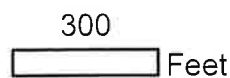

Simonson Companies First Addition will be a replat of Lot 2, Block 1, The District of Fargo Addition. The subject properties are located at 5237 38th Street South and 3825 53rd Avenue South and encompasses approximately 3.28 acres.</p> <p>Background: Simonson First Addition was a replat of Lot 2, Block 1, The District of Fargo Addition that</p>

was approved by the Planning Commission on February 6, 2018 and the City Commission on May 21, 2018. The minor subdivision plat was recorded on June 12, 2018.

On June 12, 2018, the Cass County Recorder's Office informed the Planning and Development Department that the name on the plat was similar to the title of Simonson's First Addition that was platted in 1994 and that the proposed Simonson First Addition name would create a lot of challenges for the Recorder's Office in the future.

Staff discussed the issue with the Engineering Department, Recorder's Office and City Attorney and determined that a vacation and replat would be needed to rename the plat.

Therefore, the current legal description of the properties is Simonson First Addition. However, it is the intention of the applicant to vacate Simonson First Addition by recorded affidavit before Simonson Companies First Addition is recorded.

Between February and June 2018, changes have occurred in regards to city staff positions and legal descriptions to surrounding land areas. Therefore, differences between Simonson First Addition plat and the proposed Simonson Companies plat are the following:

1. Title change and text changes from "Simonson First Addition" to "Simonson Companies First Addition"
2. City Engineer name change from "Mark H. Bittner" to "Brenda E. Derrig"
3. Change of legal description of the property east of the subject property from "The District of Fargo Addition Lot 1 Block 6" to "The District of Fargo 3rd Addition Lot 1 Block 1."

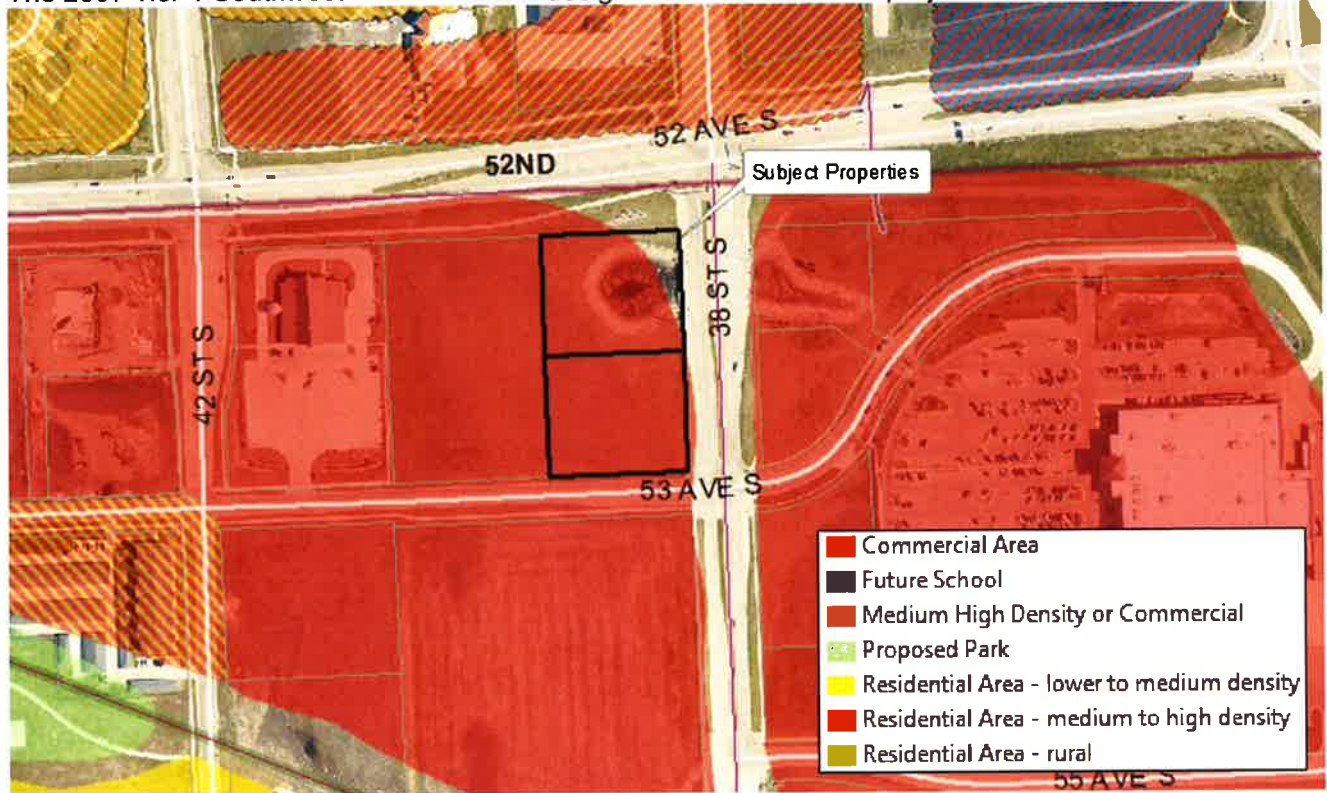

PROJECT HISTORY NOTE: This project is continued from the January 4 and February 6, 2018, Planning Commission meetings.

The applicant requests approval of one entitlement:

1. A plat of the **MVM Addition**, a replat of Lot 1, Block 5 of Replat of Lots 6-17, Block 1; Lots 13 & 14, Block 3; Lots 1-6, Block 4 of Southwood Park, to create two lots for commercial development.

The subject property is located at 3502 36th Street South. The applicant intends to create two lots. Lot 1 lot will contain the existing commercial building. Lot 2 will have no development on it. 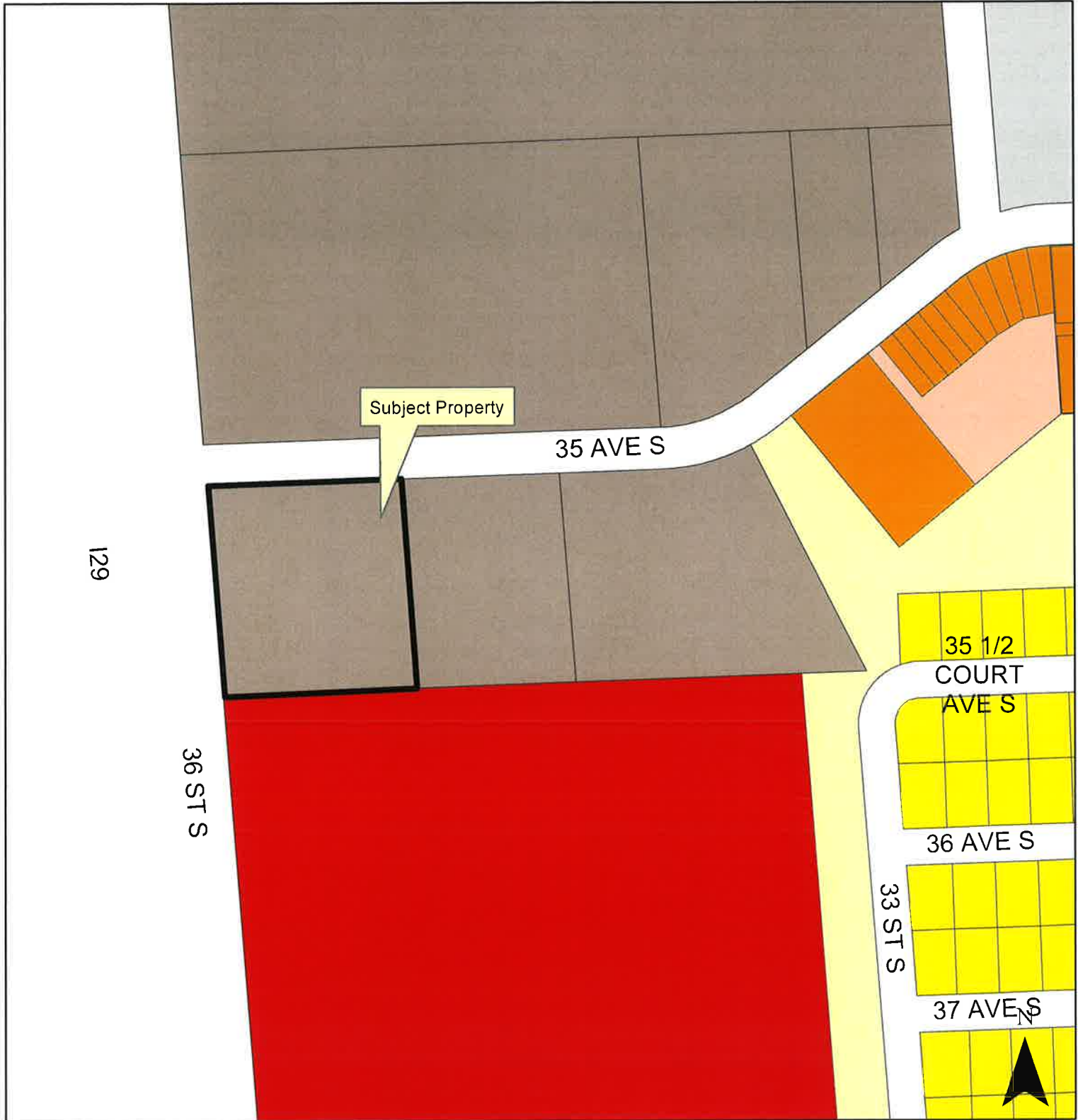

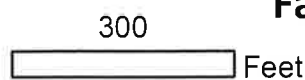

The following is an excerpt from RFQ 18-172 which outlines the criteria for scoring the architect proposals for the next phase of our building renovation.

Interviews

Background:

Project No. FM-15-K1 bids were opened on May 30, 2018 and the project awarded by the City Commission to Industrial Builders on June 4, 2018. Construction began on June 25, 2018.

The project continues construction of flood control on the north side of Rose Coulee across the Rosewood neighborhood. During excavation for the inspection trench, unsuitable soils were found that could not be re-used on site. It was determined, by the geotechnical engineer, that suitable soils would need to be imported to assure the meeting of the design, and Corps of Engineer's standards, for earthen levee construction. Please see attached. The change includes extending the allowable time frames for a lane closure on south University to allow the safe hauling of the materials. The change will also include detouring pedestrian traffic from the west side of University to the east side during hauling operations to provide safe use by the public. The change order amount is \$176,500.00 and is being paid for with Sales Tax Funds-Flood Control-460.

The requested change order items have been reviewed and are reasonable.

Dear Jody:

On the referenced project, Industrial Builders (IBI) has encountered excess topsoil and excess material unsuitable for levee construction. In the plans, it was assumed that 20% of the material encountered will not be suitable. The actual material encountered in the field is exceeding that assumption. It was assumed that all excavated material on the project would be able to be re-incorporated into the project, so there was not a bid item included for hauling material off site. Due to the excess unsuitable material, there will need to be additional quantity of suitable material hauled to the project and the unsuitable material will need to be hauled off the project site.

IBI has submitted a proposed price of \$7.15/CY to haul off site and dispose of the unsuitable material. Please see the attached letter dated July 11, 2018. Based on the earthwork bid prices received from IBI \$7.15/CY is a reasonable price. KLJ recommends a change order to add the bid item "Fill Haul" (2000-L090-0000) at a unit price of \$7.15/CY to the contract. This material will be measured in the field via topographic survey, material will not be quantified by any other method.

Based on field observations and discussions with IBI, it is estimated that 10,000 CY of material will be deemed unsuitable and required to be hauled off site. At \$7.15/CY, this will add \$71,500 to the contract price. This will also require an additional 10,000 CY of "Fill-impervious" be imported to the project. At IBI's bid price of \$10.50/CY, this is an additional \$105,500 to the contract.

IBI has also requested that the provisions in Note 12 of the Special Instructions to bidders be revised to allow the lane closure on University Drive to remain in place longer than the current allowable times. Due to the increase truck traffic hauling material to and from the site, KLJ recommends allowing IBI to utilize the lane closure as shown in the Section 100 of the during earth hauling operations in construction of the gate well. The lane closure will be required to be removed when truck hauling operations are not taking place, including nights and weekends.



In addition, IBI has requested that the sidewalk along the west side of University Drive be detoured north and south of the project to allow for the sidewalk to be closed at the construction entrance. KLJ concurs with IBI's proposal for the sidewalk closure. There will be no additional compensation for this temporary signage.

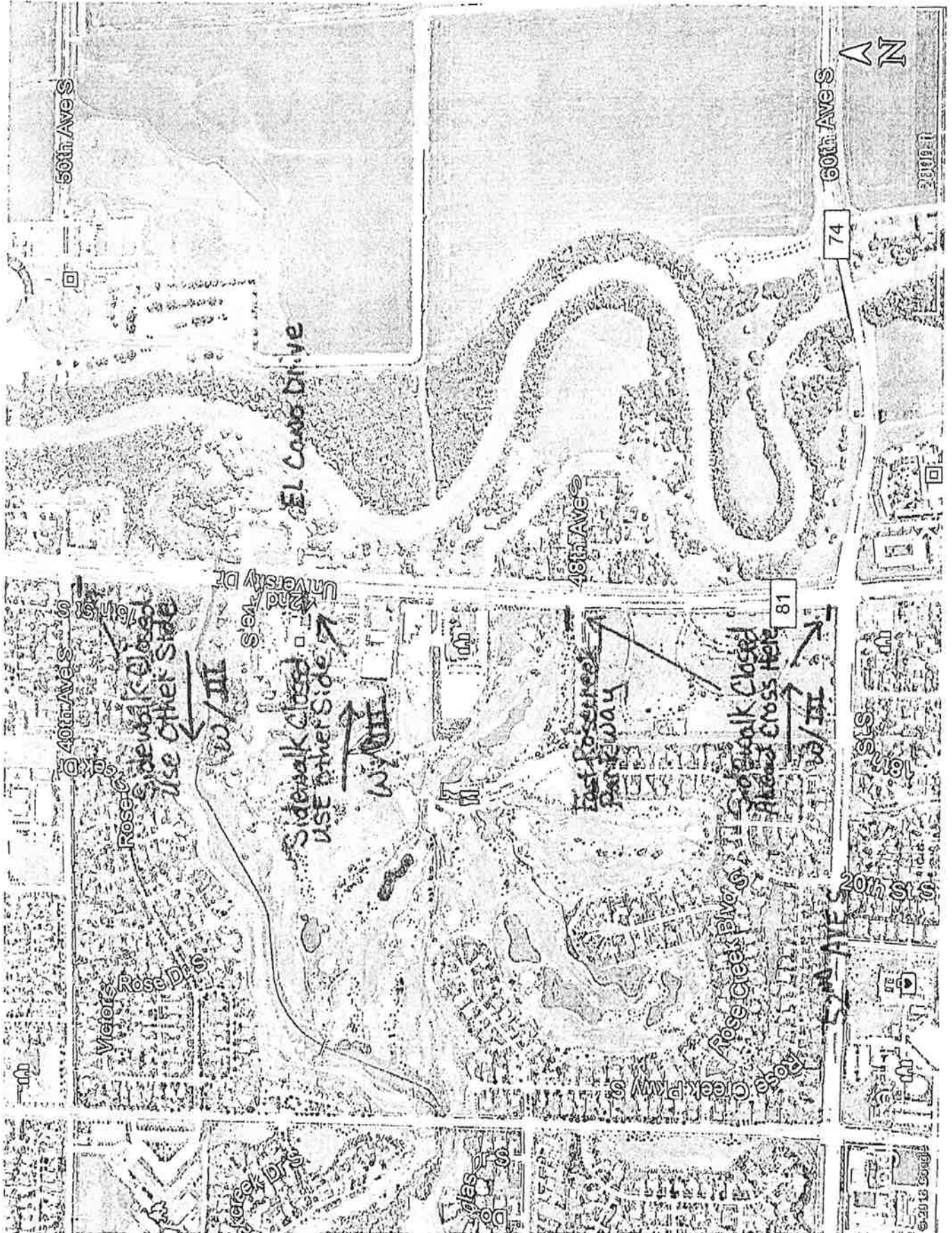

Background:

This contract amendment covers four project administration items for which KLJ Engineering has or will incur during the performance of their duties. The first is the additional staff time required for the two added pre-bid meetings held to enable contractors to understand the timing of the project components and allow for bidding related questions to be answered. The second item is for the redrafting of easements and related documents for a change in the project scope, with the addition of a bike path extension out to University Drive and the impacts resulting to the surrounding property owner's proposed easements. The Xcel Energy coordination was another additional task due to the relocation of their two gas mains, which resulted in numerous on site meetings to determine the most desirable path in relation to the proposed and existing facilities. The last item is related to the 404 permitting required for the discovery of wetlands not initially identified in the project scope. This has included the delineation of the wetlands and the coordinating and submitting of the Corp of Engineers permit and associated documentation. The cost for these work items is estimated at \$45,536.00.

Due to the identification of the wetlands later in the design process, it was necessary to extend the project completion date until 2019 to allow for the 120 day permit processing allowed for the Corp of Engineers to review and issue the 404 permit for a "site specific" location versus the typical approval under a nationwide permit application for smaller environmental impacts. Due to this extended project completion date, additional administration and inspection services will be required from KLJ into the 2019 construction season along with added geotechnical services, which have and will be necessary for permitting and project completion. The cost for these work items is estimated at \$96,525.00.

The proposed contract amendment #2 provided by KLJ totals \$142,061.00, which is a sufficient amount to cover the additional administrative design costs and the project administration and inspection cost increase of the above identified items.

A letter provided by KLJ Engineering is attached to this memo and spreadsheet with tasks and costs identified.

Recommended Motion:

Approve Contract Amendment #2 with KLJ Engineering in the amount of \$142,061.00 for additional work associated with the additional administrative design costs and the project administration and inspection cost increase as described above. The current contract amount is \$453,568.00 and the requested contract amendment is \$142,061.00, for a new engineering services contract amount of \$595,629.00.

KLJ would like to request a supplement to the agreement for professional services for the reference project. There have been a few items that were not part of the original scope of services, therefore not accounted for in KLJ's initial budget. These items have been outlined below:

Pre-bid Meetings

Two pre-bid meetings were held while the project was out for advertisement. These meetings were to inform give the potential contractors an overview of the project and to answer any questions. KLJ developed a Power Point presentation and hosted the meetings with assistance from the City of Fargo.

Easement Exhibit Coordination

KLJ was requested to create additional multiple easement exhibits for one of the landowners within the project corridor after the original easement exhibits had been submitted. The additional exhibits were required due to landowner concerns of the types of easements that were proposed to be acquired.

Xcel Utility Coordination

KLJ did not anticipate the level of effort that has been required for the Xcel gas lines along the east side of the project. KLJ has held multiple meetings and taken part in multiple field visits for this line to ensure that the line gets relocated per the project requirements.

404 Permitting

KLJ completed a wetland delineation, 404 permit application, and coordinated with the USACE and Ducks Unlimited to permit and mitigate impacted wetlands on the project. The wetland impacts caused design revisions to the plans. There will be ongoing coordination with the USACE once the review period for the permit has expired.

Construction Administration

This project was originally scheduled for 2016 construction. The project has been moved to the 2018/2019 construction seasons. With the current project completion dates, a 46-week construction schedule is anticipated with 28 weeks in 2018 and 18 weeks in 2019. KLJ has assumed an average of 40



hours/week of inspection time in 2018 and an average of 10 hours/week for 2019. KLJ has revised our hours to account for these assumed hours. Braun Intertec has also requested additional compensation for materials testing. Their original estimate was based on the preliminary layout provided in the project RFP. The final project design varies slightly from what was originally shown. Please see their attached revised proposal.

The above work items will increase the contract from \$453,568 to **\$595,629**. Please below cost summary for a breakdown of the proposed costs.

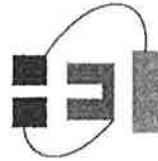

This memo serves as our recommendation for a Contract Time Extension for Project FM-14-61 Drain 27 – Prairie Rose Area Flood Risk Management Project (40th Avenue South Floodwall Project). Based on Change Order No. 10, the sidewalk replacement was to be completed by July 15th, 2018, but rain has hampered the installation process.

The attached time extension request dated July 13th from the Contractor requests the new completion date be pushed back an additional 15 working days. The Contractor supplied a list of days that rain had delayed the construction activities, and our RPR has verified the days listed in the attached time extension letter as to be accurate.

The 40th avenue sidewalk corridor is heavily traveled by school age children to reach Centennial Elementary School and the Discovery Middle school to the east of the project. This time extension request has the final concrete sidewalk replacement installed prior to school being back in session, which was a major driver to construction schedules during the original sidewalk construction.

In summary, based on these facts, we recommend that the final completion date for the sidewalk installation be adjusted to August 3rd, 2018.

THIS CONTRACT, is made this 26 day of July, 2018, by and between the City of Fargo, North Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and Glenn's Body Repair, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor".

WHEREAS, the City is in need of repairs and the Contractor agrees to provide such services according to the terms of this Contract; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Contractor wish to set forth the procedures, conditions and agreements between the parties; and

4. PRICE

The City agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to receive and accept payment in accordance with the prices proposed for the unit items as set forth in the conformed copy of the Proposal, which prices shall conform to those in the accepted Proposal. Payments will be made as provided in the Specifications.

5. ATTACHMENTS

The Contract consists of the following component parts, all of which are fully a part of this Contract as if herein set out verbatim, or if not attached, as if hereto attached, to wit:

1. Advertisement for Proposals dated March 19th, 2018 (Exhibit B);
2. Request for Proposals for Body Repair Services dated April 6th, 2018 (Exhibit C);
3. All Addendums and Attachments identified in the Request for Proposal (not specified below), if any (Exhibit D); and
4. Contractor Price Proposal Summary dated April 4th, 2018(Exhibit A).

6. STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDING

Not Applicable

7. MODIFICATIONS

Both parties will abide by all provisions set out within and agreed upon and detailed within the Proposal, Specifications and all Attachments. Any changes to the provisions of this Contract must be made with a written document that is signed by both parties.

8. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The Contractor, by submission of its Proposal, assures the City that it will comply with, and be bound by, all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and ordinances.

9. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The Contractor, as a recipient of City funds, must not discriminate against any worker, employee, applicant, or any member of the public because of race, color, sex, gender, sexual orientation, religion, age, marital status, national origin, veterans status, physical or mental disability or perceived disability, public assistance status, or other criteria protected by law.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

Said indemnification will include, inter alia, attorneys' fees, damages, whether punitive, economic or compensatory, and costs and disbursements. However, this paragraph will not apply to suits against the City arising out of the City's negligence or intentional acts, or those of its employees, agents or designees.

11. LICENSURE & INSURANCE

The Contractor must be properly licensed to do business in Fargo during the entire term of this Contract. The Contractor must maintain the appropriate Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance and must annually provide the City with a Certificate of Liability Insurance describing the limits of coverage and naming the City of Fargo as an additional insured party. By signing this Contract, the Contractor certifies that it will maintain the specified coverage during the entire term of the Contract. The City will require annual proof of proper licensure and insurance to be submitted to the City no later than June 30th in each year of the contract. Any Cancellation Policy statement must read: "Should any of the above described policies be canceled or modified before the expiration date thereof, the issuing company will mail forty-five (45) calendar days written

notice to the certificate holder named as the additional insured, but shall impose no obligation or liability of any kind upon the company, its agents, or representatives.”

12. GOVERNING LAW.

This Contract has been made and entered into under the laws of the State of North Dakota, and said laws will control its interpretation. The parties agree the venue for any litigation arising out of this Contract will be in state District Court within Cass County, North Dakota, and the parties waive any objection to personal jurisdiction.

13. SUBCONTRACTORS

Subcontractors are not permitted under this Contract.

14. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- a) The City reserves the right to terminate this agreement for cause by written notices to the Contractor. Cause for termination will be documented failure(s) of the Contractor to provide services in the quantity and/or quality required by the agreement. Contractor will, within ten (10) days, correct the failure or present the City with a plan to correct the failure. In the event Contractor does not correct failure or complete its plan to correct failure, then the City may terminate this agreement by notifying Contractor of date of termination. Said termination shall not diminish the City of Fargo’s rights under law or equity.
- b) This Contract may be terminated for cause by either party upon seven (7) days’ written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform through no fault of the terminating party.
- c) In the event of any termination, City of Fargo shall pay the agreed rate only for services delivered up to the date of termination. City of Fargo has no obligation to Contractor, of any kind, after the date of termination.

15. SEVERABILITY

In the event any provision of the contract is declared or determined to be unlawful, invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect, in any manner, the legality of the remaining provisions of the contract and each provision of the contract will be and is deemed to be separate and severable from each other provision.

1. INTENT

This Request for Proposal (RFP) is being published by the City of Fargo for the purpose of selecting a vendor or vendors to perform Body/Collision repair on vehicles and equipment operated by the City of Fargo.

2. PROPOSER

The Proposer must fill out the correct Questionnaire and Bid Sheet for each type of vehicle for which they are submitting a proposal.

3. PROPOSAL

All proposals submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the RFP shall be binding upon the proposer for at least **ninety (90)** calendar days after the proposal opening.

4. BID OPENING

There will not be a public opening since this is not a Low Bid Award but is instead a Request for Proposal. All proposals will be reviewed by the selection committee.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PROPOSAL INFORMATION

Each proposal and supporting documents must be submitted in or under cover of a sealed envelope to provide confidentiality of the proposal information prior to the proposal opening. During the selection period, all proposals will be confidential.

6. CITY OF FARGO RIGHTS

The City reserves the right to cancel this RFP in writing or postpone the date and time for submitting proposals at any time prior to the proposal due date. The City by this RFP does not promise to accept the lowest cost or any other proposal and specifically reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to waive any formal proposal requirements, to investigate the qualifications and experience of any Proposer, to reject any provisions in any proposal, to modify RFP contents, to obtain new proposals, to negotiate the requested services and contract terms with any Proposer, or to proceed to do the work otherwise.

The Proposer waives any claim for the return of its proposal security if, on account of errors or omissions claimed to have been made by it in its proposal or for any other reason it should refuse or fail to execute the contract.

23. INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION

- b) **Race, Color, Religion, National Origin, Sex.** In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq., and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor,"

41 C.F.R. chapter 60, and Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity in Federal Employment," September 24, 1965, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note, as amended by any later Executive Order that amends or supersedes it, referenced in 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note. The Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, or sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity). Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, promotion, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

- c) Age. In accordance with the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 621-634, U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (U.S. EEOC) regulations, "Age Discrimination in Employment Act," 29 C.F.R. part 1625, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 6101 *et seq.*, U.S. Health and Human Services regulations, "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Age in Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance," 45 C.F.R. part 90, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- d) Disabilities. In accordance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 *et seq.*, the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 4151 *et seq.*, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against individuals on the basis of disability. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

6. TERMINATION PROVISIONS

- a) The City reserves the right to terminate this agreement for cause by written notices to the Contractor. Cause for termination will be documented failure(s) of the Contractor to provide services in the quantity and/or quality required by the agreement. Contractor will, within ten (10) days, correct the failure or present the City with a plan to correct the failure. In the event Contractor does not correct failure or complete its plan to correct failure, then the City may terminate this agreement by notifying Contractor of date of termination. Said termination shall not diminish the City of Fargo's rights under law or equity.
- b) This Contract may be terminated for cause by either party upon seven (7) days' written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform through no fault of the terminating party.
- c) In the event of any termination, City of Fargo shall pay the agreed rate only for services delivered up to the date of termination. City of Fargo has no obligation to Contractor, of any kind, after the date of termination.

7. DISADVANTAGED AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

The contractor, subrecipient or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate, which may include, but is not limited to:

- a) Withholding monthly progress payments;
- b) Assessing sanctions;
- c) Liquidated damages; and/or
- d) Disqualifying the contractor from future bidding as non-responsible. 49 C.F.R. § 26.13(b).

Further, recipients must establish a contract clause to require prime contractors to pay subcontractors for satisfactory performance of their contracts no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment the recipient makes to the prime contractor. 49 C.F.R. § 26.29(a). Finally, for contracts with defined DBE contract goals, each FTA recipient must include in each prime contract a provision stating that the contractor shall utilize the specific DBEs listed unless the contractor obtains the recipient's written consent; and that, unless the recipient's consent is provided, the contractor shall not be entitled to any payment for work or material unless it is performed or supplied by the listed DBE. 49 C.F.R. § 26.53(f) (1).

In connection with the performance of this service, the Contractor will cooperate with the City of Fargo in the utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises including women-owned business enterprises for the duration of the contract and will use its best efforts to insure that disadvantaged business enterprises have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work. In order to insure that a fair proportion of the purchases of supplies and services is placed with disadvantaged business enterprises, the Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to identify disadvantaged business firms, solicit bids or quotations from them for supplies and services related to this proposal.

The Contractor agrees to meet any goals established by City of Fargo for purchases pertaining to this Contract to the best of the Contractor's ability and will provide the City of Fargo with the necessary certification and records for reporting purposes. When the majority of the contract is labor, which is not a contracting opportunity, DBE goals will not be set but Contractors are encouraged to use DBE businesses.

The CONTRACTOR will be required to report its DBE participation obtained through race-neutral means throughout the period of performance.

The contractor must promptly notify the City of Fargo whenever a DBE subcontractor performing work related to this contract is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work. The contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of the City of Fargo.

The City of Fargo has established a small business element to its DBE program, pursuant to 49 CFR 26.39. This program aims to provide opportunities and foster small business enterprises (SBE)/participation in contracting with the City of Fargo. 8. INCORPORATION OF FTA TERMS

- a) The preceding provision includes, in part, certain Standard Terms and Conditions required by DOT, whether or not expressly set forth in the preceding contract provisions. 9. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, INELIGIBILITY AND VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION

The Contractor shall comply and facilitate compliance with U.S. DOT regulations, "Nonprocurement Suspension and Debarment," 2 C.F.R. part 1200, which adopts and supplements the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (U.S. OMB) "Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement)," 2 C.F.R. part 180. These provisions apply to each contract at any tier of \$25,000 or more, and to each contract at any tier for a federally required audit (irrespective of the contract amount), and to each contract at any tier that must be approved by an FTA official irrespective of the contract amount. As such, the Contractor shall verify that its principals, affiliates, and subcontractors are eligible to participate in this federally funded contract and are not presently declared by any Federal department or agency to be:

- a) Debarred from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- b) Suspended from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- c) Proposed for debarment from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- d) Declared ineligible to participate in any federally assisted Award;
- e) Voluntarily excluded from participation in any federally assisted Award; or
- f) Disqualified from participation in any federally assisted Award.

By signing and submitting its bid or proposal, the bidder or proposer certifies as follows: The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact relied upon by the AGENCY. If it is later determined by the AGENCY that the bidder or proposer knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to remedies available to the AGENCY, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment. The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. part 180, subpart C, as supplemented by 2 C.F.R. part 1200, while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

10. BREACH OF CONTRACT AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a) Disputes

Disputes arising in the performance of this Contract which are not resolved by agreement of the parties shall be decided in writing by the authorized representative of the City, the City Administrator. This decision shall be final and conclusive unless within ten (10) calendar days from the date of receipt of its copy, the Contractor mails or otherwise furnishes a written appeal to the Fargo City Commission, 200 N 3rd Street, Fargo, ND 58102. A hearing will be scheduled with the Fargo City Commission at the next regularly scheduled meeting. In connection with any such appeal, the Contractor shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of its position at said hearing. The decision of the Fargo City Commission shall be binding upon the Contractor and the Contractor shall abide by the decision.

b) Performance During Dispute

Unless otherwise directed by the City, Contractor shall continue performance under this Contract while matters in dispute are being resolved.

c) Claims of Damages

Should either party to the Contract suffer injury or damage to person or property because of any act or omission of the party or of any of his employees, agents or others for whose acts he is legally liable, a claim for damages therefore shall be made in writing to such other party within a reasonable time after the first observance of such injury of damage.

d) Remedies

Unless this contract provides otherwise, all claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question between the City and the Contractor arising out of or relating to this agreement or its breach will be decided by arbitration if the parties mutually agree, or in a court of competent jurisdiction within the State of North Dakota.

e) Rights and Remedies

The duties and obligations imposed by this Agreement/Contract and the rights and remedies available thereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation of any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law. No action or failure to act by the City or Contractor shall constitute a waiver of any right or duty afforded any of them under the Contract, nor shall any such action or failure to act constitute an approval of or acquiescence in any breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.

11. LOBBYING RESTRICTIONS

The Proposer certifies that:

- a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Proposer, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned

shall complete and submit Standard Form -LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

- c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-contracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreement) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure

12. CLEAN AIR AND FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT

The Contractor agrees:

- a) It will not use any violating facilities;
- b) It will report the use of facilities placed on or likely to be placed on the U.S. EPA "List of Violating Facilities;"
- c) It will report violations of use of prohibited facilities to FTA; and

14. SUBSTANCE ABUSE REQUIREMENTS: DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

The Contractor agrees to establish and implement a drug and alcohol testing program that complies with 49 C.F.R. part 655, produce any documentation necessary to establish its compliance with part 655, and permit any authorized representative of the United States Department of Transportation or its operating administrations, the State Oversight Agency of North Dakota or the City of Fargo, to inspect the facilities and records associated with the implementation of the drug and alcohol testing program as required under 49 C.F.R. part 655 and review the testing process. 15. ENERGY CONSERVATION

- a) Contractor shall recognize mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 USC Section 6321 et seq).

16. SAFE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

a) Seat Belt Use

The Contractor is encouraged to adopt and promote on-the-job seat belt use policies and programs for its employees and other personnel that operate company-owned vehicles, company-rented vehicles, or personally operated vehicles. The terms "company-owned" and "company-leased" refer to vehicles owned or leased either by the Contractor or AGENCY.

b) Distracted Driving

The Contractor agrees to adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers, including policies to ban text messaging while using an electronic device supplied by an employer, and driving a vehicle the driver owns or rents, a vehicle Contractor owns, leases, or rents, or a privately-owned vehicle when on official business in connection with the work performed under this agreement.

17. DAVIS-BACON ACT AND COPELAND ACT – PREVAILING WAGE AND ANTI-KICKBACK

THIS CONTRACT, is made this 26 day of July, 2018, by and between the City of Fargo, North Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and Glenn's Body Repair, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor".

WHEREAS, the City is in need of transit fleet body repairs and the Contractor agrees to provide such services according to the terms of this Contract; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Transit Administration may be providing federal operating assistance for this project in an estimated expected amount not to exceed 50 percent; the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 20.507; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Contractor wish to set forth the procedures, conditions and agreements between the parties; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED for good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged:

1. THE WORK

The work under this contract will include transit vehicle body repair services for the City's MATBUS system and heavy duty vehicle body repair for the city fleet. Tasks will include repairing of body damage to heavy duty and light duty transit vehicles and heavy duty city fleet vehicles.

2. TERM

The Contractor covenants and agrees that it will commence and continue the work during the period from August 1, 2018, through July 31, 2021, and will have completed the work in every aspect to the satisfaction and approval of the City.

3. MATERIALS

The Contractor hereby agrees to furnish all materials (except such as are to be furnished by the City), all necessary tools and equipment, and to do and perform all the work and labor, for the price and compensation set forth and specified in the proposal signed by the Contractor and hereto attached as Exhibit A and hereby made a part of this Contract (the "Proposal"), said work to be done and performed in accordance with the Specifications on file in the office of the City which Specifications are hereby made a part of this Contract.

4. PRICE

The City agrees to pay and the Contractor agrees to receive and accept payment in accordance with the prices proposed for the unit items as set forth in the conformed copy of the Proposal, which prices shall conform to those in the accepted Proposal. Payments will be made as provided in the Specifications.

5. ATTACHMENTS

The Contract consists of the following component parts, all of which are fully a part of this Contract as if herein set out verbatim, or if not attached, as if hereto attached, to wit:

1. Advertisement for Proposals dated March 19th, 2018 (Exhibit B);
2. Request for Proposals for Body Repair Services dated April 6th, 2018(Exhibit C):
3. All Addendums and Attachments identified in the Request for Proposal (not specified below), if any (Exhibit D); and
4. Contractor Price Proposal Summary with Signed Certifications dated April 4th, 2018 (Exhibit A).

6. STATE AND FEDERAL FUNDING

It is understood that the validity of this Contract between the City and the Contractor is contingent upon the receipt by the City of State and Federal funding for the operating deficit of the transit system during the time period specified herein. It is further understood that any reduction or loss of State or Federal funding for the operations of the transit system shall be cause for the City, upon thirty (30) days written notification to the Contractor, to terminate this Contract.

7. MODIFICATIONS

Both parties will abide by all provisions set out within and agreed upon and detailed within the Proposal, Specifications and all Attachments. Any changes to the provisions of this Contract must be made with a written document that is signed by both parties.

8. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The Contractor, by submission of its Proposal, assures the City that it will comply with, and be bound by, all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and ordinances.

9. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The Contractor, as a recipient of City funds, must not discriminate against any worker, employee, applicant, or any member of the public because of race, color, sex, gender, sexual orientation, religion, age, marital status, national origin, veterans status, physical or mental disability or perceived disability, public assistance status, or other criteria protected by law.

10. INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor will hold harmless, indemnify and defend the City from any and all claims arising out of or in any way related to the work under this Contract. Said indemnification will include, inter alia, attorneys' fees, damages, whether punitive, economic or compensatory, and costs and disbursements. However, this paragraph will not apply to suits against the City arising out of the City's negligence or intentional acts, or those of its employees, agents or designees.

11. LICENSURE & INSURANCE

The Contractor must be properly licensed to do business in Fargo during the entire term of this Contract. The Contractor must maintain the appropriate Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance and must annually provide the City with a Certificate of Liability Insurance describing the limits of coverage and naming the City of Fargo as an additional insured party. By signing this Contract, the Contractor certifies that it will

maintain the specified coverage during the entire term of the Contract. The City will require annual proof of proper licensure and insurance to be submitted to the City no later than June 30th in each year of the contract. Any Cancellation Policy statement must read: "Should any of the above described policies be canceled or modified before the expiration date thereof, the issuing company will mail forty-five (45) calendar days written notice to the certificate holder named as the additional insured, but shall impose no obligation or liability of any kind upon the company, its agents, or representatives."

12. GOVERNING LAW

This Contract has been made and entered into under the laws of the State of North Dakota, and said laws will control its interpretation. The parties agree the venue for any litigation arising out of this Contract will be in state District Court within Cass County, North Dakota, and the parties waive any objection to personal jurisdiction.

13. SUBCONTRACTORS

Subcontractors are not permitted under this Contract.

14. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

This contract may be terminable at will by either party after giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

15. SEVERABILITY

In the event any provisions or part of this Contract is found to be invalid or unenforceable, only that particular provision or part so found, and not the entire Contract, will be inoperative.

The date of commencement of the Contractor's performance shall be the date of signature by the City of Fargo, North Dakota authorized personnel or August 1, 2018, whichever event occurs later.

2. PROPOSER

The Proposer must fill out the correct Questionnaire and Bid Sheet for each type of vehicle for which they are submitting a proposal.

3. PROPOSAL

All proposals submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the RFP shall be binding upon the proposer for at least **ninety (90)** calendar days after the proposal opening.

4. BID OPENING

There will not be a public opening since this is not a Low Bid Award but is instead a Request for Proposal. All proposals will be reviewed by the selection committee.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PROPOSAL INFORMATION

Each proposal and supporting documents must be submitted in or under cover of a sealed envelope to provide confidentiality of the proposal information prior to the proposal opening. During the selection period, all proposals will be confidential.

6. CITY OF FARGO RIGHTS

25. TERM OF AGREEMENT:

This Agreement shall extend for a term of thirty-six (36) months commencing on the date signed by the parties. Upon the expiration of the term of this Agreement, or any renewal thereof, the Agreement shall continue in full force on a month-to-month basis and may be cancelled by either party upon the giving of ninety (90) days written notice to the other party. In the event that this Agreement continues on a month-to-month basis and any party to this agreement desires to modify or alter the agreement, such party must provide the other party with sixty (60) days notice of such modification/amendment. The other party shall have thirty (30) days thereafter to provide notice of its intent to cancel the Agreement or during the 30-day period, enter into a mutually agreeable modification of this Agreement.

Applicable Federal Clauses for Attachment #3

Only to the extent any of the following sections are applicable to a contract of the nature herein contemplated, the following shall apply:

1. NO GOVERNMENT OBLIGATION TO THIRD PARTIES

- a) The Purchaser and Contractor acknowledge and agree that, notwithstanding any concurrence by the Federal Government in or approval of the solicitation or award of the underlying contract, absent the express written consent by the Federal Government, the Federal Government is not a party to this contract and shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities to the Purchaser, Contractor, or any other party (whether or not a party to that contract) pertaining to any matter resulting from the underlying contract.

- b) The Contractor agrees to include the above clause in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clause shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to its provisions.

2. PROGRAM FRAUD & FALSE OR FRAUDULENT STATEMENTS & RELATED ACTS

- a) The Contractor acknowledges that the provisions of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986, as amended, 31 U.S.C. 3801 *et seq.* and U.S. DOT regulations, Program Fraud Civil Remedies, 49 C.F.R. Part 31, apply to its actions pertaining to this Project. Upon execution of the underlying contract, the Contractor certifies or affirms the truthfulness and accuracy of any statement it has made, it makes, it may make, or cause to be made, pertaining to the underlying contract or the FTA assisted project for which this contract work is being performed. In addition to other penalties that may be applicable, the Contractor further acknowledges that if it makes, or causes to be made, a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission or certification, the Federal Government reserves the right to impose the penalties of the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 on the Contractor to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.

- b) The Contractor also acknowledges that if it makes, or causes to be made, a false, fictitious, or fraudulent claim, statement, submission, or certification to the Federal Government under a contract connected with a project that is financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance originally awarded by FTA under the authority of 49 U.S.C. chapter 53, the Government reserves the right to impose the penalties of 18 U.S.C. 1001 and 49 U.S.C. § 5323(1) on the Contractor, to the extent the Federal Government deems appropriate.

- c) The Contractor agrees to include the above two clauses in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clauses shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to the provisions.

3. ACCESS TO RECORDS AND REPORTS

- a) Record Retention. The Contractor will retain, and will require its subcontractors of all tiers to retain, complete and readily accessible records related in whole or in part to the contract, including, but not limited to, data, documents, reports, statistics, sub-agreements, leases, subcontracts, arrangements, other third party agreements of any type, and supporting materials related to those records.
- b) Retention Period. The Contractor agrees to comply with the record retention requirements in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.333. The Contractor shall maintain all books, records, accounts and reports required under this Contract for a period of at not less than three (3) years after the date of termination or expiration of this Contract, except in the event of litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this Contract, in which case records shall be maintained until the disposition of all such litigation, appeals, claims or exceptions related thereto.
- c) Access to Records. The Contractor agrees to provide sufficient access to FTA and its contractors to inspect and audit records and information related to performance of this contract as reasonably may be required.
- d) Access to the Sites of Performance. The Contractor agrees to permit FTA and its contractors access to the sites of performance under this contract as reasonably may be required.

4. FEDERAL CHANGES

- a) Contractor shall at all times comply with all applicable FTA regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including without limitation those listed directly or by reference in the Master Agreement between Purchaser and FTA, and they may be amended or promulgated from time to time during the term of this contract. Contractor's failure to so comply shall constitute a material breach of this contract.

5. CIVIL RIGHTS AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The City of Fargo is an Equal Opportunity Employer. As such, the City of Fargo agrees to comply with all applicable Federal civil rights laws and implementing regulations. Apart from inconsistent requirements imposed by Federal laws or regulations, the City of Fargo agrees to comply with the requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 5323(h) (3) by not using any Federal assistance awarded by FTA to support procurements using exclusionary or discriminatory specifications.

Under this Agreement, the Contractor shall at all times comply with the following requirements and shall include these requirements in each subcontract entered into as part thereof.

- a) Nondiscrimination. In accordance with Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, or age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal implementing regulations and other implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- b) Race, Color, Religion, National Origin, Sex. In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq., and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor,"

41 C.F.R. chapter 60, and Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity in Federal Employment," September 24, 1965, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note, as amended by any later Executive Order that amends or supersedes it, referenced in 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note. The Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, or sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity). Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, promotion, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

- c) Age. In accordance with the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 621-634, U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (U.S. EEOC) regulations, "Age Discrimination in Employment Act," 29 C.F.R. part 1625, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 6101 *et seq.*, U.S. Health and Human Services regulations, "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Age in Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance," 45 C.F.R. part 90, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- d) Disabilities. In accordance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 *et seq.*, the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 4151 *et seq.*, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against individuals on the basis of disability. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

6. TERMINATION PROVISIONS

- a) The City reserves the right to terminate this agreement for cause by written notices to the Contractor. Cause for termination will be documented failure(s) of the Contractor to provide services in the quantity and/or quality required by the agreement. Contractor will, within ten (10) days, correct the failure or present the City with a plan to correct the failure. In the event Contractor does not correct failure or complete its plan to correct failure, then the City may terminate this agreement by notifying Contractor of date of termination. Said termination shall not diminish the City of Fargo's rights under law or equity.
- b) This Contract may be terminated for cause by either party upon seven (7) days' written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform through no fault of the terminating party.
- c) In the event of any termination, City of Fargo shall pay the agreed rate only for services delivered up to the date of termination. City of Fargo has no obligation to Contractor, of any kind, after the date of termination.

7. DISADVANTAGED AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

The contractor, subrecipient or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate, which may include, but is not limited to:

- a) Withholding monthly progress payments;
- b) Assessing sanctions;
- c) Liquidated damages; and/or
- d) Disqualifying the contractor from future bidding as non-responsible. 49 C.F.R. § 26.13(b).

Further, recipients must establish a contract clause to require prime contractors to pay subcontractors for satisfactory performance of their contracts no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment the recipient makes to the prime contractor. 49 C.F.R. § 26.29(a). Finally, for contracts with defined DBE contract goals, each FTA recipient must include in each prime contract a provision stating that the contractor shall utilize the specific DBEs listed unless the contractor obtains the recipient's written consent; and that, unless the recipient's consent is provided, the contractor shall not be entitled to any payment for work or material unless it is performed or supplied by the listed DBE. 49 C.F.R. § 26.53(f) (1).

In connection with the performance of this service, the Contractor will cooperate with the City of Fargo in the utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises including women-owned business enterprises for the duration of the contract and will use its best efforts to insure that disadvantaged business enterprises have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work. In order to insure that a fair proportion of the purchases of supplies and services is placed with disadvantaged business enterprises, the Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to identify disadvantaged business firms, solicit bids or quotations from them for supplies and services related to this proposal.

The Contractor agrees to meet any goals established by City of Fargo for purchases pertaining to this Contract to the best of the Contractor's ability and will provide the City of Fargo with the necessary certification and records for reporting purposes. When the majority of the contract is labor, which is not a contracting opportunity, DBE goals will not be set but Contractors are encouraged to use DBE businesses.

The CONTRACTOR will be required to report its DBE participation obtained through race-neutral means throughout the period of performance.

The contractor must promptly notify the City of Fargo whenever a DBE subcontractor performing work related to this contract is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work. The contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of the City of Fargo.

Fostering Small Business Participation

The City of Fargo has established a small business element to its DBE program, pursuant to 49 CFR 26.39. This program aims to provide opportunities and foster small business enterprises (SBE)/participation in contracting with the City of Fargo. This program is race- and gender-neutral, however SBEs can also count towards DBE goals.

8. INCORPORATION OF FTA TERMS

- a) The preceding provision includes, in part, certain Standard Terms and Conditions required by DOT, whether or not expressly set forth in the preceding contract provisions. All contractual provisions required by DOT, as set forth in FTA Circular 4220.1 (as amended), are hereby incorporated by reference. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, all FTA mandated terms shall be deemed to control in the event of a conflict with other provisions contained in this Agreement. The Contractor shall not perform any act, fail to perform any act, or refuse to comply with any City of Fargo requests which would cause City of Fargo to be in violation of the FTA terms and conditions.

9. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, INELIGIBILITY AND VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION

The Contractor shall comply and facilitate compliance with U.S. DOT regulations, "Nonprocurement Suspension and Debarment," 2 C.F.R. part 1200, which adopts and supplements the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (U.S. OMB) "Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement)," 2 C.F.R. part 180. These provisions apply to each contract at any tier of \$25,000 or more, and to each contract at any tier for a federally required audit (irrespective of the contract amount), and to each contract at any tier that must be approved by an FTA official irrespective of the contract amount. As such, the Contractor shall verify that its principals, affiliates, and subcontractors are eligible to participate in this federally funded contract and are not presently declared by any Federal department or agency to be:

- a) Debarred from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- b) Suspended from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- c) Proposed for debarment from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- d) Declared ineligible to participate in any federally assisted Award;
- e) Voluntarily excluded from participation in any federally assisted Award; or
- f) Disqualified from participation in any federally assisted Award.

By signing and submitting its bid or proposal, the bidder or proposer certifies as follows: The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact relied upon by the AGENCY. If it is later determined by the AGENCY that the bidder or proposer knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to remedies available to the AGENCY, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment. The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. part 180, subpart C, as supplemented by 2 C.F.R. part 1200, while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

10. BREACH OF CONTRACT AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a) Disputes

Disputes arising in the performance of this Contract which are not resolved by agreement of the parties shall be decided in writing by the authorized representative of the City, the City Administrator. This decision shall be final and conclusive unless within ten (10) calendar days from the date of receipt of its copy, the Contractor mails or otherwise furnishes a written appeal to the Fargo City Commission, 200 N 3rd Street, Fargo, ND 58102. A hearing will be scheduled with the Fargo City Commission at the next regularly scheduled meeting. In connection with any such appeal, the Contractor shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of its position at said hearing. The decision of the Fargo City Commission shall be binding upon the Contractor and the Contractor shall abide by the decision.

b) Performance During Dispute

Unless otherwise directed by the City, Contractor shall continue performance under this Contract while matters in dispute are being resolved.

c) Claims of Damages

Should either party to the Contract suffer injury or damage to person or property because of any act or omission of the party or of any of his employees, agents or others for whose acts he is legally liable, a claim for damages therefore shall be made in writing to such other party within a reasonable time after the first observance of such injury of damage.

d) Remedies

Unless this contract provides otherwise, all claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question between the City and the Contractor arising out of or relating to this agreement or its breach will be decided by arbitration if the parties mutually agree, or in a court of competent jurisdiction within the State of North Dakota.

e) Rights and Remedies

The duties and obligations imposed by this Agreement/Contract and the rights and remedies available thereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation of any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law. No action or failure to act by the City or Contractor shall constitute a waiver of any right or duty afforded any of them under the Contract, nor shall any such action or failure to act constitute an approval of or acquiescence in any breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.

11. LOBBYING RESTRICTIONS

The Proposer certifies that:

- a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Proposer, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned

shall complete and submit Standard Form -LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

- c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-contracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreement) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure

12. CLEAN AIR AND FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT

The Contractor agrees:

- a) It will not use any violating facilities;
- b) It will report the use of facilities placed on or likely to be placed on the U.S. EPA "List of Violating Facilities;"
- c) It will report violations of use of prohibited facilities to FTA; and
- d) It will comply with the inspection and other requirements of the Clean Air Act, as amended, (42 U.S.C. §§ 7401 – 7671q); and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended, (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251-1387).

13. CONTRACT WORK HOURS & SAFETY STANDARDS ACT

- a) The Contractor shall comply with all federal laws, regulations, and requirements providing wage and hour protections for non-construction employees, in accordance with 40 U.S.C. § 3702, Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, and other relevant parts of that Act, 40 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq., and U.S. DOL regulations, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction (also Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Non-construction Contracts Subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act)," 29 C.F.R. part 5.
- b) The Contractor shall maintain payrolls and basic payroll records during the course of the work and shall preserve them for a period of three (3) years from the completion of the contract for all laborers and mechanics, including guards and watchmen, working on the contract. Such records shall contain the name and address of each such employee, social security number, correct classifications, hourly rates of wages paid, daily and weekly number of hours worked, deductions made, and actual wages paid.
- c) Such records maintained under this paragraph shall be made available by the Contractor for inspection, copying, or transcription by authorized representatives of the FTA and the Department of Labor, and the Contractor will permit such representatives to interview employees during working hours on the job.
- d) The contractor shall require the inclusion of the language of this clause within subcontracts of all tiers.

14. SUBSTANCE ABUSE REQUIREMENTS: DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

The Contractor agrees to establish and implement a drug and alcohol testing program that complies with 49 C.F.R. part 655, produce any documentation necessary to establish its compliance with part 655, and permit any authorized representative of the United States Department of Transportation or its operating administrations, the State Oversight Agency of North Dakota or the City of Fargo, to inspect the facilities and records associated with the implementation of the drug and alcohol testing program as required under 49 C.F.R. part 655 and review the testing process. The Contractor agrees further to certify annually its compliance with part 655 before the start of the contract period and to submit the Management Information System (MIS) reports before the start of the contract to the City of Fargo Fleet Manager. To certify compliance, the Contractor shall use the "Substance Abuse Certifications" in the "Annual List of Certifications and Assurances for Federal Transit Administration Grants and Cooperative Agreements," which is published annually in the *Federal Register*.

15. ENERGY CONSERVATION

- a) Contractor shall recognize mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 USC Section 6321 et seq).

16. SAFE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

- a) Seat Belt Use

The Contractor is encouraged to adopt and promote on-the-job seat belt use policies and programs for its employees and other personnel that operate company-owned vehicles, company-rented vehicles, or personally operated vehicles. The terms "company-owned" and "company-leased" refer to vehicles owned or leased either by the Contractor or AGENCY.

- b) Distracted Driving

The Contractor agrees to adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers, including policies to ban text messaging while using an electronic device supplied by an employer, and driving a vehicle the driver owns or rents, a vehicle Contractor owns, leases, or rents, or a privately-owned vehicle when on official business in connection with the work performed under this agreement.

17. DAVIS-BACON ACT AND COPELAND ACT – PREVAILING WAGE AND ANTI-KICKBACK

For all prime construction, alteration or repair contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by FTA, the Contractor shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Act and the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act. Under 49 U.S.C. § 5333(a), prevailing wage protections apply to laborers and mechanics employed on FTA assisted construction, alteration, or repair projects. The Contractor will comply with the Davis-Bacon Act, 40 U.S.C. §§ 3141-3144, and 3146-3148 as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 5, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Governing Federally Financed and Assisted Construction." In accordance with the statute, the Contractor shall pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, the Contractor agrees to pay wages not less than once a week. The Contractor shall also comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. § 3145), as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work

Financed in Whole or in part by Loans or Grants from the United States." The Contractor is prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled.

This Request for Proposal (RFP) is being published by the City of Fargo for the purpose of selecting a vendor or vendors to perform Body/Collision repair on vehicles and equipment operated by the City of Fargo.

2. PROPOSER

The Proposer must fill out the correct Questionnaire and Bid Sheet for each type of vehicle for which they are submitting a proposal.

3. PROPOSAL

All proposals submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the RFP shall be binding upon the proposer for at least **ninety (90)** calendar days after the proposal opening.

4. BID OPENING

There will not be a public opening since this is not a Low Bid Award but is instead a Request for Proposal. All proposals will be reviewed by the selection committee.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PROPOSAL INFORMATION

Each proposal and supporting documents must be submitted in or under cover of a sealed envelope to provide confidentiality of the proposal information prior to the proposal opening. During the selection period, all proposals will be confidential.

6. CITY OF FARGO RIGHTS

The City reserves the right to cancel this RFP in writing or postpone the date and time for submitting proposals at any time prior to the proposal due date. The City by this RFP does not promise to accept the lowest cost or any other proposal and specifically reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to waive any formal proposal requirements, to investigate the qualifications and experience of any Proposer, to reject any provisions in any proposal, to modify RFP contents, to obtain new proposals, to negotiate the requested services and contract terms with any Proposer, or to proceed to do the work otherwise.

16. ASSIGNMENT/TRANSFER OF INTERESTS

There shall be no assignment/transfer of interests or delegation of Contractor's rights, duties or responsibilities of Contractor under the contract derived from this RFP without the prior written approval of the City, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. 22. WAIVER

The Proposer waives any claim for the return of its proposal security if, on account of errors or omissions claimed to have been made by it in its proposal or for any other reason it should refuse or fail to execute the contract.

- c) The Contractor agrees to include the above two clauses in each subcontract financed in whole or in part with Federal assistance provided by FTA. It is further agreed that the clauses shall not be modified, except to identify the subcontractor who will be subject to the provisions.

3. ACCESS TO RECORDS AND REPORTS

- a) **Record Retention.** The Contractor will retain, and will require its subcontractors of all tiers to retain, complete and readily accessible records related in whole or in part to the contract, including, but not limited to, data, documents, reports, statistics, sub-agreements, leases, subcontracts, arrangements, other third party agreements of any type, and supporting materials related to those records.
- b) **Retention Period.** The Contractor agrees to comply with the record retention requirements in accordance with 2 C.F.R. § 200.333. The Contractor shall maintain all books, records, accounts and reports required under this Contract for a period of at not less than three (3) years after the date of termination or expiration of this Contract, except in the event of litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this Contract, in which case records shall be maintained until the disposition of all such litigation, appeals, claims or exceptions related thereto.
- c) **Access to Records.** The Contractor agrees to provide sufficient access to FTA and its contractors to inspect and audit records and information related to performance of this contract as reasonably may be required.
- d) **Access to the Sites of Performance.** The Contractor agrees to permit FTA and its contractors access to the sites of performance under this contract as reasonably may be required.

4. FEDERAL CHANGES

- a) Contractor shall at all times comply with all applicable FTA regulations, policies, procedures and directives, including without limitation those listed directly or by reference in the Master Agreement between Purchaser and FTA, and they may be amended or promulgated from time to time during the term of this contract. Contractor's failure to so comply shall constitute a material breach of this contract.

5. CIVIL RIGHTS AND EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The City of Fargo is an Equal Opportunity Employer. As such, the City of Fargo agrees to comply with all applicable Federal civil rights laws and implementing regulations. Apart from inconsistent requirements imposed by Federal laws or regulations, the City of Fargo agrees to comply with the requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 5323(h) (3) by not using any Federal assistance awarded by FTA to support procurements using exclusionary or discriminatory specifications.

Under this Agreement, the Contractor shall at all times comply with the following requirements and shall include these requirements in each subcontract entered into as part thereof.

- a) Nondiscrimination. In accordance with Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, or age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal implementing regulations and other implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- b) Race, Color, Religion, National Origin, Sex. In accordance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq., and Federal transit laws at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable equal employment opportunity requirements of U.S. Department of Labor (U.S. DOL) regulations, "Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs, Equal Employment Opportunity, Department of Labor,"

41 C.F.R. chapter 60, and Executive Order No. 11246, "Equal Employment Opportunity in Federal Employment," September 24, 1965, 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note, as amended by any later Executive Order that amends or supersedes it, referenced in 42 U.S.C. § 2000e note. The Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, or sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity). Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, promotion, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

- c) Age. In accordance with the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, 29 U.S.C. §§ 621-634, U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (U.S. EEOC) regulations, "Age Discrimination in Employment Act," 29 C.F.R. part 1625, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 6101 *et seq.*, U.S. Health and Human Services regulations, "Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Age in Programs or Activities Receiving Federal Financial Assistance," 45 C.F.R. part 90, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees to refrain from discrimination against present and prospective employees for reason of age. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.
- d) Disabilities. In accordance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, 29 U.S.C. § 794, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 *et seq.*, the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 4151 *et seq.*, and Federal transit law at 49 U.S.C. § 5332, the Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against individuals on the basis of disability. In addition, the Contractor agrees to comply with any implementing requirements FTA may issue.

6. TERMINATION PROVISIONS

- a) The City reserves the right to terminate this agreement for cause by written notices to the Contractor. Cause for termination will be documented failure(s) of the Contractor to provide services in the quantity and/or quality required by the agreement. Contractor will, within ten (10) days, correct the failure or present the City with a plan to correct the failure. In the event Contractor does not correct failure or complete its plan to correct failure, then the City may terminate this agreement by notifying Contractor of date of termination. Said termination shall not diminish the City of Fargo's rights under law or equity.
- b) This Contract may be terminated for cause by either party upon seven (7) days' written notice in the event of substantial failure to perform through no fault of the terminating party.
- c) In the event of any termination, City of Fargo shall pay the agreed rate only for services delivered up to the date of termination. City of Fargo has no obligation to Contractor, of any kind, after the date of termination.

7. DISADVANTAGED AND SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

The contractor, subrecipient or subcontractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 C.F.R. part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this contract, which may result in the termination of this contract or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate, which may include, but is not limited to:

- a) Withholding monthly progress payments;
- b) Assessing sanctions;
- c) Liquidated damages; and/or
- d) Disqualifying the contractor from future bidding as non-responsible. 49 C.F.R. § 26.13(b).

Further, recipients must establish a contract clause to require prime contractors to pay subcontractors for satisfactory performance of their contracts no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment the recipient makes to the prime contractor. 49 C.F.R. § 26.29(a). Finally, for contracts with defined DBE contract goals, each FTA recipient must include in each prime contract a provision stating that the contractor shall utilize the specific DBEs listed unless the contractor obtains the recipient's written consent; and that, unless the recipient's consent is provided, the contractor shall not be entitled to any payment for work or material unless it is performed or supplied by the listed DBE. 49 C.F.R. § 26.53(f) (1).

In connection with the performance of this service, the Contractor will cooperate with the City of Fargo in the utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises including women-owned business enterprises for the duration of the contract and will use its best efforts to insure that disadvantaged business enterprises have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work. In order to insure that a fair proportion of the purchases of supplies and services is placed with disadvantaged business enterprises, the Contractor agrees to take affirmative action to identify disadvantaged business firms, solicit bids or quotations from them for supplies and services related to this proposal.

The Contractor agrees to meet any goals established by City of Fargo for purchases pertaining to this Contract to the best of the Contractor's ability and will provide the City of Fargo with the necessary certification and records for reporting purposes. When the majority of the contract is labor, which is not a contracting opportunity, DBE goals will not be set but Contractors are encouraged to use DBE businesses.

The CONTRACTOR will be required to report its DBE participation obtained through race-neutral means throughout the period of performance.

The contractor must promptly notify the City of Fargo whenever a DBE subcontractor performing work related to this contract is terminated or fails to complete its work, and must make good faith efforts to engage another DBE subcontractor to perform at least the same amount of work. The contractor may not terminate any DBE subcontractor and perform that work through its own forces or those of an affiliate without prior written consent of the City of Fargo.

Fostering Small Business Participation

The City of Fargo has established a small business element to its DBE program, pursuant to 49 CFR 26.39. This program aims to provide opportunities and foster small business enterprises (SBE)/participation in contracting with the City of Fargo. This program is race- and gender-neutral, however SBEs can also count towards DBE goals.

8. INCORPORATION OF FTA TERMS

- a) The preceding provision includes, in part, certain Standard Terms and Conditions required by DOT, whether or not expressly set forth in the preceding contract provisions. All contractual provisions required by DOT, as set forth in FTA Circular 4220.1 (as amended), are hereby incorporated by reference. Anything to the contrary herein notwithstanding, all FTA mandated terms shall be deemed to control in the event of a conflict with other provisions contained in this Agreement. The Contractor shall not perform any act, fail to perform any act, or refuse to comply with any City of Fargo requests which would cause City of Fargo to be in violation of the FTA terms and conditions.

9. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, INELIGIBILITY AND VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION

The Contractor shall comply and facilitate compliance with U.S. DOT regulations, "Nonprocurement Suspension and Debarment," 2 C.F.R. part 1200, which adopts and supplements the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (U.S. OMB) "Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement)," 2 C.F.R. part 180. These provisions apply to each contract at any tier of \$25,000 or more, and to each contract at any tier for a federally required audit (irrespective of the contract amount), and to each contract at any tier that must be approved by an FTA official irrespective of the contract amount. As such, the Contractor shall verify that its principals, affiliates, and subcontractors are eligible to participate in this federally funded contract and are not presently declared by any Federal department or agency to be:

- a) Debarred from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- b) Suspended from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- c) Proposed for debarment from participation in any federally assisted Award;
- d) Declared ineligible to participate in any federally assisted Award;
- e) Voluntarily excluded from participation in any federally assisted Award; or
- f) Disqualified from participation in any federally assisted Award.

By signing and submitting its bid or proposal, the bidder or proposer certifies as follows: The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact relied upon by the AGENCY. If it is later determined by the AGENCY that the bidder or proposer knowingly rendered an erroneous certification, in addition to remedies available to the AGENCY, the Federal Government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment. The bidder or proposer agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. part 180, subpart C, as supplemented by 2 C.F.R. part 1200, while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any contract that may arise from this offer. The bidder or proposer further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

10. BREACH OF CONTRACT AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- a) Disputes

Disputes arising in the performance of this Contract which are not resolved by agreement of the parties shall be decided in writing by the authorized representative of the City, the City Administrator. This decision shall be final and conclusive unless within ten (10) calendar days from the date of receipt of its copy, the Contractor mails or otherwise furnishes a written appeal to the Fargo City Commission, 200 N 3rd Street, Fargo, ND 58102. A hearing will be scheduled with the Fargo City Commission at the next regularly scheduled meeting. In connection with any such appeal, the Contractor shall be afforded an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence in support of its position at said hearing. The decision of the Fargo City Commission shall be binding upon the Contractor and the Contractor shall abide by the decision.

b) Performance During Dispute

Unless otherwise directed by the City, Contractor shall continue performance under this Contract while matters in dispute are being resolved.

c) Claims of Damages

Should either party to the Contract suffer injury or damage to person or property because of any act or omission of the party or of any of his employees, agents or others for whose acts he is legally liable, a claim for damages therefore shall be made in writing to such other party within a reasonable time after the first observance of such injury of damage.

d) Remedies

Unless this contract provides otherwise, all claims, counterclaims, disputes and other matters in question between the City and the Contractor arising out of or relating to this agreement or its breach will be decided by arbitration if the parties mutually agree, or in a court of competent jurisdiction within the State of North Dakota.

e) Rights and Remedies

The duties and obligations imposed by this Agreement/Contract and the rights and remedies available thereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation of any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law. No action or failure to act by the City or Contractor shall constitute a waiver of any right or duty afforded any of them under the Contract, nor shall any such action or failure to act constitute an approval of or acquiescence in any breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.

11. LOBBYING RESTRICTIONS

The Proposer certifies that:

- a) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Proposer, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- b) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned

shall complete and submit Standard Form -LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

- c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-contracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreement) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure

12. CLEAN AIR AND FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT

The Contractor agrees:

- a) It will not use any violating facilities;
- b) It will report the use of facilities placed on or likely to be placed on the U.S. EPA "List of Violating Facilities;"
- c) It will report violations of use of prohibited facilities to FTA; and
- d) It will comply with the inspection and other requirements of the Clean Air Act, as amended, (42 U.S.C. §§ 7401 – 7671q); and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended, (33 U.S.C. §§ 1251-1387).

13. CONTRACT WORK HOURS & SAFETY STANDARDS ACT

- a) The Contractor shall comply with all federal laws, regulations, and requirements providing wage and hour protections for non-construction employees, in accordance with 40 U.S.C. § 3702, Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, and other relevant parts of that Act, 40 U.S.C. § 3701 et seq., and U.S. DOL regulations, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction (also Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Non-construction Contracts Subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act)," 29 C.F.R. part 5.
- b) The Contractor shall maintain payrolls and basic payroll records during the course of the work and shall preserve them for a period of three (3) years from the completion of the contract for all laborers and mechanics, including guards and watchmen, working on the contract. Such records shall contain the name and address of each such employee, social security number, correct classifications, hourly rates of wages paid, daily and weekly number of hours worked, deductions made, and actual wages paid.
- c) Such records maintained under this paragraph shall be made available by the Contractor for inspection, copying, or transcription by authorized representatives of the FTA and the Department of Labor, and the Contractor will permit such representatives to interview employees during working hours on the job.
- d) The contractor shall require the inclusion of the language of this clause within subcontracts of all tiers.

14. SUBSTANCE ABUSE REQUIREMENTS: DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

The Contractor agrees to establish and implement a drug and alcohol testing program that complies with 49 C.F.R. part 655, produce any documentation necessary to establish its compliance with part 655, and permit any authorized representative of the United States Department of Transportation or its operating administrations, the State Oversight Agency of North Dakota or the City of Fargo, to inspect the facilities and records associated with the implementation of the drug and alcohol testing program as required under 49 C.F.R. part 655 and review the testing process. The Contractor agrees further to certify annually its compliance with part 655 before the start of the contract period and to submit the Management Information System (MIS) reports before the start of the contract to the City of Fargo Fleet Manager. To certify compliance, the Contractor shall use the "Substance Abuse Certifications" in the "Annual List of Certifications and Assurances for Federal Transit Administration Grants and Cooperative Agreements," which is published annually in the *Federal Register*.

15. ENERGY CONSERVATION

- a) Contractor shall recognize mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (42 USC Section 6321 et seq).

16. SAFE OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

- a) Seat Belt Use

The Contractor is encouraged to adopt and promote on-the-job seat belt use policies and programs for its employees and other personnel that operate company-owned vehicles, company-rented vehicles, or personally operated vehicles. The terms "company-owned" and "company-leased" refer to vehicles owned or leased either by the Contractor or AGENCY.

- b) Distracted Driving

The Contractor agrees to adopt and enforce workplace safety policies to decrease crashes caused by distracted drivers, including policies to ban text messaging while using an electronic device supplied by an employer, and driving a vehicle the driver owns or rents, a vehicle Contractor owns, leases, or rents, or a privately-owned vehicle when on official business in connection with the work performed under this agreement.

17. DAVIS-BACON ACT AND COPELAND ACT – PREVAILING WAGE AND ANTI-KICKBACK

For all prime construction, alteration or repair contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by FTA, the Contractor shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Act and the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act. Under 49 U.S.C. § 5333(a), prevailing wage protections apply to laborers and mechanics employed on FTA assisted construction, alteration, or repair projects. The Contractor will comply with the Davis-Bacon Act, 40 U.S.C. §§ 3141-3144, and 3146-3148 as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 5, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Governing Federally Financed and Assisted Construction." In accordance with the statute, the Contractor shall pay wages to laborers and mechanics at a rate not less than the prevailing wages specified in a wage determination made by the Secretary of Labor. In addition, the Contractor agrees to pay wages not less than once a week. The Contractor shall also comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. § 3145), as supplemented by DOL regulations at 29 C.F.R. part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work

Financed in Whole or in part by Loans or Grants from the United States." The Contractor is prohibited from inducing, by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he or she is otherwise entitled.

Background:

Improvement District #BN-18-E1 is for the new construction of underground utilities, asphalt paving, street lights and incidentals on 38th Street South from 26th Avenue South to 850' north. The request for 38th Street South was to service the new corporate office of Border States Electric.

KPH, Inc. is the prime contractor for Improvement District #BN-18-E1.

This letter is in response to KPH's request for a time extension dated June 31, 2018. KPH is requesting a nine day extension to the substantial completion date, four days due to the City of Fargo denying work on Sunday in June, and five days due to rain. They have also requested to move the final completion date to September 1, 2018 to allow for delivery and installation of street light poles and to finish work in the boulevard that will not impact traffic.

KPH did not request to work all Sundays in June, they only asked to work on Sunday, July 1, 2018 (see attached). The contract states: "No work will be done on Sunday except in the case of an emergency. The City Commission can waive this provision if the Contractor sufficiently establishes an emergency exists." KPH asked to work on Sunday, July 1, 2018 to give their employees a four day weekend over the 4th of July holiday.

This project was awarded on April 23, 2018. KPH moved in for underground on Friday, June 1, 2018 to work on some removals and on Monday, June 4, 2018 they started laying pipe. I can identify three half days where KPH pumped water in the morning and laid pipe in the afternoon at a reduced production rate due to muddy conditions. In the three half days they worked, I would estimate that they completed the amount of work they would have completed in one day of dry conditions. I can also identify an additional two full days that KPH did not work due to rain. They have lost two days for the half days due to muddy conditions and lost two full days due to rain, for a total of four lost days.

It was realistic that KPH could have started in mid-May, which would have afforded them two of the four anticipated lost days for May, as well as five anticipated lost days for June, for a total of seven anticipated days lost due to weather through June. I am only able to identify four lost days, which is less than what was anticipated.

KPH has also encountered delays at the manufacturing level for street light poles. They have attached a letter from their supplier stating an anticipated manufacture completion date of August 17, 2018 with an additional two weeks for delivery. KPH has requested to move the street light pole installation from the substantial completion date to the final completion date and to revise the final completion to September 1, 2018.

KPH has also asked that the seeding be moved from the substantial completion date to the final completion date, as it is boulevard work and will not impact the functionality of 38th Street South.

KPH has worked diligently and has completed all of the boulevard work. The only outstanding item at this time is the installation of the street light poles and fixtures.

Staff concludes that KPH did not lose more than the anticipated days due to weather, and therefore recommends to deny a time extension to the substantial completion date due to weather related delays. We also recommend moving street light installation and seeding to the final completion date.

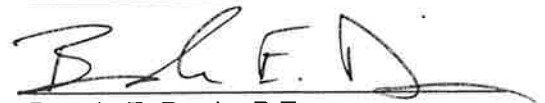

Improvement District #BN-17-B1 is for the new construction of underground utilities, concrete paving, site grading, street lights and incidentals on 19th Avenue North from 45th Street North to the west I-29 on/off ramp and 45th Street from 16th Avenue North to 19th Avenue North. In addition, the sanitary sewer interceptor mains will have an overflow structure installed.

Master Construction is the prime contractor for Improvement District #BN-17-B1.

James Hausauer has already received approval for the two west side overflow items to be paid under the HMGP Funds from the City of Fargo's Utility Committee to be paid under Improvement District BN-17-B1 in the amount of \$19,122.57.

With the delay of the BNSF RR Crossing on 45th Street N during last year's construction season, temporary pavement marking was installed on 45th Street N and 19th Avenue N to provide direction and safety to the traveling public during the winter suspension. A total of 11,922 LF of 4" epoxy pavement marking was installed at a total cost of \$7,153.20.

Moorhead Electric has provided two estimates to place the control panel/transformer away from the vault. They verbally asked for option #2 with a cost estimate of \$13,044.38.

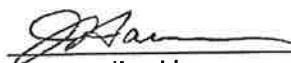

Background

If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local.

The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows and sanitary sewer backups within the Broadway Interceptor Service Area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding. To accomplish this reduction in hazards, the project will include three main components:

1. **Structure Improvements:** This will include modifications to sanitary Lift Station (LS) #1, LS #2, and the West Side Interceptor Overflow Improvements.
2. **Broadway Relief Force Main:** This will include the construction of 22,000' of relief force main from LS #1 & LS #2 and will convey wet weather flows to the WWTP or wastewater stabilization ponds (WWSP).
3. **WWTP Effluent Force Main Rehabilitation:** This will include the rehab of 2,000 ft of the existing 30" ductile iron Effluent Force Main from the WWTP to the stabilization ponds.

The Broadway HMGP Project has been divided into multiple segments (12) with some installed in conjunction with previously scheduled projects (water main replacement & street rehab) and some led by the Wastewater Utility.

ID BN-17-B Work Change Directive

Improvement District BN-17-B1 consists of new construction of underground utilities, paving, site grading, and streetlights along 19th Avenue North from 45th Street to I-29. The HMGP portion of this project consists of the installation of an overflow structure that will allow wastewater staff the ability to divert wastewater flows from the West Side Interceptor to the 60" gravity line associated with the 45th Street Interceptor. At this point, wet weather flows can be diverted to the lagoons via Lift Station #61.

The structure that diverts flows from the West Side Interceptor to the 60" gravity line consists of an underground vault with valves and above ground actuators, valve stems and a control panel in the City's Right-of Way. Representatives from Olaf Anderson have made city staff aware that they are unhappy with the placement & appearance of the vault and actuators and have asked if the control panel and transformer could be installed at an alternate location to minimize the unsightly appearance (in their opinion) to their adjacent business sign. Moorhead Electric has provided two estimates to place the control panel/transformer away from the vault (& driveway). Olaf Anderson has verbally asked consideration for option #2. The estimated cost for option #2 is \$13,044.38

The HMGP funding formula is as follows:

Master Construction is currently constructing the West Side Interceptor (WSI) Overflow Structure, near the intersection of 19th Avenue North and 41st Street. This new overflow structure includes sluice gates, which allow the City control the flow and provide operational flexibility to divert flow to the 45th Street Interceptor or allow the flow to continue downstream through the WSI to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. After the sluice gate actuators were installed, Olaf Anderson contacted the City with concerns that the actuators were detracting from the aesthetics of their business sign and requested that the structure be moved. The overflow structure is located in the City's Right-of-Way and relocation is not feasible as the intersection of the existing utility pipes determined the location of the structure. Discussions with Olaf Anderson have resulted in their request to relocate the control panel and transformer to an alternate location that will not detract from the aesthetics of their business sign.

Two alternative locations for the control panel and transformer have been identified. The first location is across 19th Ave to the North in front of John Deere and the second location is across Olaf Anderson's driveway to the east, along the tree line. Proposed costs for the relocation of the control panel and transformer have been provided for both alternatives. In addition to the relocation costs, Olaf Anderson has requested shrubs and landscaping around the overflow structure.

The option to relocate the equipment is at the City of Fargo's discretion. If the City would like to move forward with the relocation of the control panel and transformer a final meeting will be held with Olaf Anderson and the City to select the preferred alternate location and any additional costs associated with this change would then be included in a change order for the project.

The overflow structure that was originally installed was not working properly, causing back up at the underpass of the railroad tracks on 19th Ave North. The new structure installed has sluice gates, which control the flow and provides the City with operational flexibility to either: (1) divert 100 percent of the flow to the 45th Street Interceptor, or (2) allow the flow to continue downstream along the WSI to the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).

Purpose of Work Change Directive: Olaf Anderson has requested to have the transformer and the control panel relocated to another location due to their business sign. In addition, they have also requested shrubs and landscaping be placed around the WSI, to cover-up the bollards.

Background

If you recall, the City of Fargo was approved for FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funding for project DR-1981-ND-9R (Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project). The HMGP funding that was available consisted of 85% project grant funds for the City, with a funding formula of 75% Federal, 10% State, and 15% Local.

The Broadway SSO Reduction Project will reduce hazards associated with sanitary sewer overflows and sanitary sewer backups within the Broadway Interceptor Service Area caused by wet weather conditions and river flooding. To accomplish this reduction in hazards, the project will include three main components:

1. **Structure Improvements:** This will include modifications to sanitary Lift Station (LS) #1, LS #2, and the West Side Interceptor Overflow Improvements.
2. **Broadway Relief Force Main:** This will include the construction of 22,000' of relief force main from LS #1 & LS #2 and will convey wet weather flows to the WWTP or wastewater stabilization ponds (WWSP).
3. **WWTP Effluent Force Main Rehabilitation:** This will include the rehab of 2,000 ft of the existing 30" ductile iron Effluent Force Main from the WWTP to the stabilization ponds.

The Broadway HMGP Project has been divided into multiple segments (12) with some installed in conjunction with previously scheduled projects (water main replacement & street rehab) and some led by the Wastewater Utility.

ID BN-17-B Work Change Directive II

Improvement District BN-17-B1 consists of new construction of underground utilities, paving, site grading, and streetlights along 19th Avenue North from 45th Street to I-29. The HMGP portion of this project consists of the installation of an overflow structure that will allow wastewater staff the ability to divert wastewater flows from the West Side Interceptor to the 60" gravity line associated with the 45th Street Interceptor. At this point, wet weather flows can be diverted to the lagoons via Lift Station #61.

The structure that diverts flows from the West Side Interceptor to the 60" gravity line consists of an underground vault with valves and above ground actuators, valve stems and a control panel in the City's Right-of-Way. Representatives from Olaf Anderson have made city staff aware that they are unhappy with the placement & appearance of the vault and actuators. They have asked if the control panel and

transformer could be installed at an alternate location to minimize the unsightly appearance (in their opinion) to their adjacent business sign, as well look into the possibility of lowering the actuators, as they cannot be relocated. Moorhead Electric previously has provided an estimate to place the control panel/transformer away from the vault (& driveway). This was included in a previously approved Work Change Directive.

Attached you will find a quote from Master Construction to lower the actuators 18" to approximately 6-7" off the top of the vault maintaining support and warranty terms with this relocation. Representatives from Olaf Anderson have verbally advised city staff that they would be very happy with this relocation (lowering) of the actuators. The cost of this change order will be \$6,078.19

The HMGP funding formula is as follows:

Note: As per the HMGP Funding formula, the City of Fargo will be responsible for \$911.73 and is funded with Wastewater Infrastructure Sales Tax Fund 455.

Master Construction constructed the West Side Interceptor (WSI) Overflow Structure, near the intersection of 19th Avenue North and 41st Street; located in the City's Right-of-Way. This new overflow structure includes electric actuated sluice gates, which allow the City to control the flow and provide operational flexibility to divert flow to the 45th Street Interceptor or allow the flow to continue downstream through the WSI to the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

After the sluice gate actuators were installed, Olaf Anderson contacted the City with concerns that the actuators were detracting from the aesthetics of their business sign and requested that the structure be moved. Since then, Olaf Anderson's request to relocate the control panel and transformer was approved, and the control panel was installed on the east side of their driveway. In further discussion with Olaf Anderson it was requested to lower the gate actuators to allow a majority of the stem to be hidden with landscaping installed by Olaf Anderson. The gate actuator pedestals would be lowered approximately 18-inches from the currently installed standard height of 42-inches (maintaining the actuators 7-inches or more above the ground for warranty).

The option to replace the pedestals is at the City of Fargo's discretion. If the City would like to move forward with the replacement of the actuators, the additional costs included in the attached proposal from Master Construction for this change would be included in a change order for the project. Background:

SRF Consulting Group was selected by the NDDOT Selection Committee in April of 2016 and has the NDDOT design contract for the Main Avenue street reconstruction project slated for 2019. We entered into a separate contract with them to complete the water and sanitary sewer design associated with this project. The original fee amount was \$215,044.25.

Update:

We are on the verge of the NDDOT making the final decision on the design of this project and once that occurs it will be an all-out rush to get the plans completed by the first week in December.
