ORDINANCE NO.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 25-3001, 25-3002 AND 25-3006, AND REPEALING SECTIONS 25-3003 AND 25-3004 OF ARTICLE 25-30 OF CHAPTER 25 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ALARM SYSTEMS

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Amendment.

Section 25-3001 of Article 25-30 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

25-3001. Definitions.--

- 1. "Alarm user" shall mean any person as defined herein, using the services of a police alarm system or a central station. who installed an alarm system that uses alarm answering services to notify Police for a Police response.
- 2. "Answering service" refers to a telephone answering service which receives emergency signals from alarm systems, and thereafter immediately relaying the message by live voice to the communication center of the police department.
- "Automatic dialing device" refers to an automated alarm system which sends a prerecorded voice message or coded signal indicating the existence of the emergency situation which the alarm system is designed to detect.
 - 4. "Central station" means an office to which remote alarm and supervisory signaling

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devices are connected, where operators supervise the circuits, and where guards are maintained continuously to investigate signals.

- 5. "Central station system" means a system in which the operation of electrical protection circuits and devices are signaled automatically to, recorded in, maintained, and supervised from a central station having operators and security personnel on duty at all times.
- 6. "Direct line" means a telephone line leading directly from a central station to the communication center of the police department that is for use only to report emergency signals on a person to person basis.
- 74. "False alarm" means the activation of an alarm system caused by anything other than an emergency, or criminal activity or weather.
- 8. "Excessive alarms" shall mean false alarms in excess of three within the months of January through June of any year or July through December of any year.
- 95. "Person" shall mean any individual, partnership, corporation, association or other entity.
- 106. "Police a—Alarm system" shall mean any device designed for the detection of an unauthorized entry on premises or for alerting others of the commission of an unlawful act, or both, and, when actuated, emits a sound or transmits a signal or message which system alerts the Fargo police department directly, or causes the Police department to be alerted.
- 11. "Primary trunkline" means a telephone line leading directly into the communication center of the police department that is for the purpose of handling emergency calls on a person to-person basis, and which is identified as such by a specific number included among the emergency numbers listed in the telephone directory issued by the telephone company and covering the service area within the police department's jurisdiction.
- 12. "Proprietary system" means an alarm system sounding and/or recording alarm and supervisory signals at a control center located within the protected premises, the control center being under the supervision of the proprietor of the protected premises. If a proprietary system includes a signal line connected directly to the police communication center, a central station, or answering service, it thereby becomes an "alarm system" as defined in this ordinance.
- 13. "Special trunkline" means a telephone line leading into the communication center of the police department and having the primary purpose of handling emergency signals or messages originating either directly or through a central location from automatic dialing devices.
 - 7. "Alarm Period" is defined as January 1st through December 31st, calendar year.

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Section 2. Amendment.

Section 25-3002 of Article 25-30 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

25-3002. <u>Rules and regulations</u>.--The chief of police may prescribe rules and regulations for alarm systems, including but not limited to the following:

- A. Minimum standards for the quality, efficiency, and effectiveness of police alarm systems and alarm business permittees;
- B. Specific provisions relating to testing procedures;
- C. Minimum standards for the training of alarm business personnel.

He <u>The Chief of Police</u> is authorized to inspect or cause to be inspected the premises of the alarm business and the premises whereon the police alarm system is located. He shall have the power to make and enforce such reasonable rules and regulations as may in his discretion be necessary to implement the provisions of this article.

Section 3. Repeal.

Section 25-3003 of Article 25-30 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 4. Repeal.

Section 25-3004 of Article 25-30 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 5. Amendment.

Section 25-3006 of Article 25-30 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

25-3006. Charges for excessive false alarms.--


- A. Any alarm user who maintains or has an police alarm system which signals more than three (3) false excessive alarms in an alarm period as defined herein, as hereinabove defined, shall pay a service charge fee to the city of Fargo as follows:
 - 1. For the first excessive alarm, the sum of \$50. False Alarm 1-3 \$0/alarm.

1 2	2. For the second and subsequent excessive alarms, the sum of \$50 plus the additional sum of \$25 for each alarm after the first excessive alarm. False Alarm 4-6 \$100/alarm. 3. False alarm 7-9 \$150/alarm. 4. False Alarm ten (10) and more \$200/alarm.
3	B. Alarm fees shall be cumulative and due immediately upon receipt of billing notice. Interest shall accrue at a rate of 1 ½% per month on all invoices 30 days' past due,

5	C. The Chief of Police may suspend police response to alarms without secondary
6	verification, excluding panic and robbery alarms, in the event the alarm user exceeds ten (10) false alarms in the alarm period. The Chief of Police or designee shall

WAIVER, RELEASE AND ACCESS AGREEMENT

This Waiver, Release, and Access Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective this _____ day of May 2018, by and between the Fire Department and Police Department of the CITY OF FARGO, NORTH DAKOTA, a municipal corporation (hereinafter called "FFD and FPD"), and Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation ("NSP").

WHEREAS, NSP owns, or anticipates it will own, the property located at 11 12th Street, Fargo, North Dakota (the "Property"), as depicted on Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, NSP has performed and will continue to perform an investigation of the Property in accordance with North Dakota Century Code, Section 23-20.3-03.1, of a Manufactured Gas Plant ("MGP") that operated historically on the Property; and

VISITOR expressly understands and agrees that the activities on the Property may be of a hazardous nature and that access to the Property at this time presents risks both serious and minor, including but not limited to personal property damage, illness, injuries, and death. VISITOR understands and agrees there are risks involved in this access and is solely responsible for researching and evaluating the concomitant risks and is responsible for VISITOR's actions. VISITOR assumes all risk of personal injury, death, and property damage or loss arising from any direct or indirect causes whatsoever while VISITOR is at or on the Property.

VISITOR further recognizes, understands and agrees that NSP assumes no responsibility for any liability, damage, claim, expense or injury that may arise due to the access granted to VISITOR whether caused by negligent acts or omissions, or for any liability, damage, or injury caused by the conduct of any third party arising from the VISITOR's access.

The City of Fargo would like to update the drug and alcohol policies ahead of our Triennial Federal Transit Administration (FTA) audit. Specifically, policies 400-008 and 400-008B. We have summarized the federally mandated revisions below. This update process is pursuant to the FTA audit and mainly affects Transit workers. The changes have been reviewed by MATBUS administration and the city attorney's office.

We are requesting approval of the policy changes with an effective date of June 4, 2018.

Drug Free Workplace 400-008- All Employees

Adding the word "dispense" to list of prohibited behaviors.

Drug and Alcohol Policy 400-008B - Transit Employees

- Improving the description of prohibited drugs to match recent changes in United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) testing requirements.
- 2. Notifying Transit System of Criminal Drug Conviction.
- 3. Updating the contact information for personnel and organizations involved in the program/policy.
- 4. Appendix 3-improving description of initial and cutoff testing levels in accordance with January 1, 2018 changes in USDOT testing requirements and United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) laboratory protocols.

CITY OF FARGO EMPLOYMENT POLICY NO. 400-008 DRUG FREE WORKPLACE (formerly 400-004)

Date Issued: 1/95

Date Revised: 9/06 7/12 5/18

Purpose and Goal

The City of Fargo is committed to protecting the safety, health and well-being of all employees, and other individuals in our workplace. We recognize that alcohol and drug abuse pose a significant threat to our goals. We have established a drug-free workplace program that balances our respect for individuals with the need to maintain an alcohol and drug-free environment.

- This policy recognizes that employee involvement with alcohol and other drugs can be very
 disruptive, adversely affect the quality of work and performance of employees, pose
 serious health risks to users and others, and have a negative impact on productivity and
 morale.
- The City of Fargo has no intention of interfering with the private lives of its employees unless involvement with alcohol and drugs off the job affects job performance or public safety.
- As a condition of employment, the City of Fargo requires that employees adhere to a strict policy regarding the use and possession of drugs and alcohol.
- All new employees are subject to the successful completion of a background check and a drug/alcohol screen before starting work.
- The City of Fargo encourages employees to voluntarily seek help with drug and alcohol problems.

Covered Workers

Any individual employed by the City of Fargo, conducts business for the City of Fargo, or applies for a position with the City of Fargo is covered by our drug-free workplace policy. Our policy includes, but is not limited to department heads, directors, managers, supervisors, full-time employees, part time employees, contract employees, temporary/seasonal employees, off-site employees, volunteers, interns and applicants.

Applicability

Our drug-free workplace policy is intended to apply whenever anyone is representing or conducting business for the City of Fargo. Therefore, this policy applies during all working hours, whenever conducting business or representing the City of Fargo, while on call, paid standby, while on City of Fargo property and at work related events.

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Prohibited Behavior

It is a violation of our drug-free workplace policy to use or be under the influence of, possess, dispense, sell, manufacture, trade, and/or offer for sale alcohol, illegal drugs or intoxicants while in performance of City of Fargo business or while on City of Fargo property.

Prescription and over-the-counter drugs are not prohibited when taken in standard dosage and/or according to a physician's prescription. Any employee taking prescribed or over-the-counter medications will be responsible for consulting the prescribing physician and/or pharmacist to ascertain whether the medication may interfere with safe performance of his/her job. If the use of a medication could compromise the safety of the employee, fellow employees or the public, it is the employee's responsibility to use appropriate personnel procedures (e.g., call in sick, request change of duty, notify supervisor) to avoid unsafe workplace practices.

The illegal or unauthorized use of prescription drugs is prohibited. It is a violation of our drug-free workplace policy to intentionally misuse and/or abuse prescription medications. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken if job performance deterioration or accidents occur.

Notification of Convictions

Any employee who is convicted of a criminal drug violation must notify the City of Fargo in writing within five calendar days of the conviction. The City of Fargo will take appropriate action within 30 days of notification.

Consequences

One of the goals of our drug-free workplace program is to encourage employees to voluntarily seek help with alcohol and/or drug problems. If, however, an individual violates the policy, the consequences are serious.

In the case of applicants, if he or she violates the drug-free workplace policy, the offer of employment will be withdrawn. The applicant may not reapply.

If an employee violates the policy, he or she will be subject to disciplinary action including being required to enter rehabilitation. An employee required to enter rehabilitation and fails to successfully complete it and/or repeatedly violates the policy will be terminated from employment. Nothing in this policy prohibits the employee from being disciplined or discharged for other violations and/or performance problems.

Assistance

The City of Fargo recognizes that alcohol and drug abuse and addiction are treatable illnesses. We also realize that early intervention and support improve the success of rehabilitation. To support our employees, our drug-free workplace policy:

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- Encourages employees to seek help if they are concerned that they or their family members may have a drug and/or alcohol problem
- Offers all employees and their family member's assistance with alcohol and drug problems through the Employee Assistance Program (EAP).
- Treatment for alcohol and/or other drug use disorders may be covered by the employee benefit plan. However, the ultimate financial responsibility for recommended treatment belongs to the employee.

Confidentiality

All information received by the City of Fargo through the drug-free workplace program is confidential communication. Access to this information is limited to those who have a legitimate need to know in compliance with relevant laws and management policies.

Shared Responsibility

A safe and productive drug-free workplace is achieved through cooperation and shared responsibility. Both employees and management have important roles to play.

No employee shall report to work or be subject to duty while their ability to perform job duties is impaired due to use of alcohol or drugs.

In addition, employees are encouraged to:

- Be concerned about working in a safe environment.
- Support fellow workers in seeking help.
- Use the Employee Assistance Program
- Report dangerous behavior to their supervisor.

It is the supervisor's responsibility to:

- Inform employees of the drug-free workplace policy.
- Observe employee performance.
- Investigate reports of dangerous practices.
- Document negative changes and problems in performance.
- Counsel employees as to expected performance improvement.
- Refer employees to the Employee Assistance Program.
- Clearly state consequences of policy violations.

Communication

Communicating our drug-free workplace policy to both supervisors and employees is critical to our success. To ensure all employees are aware of their role in supporting our drug-free workplace program:

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- All employees will receive a written copy of the policy.
- The policy will be reviewed in orientation sessions with new employees.
- The policy and assistance programs will be reviewed at safety meetings.
- Employee education about the dangers of alcohol and drug use and the availability of help will be provided to all employees.
- Every supervisor will receive training to help him/her recognize and manage employees with alcohol and other drug problems.

<u>DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING</u> FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (FTA)

I. STATEMENT OF POLICY [655]

Please note: Items appearing in ITALICS are City of Fargo Policies and are not FTA mandated items.

A. Purposes and Goals [655.1]

The City of Fargo, the Federal Transit Administration and the U.S. Congress have determined that alcohol abuse and illegal drug use pose specific dangers to the safety and welfare of the Nation. In fact, the Federal Transit Administration has specifically noted that the use of alcohol and illegal drugs has been demonstrated to significantly affect the performance of individuals involved in the mass transportation industry. It is therefore the policy of the City of Fargo and the Federal Transit Administration that safety-sensitive employees in the mass transportation industry be free from the influence of drugs and alcohol. Participation in the City of Fargo Substance Abuse Policy is a requirement of each safety-sensitive employee and therefore is a condition of employment.

In order to achieve this goal and to comply with the requirements of the Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991 and Federal Transit Administration Regulations, 49 CFR Part 655 and US DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 40, as amended, the City of Fargo has developed and is implementing a drug and alcohol testing program designed to help prevent accidents and injuries resulting from the misuse of alcohol and prohibited drugs by employees who perform safety-sensitive functions in the mass transportation industry, and to deter and detect the use of prohibited drugs by covered employees. While it is difficult to estimate the precise cost to society from alcohol misuse, there is no doubt that the cost is enormous. The potential effects of alcohol misuse are substantial in absenteeism, increased health care costs, and environmental damage. Implementation of this program will also help discourage substance abuse, reduce absenteeism, accidents, health care costs and other drug related problems, and operate as a deterrent to those individuals who might be tempted to try drugs for the first time or who currently use drugs. Finally, we believe that this program will enhance the safety of our employees and the users of mass transportation by fostering the early identification and referral for treatment of workers with drug or alcohol abuse problems.

The City of Fargo's drug and alcohol testing program is designed to create a drug and alcohol free mass transportation system and to provide help to those employees who may be suffering from problems with chemical dependency. The program has therefore been developed in compliance with federal regulations in a manner which ensures accurate and reliable test results thereby eliminating the possibility of any "false positives." It also contains procedures designed to recognize and respect the dignity and privacy of all of our employees. We have also established an appropriate referral, evaluation and treatment program designed to help those individuals desirous of treating problems with alcohol and drug abuse.

B. Dissemination of this Policy [655.16]

Each covered employee and representatives of employee organizations shall have a written copy of the City of Fargo policy.

C. Authority of Testing [655.17]

Before performing a drug or alcohol test under this policy, each covered employee shall receive written notification under whose authority the test is being given (Appendix 1).

II. SCOPE

A. Individuals Subject to Testing [655.3]

The drug and alcohol testing required under this policy will apply to any person, including applicants or transferees, who performs a safety-sensitive function as defined herein. Volunteers are also covered, but only if they operate a vehicle designed to transport sixteen or more passengers, including the driver.

For purposes of this policy a "safety-sensitive function" includes:

- 1. Operating a revenue service vehicle, including when not in revenue service;
- 2. Operating a non-revenue service vehicle, when required to be operated by a holder of a Commercial Driver's License;
- 3. Controlling dispatch of movement of a revenue service vehicle;
- 4. Maintaining a revenue service vehicle or equipment use in revenue service;
- 5. Carrying a firearm for security purposes;

6. The Assistant Planner Transit; all Paratransit and Fixed Route Dispatchers; all Contractor's staff including the Project Manager, the Road Supervisor, the Lead Driver, all Paratransit and Fixed Route Drivers of vehicles as defined below; all Central Garage personnel including the Fleet Services Manager, all Mechanics working on transit vehicles, and transit vehicle washers. Should the need for additional Transit personnel arise in the future, these personnel will also become part of the pool of individuals subject to testing if it is determined these personnel are in a safety-sensitive function.

An individual can be tested for drugs any time while on duty, and for alcohol JUST before, during, or immediately after safety-sensitive duty.

"Vehicles" subject to this policy include buses, electric buses, vans, automobiles. "Mass transit vehicles" are vehicles used for mass transportation or ancillary services.

In light of the above, the requirements of this policy will specifically apply, as a matter of policy and federal law, to individuals who work in the following positions:

- Dispatchers
- Vehicle maintenance workers of Transit vehicles

B. Contractors

Under FTA regulations, the requirements of this policy apply to recipients of FTA assistance as defined in 49 CFR Part 655, as well as other entities that provide mass transportation services or perform safety-sensitive functions for such recipients or entities, including sub-recipients, operators and contractors.

"Contractors" subject to the requirements of the regulations include persons or organizations that provide services for the above-described "employer" consistent with a specific understanding or arrangement, which can be evidenced by a written agreement or an informal arrangement that reflects an ongoing relationship between the parties. As a result, the City of Fargo will ensure that any contractors who perform safety-sensitive functions within the scope of this policy and the regulations certify their compliance with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 655.

C. Alcohol

For purposes of this policy, "alcohol" means the intoxicating agent in beverage alcohol,

ethyl alcohol, or other low molecular weight alcohols including methyl and isopropyl alcohol. "Alcohol use" means the consumption of any beverage, mixture, or preparation, including any medication, which contains alcohol. "Alcohol concentration" (or content) means the alcohol in a volume of breath expressed in terms of grams of alcohol per 210 liters of breath as indicated by an evidential breath test.

D. Prohibited Drugs

The use of any illegal drug or any substance identified in Schedules I through V of Section 202 of the Controlled Substance Act (21 U.S.C. 812), as further defined by 21 CFR 1300.11 through 1300.15 is prohibited at all times unless a legal prescription has been written for the substance. This includes, but is not limited to: marijuana (including medical marijuana), amphetamines, opioids, phencyclidine (PCP), cocaine, ecstasy, eve, heroin, an initial test for Methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA) and a confirmatory test for MDMA, Methylenedioxymphetamine (MDA), Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, Oxymorphone Oxycodone and initial testing for 6-Acetylmorthines for opioid positives above the initial test cutoff concentration as well as any drug not approved for medical use by the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration or the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Illegal use includes use of any illegal drug, misuse of legally prescribed drugs, and use of illegally obtained prescription drugs. See appendix 3 for cutoff levels.

E. Prescribed Medication

An individual will be allowed to list on the back of the donor copy of the Urine Custody and Control Form, any prescribed medication that he/she may be taking or may have recently taken. The individual will have the opportunity to discuss the use of the medication with the physician prescribing the medication and to authorize the City of Fargo's medical review officer to communicate with that physician about the medication, its possible side effects, the condition requiring the taking of the medication and their relationship to the individual's ability to safely perform his/her job.

In the event it is determined by the MRO that an employee is taking or is under the influence of a prescribed medication that will pose a direct threat of harm to the safety and health of the employee, his/her co-workers and/or the general public, the employee may be placed on a medical leave of absence until that threat is acceptably reduced or eliminated.

III. QUALIFICATIONS FOR EMPLOYMENT

A. PROHIBITED CONDUCT

1. Prohibited Drugs [655.21]

It is the City of Fargo's policy to have an alcohol and drug free workplace. Therefore, covered employees are prohibited from manufacturing, using, selling, possessing or distributing prohibited drugs at any time, and from refusing to submit to or receiving a verified positive test result in any drug test required by this policy.

2. Alcohol [655.31]

City of Fargo policy and Federal Transit Administration Regulations prohibit the following conduct as it relates to the use of alcohol:

- a. Alcohol concentration reporting for duty or remaining on duty requiring the performance of safety-sensitive functions while having an alcohol concentration of 0.02 or greater. [655.34]
- b. On-duty use using alcohol while performing safety-sensitive functions. [655.32]
- c. Pre-duty use using alcohol within four hours prior to performing a safety-sensitive function. [655.33]
- d. Use following an accident using alcohol for eight hours following an accident, unless the employee has first undergone a post-accident alcohol test. [655.34]
- e. Refusal to submit refusing to submit to any alcohol test required under this policy. [655.49]
- f. Other alcohol related conduct any covered employee requested to submit to an alcohol test required under this policy and found to have an alcohol concentration of 0.02 or greater, but less than 0.04 will be disqualified from performing or continuing to perform a safety-sensitive function until the employee's alcohol concentration measures less than 0.02 in a retest or the start of the employee's next regularly scheduled duty period, but not less than eight hours following administration of the test. Any covered employee whose test result is 0.04 or greater will be disqualified from performing a safety-sensitive function, will be subject to company discipline, and referred to the SAP.

On-Call employees are prohibited from using alcohol during their specified on-call hours. However, any on-call employee who has used alcohol during his/her on-call hours will be given the opportunity to acknowledge such use and/or his/her inability to perform a safety-sensitive function at the time he/she is called to report to duty. If an on-call employee acknowledges the use of alcohol, but claims to be able to perform his/her safety-sensitive function, he/she will be required to submit to an alcohol test. No discipline will be taken against any on-call employee who

acknowledges his/her violation of this prohibition, unless such conduct has the effect of making that employee repeatedly unavailable for duty.

3. Knowledge of Prohibited Conduct

If the City of Fargo has actual knowledge that an individual has engaged in any conduct prohibited above, it will not permit that individual to perform or continue to perform safety-sensitive functions.

4. Notifying the Transit System of Criminal Drug Conviction

In accordance with the Drug Free Work Place Act of 1988, any individual covered by this policy who is convicted of any criminal drug statute for a violation occurring on duty, on City of Fargo premises or customer premises, while operating any fleet vehicle shall notify the Designated Employer Representative (DER) or the City of Fargo no later than five days after such conviction. Pursuant to the Federal Drug-Free Workplace Act, the City of Fargo will notify the appropriate federal granting or contracting agency, if any, of the conviction within ten (10) days after receiving such notification. Within thirty (30) days after receiving notice from an individual covered by this policy of a drug-related conviction, the City of Fargo, at its sole discretion, will take appropriate personnel action against the individual up to and including termination, or require the individual to satisfactorily participate in a referral, evaluation and treatment program. Failure to comply with this provision shall result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

ALCOHOL FACTS AND INFORMATION

Alcohol is a socially acceptable drug that has been consumed throughout the world for centuries. However, when consumed primarily for its physical and mood-altering effects, it is a substance of abuse. As a depressant, it slows down physical responses and progressively impairs mental functions.

Signs and Symptoms of Use

- Dulled mental processes
- Lack of coordination
- Odor of alcohol on breath
- Possible constricted pupils
- Sleepy or stuporous condition
- Slowed reaction rate
- Slurred speech

[NOTE: Except for the odor, these are general signs and symptoms of any depressant substance].

Health Effects

The chronic consumption of alcohol (average of three servings per day of beer [12 ounces] and whiskey [one ounce glass] over time may result in the following health hazards:

- Dependency (up to 10% of all people who drink alcohol become physically and/or mentally dependent on alcohol and can be termed "alcoholic")
- Fatal liver diseases
- Increased cancers of the mouth, tongue, pharynx, esophagus, rectum, breast, and malignant melanoma
- Decreased sexual functioning
- Kidney disease
- Spontaneous abortion and neonatal morality
- Ulcers
- Birth defects (up to 54% of all birth defects are alcohol related)

Workplace Issues

- It takes one hour for the average person (=150 pounds) to process one serving of an alcoholic beverage from the body
- Impairment in coordination and judgment can be objectively measured with as little as two drinks in the body
- A person who is legally intoxicated is six times more likely to have an accident than a sober person

B. REMOVAL FROM SERVICE

1. Prohibited drugs

As soon as the City of Fargo has received notice from a medical review officer that an employee has a verified positive test result, or upon notice that an employee has refused to submit to a required test, it shall immediately remove the employee from the performance of safety-sensitive functions.

2. Alcohol

Any employee who has engaged in alcohol-related conduct prohibited by this policy will be immediately removed from the performance of safety-sensitive functions and may also be subject to any discipline required under this policy.

Any covered employee requested to submit to an alcohol test required under this policy and found to have an alcohol concentration of 0.02 or greater, but less than 0.04, will be disqualified from performing or continuing to perform a safety-sensitive function until the employee's alcohol concentration measures less than 0.02 in a retest prior to the start of the employee's next regularly scheduled duty period, but not less than eight hours following administration of the test.

3. Return to Duty

No employee who has engaged in conduct prohibited by this policy will be allowed to resume performing safety-sensitive functions unless and until he/she has satisfied the return-to-duty obligations outlined in Section IV, F & G of this policy.

IV. TESTING CIRCUMSTANCES [49 CFR PART 655]

A. Notice of Testing Circumstances

Before performing any alcohol or drug test required by this policy, the City of Fargo will notify the test subject that the test is being required pursuant to this policy and/or Federal Transit Administration Regulations (49 CFR Part 655). The City of Fargo will not represent that any requested test is required by federal regulations if, in fact, the individual to be tested is not subject to those regulations.

An employee will be required to submit to a drug test any time while on duty. An employee will be required to submit to an alcohol test just before, during, or immediately after safety-sensitive duties.

B. Pre-Employment – Drugs [655.41]

- 1. No individual (covered employee or applicant) will be allowed to perform a safety-sensitive function for the first time unless he/she takes a drug test with a verified negative result.
- 2. If an individual (covered employee or applicant) has previously failed or refused a preemployment drug test under this part, the individual must provide the City of Fargo proof of having successfully completed a referral, evaluation, and treatment plan as described in Section 655.62.
- 3. An employee may not transfer from a non-safety sensitive position to a safety-sensitive position until the employee takes a pre-employment drug test with a verified negative result
- 4. If for some reason the pre-employment test is canceled, the individual (applicant or employee) will be required to submit to another test.
- 5. If otherwise qualified, an individual with permanent or long-term disabilities that directly render them unable to provide an adequate urine sample will be able to perform safety-sensitive duties despite their inability to provide urine during a pre-employment test. The MRO will determine long-term inability to provide urine by medical examination and consultation with the employee's physician.

6. Leave of Absences

- a. In instances where an individual employment status has changed, (example: temporary layoff, leave of absence, lost time worker compensation claim, etc.) and the employee has been taken out of the random pool for 90 consecutive days, then a DOT pre-employment drug test with a verified negative result is required prior to performing a safety-sensitive task.
- b. In instances where a person is on temporary leave, less than 30 days, (example: vacation, time off for sickness, jury duty, etc.) and the employee has not been taken out of the random pool, then a pre-employment test is not required prior to returning to a safety-sensitive position. If the temporary leave extends beyond 30 days, the employee must have a non-DOT pre-employment test.

No individual will be hired to perform a safety-sensitive function, and no employee will be transferred from a non-safety-sensitive function to a safety-sensitive function, unless he/she takes a drug test with a verified negative test result. If for some reason a pre-employment drug test is canceled, the applicant/employee will be required to submit to another test.

C. Post-Accident [655.44]

Any covered employee operating a mass transit vehicle at the time of an accident will be required to submit to tests for alcohol and prohibited drugs as soon as practicable following the accident, if the accident:

1. Involved the loss of human life.

2. Did not involve the loss of human life, but the mass transit vehicle involved was a bus, electrical bus, van, automobile, rail car, trolley car, trolley bus, or vessel. This requirement will not apply if the City of Fargo determines, using the best information available at the time of the decision, that the covered employee's performance can be completely discounted as a contributing factor to the accident and that the employee's performance could not have contributed to the accident.

The City of Fargo will also test any other covered employee whose performance could have contributed to the accident, as determined by the City of Fargo using the best information available at the time of the decision.

Decision Maker - Appendix 4

The decision to administer or not administer a drug and alcohol post-accident test under this section shall be based upon the City of Fargo's determination, using the best information at the time of the accident. Such a decision must be documented in detail, including the decision-making process used to reach the decision to test or not to test. At the City of Fargo we will use the post-accident substance abuse testing decision maker, found in Appendix 4 to make our decision to test or not to test and to document the file.

For purpose of this policy, an "accident" is defined as an occurrence associated with the operation of a vehicle, if as a result:

- 1. An individual dies;
- 2. An individual suffers a bodily injury and immediately receives medical treatment away from the scene of the accident;
- 3. With respect to an occurrence in which the mass transit vehicle involved in a bus, electric bus, van, or automobile, one or more vehicles incurs disabling damage as the result of the occurrence and is transported away from the scene by a tow truck or other vehicle.

"Disabling damage" means damage which precludes departure of a motor vehicle from the scene of the accident in its usual manner in daylight after simple repairs, including damage to motor vehicles that could have been driven, but would have been further damaged if so driven. "Disabling damage" does not include:

- 1. Damage which can be remedied temporarily at the scene of the accident without special tools or parts.
- 2. Tire disablement without other damage even if no spare tire is available.
- 3. Headlamp or taillight damage.
- 4. Damage to turn signals, horn, or windshield wipers making them inoperative.

Covered employees are prohibited from using alcohol for eight hours following any accident or until the required post-accident alcohol test is administered, whichever occurs first. Every effort will be made to conduct post-accident drug and alcohol tests within two hours following

an accident. Covered employees involved in accidents must therefore remain readily available for testing, including notifying the City of Fargo of their location if they leave the scene of the accident before testing, and will be considered to have refused to submit to testing if they fail to do so. This requirement will not, however, require the delay of necessary medical attention for injured people following an accident or prohibit a covered employee from leaving the scene of an accident for the period necessary to obtain assistance in responding to the accident or to obtain necessary emergency medical care.

In the event an alcohol test is not administered within two hours following an accident, the City of Fargo will prepare and maintain a record stating the reasons why the test was not promptly administered. If an alcohol test is not administered within eight hours following an accident, the City of Fargo will make no further effort to administer an alcohol test and document the reasons why the test was not administered within eight hours. In the event a drug test is not administered within 32 hours following an accident, the City of Fargo will cease its attempts to administer any further testing.

D. Random Testing [655.45]

Both the City of Fargo and Federal Transit Administration believe that random drug and alcohol testing is an essential part of any program seeking to ensure a drug and alcohol-free mass transportation system. All covered employees subject to this policy will therefore be required to submit to random drug and alcohol testing.

The City of Fargo will conduct random drug and alcohol tests at a minimum annual percentage rate of covered employees as required by the FTA. The minimum annual percentage rates are located in Appendix 2 of this policy.

- 1. The random selection process will be completely objective and anonymous and will utilize a scientifically valid method such as a random number table or a computer based random number generator matched with employee' social security numbers, payroll identification numbers, or other comparable identifying numbers. The tests will be unannounced and the dates for the test will be reasonably spread throughout the course of the year and occur throughout the work shift. All covered employees will have an equal chance of being tested each time selections are made, regardless of the number of his/her pervious selections, if any.
- 2. Any covered employee notified of his/her selection for random testing will be required to proceed to the test site immediately. If a covered employee is performing a safety-sensitive.

function at the time of his/her notification of a random test requirement, he/she will be required to cease performing the safety-sensitive function and proceed to the testing site as soon as possible. Covered employees are required to submit to drug tests anytime while on duty. However, covered employee will only be required to submit to random alcohol tests

if they are performing a safety-sensitive function, about to perform a safety-sensitive function, or have just ceased performing a safety-sensitive function.

E. Reasonable Suspicion [655.43]

Whenever the City of Fargo has reasonable suspicion to believe that a covered employee has used a prohibited drug or has violated any alcohol prohibition contained in this policy, it will require him/her to submit to a drug and/or alcohol test. However, any such suspicion must be based upon specific, contemporaneous, articulated observations concerning the appearance, behavior, speech or body odors of the covered employee. These observations will only be made by one supervisor who has received appropriate training in detecting the signs and symptoms of drug and alcohol use and will be documented by that individual in a Supervisor's Report of Reasonable Suspicion. Any supervisor who makes a determination that a reasonable suspicion exists to require a covered employee to submit to an alcohol or drug test will not be permitted to conduct the breath alcohol test on that individual or serve as the drug collection site person for his/her drug test.

A reasonable suspicion alcohol test will only be required if the reasonable suspicion observations are made just before, during or after the period of the work day that the covered employee is required to be in compliance with this policy. The City of Fargo will therefore only direct a covered employee to undergo reasonable suspicion alcohol testing while the employee is performing safety-sensitive functions, is just about to perform safety-sensitive functions, or has just ceased performing safety-sensitive functions.

If any reasonable suspicion alcohol test is not administered within two hours following the reasonable suspicion determination, the City of Fargo will document the reasons why the test was not promptly administered. If the test is not administered within eight hours following the reasonable suspicion determination, the City of Fargo will no longer attempt to administer an alcohol test and will document the reasons for its inability to do so.

In any reasonable suspicion testing circumstance, a City of Fargo representative will transport the individual to an appropriate collection facility and await the completion of the collection procedure. The City of Fargo representative will then transport the individual back to City of Fargo's premises, where a spouse, family member or other individual will be contacted to transport the individual home. In the event no such individual is available, the City of Fargo will contact a taxi to transport the employee home. If the reasonable suspicion result is negative, the City of Fargo will reimburse the employee for the cost of the taxi. If the employee refuses to comply with any of these procedures and attempts to operate his/her own vehicle, the City of Fargo will take appropriate efforts to discourage him from doing so, up to and including contacting local law enforcement officials. Any employee failing to cooperate with any of the above procedures will be subject to discipline, up to and including discharge.

Notwithstanding the above testing requirements, a covered employee may not report for duty or remain on duty requiring the performance of a safety-sensitive function if that employee is

under the influence of or impaired by alcohol, as shown by the behavioral, speech and performance indicators of alcohol misuse. Any such covered employee will not be allowed to perform or continue to perform a safety-sensitive function until the employee undergoes an alcohol test yielding an alcohol concentration level of less than 0.02; or the start of the employee's next regularly scheduled duty period, but not less than eight hours following the reasonable suspicion determination.

The City of Fargo will not take any disciplinary action against a covered employee based solely upon observations of the employee's behavior and appearance, with respect to alcohol use, in the absence of an alcohol test, unless the employee has refused to submit to a requested test.

An employee who is required to submit to a controlled substance and/or alcohol test of this policy shall not be assigned to operate any City of Fargo vehicle and/or perform safety sensitive functions pending the outcome of such test. The City of Fargo may, at its option, assign such employee to available non-safety sensitive duties or place him/her on temporary suspension.

An employee whose controlled substance and/or alcohol test produces a negative result shall be promptly returned to his or her former work. Under no circumstances will an employee be made whole for any lost wages on a negative result if he or she is suspended for any additional purposes concurrently with the waiting of the outcome of his or her results. However, an employee not suspended for additional purposes shall be made whole for any lost wages on a negative result.

An employee whose alcohol or controlled substance confirmatory test produces a positive result shall not be made whole for any wages lost while assigned as provided in Section XI of the policy.

F. Return-to-Duty [655.46]

Before a covered employee who has engaged in any conduct prohibited by this policy will be allowed to return to duty requiring the performance of a safety-sensitive function, he/she will be required to undergo return-to-duty alcohol testing with a result indicating an alcohol concentration of less than 0.02 if the conduct involved alcohol, and/or a return-to-duty drug test with a verified negative result, if the conduct involved prohibited drugs. Before returning to duty, the employee must first undergo evaluation by a SAP to determine if the employee followed the recommendations for action by the SAP, including rehab. Please review Section XI, Part C for additional SAP information. If the test is canceled, he/she will be required to take another return-to-duty drug test.

1. The Substance Abuse Professional may recommend that both a drug and alcohol return to duty test be conducted on employees returning to safety-sensitive duties following engaging in conduct prohibited by this policy. If the test is cancelled, he/she will be required to take another return to duty test.

2. The City of Fargo will decide, at its discretion, after reviewing SAP recommendation and employee treatment history, whether or not to return to the employee to safety-sensitive work assignments. The SAP reports must be kept on file for five years.

G. Follow-Up Testing [655.47]

Any covered employee determined by a substance abuse professional to be in need of assistance in resolving problems associated with alcohol misuse and/or prohibited drug use will be subject to additional, unannounced follow-up testing for alcohol and/or controlled substances as directed by the SAP (minimum of six follow-up tests in the first year after return to safety-sensitive duties). However, follow-up alcohol testing will be conducted only when the employee is performing safety-sensitive functions, just before the employee is perform safety-sensitive functions, or just after the employee has ceased performing safety-sensitive functions. The employee must also follow the treatment plan as prescribed by the SAP. Random or other types of tests will not be counted as follow-up tests. Any canceled tests must be repeated.

H. Re-Test Alcohol Concentration 0.02<0.04 [655.48]

- 1. 0.02-0.039: The employee will be removed temporarily from performing safety-sensitive duties for a minimum of eight hours from the time of the test unless the individual is retested and has a test result of less than 0.02.
- 2. >0.04 or greater: The employee will be immediately removed from safety-sensitive duties and subject to the consequences and discipline outlined in Section XI.

I. Refusal to Submit [655.49]

Any covered employee who refuses to submit to an alcohol or drug test will be prohibited from performing or continuing to perform a safety-sensitive function and be subject to discipline as outlined in Section XI of this policy. "Refusal to submit" to an alcohol or drug test constitutes a verified positive result and violation of policy. Refusal to submit includes the following conduct:

1. Alcohol:

Per DOT Regulation 49 CFR 40.261, as an employee, you are considered to have refused to take an alcohol test if you:

- a. Fail to appear for any test (except a pre-employment test) within a reasonable time, as determined by the City of Fargo, consistent with applicable DOT agency regulations, after being directed to do so by the City of Fargo;
- b. Fail to remain at the testing site until the testing process is complete; an employee who leaves the testing site before the testing process commences for a preemployment test is not deemed to have refused to test;
- c. Fail to provide an adequate amount of saliva or breath for any alcohol test required by this part or DOT agency regulations; an employee who does not provide an

- adequate amount of breath or saliva because he or she has left the testing site before the testing process commences for a pre-employment test is not deemed to have refused to test;
- d. Fail to provide a sufficient breath specimen, and the physician has determined, through a required medical evaluation, that there was not adequate medical explanation for the failure;
- e. Fail to undergo a medical examination or evaluation, as directed by the City of Fargo as part of the insufficient breath procedures;
- f. Fail to sign the certification of the ATF; or
- g. Fail to cooperate with any part of the testing process.
 - i. As an employee, if you refuse to take an alcohol test, you incur the same consequences specified under DOT agency regulations for a violation of those DOT agency regulations.
 - ii. AS a BAT or an STT, or as the physician evaluating a "shy lung" situation, when an employee refuses to test as provided in this section, you must terminate the portion of the testing process in which you are involved, document the refusal on the ATF (or in a separate document which you cause to be attached to the form), immediately notify the DER by any means (e.g., telephone or secure fax machine) that ensures the refusal notification is immediately received.
 - iii. As an employee, when you refuse to take a non-DOT test or to sign a non-DOT form, you have not refused to take a DOT test. There are no consequences under DOT agency regulations for such a refusal.

2. Drugs:

Per DOT Regulation 49 CFR 40.191, as an employee, you have refused to take a drug test if you:

- a. Fail to appear for any test (except a pre-employment test) within a reasonable time, as determined by the City of Fargo, consistent with applicable DOT agency regulations, after being directed to do so by the City of Fargo;
- b. Fail to remain at the testing site until the testing process is complete; an employee who leaves the testing site before the testing process commences for a preemployment test is not deemed to have refused to test;
- c. Fail to provide a urine specimen for any drug test required by this part or DOT agency regulations; an employee who does not provide a urine specimen because he or she has left the testing site before the testing process commences for a preemployment test is not deemed to have refused to test;
- d. In the case of a directly observed or monitored collection in a drug test, fail to permit the observation or monitoring of your provision of a specimen;
- e. Fail to provide a sufficient amount of urine when directed, and it has been determined, through a required medical evaluation, that there was no adequate medical explanation for the failure;
- f. Fail or decline to take a second test the City of Fargo or collector has directed you to take;

- g. Fail to undergo a medical examination or evaluation, as directed by the MRO as part of the verification process, or as directed by the DER. In the case of a preemployment drug test, the employee is deemed to have refused to test on this basis only if the pre-employment test is conducted following a contingent offer of employment; or
- h. Fail to cooperate with any part of the testing process (e.g., refuse to empty pockets when so directed by the collector; behave in a confrontational way that disrupts the collection process).
 - i. As an employee, if the MRO reports that you have a verified adulterated or substituted test result, you have refused to take a drug test.
 - ii. As an employee, if you refuse to take a drug test, you incur the consequences specified under DOT agency regulations for a violation of those DOT agency regulations.
 - iii. As a collector or an MRO, when an employee refuses to participate in the part of the testing process in which you are involved, you must terminate the portion of the testing process in which you are involved, document the refusal on the CCF (including, in the case of the collector, printing the employee's name on Copy 2 of the CCF), immediately notify the DER by any means (e.g., telephone or secure fax machine) that ensures that the refusal notification is immediately received. As a referral physician (e.g., physician evaluating a "shy bladder" condition or a claim of a legitimate medical explanation in a validity testing situation), you must notify the MRO, who in turn will notify the DER.
 - iv. As an employee, when you refuse to take a non-DOT test or to sign a non-DOT form, you have not refused to take a DOT test. There are no consequences under DOT agency regulations for such a refusal.
- i. For an observed collection, fail to follow the observers' instructions to raise your clothing above the waist, lower clothing and underpants, and to turn around to permit the observer to determine if you have any type of prosthetic or other device that could be used to interfere with the collection process.
- j. Possess or wear a prosthetic or other device that could be used to interfere with the collection process.
- k. Admit to the collector or MRO that you adulterated or substituted the specimen.
 - i. As an employee, if the MRO reports that you have a verified adulterated or substituted test result, you have refused to take a drug test.
 - ii. As an employee, if you refuse to take a drug test, you incur the consequences specified under DOT agency regulations for a violation of those DOT agency regulations.
 - iii. As a collector or an MRO, when an employee refuses to participate in the part of the testing process in which you are involved, you must terminate the portion of the testing process in which you are involved, document the
 - refusal on the CCF (including, in the case of the collector, printing the employee's name on Copy 2 of the CCF), immediately notify the DER by any means (e.g., telephone, or secure fax machine) that ensures that the

refusal notification is immediately received. As a referral physician (e.g. physician evaluating a "shy bladder" condition or a claim of a legitimate medical explanation in a validity testing situation), you must notify the MRO, who in turn will notify the DER; as the collector, you must note the refusal in the "Remarks" line (Step 2) and sign and date the CCF; as the MRO, you must note the refusal by checking the "refused to test because" box (Step 6) on Copy 2 of the CCF, and add the reason on the "Remarks" line. You must then sign and date the CCF. As an employee, when you refuse to take a non-DOT test or to sign a non-DOT form, you have not refused to take a DOT test. There are no consequences under DOT agency regulations for refusing to take a non-DOT test. Failing to remain readily available for testing, including notifying the City of Fargo of his/her location if he/she leaves the scene of the accident, when an individual is involved in an accident as defined in this policy.

3. Other Testing

If an employee has a verified positive result, adulterated or substituted sample, the employee is to be immediately removed from safety-sensitive duties.

- a. Negative Dilute Specimen
 - The City of Fargo will require the employee to provide another specimen immediately.
 - The City of Fargo will accept the second negative dilute result.
 - The collection cannot be witnessed, unless there is another basis for use of direct observation.
 - If the result is canceled/invalid, (with no medical explanation) the employee will need to undergo an immediate witnessed collection.

J. Cancelled tests

If the test is canceled, immediate re-collections are required for pre-employment, return to duty, or follow-up tests. Only the MRO can cancel a test.

V. <u>DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING – All testing will be done in accordance with 49</u> CFR Part 40

VI. CONFIDENTIALITY AND RECORDKEEPING

A. Access to Facilities and Records [Part 40.37]

Upon written request by any covered employee, the City of Fargo will promptly provide copies of any records pertaining to the employee's use of alcohol or drugs, including any records pertaining to his or her alcohol or drug tests. Access to a covered employee's records will not be contingent upon payment for the records other than those specifically requested.

VII. EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM/SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROFESSIONAL

A. Employee Education

The City of Fargo will provide employees subject to this policy with education materials explaining the requirements of the Federal Transit Administration drug and alcohol regulations and the City of Fargo policies and procedures for meeting them. In addition, employees will be provided with information concerning the effects of drug use and alcohol misuse on an individual's health, work, and personal life; signs and symptoms of an alcohol or drug problem (the employee's or a co-worker's); and available methods of intervening when an alcohol or drug problem (the employee's or a co-worker's); and available methods of intervening when an alcohol or drug problem is suspected, including confrontation, referral to any employee assistance program and/or referral to management. This information will include the following:

- 1. Display and distribution of information material
- 2. Display and distribution of a community service hot-line telephone number for employee assistance.

Covered employees will receive at least 60 minutes of training on the effects and consequences of prohibited drug use on personal health, safety and the work environment and on the signs and symptoms which may indicate prohibited drug use.

Copies of the above materials and this policy will be distributed to each covered employee prior to the start of alcohol and drug testing required herein and to each employee subsequently hired or transferred into a position requiring the performance of a safety-sensitive function covered by this policy. Each employee who receives a copy of these materials will be required to sign a statement certifying that he or she has received a copy of the same. The City of Fargo will retain the original of the signed certificate and will provide a copy to the employee, if requested. The City of Fargo will also provide written notice to representatives of employee organizations as to the availability of this information, if applicable.

Any questions about the requirements of this policy should be directed to the program contact individual listed.

B. Supervisory Training

Any individual designated to determine whether reasonable suspicion exists to require a

covered employee to undergo a drug or alcohol test under this policy will be required to receive at least 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and 60 minutes of training on drug use. This training will cover the physical, behavioral, speech and performance indicators of probable alcohol misuse and prohibited drug use.

C. Referral, Evaluation and Treatment

Procedures for referral of covered employees, including applicants, with a positive test result or an alcohol concentration of 0.04 or greater [49 CFR Part 40] & [655.62].

1. Available Resources

Any employee who engages in conduct prohibited by this policy will be provided with information about the resources available for evaluating and resolving problems associated with the misuse of alcohol or prohibited drug use, including the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of substance abuse professionals and counseling and treatment programs.

2. Substance Abuse Evaluation

Although an employee's employment with the City of Fargo may be terminated for a violation of this policy, employees will be advised to undergo an evaluation by an appropriate substance abuse professional, who will determine what, if any, assistance the employee may need in resolving problems associated with alcohol misuse and/or prohibited drug use. This requirement will apply regardless of whether such conduct is discovered as a result of a positive drug or alcohol test, independent employer knowledge or a voluntary admission by the employee. The referral, evaluation and rehabilitation requirements outlined above do not apply to applicants who refuse to submit to or test positive in a pre-employment drug test.

3. Follow Up Testing [655.47]

The SAP shall determine the frequency and duration of follow up testing for a covered employee. Such employees shall be required to take a minimum of six follow up drug tests or six follow up breath alcohol tests, with verified negative results during the first 12 months after returning to duty. After that period of time, the SAP may recommend to the employer the frequency and duration of testing, provided that the testing ends in 60 months for the return to duty.

- a. The SAP will conduct the initial evaluation and any follow-up evaluations required.
- b. It is the duty of the SAP to determine if the employee has cooperated with any recommendations.
- c. The SAP will determine if further treatment or aftercare is needed.
- d. The SAP will provide the City of Fargo with a follow-up testing plan.

4. Substance Abuse Professional (SAP) [655.52]

For purposes of this policy, a substance abuse professional (SAP) is defined as a licensed physician (M.D. or D.O.), or a licensed or certified psychologist, social worker, employee assistance professional, or addiction counselor (certified by NAADAC or ICRC who has knowledge of and clinical experience in the diagnosis and treatment of drug and alcohol-related disorders. The SAP's role is to evaluate the employee's need for assistance in resolving problems related to alcohol or drug abuse,

determine if the employee has complied with any recommended treatment or rehabilitation, and to determine a program of follow-up testing as appropriate.

All SAP's must comply with Part 40.281-Part 40.283 for qualifications. All SAP's must complete a training course with an accredited organization and pass an examination on course content. Every three years SAP's must complete 12 (CEU) hours of continuing education relevant to SAP functions. All SAP's (local and national) must provide certification to the City of Fargo.

D. Voluntary Rehabilitation

An employee who voluntarily (not in response to a City of Fargo request to take a controlled substance abuse/alcohol test or the positive result of a controlled substance abuse/alcohol test) admits to management that he or she has a controlled substance abuse/alcohol problem, and who wishes to submit to a Rehabilitation Program, must sign a release and agreement of rehabilitation, and will be subject to the following:

- 1. The employee shall be placed on unpaid medical leave until:
 - a. He or she presents evidence of having enrolled in and successfully completed at his or her own expense, a rehabilitation program approved by the City of Fargo, and:
 - b. He or she submits to a return to duty controlled substance and alcohol test at his or her own expense which produces a negative result, and:
 - c. He or she signs the City of Fargo's Post Rehabilitation Return to Work Agreement.
- 2. An employee placed on rehabilitation leave as provided in paragraph (D) of this section must satisfy the provisions of sub-paragraphs a, b, and c of that paragraph no later than 12 weeks from the commencement of this personal leave. An employee failing to do so shall be deemed to have abandoned his or her job. Any employee who is returned to work as provided in this section of the policy and who fails to comply with any of the terms of the Rehabilitation Agreement will be discharged. In addition to the removal from safety-sensitive functions required by Federal Transit Administration Regulations, the City of Fargo will follow the City's disciplinary guide which calls for unpaid suspension and referral to EAP a second offense is discharge.

E. Applicants

An individual who tests positive on a pre-employment test for a prohibited drug will not be hired for a covered function

F. Employees

Any employee who tests positive for a prohibited drug or for alcohol with a saturation level of 0.04 or greater on a second will be discharged from employment with the City of Fargo.

Any employee who engages in any conduct that constitutes a refusal to submit to a drug or alcohol test required under this policy will be discharged from employment with the City of Fargo.

Any employee whose alcohol test result is 0.02-0.03 concentration will be removed from duty for at least 24 hours or until his/her next regularly scheduled shift, whichever is longer. All time suspended will be without pay. Any employee who tests 0.02-0.039 alcohol concentration on more than one occasion will be discharged from employment with the City.

VIII. OTHER CONSEQUENCES

The following consequences (any other consequences described in this policy that differ from the minimum requirements of FMCSA rules and regulations) are imposed by the City of Fargo under independent authority and are not required by FMCSA regulations.

A. Termination of Employment

- 1. City of Fargo will not guarantee reinstatement of an employee who has been removed from safety-sensitive functions after engaging in prohibited conduct, even when that employee is involved and cooperating in DOT's return-to-duty process. City of Fargo reserves the right to withhold a final decision regarding reinstatement until after results of a Return-to-Duty test have been received.
- 2. An employee who engages in prohibited conduct a second time will be terminated from employment.
- 3. An employee who tests positive for controlled substances or whose test indicates alcohol concentration of 0.04 or greater following a fatal accident will, under FMCSA rules, be immediately removed from service, and, under the City's independent authority, will be terminated from employment.
- 4. An employee who is convicted of driving under the influence of controlled substances and/or alcohol while on duty will be immediately terminated from employment.
- 5. An employee who refuses to submit to required testing for alcohol and/or controlled substances will be considered to have voluntarily resigned.
- 6. The services of any non-employee (a contract driver, or independent owner-operator) who engages in prohibited conduct will be immediately discontinued.
- 7. An employee who provides two alcohol test results that are greater than 0.02 but below 0.04, and whose employment is not terminated as provided herein, will be terminated from employment if he/she refuses to be assessed by our EAP, or refuses to sign a release of information for the City to receive assessment results, or refuses to participate in or complete a program of rehabilitation or treatment recommended by the EAP counselor.

- 8. When an employee has not reported to a scheduled SAP appointment within three working days after receiving the SAP's name and phone number, the City will no longer continue to hold the employee's position open and will consider the employee to have voluntarily resigned.
- 9. If a SAP reports that an employee is not cooperating, or has dropped out of the program, the City will consider that the employee has voluntarily resigned, and will take steps to replace the employee.
- 10. When it is discovered that an employee provided false information regarding previous test results on pre-employment test, or when other information on the application has been falsified, the employee will be immediately terminated.

B. Suspended Status

- 1. When an employee's alcohol test result is above 0.02 but less than 0.04, FMCSA regulations require that the employee be removed from safety-sensitive functions for 24 hours. Under independent authority, the City considers this to be unpaid suspension.
- 2. When an employee is using a prescription medication and provides no written notice or authorization from a licensed medical practitioner advising that the employee may continue to safely operate a Commercial Motor Vehicle while using the medication, city of Fargo reserves the right to place the employee on unpaid suspension until such information is received by the City's Safety Coordinator or Director of Human Resources, or until the medication is no longer required.
- 3. An employee who is charged by any governmental authority with driving under the influence of controlled substances and/or alcohol while on duty will be place on unpaid suspension, pending resolution of the charge.

C. Employee Costs for Testing

1. When the cost of a follow-up test, or a retest, as specified in this policy, is to be borne by the employee, that employee may elect to sign an authorization form that permits the City of Fargo to deduct those costs from the employee's subsequent paycheck. Such arrangements will be made through the City's Human Resources Department.

D. Additional Testing for Drugs and Alcohol

An employee will be required to submit to a non-DOT test for reasonable suspicion in those circumstances when the employee is suspected of drug or alcohol use, or has violated a work rule as stated elsewhere in the City of Fargo's policies, or is involved in or may have contributed to the cause of an accident, or causes injury to him/herself or to another person, when the circumstances related to that incident do not meet the requirements of a DOT test.

City of Fargo may change, later, or eliminate any or all portions of this policy as it deems appropriate, or as mandated or permitted by applicable laws, and may interpret it in response to any particular circumstances. An up-to-date copy of the policy is kept in the Office of the Director of Human Resources. Employees may request to see the policy at any time during normal business hours. An up-to-date copy will also be stored on the City's Intranet, at the Human Resources site.

APPENDIX 1

NOTIFICATION OF TESTING

This testing is required by Federal Transit Administration regulations (49 CFR Part 655 & US DOT Regulation 49 CFR Part 40). A verified positive result in and/or the failure or refusal to submit to this test will disqualify you from the performance of safety-sensitive functions of the City of Fargo and may subject you to such other action as outlined by the City of Fargo policy.

APPENDIX 2

MINIMUM ANNUAL PERCENTAGES FOR RANDOM DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

The annual random testing rates for drugs and alcohol are determined separately based on the industry wide positive rate for the preceding two-consecutive year period based on annual MIS reports submitted by covered employers and in accordance with 49 CFR Part 655. Rates for future years will be announced each year with the rates dependent on industry-wide experience rates. If changes occur, they will be noted in this section.

Drugs

The annual percentage of covered employees that need to be tested on an annual basis is 50%.

Alcohol

The annual percentage of covered employees that need to be tested on an annual basis is 10%. (The 10% annual percentage of covered employees that need to be tested is a change and a reduction from 25%. The change occurred on 1/6/1998, Federal Register vol. 63, No. 3, page 418 & 419).

APPENDIX 3

Initial Testing

The initial test shall use an immunoassay which meets the requirements of the food and Drug Administration for commercial distribution. The following initial cutoff levels shall be used when screening specimens to determine whether they are negative for these drugs or classes of drugs:

In the even a drug test is not administered within 32 hours following an accident; do not continue to administer the drug test.

If an employee is required to submit to a substance abuse test, they shall not be assigned to operate any City vehicles or perform any safety sensitive functions pending the outcome of the test.






One water quality masters student (wage @\$11,000 per year) will be hired on the project and will work on water quality and e.coli both surface and piezometer study, see descriptions below.

A second soils masters student (wage @\$3,000 per year) will be hired to work on soils and soil forming factors to support the piezometer portion of the study.

Fringe Benefits

3% for graduate student (\$840 for both students over the 2 years)

Research Design

During recent research e.coli was found to be very high in FM area detention stormwater ponds, but other water quality research in the area showed that e.coli was not high at retention stormwater ponds. The following study seeks to further understand this relationship as well as investigate the soils and soil forming factors at the Fargo Project. This proposal includes three different portions of the study: 1) piezometers to look at groundwater near detention channel and how far e.coli stays in the water as one moves away from the channel; 2) surface sampling to determine e.coli that moves into these sites and how rain events affect both retention (holds water — "pond" type basin) vs. detention (only during storm events); and 3) investigate the soil characteristics at the Fargo Project and soil forming factors at the site as related to present and past research on water, vegetation, and dynamics of the basin.

Portion 1 - Piezometer Water Quality:

We propose putting in 4 areas of piezometers at the Fargo project basin. At each of these 4 areas there would be a piezometer placed adjacent to the channel (0) and then 2 more piezometers placed at a certain distance from the channel (TBD, but possibly 2.5 m and 5 m) at the Fargo Project. Additionally 2 sites (likely one retention and one detention) would be part of the study. At these sites there would just be one piezometer location but there would be 3 piezometers put in at the 0, and 2 TBD distances (same as Fargo project). When these piezometers are sampled surface sampling would need to be done for comparison. At the Fargo project that would mean 4 surface samples at the inlets (2), confluence, and outlet. At the other 2 sites it would mean 2 samples (inlet and outlet), potentially only 1 at the pond basin.

Portion 2 - Surface Water Quality:

To determine how these sites are impacted on a larger scale and at both detention and retention basins we propose sampling at 5 total retention "ponds" and 3 total detention basins at the surface. This would be an additional 6 samples to what is proposed in portion one of the study.

Timing of Sampling for Water Quality:

Surface sampling would occur every time it rains enough to have residence time of water of 5-10+ hours at the Fargo Project, preferably at the "peak" of water in the detention basins. We assume this would equate to approximately a ½" of rain or more in an hour.

The exact same surface sampling as well as the full piezometer sampling would take place 1 week after the event to determine the flush during the event and then the residence of e.coli at the site. It is of course impossible to predict rain. So at a minimum we would sample once per month at all the locations to record based data if it is a dry year. Sampling will take place May-September during the summers of 2018 and 2019. Additionally it should be mentioned that samples will only be taken during storm events if they can be transported to NDDoH and analyzed within the time allotment.

Portion 3 - Soils:

At the Fargo Project previous research has been conducted on native vegetation, water quality, and stakeholder perceptions of the site. However, the one piece that is missing is an understanding of the soils. The objective of this research is to study soil development and characteristics within the basin. There are wetland soils at the site as well as arid soils that are covered periodically by water. The goal of this research is to determine how soils develop at a site like this and if/when hydric soil characteristics form. The methods used for this study will be to characterize and compare the soils at the Fargo Project and knowledge of soils and hydric soil formation factors within the area.

Travel

There will be travel needed to the Fargo Project and other sites, all will be within the FM area city limits or close to it. Additionally, students will be asked to present at a professional meeting such as the North Dakota Water Quality Monitoring Conference in Bismarck. Costs for travel are estimated at \$1,000 per year for both years of the project = \$2,000.

Supplies

This money will be used to carry out the different portions of the project. For the water quality study piezometers will need to be purchased and installed (\$150 each X 20 = \$3,000). Additional supplies will be needed for the water quality and soils portions of the study. We are unsure of exact materials needed but will include items such as the following: hip waders or mud boots, coolers to hold samples, lab consumables, sample bottles, shovels, and soil auger. These expenses have been estimated at \$250 per year for both years = \$500. This equals \$3,500 total in supplies for the project.

Administration

The City of Fargo pays 10% for administration fees (see attached letter).

Total Direct Cost = \$34,340

Administration @ 10% - \$3,434

Total Project Cost = \$37,774

Research Design:

We are proposing 2 different portions of the study: 1) piezometers to look at groundwater near channel and how far e.coli stays in the water as you move away from the channel; and 2) surface sampling to see e.coli that moves into these sites and how rain events affect both retention (holds water – "pond" type basin) vs. detention (only during storm events).

Rationale:

Based on the urban stormwater retention study of 30 rural, peri-urban, and urban ponds we didn't see much problem with e.coli (sporadic but not common). But at the Fargo project and sampling for storms we saw major problems with e.coli. At no time during sampling for 2 years would the Fargo project meet recreational standards for e.coli or even close — one storm event almost all "too many to count" readings on the second dilution, this means 16,000 and the recreational standard is 126.

Additionally e.coli was found to be very high in both the surface samples as well as the piezometers that were placed directly adjacent to the channel to measure groundwater. As part of the storm event sampling we also saw fluctuations in e.coli based on how recently minor rains had happened. We would like to better gauge the amount of e.coli that flows through the basins during different types of storm events.

In general we also want to know how does it impact recreation at the Fargo Project? Information we are finding out says that the source of the e.coli is very important in determining if the e.coli is detrimental. New and scientifically valid technology allows source tracking of the e.coli bacteroidales to determine if they are human, dog, bird, etc. For example if it is from humans it is more likely to cause major illness. This type of analysis is not cheap so it is best to do regular e.coli analysis (NDDoH) but then choose select samples to determine the source(s) of e.coli to establish safety.

Portion 1 of the study:

We propose putting in 4 areas of piezometers at the Fargo project basin. At each of these 4 areas there would be a piezometer placed adjacent to the channel (0) and then 2 more piezometers placed at a certain distance from the channel (TBD, but possibly 2.5 m and 5 m) at the Fargo Project. Additionally 2 sites (likely one retention and one detention) would be part of the study. At these sites there would just be one piezometer location but there would be 3 piezometers put in at the 0, and 2 TBD distances (same as Fargo project). When these piezometers are sampled surface sampling would need to be done for comparison. At the Fargo project that would mean 4 surface samples at the inlets (2), confluence, and outlet. At the other 2 sites it would mean 2 samples (inlet and outlet), potentially only 1 at the pond basin.

Portion 2 of the study:

To determine how these sites are impacted on a larger scale and at both detention and retention basins we propose sampling at 5 total retention "ponds" and 3 total detention basins at the surface. This would be an additional 6 samples to what is proposed in portion one of the study.

When to sample:

Surface sampling would occur every time it rains enough to have residence time of water of 5-10+ hours at the Fargo Project, preferably at the "peak" of water in the detention basins. We assume this would equate to approximately a $\frac{1}{2}$ " of rain or more in an hour.

Then the exact same surface sampling as well as the full piezometer sampling would take place 1 week after the event to determine the flush during the event and then the residence of e.coli at the site.

It is of course impossible to predict rain. So at a minimum we would sample once per month at all the locations to record based data if it is a dry year. In case of a large rain event year we could cap this sampling at a certain number of events per summer. We would like to be able to conduct this sampling May-September during the summers of 2018 and 2019 if possible. Additionally it should be mentioned that samples will only be taken during storm events if they can be transported to NDDoH and analyzed within the time allotment.

Additionally, we will be talking to the City of Fargo about source tracking the e.coli. We would request that the NDDoH filter and chill samples that if then showed high e.coli we could send to Source Molecular (or most suitable location for source tracking the e.coli).

Request from NDDoH:

- Analysis of the samples mentioned above for e.coli first and second dilutions. A spreadsheet is attached that lays out the number of samples for each sampling time (take times 2 for storm and 1 week after).
- If possible we would also like to request potential analysis of these samples for general chemistry, nutrients, and TSS; TSS only in surface samples. This would of course depend on NDDoH's interest and availability to do so. Sampling during the Fargo Project for diesel range organics, oil and grease, and trace elements didn't show any major concerns so we don't feel additional analysis and cost associated with testing these analytes would be useful.
- Access to courier for transporting samples to Bismarck

Request from the City of Fargo:

- Masters student (e.coli) stipend/partial stipend (\$10-12,000 X 2 years)
- Masters student (soils) partial stipend (\$3,000/year X 2 years)
- Piezometer supplies
- Permissions to access properties and install piezometers for sampling
- Travel (to site and maybe a conference or 2 for presentation of results)
- Source tracking of e.coli (human, bird, dog, etc) this could be anywhere from as little as \$1,000 to as expensive as you are willing to make it. The more samples you have the more accurate your data and knowledge of what is at the site. We can discuss exact amounts and how this works in person to give you a better idea. At this point we would recommend doing this through Source Molecular. Their approximate rates are \$415 for first sample/1st marker (ie human or bird, etc), \$315 each for 2 markers on sample, \$265 each for 3 markers on sample, and \$215 each for 4+ markers on sample. If a program of samples/markers was to be set up can get price estimate for that.

This project was reviewed by the City's Planning and Development, Engineering, Public Works, and Fire Departments ("staff"), whose comments are included in this report.

Surrounding Land Uses and Zoning Districts:

- North: LC, Limited Commercial with vacant, daycare, office, and retail, sales, and service uses
- East: MR-1, Multi-Dwelling Residential and GC, General Commercial with vacant land use
- · South: GC, General Commercial with vacant land use
- West: City of West Fargo zoning; public schools (Liberty Middle and Sheyenne High Schools)

Area Plans

The 2003 Southwest Future Land Use Plan designates the area of this project as "Commercial or Medium/High Density".





Schools and Parks:

Schools: The subject property is located within the West Fargo Public School District and is served by Independence Elementary, Liberty Middle, and Sheyenne High Schools.

Neighborhood: The subject property is located in the Brandt Crossing Neighborhood.

Parks: The project site is located approximately one-half mile west of Brandt Crossing Park, which has basketball courts, dog park, playgrounds, recreational trails, and a shelter; and 0.75 miles north of Osgood School Park, which has basketball courts, multi-purpose field, playground, recreational trails, and a shelter.

Pedestrian / Bicycle: There are off-road bike facilities located along Veterans Boulevard, and in Brandt Crossing Park and Osgood School Park. These bike routes are a component of the metro area bikeways system.

Staff Analysis:

Minor Subdivision

The LDC stipulates that the following criteria is met before a minor plat can be approved:

1. Section 20-0907.B.3 of the LDC stipulates that the Planning Commission recommend approval or denial of the application, based on whether it complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of

Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. Section 20-0907.B.4 of the LDC further stipulates that a Minor Subdivision Plat shall not be approved unless it is located in a zoning district that allows the proposed development and complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.

The subdivision is intended to replat Lot 2, Block 1, Valley View 7th Addition into five lots and one block to accommodate future development. In accordance with Section 20-0901.F of the LDC, notices of the proposed plat have been sent out to property owners within 300 feet of the subject property. To date, staff has not received any inquiries. Staff has reviewed this request and finds that this application complies with standards of Article 20-06 and all applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. (Criteria Satisfied)

2. Section 20-907.C.4.f of the LDC stipulates that in taking action on a Final Plat, the Board of City Commissioners shall specify the terms for securing installation of public improvements to serve the subdivision.

While this section of the LDC specifically addresses only major subdivision plats, staff believes it is important to note that any improvements associated with the project (both existing and proposed) are subject to special assessments. Special assessments associated with the costs of the public infrastructure improvements are proposed to be spread by the front footage basis and storm sewer by the square footage basis as is typical with the City of Fargo assessment principles. (Criteria Satisfied)

Planning Commission Recommendation: January 4, 2018

On January 4, 2018, with a 9-0 vote, the Planning Commission accepted the findings and recommendations of staff and recommended approval to the City Commission of the proposed Subdivision Plat, **Valley View Eight Addition** as outlined within the staff report, as the proposal complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06, and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. The Planning Commission approved the Conditional Use Permit to allow for an Alternative Access Plan as the proposal complies with Section 20-0909.D (1-6) and all other requirements of the LDC, with the following conditions:

- Bicycle parking facilities, such as bike racks or bike lockers, shall be provided on-site;
- The Conditional Use Permit will cease if the land use changes from commercial, restaurant, fast food or residence.

Suggested Motion: "To accept the findings and recommendations of staff and the Planning Commission and move to approve the proposed Subdivision Plat, **Valley View Eight Addition** as outlined within the staff report, as the proposal complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06, and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.



FOOD TRUCK PILOT PROGRAM FOR SUMMER OF 2018

On May 21st the City Commission approved a request to engage with the City Attorney to further investigate a pilot program for food trucks in the downtown to operate within the ROW. Attached is a status report, indicating the background, history, proposal and the reasoning on the pilot.

Also included in the packet is the draft policy and ordinance suggestions for implementation once a review is conducted against the 2018 pilot program operations. Once the pilot program has been instituted, upon conclusion staff will provide an analysis of our findings for more permanent policies and operations to be considered for 2019.

This memo and attached materials is a status report and proposal for consideration by the City Commission. We recommend confirming the pilot program in two more weeks for additional analysis or to field any questions from staff or the public.

Recommended Motion: Implement the Summer 2018 Food Truck pilot program to operate between July 14 - October 27, after confirmation at the June 18th City Commission meeting, that no other considerations should be addressed.





Food Truck Pilot Test Proposal

Background and Request:

Based on community input during Downtown InFocus and from vendors in our community, including a local food truck alliance, there is a proposal to engage in a pilot program for food trucks to operate in public rights-of-way (ROW) for the summer of 2018. Currently, vending in the ROW is prohibited.

Many city departments provide oversight to regulations that apply to this initiative, and as such, there have been several meetings among staff and our City Attorney's office to review current constraints. So that the 2018 summer season is not missed, staff is suggesting a pilot test to learn more about the actual nuisances, as well as, obtain data regarding number of vendors, preferred locations, hours of operation, public costs, and city costs to administer the program and manage nuisances.

History and Analysis:

Currently sections in Article of 18-03 restrict vending in the ROW. Planning staff has spent several months researching other cities' ordinances and the provisions related to allowing food trucks on public streets. However, it was soon discovered there wasn't a common trend or recommendations we could collectively use. Many cities suggested creating a trial period and trial policies. This lead us to facilitating multiple conversations with city staff members and to coordinate with the city attorney's office to develop policies and ordinances. While the city staff are close to developing an overall policy and ordinance recommendation, we decided it would be best to put some policies on a trial period in order to learn what potential costs and nuisances this could create for the public.

Who is involved:

The following departments have had representatives in this discussion: Fire, Police, Engineering, Public Works, Auditors, Health and Planning. In addition, we've reached out to the Downtown Community Partnership. Nuisances that could occur with food trucks in ROW include:

- Pedestrian safety Police and Engineering
- Grease and debris Public Works, DCP, Parking
- Lack of knowledge on who is where Health, Police, Auditors
- Noise Police, Downtown Neighborhood Association
- Odor- Health
- Food safety Health
- Blocking traffic and visibility Engineering
- Extended stay in downtown parking spots Police, Parking
- Market impacts- DCP, Planning

Who is eligible for the pilot program:

• • A health licensed mobile food unit that is self-contained, can be moved without disassembly, has the ability to serve food items from within the unit, and has signed the 2018 pilot program waiver.

Pilot program parameters:

- Approved food vendors will only be allowed to operate during the pilot program in the designated areas on the map prepared for the program.
- A copy of the Health Department Mobile Food Unit license as well as a signed copy of the 2018 Pilot Program waiver must be available upon request.
- The pilot program map includes the central business district with the exception of the prohibited streets highlighted in red.
- The 2018 pilot season will run from July 14- October 27, 2018.
- The hours of operation will be unlimited pending on-street parking restrictions.

Procedures:

In the City Commission packet is a proposed 2019 policy and ordinance recommendations. We suggest waiting to enact these until 2019 and until the pilot program is completed and reviewed. This will allow time to investigate the estimated costs and public feedback in order to properly develop internal procedures. There are many ordinances currently in the municipal code that are eligible for enforcement of nuisances listed above. However, many departments indicate that they currently operate on complaint driven basis responding as needed to enforce associated ordinances. For this pilot program, we suggest hiring Interstate Parking to supplement city staff if needed. We are currently looking into the costs associated with Interstate Parking.

In lieu of a new type of permit, we are proposing the Health Department utilizes their Mobile Food Unit licensing process to capture vendor contact information for the pilot program. A new permit program could be implemented in 2019 if desired, once a policy and review procedure accompanied by a vetted due process utilizing the metrics from the pilot program is created. For the 2018 pilot program we propose mobile vendors acknowledge the waiver to operate via signature during the health licensing process. This would release the City of Fargo from liability.

Governing body:

The 2018 pilot program waiver can be revoked by the City of Fargo Commission upon internal review of any ordinance violations and/or public complaints filed on a food unit. Staff will implement a cross-departmental email communication tool for internal coordination.



DRAFT: FOR CONSIDERATION FOR 2019 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 18-0304, 18-0308 AND ENACTING SECTION 18-0318 OF ARTICLE 18-03 OF CHAPTER 18 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO USE AND CARE OF STREETS AND SIDEWALKS

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the city of Fargo seeks to regulate parking in publicly owned or operated parking lots and ramps.

NOW. THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Amendment.

Section 18-0304 of Article 18-03 of Chapter 18 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

18-0304. Sale of merchandise from stands on streets prohibited.

Except as authorized under sections 18-0307 through 18-0319 herein, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to set up any stand or wagon upon any of the streets, alleys, sidewalks, crosswalks, or public grounds within the city for the purpose of selling therefrom, or exposing for sale, any meats, provisions, refreshments, or any goods or merchandise whatsoever.

Section 2. Amendment.

Section 18-0308 of Article 18-03 of Chapter 18 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

18-0308. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this article, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- A. Central Business District" shall mean an area within the following boundaries:
 - 1. On the north by 6th Avenue North;
 - 2. On the east by the Red River of the North;
 - 3. On the south by 1 st Avenue South; and,
 - 4. The westerly boundary shall be Roberts Street from 6 th Avenue North to 1 st Avenue North, 9 th Street from 1 st Avenue North to Northern Pacific Avenue and 8 th Street from Northern Pacific Avenue to 1 st Avenue South.
 - 5. In addition to the area defined by the foregoing boundaries the Central Business District shall include 7 th and 8 th Streets South, to 2 nd Avenue South.

For purposes of defining this boundary, the sidewalk on both sides of the streets, above-named, shall be included within the Central Business District.

- B. Mobile food vending unit shall mean a food establishment preparing and/or serving foods from a self-contained vehicle, either motorized or within a trailer, located either curbside on a public street or on private property, that may be readily moved without disassembling for transport to another location.
- C. Grilling" shall mean the cooking of raw animal products such as meat, poultry or fish on a flat top or charbroil style high-heat surface designed for such purpose, but does not include smoking, deep-fat frying, wok or skillet-style cooking, barbecuing/ rotisserie-style cooking or any other type of cooking.
- D. "Grilling pushcart" shall mean a pushcart that includes equipment for grilling.
- E. "Merchandise" shall include, but is not limited to, plants, flowers, wearing apparel, jewelry, ornaments, art work, household or office supplies, food or beverages of any kind, whether or not for immediate consumption, or other goods or wares.
- F. "Outdoor dining area" shall mean an area in front of or adjacent to a business maintaining a restaurant or limited restaurant license issued by the city health department and located on a public sidewalk whereon tables, chairs or benches are placed for purposes of serving food and/or alcoholic beverages.
- G. "Outdoor merchandise area" shall mean an area in front of or adjacent to a retail business where merchandise is located on a public sidewalk for the purpose of displaying, exhibiting, selling or offering for sale merchandise.
- H. "Pedestrian way" shall mean the area of sidewalk adjacent to the property line and extending therefrom to the edge of the curb or for a distance of ten (10) feet, whichever is narrower.

- I. "Planning Director" shall mean the department head of the Department of Planning and Development of the city of Fargo.
- J. "Professional sidewalk entertainer" shall mean a sidewalk entertainer who, through direct or passive behavior, asks for or solicits any form of remuneration and "professional sidewalk entertainment" shall mean sidewalk entertainment performed while the performer is thus soliciting any form of remuneration.
- K. "Pushcart" shall mean a wheeled cart which may be moved by one person without the assistance of a motor and which is designed and used for displaying, keeping or storing any food, beverages or other articles for sale by a vendor. To the extent a pushcart is used for displaying, keeping or storing food or beverages, the pushcart must be limited to service of potentially hazardous foods or commissary-wrapped food maintained at proper temperatures, or limited to the preparation and service of frankfurters, as is defined by North Dakota Administrative Code Chapter 33-33-04. Cooking will only be allowed on an approved grilling pushcart.
- L. "Review Committee" shall consist of five members to be appointed by the mayor with the consent of the board of city commissioners. Such membership of the review committee may be comprised of one or more city employees from one or more departments within the city.
- M. "Sidewalk entertainer" shall mean a person who engages in sidewalk entertainment.
- N. "Sidewalk entertainment" shall mean performances which may include, but not be limited to, music, dance, mimes, magicians, clowns, jugglers and theatrical presentations, but specifically excluding speeches, lectures, and sermons.

Section 3. Enactment.

* * * *

Section 18-0318 of Article 18-03 of Chapter 18 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

18-0318. – Mobile Food Vending.

- A. The health director shall have such authority to adopt regulations, rules, standards and practices pertaining to the operation of mobile food vending units, said regulations, rules, standards, and practices, and any amendments thereto, to take effect upon approval of the board of city commissioners. The health director is hereby authorized to issue a permit for the operation of a mobile food vending unit in accordance with this chapter and with the regulations, rules, standards, and practices in effect pertaining thereto.
- B. No person, firm or other entity shall, directly or indirectly, operate a mobile food vending unit in the city without a valid permit.
- C. No person, firm or other entity shall, directly or indirectly, offer or dispose of, or give away, or cause to be offered or exposed for sale, exchanged, bartered, disposed of or given away any food, beverage or other product that has been stored, cooled, heated, warmed-up, cooked

or any combination of the same, at a mobile food vending unit within the city of Fargo without a valid permit.

- D. A mobile food vending unit permit may be revoked or suspended by the health director for any violation of this section following written notice or, upon request for renewal, the renewal permit may be refused by the health director. The permittee may appeal the revocation, suspension or refusal of renewal of the permit by timely request for a hearing before the city health officer. The request for hearing must be either postmarked or received in the city auditor's office within seven (7) days of the date of the notice. The city health officer shall hold a hearing on the permittee's request for hearing and shall render a decision on the matter after said hearing. The decision of the health officer may be further appealed to the board of city commissioners by filing a timely notice of appeal of the decision of the health officer with the city auditor. The notice of appeal must be either postmarked or received in the city auditor's office within seven (7) days of the date of the decision of the health officer.
- E. <u>Separate offense for each day</u>.--Each day any person shall violate this section shall constitute a separate infraction or offense.

Section 4. Penalty.

A person who willfully violates this ordinance is guilty of an infraction. Every person, firm or corporation violating an ordinance which is punishable as an infraction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000; the court to have power to suspend said sentence and to revoke the suspension thereof.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

RECIPROCAL EASEMENT AGREEMENT

This Reciprocal Easement Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by HOMEFIELD LLLP, a
North Dakota limited liability limited partnership ("HomeField 1"), HOMEFIELD 2, LLLP, a
North Dakota limited liability limited partnership ("HomeField 2"), and BEYOND SHELTER,
INC., a North Dakota nonprofit corporation ("Landlord") as of [], 2018 (the "Effective
Date").

RECITALS:

- A. HomeField 1 is the leasehold owner of certain real property located in the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota, as more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto (the "HomeField 1 Property"), which is improved with a multifamily residential building and related improvements, pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain that certain Ground Lease dated as of July 20, 2016, as amended by that certain First Amendment thereto dated as of September 15, 2016, as further amended by that certain Second Amendment thereto dated as of March 2, 2018 (the "HomeField 1 Ground Lease");
- B. HomeField 2 is the leasehold owner of that adjacent real property located in the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota, as more particularly described on Exhibit B attached hereto ("HomeField 2 Property"), which is (or will be) improved with a multifamily residential building and related improvements, pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain that certain Ground Lease dated as of [_____], 2018 (the "HomeField 2 Ground Lease");
- C. Landlord is the fee owner of the HomeField 1 Property and HomeField 2 Property and certain contiguous property, described as "HomeField 3 Parcel" on Exhibit C hereto ("Phase 3 Property").

D. HomeField 1 and HomeField 2 (sometimes collectively, the "Parties" or individually, a "Party") desire to grant to the other, their respective successors, assigns, tenants, occupants, licensees, contractors, agents, employees, or invitees (the "Permitted Users") certain rights, licenses and easements upon the terms and conditions provided herein, and Landlord consents to the grant of such rights, licenses and easement. In addition, Landlord agrees on behalf of itself, and all successors and assigns in interest in the fee estate of the HomeField 1 Property and HomeField 2 Property, to subordinate its interest in the fee estate to the easements, rights and interests granted in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for the covenants provided herein and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

A. Grant of Easement to Use and Access Shared Facilities and Access Improvements

- 1. <u>HomeField 2 Shared Facility.</u> HomeField 2 hereby grants to HomeField 1 and HomeField 1's Permitted Users, for the benefit of the HomeField 1 Property, a non-exclusive, appurtenant easement to use the following facilities located on the HomeField II Property:
 - a. the salon (the "HomeField 2 Shared Facility").

In addition, HomeField 2 grants HomeField 1 and HomeField 1's Permitted Users, for the benefit of the HomeField 1 Property, pedestrian, vehicular and bicycle access over and across the HomeField 2 Property to access the HomeField 2 Shared Facility.

The details of the parties' respective rights to use the HomeField 2 Shared Facility, including means of scheduling uses and the priority for certain times, shall be detailed in the rules and regulations (the "HomeField 2 Shared Facility Rules and Regulations") established for the HomeField 2 Shared Facility by HomeField 1, which Rules and Regulations shall be subject to the reasonable approval of HomeField 1. HomeField 1 shall be required to comply with the HomeField 2 Shared Facility Rules and Regulations.

- 2. <u>HomeField 1 Shared Access Improvements.</u> HomeField 1 hereby grants to HomeField 2, and HomeField 2's Permitted Users, a non-exclusive, appurtenant easement to use all driveways, sidewalks and walkways located on the HomeField 1 Property for pedestrian, vehicular and bicycle access over and across the HomeField 1 Property.
- 3. <u>HomeField 2 Shared Access Improvements.</u> HomeField 2 hereby grants to HomeField 1, and HomeField 1's Permitted Users, a non-exclusive, appurtenant easement to use all driveways, sidewalks and walkways located on the HomeField 2 Property for pedestrian, vehicular and bicycle access over and across the HomeField 2 Property. The HomeField 1 Shared Access Improvements and HomeField 2 Shared Access Improvements shall be collectively referred to herein as the "Shared Access Improvements")

- 4. 28th Avenue Access Drive. HomeField 2 is dependent on HomeField 1 for access to 28th Avenue South. In addition to the easement grant to use and access the driveways part of the Shared Access Improvements that are located on the HomeField 1 Property as set forth in Section A(2) herein, HomeField 1 grants to HomeField 2 and its Permitted Users, for the benefit of the HomeField 2 Property, a non-exclusive pedestrian and vehicular access easement over that portion of the HomeField 1 Property as depicted as the "Proposed Access Easement" and "Existing 36' Access Easement" on the site plan attached hereto as Exhibit D (the "Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive"). HomeField 2 and its Permitted Users shall have direct and unobstructed access to the 28th Avenue South right of way by way of the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive at all times and no barriers or obstructions shall be placed within the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive, subject to temporary closures for maintenance, repair and construction as set forth in Section A(6) below, and during any such temporary closures, HomeField 1 shall provide HomeField 2 and its Permitted Users with an alternate access route to the 28th Avenue South right of way that is substantially similar to the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive. In the event that HomeField 1 fails to maintain, repair or replace the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive in the manner required under this Agreement, then subject to all applicable notice and cure periods set forth herein (except in the case of material obstructions of access, or failure to promptly remove snow or ice from the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive, and in such events, no notice and cure period shall be required), HomeField 2 shall have the right, but not obligation, to enter the HomeField 1 Property and perform such maintenance, repair or replacement of the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive itself, and HomeField 1 shall promptly reimburse HomeField 2 all costs associated therewith.
- 5. <u>Utility Improvements</u>. In addition to the easement grant to use and access the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive, HomeField 1 further grants to HomeField 2 and its Permitted Users, over, under across and upon the easterly portion of the Phase 2 28th Avenue Access Drive, as depicted as the "Proposed Utility Easement" on the site plan attached hereto as Exhibit E, a non-exclusive easement ("Utility Easement") for reasonable use to construct, maintain, repair and replace certain water and sanitary sewer utilities (the "Utility Improvements").
- 6. Reciprocal Use and Access During Construction. Landlord hereby grants HomeField 2 and its contractors, agents, partners and invitees the right of access and use of that portion of the Phase III Property during HomeField 2's initial construction of any improvements on the HomeField 2 Property. HomeField 2 shall have the right to use the Phase 3 Property for the purposes of accessing the HomeField 2 Property and storing construction equipment, materials and supplies (the "Permitted Uses"). Each of Landlord and HomeField 2 shall hold harmless and indemnify the other party, its agents, and their respective employees, successors and assigns, from and against all loss, costs, damage, actions, suits, judgments and expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or due to, the use by the indemnifying party, except to the extent due to or a result of the negligence or willful misconduct of the other party. Landlord shall maintain comprehensive general liability insurance against claims for bodily injury, death and property damage occurring in or upon the Phase 3 Property, and until construction by HomeField 2 of the initial improvements on the HomeField 2 Property are completed, Tenant shall maintain comprehensive general liability insurance against claims for bodily injury, death and property damage occurring in or upon the Phase 3 Property, including contractual liability coverage for claims made

pursuant to the indemnity provisions of this Section 6, in such amounts as may be carried from time to time by prudent owners of similar properties in the Fargo area, but in all events to afford protection for limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit for bodily injury or property damage and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Landlord and HomeField 2 shall each name each other as an additional insured under all such policies. The provisions of this Section 6 shall terminate upon receipt by HomeField 2 of a certificate of occupancy for all improvements on the HomeField 2 Property.

- 7. Obstructions. Neither HomeField 1, nor HomeField 2, shall construct, install, or place any barrier or obstruction on any portion of the HomeField 1 Property or HomeField 2 Property so as to obstruct access to or the use and enjoyment of the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements or the Utility Easement, provided, however, that either Party may restrict access to the Shared Access Improvements or Utility Easement, and HomeField 2 may restrict access to the Shared Facility, for maintenance, repair and construction, which shall be undertaken in a timely manner and which closure shall be for the shortest reasonable period of time.
- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>. Each of HomeField 1 and HomeField 2 shall hold harmless and indemnify the other Party, its agents, and their respective employees, successors and assigns, from and against all loss, costs, damage, actions, suits, judgments and expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or due to, the use by such Party or its Permitted Users, of the respective right to use the Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements or Utility Easement, except to the extent due to or a result of, the negligence or willful misconduct of either Party or its respective Permitted Users.
- 9. <u>Insurance</u>. Each Party to this Agreement shall maintain comprehensive general liability insurance against claims for bodily injury, death and property damage occurring in or upon the Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Easement, or access thereto, including contractual liability coverage for claims made pursuant to the indemnity provisions of this Agreement, in such amounts as may be carried from time to time by prudent owners of similar properties in the Fargo area, but in all events to afford protection for limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 combined single limit for bodily injury or property damage and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. In addition, each Party to this Agreement shall maintain comprehensive property insurance in such amounts as may be carried from time to time by prudent owners of similar properties in the Fargo area. Further, each Party shall name the other as an additional insured on each policy, the insurance companies shall be required to notify the other Party of any cancellation of insurance, and certificates of insurance shall be provided on request from either Party.
- 10. No Right in General Public. Nothing herein contained in this Agreement shall be deemed to be a gift or dedication of any portion of either the HomeField 1 Property or HomeField 2 Property to the general public, or for any public purposes whatsoever, it being the intention of this Agreement shall be strictly limited to and for the purposes herein expressed.
- 11. <u>Term.</u> Use of the Shared Facility by HomeField 1, and of the Shared Access Improvements or Utility Easement by the Parties and their Permitted Users, pursuant to the easements

granted herein, shall not be terminated by HomeField 1 or HomeField 2 without the prior written consent of the other Party. The easements granted herein shall not terminate until the later of (i) the expiration of the "Tax Credit Compliance Period" under Section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code for the project located on the HomeField 2 Property, or (ii) at such time as each of the HomeField 1 Property and HomeField 2 Property are not used for multifamily housing (excluding any periods where either or each of the HomeField 1 Property or HomeField 2 Property are not used for multifamily housing due to any casualty, condemnation, construction or repair).

12. Maintenance, Repair and Replacement of the Shared Access Improvements and Utility Improvements.

- i. <u>Maintenance Obligations</u>. Each Party, its successors and assigns, shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements and the Utility Improvements located on its property, subject to potential reimbursement as set forth below, and shall maintain the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements and the Utility Improvements in a good, safe and sightly condition suitable for their intended use and in accordance with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations. The Parties, their successors and assigns, agree to cooperate with the other during all such maintenance, repair or replacement.
- ii. Failure to Perform. In the event either Party, its successors or assigns, fails to maintain, repair or replace the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements and/or the Utility Improvements located on its property in the manner indicated or within a reasonable time (30 days) after the reasonable request by the other Party, then such non-defaulting Party shall be entitled to perform the same, and is hereby granted a right of entry onto the defaulting Party's property, with such personnel, materials and equipment as may be necessary for the purpose of performing any obligation that such defaulting Party has not timely performed. The defaulting Party shall reimburse the non-defaulting Party for all costs associated with the repair, replacement or maintenance undertaken by the non-defaulting Party on such defaulting Party's property within 30 days of demand.
- iii. Reimbursement of Costs for Maintenance. Although each Party, its successors and assigns, shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements and the Utility Improvements located on its own property, the Parties hereby agree and acknowledge that all costs for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the Shared Facility, the Shared Access Improvements and the Utility Improvements shall be divided as follows:
- a. HomeField 1 shall be responsible for (i) thirty-three and one third percent (33.33%) of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing all Shared Access Improvements and Utility Improvements, and (ii) fifty percent (50%) of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing the Shared Facility.
- b. HomeField 2 shall be responsible for (i) thirty-three and one third percent (33.33%) of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing all Shared Access

Improvements and Utility Improvements, and (ii) fifty percent (50%) of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing the Shared Facility., and

c. Landlord shall be responsible for thirty-three and one third (33.33%) of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing all Shared Access Improvements and Utility Improvements.

Thus, each Party may demand reimbursement from the other Party and Landlord for its percentage share of the costs of maintaining, repairing and replacing the Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and Utility Improvements, as applicable, and these costs shall include any utility costs for the Shared Facility and Shared Access Improvements, as applicable. Such reimbursement shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt by either Party or Landlord of a written invoice for the reimbursement amount. The reimbursement amount shall be modified if the maintenance, repair or replacement is necessitated by damage to the Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Improvements, as applicable, by one of the Parties or its Permitted Users or Landlord, in which event that Party or Landlord shall be solely responsible for the cost of such maintenance, repair or replacement.

The Parties hereto acknowledge that Landlord has further granted certain access easements and utility easements burdening the HomeField 1 Property and Homefield 2 Property pursuant to that certain Declaration of Access Easement dated March 1, 2018, which was recorded on March 5, 2018 as document number 1532381 and that certain Declaration of Utility Easement March 1, 2018, which was recorded on March 5, 2018 as document number 1532382 (collectively, the "Declarations"), for the benefit of the owners of the adjacent land, as described in the Declarations, respectively (collectively, the "Benefitted Property Owners"). Pursuant to the Declarations, the Benefitted Property Owners, as applicable, are obligated to bear a percentage of the cost of maintaining, repairing and replacing the improvements constructed within the easements granted therein (the "Benefitted Properties' Share"). To the extent that either of HomeField 1 or HomeField 2, individually or collectively, bear the full cost of any maintenance, repair or replacement of the improvements described in the Declarations, Landlord covenants that it shall promptly reimburse HomeField 1 and HomeField 2, as applicable, pursuant to the percentages set forth in this Section A(12)(iii) above, for the amount of the applicable Benefitted Property Owners' respective Benefitted Properties' Share.

iv. <u>Effect of Non-Payment; Lien.</u> Should HomeField 1 or HomeField 2 default in the payment of any amounts required hereunder and such default shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice thereof, said amounts shall become a continuing lien on the property owned by the party or parties in default (the "Defaulting Parties"), which shall bind the Defaulting Parties, their successors and assigns, and the parties not in default (the "Non-Defaulting Parties") may bring an action at law against the Defaulting Parties to pay the same, and there shall be added to the amount of such costs and expenses the cost of preparing and filing the complaint in such action. In the event a judgment is obtained, reasonable attorneys' fees shall be paid to the prevailing parties. The Non-Defaulting Parties shall have the right, but not the obligation, to record

their liens against the property interest owned by the party in default, but at all times their liens pursuant to this section shall be subject and subordinate to (a) the lien of any mortgage now or hereafter held by any mortgagee, or any extension, renewal, modification or refinancing thereof, on the Defaulting Parties' properties, whether or not such mortgage or any extension, renewal, or modification or refinancing is recorded before or after the lien in favor of the Non-Defaulting Parties; (b) the leasehold estate created by any lease of all or any part of the Defaulting Parties' parcels; and (c) any other lien or contract for deed of record against the Defaulting Parties' properties of the date that the Non-Defaulting Parties' liens are recorded. No party may waive nor otherwise escape liability for the costs and expenses provided for herein by non-use of the easements or abandonment of its property.

- **B.** Covenants to Run with Land. HomeField 1, HomeField 2, and Landlord hereby agree that the license, easements, restrictions, reservations, rights and obligations set forth herein shall run with the property burdened and shall be binding on all parties having any right, title or interest in the same, their heirs, successors and assigns.
- Casualty and Condemnation. Should any portion of the Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Improvements be condemned, otherwise taken, or subject to a casualty, the Parties agree to pay the cost of replacing such Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Improvements located on its respective parcel without contribution from the other Party, except as otherwise provided for in Section A(8) with respect to casualties caused by the actions or omissions of any Party or its respective Permitted Users. The Party with the condemned or damaged Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Improvements on its property shall be responsible for coordinating replacement of such Shared Facility, Shared Access Improvements and/or Utility Improvements.
- **D.** <u>Waiver</u>. Any waiver by any Party of any default of the other Party hereunder shall not affect or impair any right arising from any subsequent default.
- E. <u>Severability</u>. If any clause, provision or portion of this Agreement is deemed to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable under present or future laws, then the remainder of the Agreement shall remain unaffected but the illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision shall be modified in such a way that effectuates the intention of this Agreement but complies with all applicable laws.
- **F.** <u>Captions</u>. The caption of each paragraph of this Agreement is for convenience only and shall not be considered in the interpretation or construction of any provision of this Agreement.
- **G.** <u>Amendment or Modification</u>. This Agreement and any of the rights, licenses and easements created hereby may not be modified or terminated except by a written instrument executed by all parties with a property interest in the HomeField 1 Property and the HomeField 2 Property, including without limitation any leasehold mortgagees.

- H. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.
- I. Notice to Limited Partner. A copy of all notices required or permitted to be given hereunder to HomeField 1 and HomeField 2 shall also be given to the Investor Limited Partner of each of HomeField 1 and HomeField 2, as applicable, Wells Fargo Affordable Housing Community Development Corporation, at MAC D1053-170, 301 South College Street, 17th Floor, Charlotte, North Carolina 28202-6000, Attention: Director of Asset Management. The Investor Limited Partner of HomeField 1 and HomeField 2, as applicable, shall have the right, but not the obligation, to cure any default of HomeField 1 and HomeField 2, as applicable, hereunder and such cure shall be deemed to have been made by HomeField 1 and HomeField 2, as applicable.





In 2015, we constructed the underground utilities, streets, paths, and street lighting for the Prairie Farms Addition. In the process, we missed a path connection that was planned to be installed between the Drain and 31st Street. The original location was to be behind the lots located south of the pond, but we have that graded now so that a path is physically unable to be built at that location. We have made arrangements with the Park District to install a path north of the pond this summer. The Park District bid out a project to construct a park north of this location near the Burger King on 52nd Avenue S and has included this path connection with that project. I would like to split the cost of this path connection with the Park District. The estimated cost is around \$60,000, so we would each pay \$30,000 for the installation of the path. I would recommend matching the Park District funds by using Sales Tax funds.

Emergency Storm Sewer Spot Repair

The Engineering Department has been working with the Public Works Department to address a recently discovered storm sewer issue on 25th Avenue S at the intersection of 26th Street S.



The Public Works Department discovered a large amount of gravel in the pipes and it appears to have come from a deteriorated pipe/manhole connection. There is a large void (depth in excess of four-foot probe) under the asphalt pavement and the limits of the void are unknown until the pavement is removed.

On May 17, 2018, Engineering requested quotes from eight qualified, local contractors to perform the repair. Four contractors responded with quotes and they are Dakota Underground, Key Contracting, Fox Underground and Master Construction. All quotes were submitted by 10 am on May 21, 2018.

Because the storm sewer main is nearly 15 feet deep, the plan is to close the road on Tuesday, May 22, 2018 and have the roadway open on Monday, June 8, 2018. This closure is necessary in order to expedite the repair as well as for public safety.

Due to the depth of the repair and the necessary traffic control, we anticipate the cost of the repair will be approximately \$50,000.

Please find attached for your consideration an Agreement in Draft for the Remediation and Coordination of the former site of NSP's Manufactured Gas Plant located in the 12th Street right of way and adjacent properties. The purpose of this agreement is to outline the parties' responsibilities with respect to the work to be completed to remove the contaminated soils, in conjunction with the City project to install Watermain, Sanitary and Storm Sewer, and replace paving. The Agreement is in substantially final form, and your approval is sought to permit the Mayor to sign the final agreement when completed. NSP's contractor intends to commence the remediation work in early July, with the anticipated transfer of control of the work site to the City of Fargo contractor not later than July 31, 2018.

Suggested Motion: I move to authorize the Mayor to execute a final Remediation Coordination and Road Use Agreement with NSP for the removal of contaminated soil on the former Manufactured Gas Plant site and other contaminated soil remediation needs in substantially similar form as presented for consideration.

Remediation Coordination and Road Use Agreement

This Remediation Coordination and Road Use Agreement ("Agreement"), is made and entered into as of this ______ day of _____(the "Effective Date") between and by Northern States Power Company, a Minnesota corporation ("NSP") and the City of Fargo, a North Dakota municipal corporation (the "City") (collectively the "Parties"):

WHEREAS, beginning in June 2015, NSP performed a multi-media environmental investigation of the former manufactured gas plant (MGP) site, including an investigation along NP Avenue, North University Drive, 12th Street North, and 1st Avenue North, and several adjacent alleyways, along with other private properties in the vicinity (collectively the "MGP Site") (see MGP Site figure attached as Exhibit 1); and

WHEREAS, NSP prepared a Remedial Investigation/Focused Feasibility Study (RI/FFS) Report which documented the findings of the environmental investigation, human health risk assessment, and focused feasibility analysis of remediation alternatives. The RI/FFS also identified the proposed remedy for the MGP Site which included targeted source removal (including targeted source removal in 12th Street North) along with institutional controls. The RI/FFS Report was submitted to the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDH) for review and approval and was also provided to the City, along with the general public, for review and comment. NDDH approved the RI/FFS on January 20, 2017; and

WHEREAS, NSP plans to implement targeted source removal in 12th Street North in accordance with the approved RI/FFS, (the "12th Street Remediation Work", as identified in Exhibit 2 (NDDH Approved Work Plans for 12th Street); and

WHEREAS, NSP also plans to perform certain activities (such as staging and traffic control) in NP Avenue, 12th Street North, and 11th Street North to support NSP's MGP Site

project, as further detailed in Exhibit 3 (Traffic Control Plan and Exhibit 4 (ROW Detail Plan), collectively referred to herein in as "NSP's Other ROW Work".

WHEREAS, NSP's 12th Street Remediation Work and NSP's Other ROW Work will be performed in 2018 in coordination with the City's planned infrastructure improvements in 12th Street North (the "City Improvement Project") as identified in Exhibit 5 (Coordination Plan).

WHEREAS, as part of the City's Improvement Project, the City plans to install the City infrastructure, defined herein as "City Infrastructure"). In order to avoid disruption to property owners in the area, the Parties agree that NSP shall install a certain water main and service line, a sewer line, and a storm sewer line as specifically identified on Exhibit 4 (the "NSP Installed City Infrastructure") and the costs NSP incurs for this work will be offset by work the City agrees to perform or eliminate for the 12th Street Remediation project.

WHEREAS, NSP desires to perform the 12th Street Remediation Work prior to, and in coordination with, City construction activities for the City Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, in order to perform the 12th Street Remediation Work, excavated soils that are contaminated and, therefore, cannot be reused on site and which are generated during the implementation of the 12th Street Remediation Work and/or generated during the City Improvement Project, may be transported by the NSP Representatives and/or the City to, and staged at NPS's Soil Staging Area at the MGP Site (see attached Exhibit 6 - Figure showing the ROW coordination, including the Soil Staging Area at the Heartland Property), prior to NSP transporting the excavated soils to a landfill for permanent disposal; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to coordinate the remediation work to be completed by NSP and the installation of City infrastructure in such a way to minimize costs and ensure the safety and security of the public and contractors.

NOW THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. General Use of Right of Ways. NSP, and its employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors (collectively the "NSP Representatives") shall be permitted to use public right of way in such a manner as described herein, as modified from time to time by written agreement of the parties hereto. Specifically, the NSP Representatives shall be permitted to exercise control over city right of ways adjacent to the MGP Site, including 11th Street North, 12th Street North, NP Avenue, University Drive, and 1st Avenue, and several adjacent alleyways, under certain terms and conditions as stated herein. NSP will, during any use of City public right of way at the MGP Site, use due care to protect City streets, utilities and all other public property and private utilities occupying the public right of way.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> The NSP Representatives_may utilize City right of way for a period of 12 months from the Effective Date of this Agreement. Any request for extension must be made at least one month prior to the expiration of this Agreement in order to allow City adequate time to consider the request.
- 3. <u>Termination</u>. NSP must remedy any unsafe or unsatisfactory condition due to the use of the City right of way, as determined by City in its sole discretion. If concerns persist, and no remedy can be agreed upon, City may require the NSP Representatives to vacate the City right of way use permitted herein and return the roadway to its pre-existing condition

- 4. <u>Permits</u>. The NSP Representatives shall secure all necessary permits from the City to engage in the intended construction activities, including but not limited to, wastewater treatment permits, and such other permits as required by City.
- 5. Haul Routes from MGP Site. The NSP Representatives intend to use the following haul routes for the demolition debris and contaminated soils removed from the MGP Site. (See Attached Haul Route Figure Exhibit 7). NSP and the NSP Representatives shall comply with Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) safety standards and shall follow the traffic control plan approved by City, attached hereto as Exhibit 3. NSP understands and agrees that City may require flaggers, when safety protocols warrant such measures.
- 6. <u>Use of 11th Street North</u>. The NSP Representatives shall be permitted to use the right of way on 11th Street North adjacent to the MGP Site, so long as one path of pedestrian travel is available at all times on 11th Street North, located on the east side of the MGP Site. The NSP Representatives shall be allowed to stage its water filtration equipment on the west side of 11th Street North during the entire course of the project as shown on Exhibit 6. The NSP Representatives shall be permitted discharge into an existing sanitary sewer service on 11th Street North adjacent to the MGP Site.
- 7. <u>Use of NP Avenue</u>. NSP agrees and understands that at no time shall vehicle lanes be closed on Northern Pacific (NP Avenue). The City agrees that parking may be removed for limited periods of time when pre-approved by City.
- 8. Coordination Work in 12th Street North and Use of 12th Street North.

- a. NSP plans to perform the 12th Street Remediation Work prior to the City's Improvement Project in 12th Street. This work involves removing soil as identified in Exhibit 1 (the "Targeted NSP Soil Removal Limits Area").
- b. NSP agrees to provide a 6' chain link protective fence around the perimeter of the entire site12th Street Targeted NSP Soil Removal
 Limits Area from commencement of the 12th Street Remediation Work in early July 2018, until transfer to the City's contractor, in the location as identified on attached Exhibit 6.
- c. City shall be responsible for the notification and coordination of services to the affected property owners along 12th Street North, except as provided for in ¶8(f)(iii) herein..
- d. City shall establish temporary water service for all buildings and occupants prior to July 10, 2018 the NSP's commencement of the 12th Street Remediation Work. City shall be responsible for all testing and placement of the temporary water service.
- e. The NSP Representatives shall be responsible for installing the NSP

 Installed City Infrastructure. The NSP Representatives shall perform

 pressure testing of the NSP installed water main, engaging City processes.

 The City shall be responsible for bacteriological testing of the NSP installed water main.

- f. The NSP Representatives will remove certain City Infrastructure that is being replaced by the City, and which is surrounded by impacted MGP residuals prior to the City's Improvement Project, by completing the following tasks:
 - Locate existing utilities within the Targeted NSP Soil Removal
 Limits Area in 12th Street North;
 - ii. Remove concrete within the Targeted NSP Soil Removal LimitsArea
 - Targeted NSP Soil Removal Limits Area, including removal and replacement of storm sewer sections, watermain and sanitary sewer sections removal of sections of the abandoned water line and cap ends at the excavation limit, reconnection of the water service to Prairie Roots Coop and Wild Terra Cider and Brewing with minimal disruption to their service to the extent within the NSP Representatives' control (estimated disruption is 4-6 hours) dependent on weather and other factors that may be beyond the NSP Representatives' control, and terminate all abandodned water and sanitary services in accordance with City Specifications. Such disruption to service to Prairie Roots Coop and Wild Terra Cider and Brewery shall be arranged by NSP in advance of disruption, at

times and for such durations as agreed to by NSP and the business entities.

- compaction of Class III engineered fill to 95% standard proctor density in the Targeted Soil Removal Area upon completion of the NSP 12th Street North Remediation Work. The NSP Representatives must provide and complete compaction tests from a certified testing firm. Engineered fill used for backfilled trenches will be subjected to gradation tests, and NSP agrees to secure a minimum of one (1) compaction tests per minimum of each 2 feet compacted lift per 50 linear feet of infrastructure improvements in the Targeted NSP Soil Removal Limits Area. The top 6" of backfill shall be crushed concrete, in accordance with applicable City Specifications.
- h. During performance of the 12th Street North Remediation Work, NSP agrees to utilize a qualified consultant to inspect the work and ensure compliance with applicable City Standards and Specifications (see Exhibit 8). City shall have a City Inspector available to consult with NSP to ensure compliance with applicable City Standards and Specifications during site work hours.
- i. During performance of the 12th Street North Remediation Work, the NSP Representatives shall be responsible for providing appropriate site lighting along 12th Street North in the Targeted Soil Removal Area in order to deter entrants, and shall be responsible for the general cleanliness and

- appearance of the 12th Street Remediation Work area. NSP is solely responsible for site security in 12th Street **Targeted NSP Soil Removal Limits Area** until such time as the City Project transitions to the City contractor.
- When NSP completes the 12th Street North Remediation Work (currently anticipated to be around July 21, 2018), it shall inform the City it is ready to transfer control of 12th Street North to the City, so that the City may commence its City Improvement Project. At or before that time, NSP's consultant shall provide City all survey notes, testing reports, and daily field reports to the City Inspector available at completion of work, including providing copies of daily reports and logs. The City shall also be permitted access to the site to video tape the storm and sanitary sewer lines before City acceptance of the utilities. The City may accept control of the Site within 3-days' notice of NSP's completion of the 12th Street North Remediation Work, but not before July 31, 2018 unless City Contractor is available. NSP shall retain control of the site until the City Contractor's availability is confirmed (the "Transfer of Control"), unless the City has identified a non-compliance with applicable City Standards and Specifications that must be first resolved. During the threeday notice period, NSP shall continue to be responsible for securing the work area in 12th Street North.
- k. When City accepts Transfer of Control, NSP shall transfer control of 12th
 Street North including but not limited to all erosion control devices and

certain public safety and traffic control devices (except for devices that NSP was renting and does not own, such as traffic control signs and cones) on 12th Street North to the City. The NSP Representatives will coordinate with the City Contractor prior to removing the fencing that the NSP Representatives installed . . NSP must retain control and security of the site until the City Contractor accepts responsibility, which shall be no later than July 31, 2018, as provided for in the Special Instructions to Bidder for Project Br-18-H1.

- 1. At the time of Transfer of Control, NSP shall assign the material and workmanship warranty provided by Veit & Company, Inc. ("Veit") for the NSP Installed City Infrastructure that NSP agreed to install in 12th Street to the City. NSP does not and shall not assign any other warranties to the City, and specifically retains for itself the right to enforce all other warranties provided by Veit in NSP's agreement with Veit, including, without limitation, Veit's material and workmanship warranty with respect to other portions of the MGP Site work performed by Veit.
- m. During the City's performance of the City Improvement Project in 12th
 Street, NSP will perform limited environmental project support to City
 Contractor, as defined in Exhibit 5 (Coordination Plan Exhibit).
- 9. Restoration. Prior to commencing work under this Agreement, NSP shall photograph
 City right of way baseline conditions in the MGP Site area along 12th Street North

This letter is in response to your time extension request dated March 30, 2018. You have requested a 28-day extension to the interim completion date of April 1, 2018 for completion of the storm sewer lift station.

On November 13, 2017, it was determined that the elevation of the storm outlet at the lift station was lower than the proposed outlet pipe installed on project BN-17-B1. To correct this issue, Master Construction had to core a new north invert into the 108" manhole and grout the factory cast invert closed. This elevation discrepancy also required invert elevation revisions to the east and south inverts of the precast gate well structure. At the time this discrepancy was noticed, shop drawings for the gate well had been approved, but the structure had not been cast.

Revised shop drawings were submitted to Master Construction on November 15, 2017. On November 22, 2017 shop drawings were received from Forterra. KLJ and AE2S reviewed the submitted shop drawings and resubmitted the approved shop drawings to Master Construction on November 28, 2017. The time difference between the elevation discrepancy and shop drawing approval is 16 days. To justify the additional 12 days requested, please provide documentation from Forterra outlining the impacts this revision had to their schedule for casting the gate well.

You have also requested additional time because Cass County Electric delayed getting power to the site. This power was needed for heating the excavation for the cast in place lift station. We feel that this extension is not reasonable because the plans and specifications do not state that power would be provided by a certain date. The need for power was based on means and methods of construction.

Based on the information above, the revised interim completion date is April 17, 2018. If you are able to obtain records from Forterra explaining any delay in casting due to the required revision, we will review that information and apply additional time as warranted. Except for the potential additional time based on the information from Forterra, no additional time extensions will be granted for this interim completion date unless the scope of work for the lift station is modified going forward.
