

1. Fences or Walls

In the case of fences or walls, height shall be measured from ground level on the higher side of the fence or wall.

Exceptions to Height Limits

Zoning district height limits do not apply to belfries, cupolas, spires, domes, monuments, airway beacons, radio/communication towers, structures for essential services, windmills, flagpoles, chimneys, radio/television receiving antennas or chimney flues. Height limits also do not apply to any dormer, bulkhead, elevator, water tank, or to any similar structure or necessary mechanical appurtenance extending above the roof of any building if such structure does not occupy more than 33 1/3 percent of the area of the roof. No dormer may exceed the highest point or peak of the structure to which the dormer is attached even when the structure is exempt from a height limitation.

Section 2. Penalty.

A person who willfully violates this ordinance is guilty of an infraction. Every person, firm or corporation violating an ordinance which is punishable as an infraction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500; the court to have power to suspend said sentence and to revoke the suspension thereof.

Section 3. Effective Date.

INTRODUCTION & STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

The City of Fargo, North Dakota (City) is issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP) from qualified firms or individuals to provide government relations and legislative advocacy services for the City during the 66th North Dakota Legislative Assembly at the State Capitol in Bismarck, ND. The selected firm or individuals will be expected to provide a wide range of professional services and will work closely with the City Commission, City Administrator, and appropriate City staff on all state legislative matters.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Fargo City Administrator coordinates the City's legislative program on behalf of the City Commission and the organization. The Board of City Commissioners identifies, considers, and approves legislative and policy positions that are consistent with advancing the City's legislative agenda. The City's government relations contractor(s) work in collaboration with the City Commission, City Administrator, and staff to prepare legislative advocacy materials (e.g. written testimony and exhibits); coordinate with other cities and the North Dakota League of Cities (NDLC); and communicate regular, timely updates to the City Commission and City staff throughout the Legislative Session.

Interested firms or individuals should prepare and submit a proposal consistent with the instructions provided in this RFP. The City reserves the right to select one, more than one, or none of the proposals submitted to the City for consideration.

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The scope of work presented below is representative, although not exhaustive, of tasks assigned by the City to the government relations and legislative advocacy contractor(s). These tasks include:

- Initiate, organize, and conduct internal planning/coordination sessions with the City Commissioners and City staff on legislative matters of significance to Fargo. The service provider(s) shall develop a comprehensive understanding of the City's legislative initiatives and history on specific issues.
- Assist the City's elected officials and staff to prioritize current legislative interests. Provide strategy, guidance, and background information to focus the City's legislative interests to ensure success.
- Assess the capacity of the City's elected officials and staff to assist with direct government relations activities. - B. The City will not reimburse any expenses incurred by the firm or individual submitting responses, including but not limited to expenses associated with the preparation and submission of the response and attendance at interviews.
- C. The City reserves the right to accept one, accept more than one, or reject any and all proposals; to request additional information from any or all Proposers; and to suggest modifications to the terms and conditions offered by a Proposer.

Proposal Content

Proposals must contain the following elements:

- A. *Title Page* which contains the name of the proposing firm/individual, its address, telephone number, name of the contact person, and the date of submittal.
- B. *Firm/Individual Profile* that contains the firm or individual's organizational history and credentials, including:
 - Who will be assigned to the project and a description of their responsibilities.
 - The size of firm and its capacity/availability to perform work on behalf of the City.

Based upon a review of the proposals and such other evaluation as may be necessary, the City Administrator will request that the City Commission approve the appointment of the firm/individual(s) determined to be the most responsive and responsible. Approval of the recommendation and authorization of the professional services agreement is at the sole discretion of the City Commission.

Walker Consultants is pleased to submit this proposal to provide professional Engineering /Landscape Architecture services to the City of Fargo. Walker proposes to team with local Landscape Architect Hanson Design Associates (HDA) to assure competent and local representation for our work. For the Block 9 development we propose services to help assure the City will receive fair value for its investment in the project. To complete this task, we will review the designs, monitor and observe the construction of the parking garage, and public plaza and monitor pay application submittals, on behalf of the City of Fargo.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The City of Fargo has entered into a public-private partnership with Block 9 Partners to construct a mixed-use building, a parking garage, and a public plaza. The City of Fargo is providing \$15 million towards the construction of a 379 car parking garage and a public plaza. The City of Fargo will be providing monthly payments to the developer as the parking garage and plaza are constructed.

With this involvement City of Fargo is interested in contracting with an experienced and responsible Engineer/Architect familiar with the design of parking facilities and landscape plazas to review and monitor the progress of the project. The goal of the work shall be to review the plan documents to determine if the design of the parking garage is consistent with generally accepted standards.

The Engineer/Architect will also periodically review the work during construction to determine if the parking garage and plaza is being constructed in conformance with plans/specifications, and review requests for payments to verify that work is acceptably completed for requested payment amount. The City is not contracting for services to perform QC testing, or to provide any construction administration services for the mixed-use building.



SCOPE OF SERVICES

To assure the interest of the City are well represented, we propose the following scope of services:

GENERAL

- 1. The Walker & HDA team will serve as the City's representative with a focus on protecting the City's interests for design and construction of the parking facility and public plaza.
- 2. Provide project oversight for public plaza and garage design and procurement, coordinating with the City of Fargo departments (Strategic Planning and Building Department) as required.
- 3. Walker will attend Owner meetings as required to communicate project findings. Include (3) meetings provided during course of project duration, typically coordinated with site observation. Start-up, mid construction and punchlist meeting.

TASK 1 - PARKING REVIEW

We will conduct a design review of the project parking garage to identify conformance of the proposed design to meet industry standard practices and adherence with federal law and state building codes for parking access, stall size, and accessibility.

- 1. Review construction drawings and specifications, including demolition plans, surveys, reports, and records or reports of salient nature as provided by the City and developer.
- 2. Provide parking facility functional design review providing quantitative Level of Service grading of elements of parking structure function. Components reviewed shall include parking circulation, parking area geometry, driving surface slope, parking access and revenue control lanes, and bank service lanes.
- 3. Provide a written facility design review report (electronic copy *.PDF) with drawings or sketches as appropriate to identify Parking Level of Service, and overall assessment of design to meet industry standards for user comfort, facility material selection and application.
- 4. Review garage design review report with City to answer questions and resolve any concerns.
- 5. Review public plaza design to identify industry standard application for landscape and unit hardscape materials utilized not to include ice rink or fountains.

TASK 2 - PROJECT OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE

- 1. Field questions, assess project schedule, and respond to questions of City staff.
- Provide site observation to evaluate construction compliance with plans and specifications.
- Garage site observation shall begin during foundation construction and be complete at substantial
 completion. Garage site observations (13) thus total including owner meetings and punchlist review
 shall be provided, on a nominal monthly basis to coincide with pay application review.
- 4. Public Plaza site observations to review general progress shall occur twice a month, for a total of twelve (12 thus) observations.
- 5. Site observation shall verify construction progress and general conformance with plans and specifications.
- 6. During the construction administration phase, review project quality control test results for compliance with construction documents.
- 7. Provide Garage and Public Plaza site observation written summary reports. Reports to identify project work completion percentage estimate, notation of work in progress, work completed, and work not in



- general conformance with plans and specifications. Job site visits will be at intervals appropriate to the stage of construction.
- 8. Review Architect/Engineer's punchlist at substantial completion and provide recommendations to City staff for additional corrective action as appropriate.

WORK NOT IN SCOPE

- 1. Review of shop drawings is not provided. This service may be contracted as an additional service as requested by City.
- 2. Services to perform QC testing, or to provide any construction administration services for the mixed-use building.

SCHEDULE

Walker is available to begin upon receipt written authorization to proceed. For Task 1, we estimate that to perform our review we will need two weeks of time after receiving provided documents. For Task 2, we will work with the City beginning before ground breaking and throughout construction to substantial completion estimated to be approximately 1 year.



DATE: OCTOBER 18, 2018

AIRBNB, Inc. is company that offers booking services for accommodations through an internet based platform. This service has become a popular way for people to use their existing real estate to rent to others and a way to expand accommodation offerings.

The City of Fargo has a lodging tax in place and AIRBNB is subject to these lodging taxes. The Convention and Visitor's Bureau requested that we execute a tax collection agreement so that we can begin to collect the lodging taxes on this new service.

The City Attorney's Office and the Finance Committee reviewed this collection agreement and recommends approval. The City can terminate this agreement for convenience with a 30-day notice requirement.

Suggested Motion:

Approve an agreement with AIRBNB, Inc. for the collection of lodging taxes pursuant to section 3-13 of the lodging tax ordinance.

VOLUNTARY COLLECTION AGREEMENT FOR CITY OF FARGO, NORTH DAKOTA LODGING TAX

THIS VOLUNTARY COLLECTION AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is dated

, 2018 and is between AIRBNB, INC., a Delaware corporation ("Airbnb")

and the CITY OF FARGO, a NORTH DAKOTA MUNICIPAL CORPORATION. Each party may be referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Airbnb represents that it provides an Internet-based platform (the "Platform") through which third parties offering accommodations ("Hosts") and third parties booking such accommodations ("Guests") may communicate, negotiate and consummate a direct booking transaction for accommodations to which Airbnb is not a party ("Booking Transaction");

WHEREAS, the Taxing Jurisdiction and Airbnb enter into this Agreement voluntarily in order to facilitate the reporting, collection and remittance of applicable lodging taxes ("Lodging Tax") imposed under applicable Fargo, North Dakota law (the applicable "Code"), on behalf of Hosts for Booking Transactions completed by Hosts and Guests on the Platform for accommodations located in Fargo, North Dakota (the "Taxable Booking Transactions"); NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS, PROMISES AND AGREEMENTS CONTAINED HEREIN, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- (A) Solely pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including only for periods in which this Agreement is effective (defined below), and solely for Taxable Booking Transactions completed on the Platform, Airbnb agrees contractually to assume the duties of a Lodging Tax collector as described in the Code solely for the collection and remittance of Lodging Tax (hereinafter referred to as a "Collector"). The assumption of such duties shall not trigger any other registration requirements to which Airbnb is not otherwise subject.
- (B) Starting on ______ (the "Effective Date"), Airbnb agrees to commence collecting and remitting Lodging Tax on behalf of Hosts, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, at the applicable rate, on Taxable Booking Transactions. Except as set forth in Paragraph (L) below, Airbnb shall not assume any obligation or liability to collect Lodging Tax for any period or for any transaction prior to the Effective Date or after termination of this Agreement.

REMITTANCE OF LODGING TAX

(C) Airbnb agrees reasonably to report aggregate information on the tax return form prescribed by the Taxing Jurisdiction, including an aggregate of gross receipts, exemptions and adjustments, and taxable receipts of all Lodging Tax that is subject to the provisions of this Agreement. Airbnb shall remit all Lodging Tax collected from Guests in accordance with this Agreement and Airbnb's Terms of Service (www.airbnb.com) (the "TOS") in the time and manner described in the Code or as otherwise agreed to in writing.

AIRBNB LIABILITY

- (D) Pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, Airbnb agrees contractually to assume liability for any failure to report, collect and/or remit the correct amount of Lodging Tax, including, but not limited to, penalties and interest, lawfully and properly imposed in compliance with the Code. Nothing contained herein nor any action taken pursuant to this Agreement shall impair, restrict or prevent Airbnb from asserting that any Lodging Tax and/or penalties, interest, fines or other amounts assessed against it were not due, are the subject of a claim for refund under applicable law or otherwise bar it from enforcing any rights accorded by law.
- (E) During any period for which Airbnb is not in breach of its obligations under this Agreement, the Taxing Jurisdiction agrees to audit Airbnb on the basis of Lodging Tax returns and supporting documentation, and agrees not to directly or indirectly audit any individual Guest or Host relating to Taxable Booking Transactions unless and until an audit of Airbnb by the Taxing Jurisdiction has been exhausted with the matter unresolved. The Taxing Jurisdiction reserves the right to audit any individual Airbnb Host for activity that has been brought to the attention of the Taxing Jurisdiction in the form of a complaint or other means independent of this Agreement or independent of data or information provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- (F) The Taxing Jurisdiction agrees to audit Airbnb on an anonymized transaction basis for Taxable Booking Transactions. Except as otherwise agreed herein, Airbnb shall not be required to produce any personally identifiable information relating to any Host or Guest or relating to any Booking Transaction without binding legal process served only after completion of an audit by the Taxing Jurisdiction of Airbnb with respect to such users. The Taxing Jurisdiction agrees that it will not audit or issue an assessment against Airbnb more than once per

any consecutive forty-eight month period and that such audit or assessment will be limited to a consecutive twelve-month period within the forty-eight month period.

(G) Airbnb, Inc. agrees to register as a Collector for the sole purpose of reporting, collection and remittance of Lodging Tax under this Agreement and will be the registered Collector on behalf of any affiliate or subsidiary collecting Lodging Tax.

GUEST AND HOST LIABILITY

(H) During any period in which this Agreement is effective relating to Taxable Booking Transactions, provided Airbnb is in compliance with its obligations herein, Hosts shall be relieved of any obligation to collect and remit Lodging Tax on Taxable Booking Transactions, and shall be permitted but not required to register individually with the Taxing Jurisdiction to collect, remit and/or report Lodging Tax. Nothing in this Agreement shall relieve Guests or Hosts from any responsibilities with respect to Lodging Tax for transactions completed other than on the Platform, or restrict the Taxing Jurisdiction from investigating or enforcing any provision of applicable law against such users for such transactions.

WAIVER OF LOOK-BACK

(I) The Jurisdiction expressly releases, acquits, waives and forever discharges Airbnb, its current or past affiliated parent or subsidiary companies, directors, shareholders investors, employees and other agents, and/or Hosts or Guests from any and all actions, causes of action, indebtedness, suits, damages or claims arising out of or relating to payment of and/or collection of Lodging Tax or other tax indebtedness, including but not limited to penalties, fines, interest or other payments relating to Lodging Tax on any Taxable Booking Transactions prior to the Effective Date. Nothing contained in this Paragraph of this Agreement will constitute a release or waiver of any claim, cause of action or indebtedness that the Jurisdiction may have or claim to have against any Host or Guest unrelated to Taxable Booking Transactions under this Agreement.

NOTIFICATION TO GUESTS AND HOSTS

(J) Airbnb agrees, for the purposes of facilitating this Agreement, and as required by its TOS, that it will notify (i) Hosts that Lodging Tax will be collected and remitted to the Taxing Jurisdiction as of the Effective Date pursuant to the terms of this Agreement; and (ii) Guests and Hosts of the amount of Lodging Tax collected and remitted on each Taxable Booking Transaction.

LIMITATION OF APPLICATION

(K) This Agreement is solely for the purpose of facilitating the administration and collection of the Lodging Tax with respect to Taxable Booking Transactions and, except with respect to the rights and liabilities set forth herein, the execution of or actions taken under this Agreement shall not be considered an admission of law or fact or constitute evidence thereof under the Code or any other provisions of the laws of the United States of America, of any State or subdivision or municipality thereof. Neither Party waives, and expressly preserves, any and all arguments, contentions, claims, causes of action, defenses or assertions relating to the validity or interpretation or applicability of the Code, regulations or application of law.

DURATION/TERMINATION

(L) This Agreement may be terminated by Airbnb or the Taxing Jurisdiction for convenience on 30 day written notification to the other Party. Such termination will be effective on the first day of the calendar month following the 30 day written notification to the other Party. Any termination under this Paragraph shall not affect the duty of Airbnb to remit to the Taxing Jurisdiction any Lodging Tax collected from Guests up through and including the effective date of termination of this Agreement, even if not remitted by Airbnb to the Taxing Jurisdiction as of the date of termination.

MISCELLANEOUS

- (M) CHOICE OF LAW. This Agreement, its construction and any and all disputes arising out of or relating to it, shall be interpreted in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of North Dakota without regard to its conflict of law principles.
- (N) MODIFICATION. No modification, amendment, or waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both Parties.
- (O) MERGER AND INTEGRATION. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement, and supersedes all prior negotiations, agreements and understandings with respect thereto.
- (P) COUNTERPARTS. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, when taken together, shall constitute one and the same instrument. The Agreement shall become effective when a counterpart has been signed by each Party and delivered to the other Party, in its original form or by electronic mail, facsimile or other electronic means. The Parties hereby consent to the use of

electronic signatures in connection with the execution of this Agreement, and further agree that electronic signatures to this Agreement shall be legally binding with the same force and effect as manually executed signatures.

- (Q) RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES. The Parties are entering into an arm's-length transaction and do not have any relationship, employment or otherwise. This Agreement does not create nor is it intended to create a partnership, franchise, joint venture, agency, or employment relationship between the Parties. There are no third-party beneficiaries to this Agreement.
- (R) WAIVER AND CUMULATIVE REMEDIES. No failure or delay by either Party in exercising any right under this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of that right or any other right. Other than as expressly stated herein, the remedies provided herein are in addition to, and not exclusive of, any other remedies of a Party at law or in equity.
- (S) FORCE MAJEURE. Neither Party shall be liable for any failure or delay in performance under this Agreement for causes beyond that Party's reasonable control and occurring without that Party's fault or negligence, including, but not limited to, acts of God, acts of government, flood, fire, civil unrest, acts of terror, strikes or other labor problems (other than those involving Airbnb employees), computer attacks or malicious acts, such as attacks on or through the Internet, any Internet service provider, telecommunications or hosting facility. Dates by which performance obligations are scheduled to be met will be extended for a period of time equal to the time lost due to any delay so caused.
- (T) ASSIGNMENT. Neither Party may assign any of its rights or obligations hereunder, whether by operation of law or otherwise, without the prior written consent of the other Party (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld). Notwithstanding the foregoing, Airbnb may assign this Agreement in its entirety without consent of the other Party in connection with a merger, acquisition, corporate reorganization, or sale of all or substantially all of its assets.
- (U) MISCELLANEOUS. If any provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to law, the provision shall be modified by the court and interpreted so as best to accomplish the objectives of the original provision to the fullest extent permitted by law, and the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in effect.

NOTICES

(V) All notices under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given upon: (i) personal delivery; (ii) the third business day after first class mailing postage prepaid; or (iii) the second business day after sending by overnight mail or by facsimile with telephonic confirmation of receipt. Notices shall be addressed to the attention of the following persons, provided each Party may modify the authorized recipients by providing written notice to the other Party:

Proposal:

The applicant is seeking approval of a minor subdivision, entitled **Oakcreek Second Addition**, which is a replat of Lots 26 and 27, Block 1, of Oakcreek Addition. The subject properties are located at 4496 and 4497 Oakcreek Drive and encompasses approximately 1.49 acres.

The applicant is proposing the subdivision in order to facilitate a land-swap between the City of Fargo and a homeowner, which is necessary for flood protection purposes. The subject property is located adjacent to Rose Coulee (Drain #27), where recent flood protection projects have resulted in the construction of a levee across the City-owned portion of the subject property. The proposed plat would essentially relocate the shared lot line between the existing privately-owned lot and City-owned lot by replatting these two existing lots into two new lots.

This project was reviewed by the City's Planning and Development, Engineering, Public Works, and Fire Departments ("staff"), whose comments are included in this report.

Surrounding Land Uses and Zoning Districts:

- North: SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential with single family residential use
- East: SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential with park use
- South: AG, Agricultural with drain use
- West: SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential with vacant land used for flood protection

Area Plans:

No area plans apply.

Schools and Parks:

Schools: The subject property is located within the Fargo School District and is served by Centennial Elementary, Discovery Middle, and Davies High schools.

Parks: The subject properties abut Oak Creek Park (4403 25th Street S) where multipurpose field and shelter amenities are provided.

Pedestrian / Bicycle: There is an off-road bike facility located along 25th Street South. This bike facility is a component of the metro area bikeways system.

Staff Analysis:

Minor Subdivision

The LDC stipulates that the following criteria is met before a minor plat can be approved:

 Section 20-0907.B.3 of the LDC stipulates that the Planning Commission recommend approval or denial of the application, based on whether it complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. Section 20-0907.B.4 of the LDC further stipulates that a Minor Subdivision Plat shall not be approved unless it is located in a zoning district that allows the proposed development and complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.

The subdivision is intended to adjust the location of the shared lot line between two lots in association with flood protection projects. In accordance with Section 20-0901.F of the LDC, notices of the proposed plat have been sent out to property owners within 300 feet of the subject property. To date, staff has not received any inquiries. Staff has reviewed this request and finds that this application complies with standards of Article 20-06 and all applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. (Criteria Satisfied)

2. Section 20-907.C.4.f of the LDC stipulates that in taking action on a Final Plat, the Board of City Commissioners shall specify the terms for securing installation of public improvements to serve the subdivision.

While this section of the LDC specifically addresses only major subdivision plats, staff believes it is important to note that any improvements associated with the project (both existing and proposed) are subject to special assessments. Special assessments associated with the costs of the public infrastructure improvements are proposed to be spread by the front footage basis and storm sewer by the square footage basis as is typical with the City of Fargo assessment principles. (Criteria Satisfied)

Planning Commission Recommendation: July 6, 2017

On July 6, 2017, by a vote of 8-0 with two commissioners absent, the Planning Commission voted to accept the findings and recommendations of staff recommend approval to the City Commission of the proposed subdivision plat, **Oakcreek Second Addition**, as the proposal complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06, and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.



The sub-recipient shall be reimbursed only upon receipt of a Reimbursement Request with supporting documentation (i.e., invoices and proof of payment, quotes) for the allowable equipment, planning, training, and exercise items. Request must be submitted online through the DES Grants software program.
- 5. Any deviation of the Scope of Service and expenditure of funds on items not in the approved cost lines, without prior written NDDES approval, will result in grant funds requested being denied.
- 6. At the conclusion of the period of performance, unexpended funds will be de-obligated. By signing the Notice of Grant Award, the sub-recipient is authorizing NDDES to reallocate and/or expend the de-obligated funds on program costs.
- 7. Sub-recipient is required to follow the applicable provisions of the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards located at Title 2, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 200.
- 8. Sub-recipient must ensure that federal funds do not replace (supplant) funds that have been budgeted for the same purpose through non-federal sources.
- 9. Sub-recipient must comply with the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Council on the Environmental Quality (CEQ) Regulations for Implementing the Procedural Provisions of NEPA.

RE: 2019 Resolution Prescribing Forestry Utility Rates

Commissioners:

Please find the attached amended resolution prescribing the forestry utility services rate change that was approved in the Mayor's 2019 budget. The resolution increases the commercial fee only to \$14.00 per month, effective January 1, 2019. Current rate is \$5.50 per month. Fees collected provide the resources needed to continue forestry department programs currently in place including curbside brush chipping, residential tree planting, Dutch Elm Disease management, ash diversification, pruning, and land development code street tree enforcement.

Background:

Utilizing the services of KLJ under the Public Works Master Services Agreement, a Forestry Utility Growth Plan and Rate Analysis was completed in early 2018. As the city continues to grow so does the need for future planning. Forestry service areas are set to increase significantly within the next 15 years with reconstruction projects, new plantings, downtown revitalization, medians and planting beds, LDC street tree requirements, in-fill, EAB preparation, pruning goals, wood waste utilization/management, and a continuous rise in street tree population.

Through the analysis it was determined that commercial properties are under paying relative to the services they are receiving. Commercial properties have nearly 23% of the total tree population, but pay just 12% of the forestry revenue whereas residential properties have approximately 68%, and pay 72%.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move to approve the attached resolution prescribing the commercial forestry utility rate increase effective January 1, 2019.

Meter Vault Installation Agreement with West Fargo

Dear Commissioners:

As you may recall, the sewer agreement between Fargo and West Fargo included a volumetric component of \$3.00/1000 gallons of treated wastewater for billing purposes. The agreement also spelled out that Fargo would install and own the point of connection/meter vault for purposes of monitoring, calibration and maintenance. West Fargo was responsible for the installation of the conveyance force main from their collection system to the point of connection/meter vault.

Recently, Dakota Underground was awarded the contract as the apparent low bidder for the West Fargo force main and lift station improvements (West Fargo Project No.1308). Wastewater Utility staff and their consultant contemplated utilizing a change order with the West Fargo/Dakota Underground contract to speed up the process, eliminate coordination, and completion issues that could arise with multiple contractors. Below are other advantages to include the point of connection/meter vault as a change order to the West Fargo/Dakota Underground contract:

- One contractor responsible for start-up, testing and warranty items.
- One contractor responsible for road maintenance and repairs.
- Eliminate a three month bidding process (advertising, contracts, ordering materials etc.).
- Have a consistent completion date for both projects.
- Earlier date to start treating West Fargo wastewater.
- Exhibits that Fargo is making every effort to accept wastewater when West Fargo is ready.

Dakota Underground provided a change order amount of \$822,770 to include the meter vault installation in conjunction with the West Fargo force main. This amount is in line the engineers estimate provided by Advanced Engineering. Fargo/West Fargo legal counsel have provided the appropriate documents to formalize this agreement, and placed on the respective commission agendas. The agreement spells out contractual, payment and ownership details & responsibilities.

The West Fargo force main installation and connection to the meter vault is to be completed by May 2019. The installation cost of the meter vault structure was included in the 2018 Wastewater Infrastructure Rate Fund 521 3065.

Recommended Motion

Wastewater Utility staff recommend approval of the Meter Vault Installation Agreement between Fargo and West Fargo.

THIS AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into this d	lay of
, 2018 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the City of Fargo, a	North
Dakota municipal corporation ("Fargo"), and the City of West Fargo, a North Dakota mun	icipal
corporation ("West Fargo").	

WHEREAS, Fargo and West Fargo entered into a Sewer Agreement effective July 1, 2017, by which the parties agreed to arrangements for installation of sewer infrastructure that would permit the transportation of sewage from West Fargo to Fargo, among other things; and

WHEREAS, West Fargo has solicited bids for construction and installation of a sewer force main to a point of connection at or near 19th Avenue North and 57th Street (the "Point of Connection") and West Fargo has entered into a contract for such construction and installation with Dakota Underground Company (the "Construction Contract"); and

WHEREAS, Fargo has requested that West Fargo undertake a change order to the Construction Contract by which Dakota Underground Company will install a meter vault and associated appurtenances, said meter vault and associated appurtenances to be located on the east side of the Point of Connection with Fargo taking full responsibility for all costs associated with said change order, and West Fargo is willing to honor said request; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to memorialize the terms and conditions stated herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. At Fargo's request, and subject to the terms and conditions hereof and to the consent by Dakota Underground Company, West Fargo will enter into an amendment to the Construction Contract by way of approving Change Order No. 2 to said Construction Contract. A copy of Change Order No. 2 is attached as **Exhibit A**, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference, with Change Order No. 2 calling for the installation of a meter vault and associated appurtenances.
- 2. Fargo grants to West Fargo and its agents, representatives, employees, and contractor, Dakota Underground Company, the right in, on, over, under, across, and through such land and lands at the construction site of the meter vault and associated appurtenances, a depiction of said lands is attached as **Exhibit B**, for the following purposes: constructing and installing the meter vault and associated appurtenances, and other related improvements; excavating, piling, storing, depositing, spoiling, spreading, and removing excavated dirt, soil, clay, silt, and other materials; storing and removing equipment, materials, and supplies; removing obstructions and any other vegetation, structures, or obstacles from the land described in **Exhibit B**; and the right to perform any other work

- necessary and incident to the construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances.
- 3. Fargo is responsible for all costs associated with Change Order No. 2, including direct and indirect construction costs paid to Dakota Underground Company, and reasonably allocated engineering or other consulting fees and or legal expenses incurred by West Fargo that are generated in order to undertake Change Order No. 2 for construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances. West Fargo will separate and deliver invoices related to Change Order No. 2 to Fargo. Fargo is then responsible for paying the invoices as provided under the Sewer Agreement, dated July 1, 2017. In the event additional change orders are required to complete construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances, West Fargo agrees to communicate and cooperate with Fargo regarding the need for the change order and the respective costs associated with the change order.
- 4. Dakota Underground Company has executed this Agreement solely for the purpose of indicating its consent to this Agreement between the Cities of Fargo and West Fargo and to the assignment by West Fargo to Fargo of any and all warranties associated with the construction and installation of the said meter vault and associated appurtenances pursuant to Change Order No. 2.
- 5. With respect to Change Order No. 2, West Fargo will obtain from Dakota Underground Company assurance that upon completion of construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances, Dakota Underground Company will accept and consent to the assignment of any warranties or other commitments from West Fargo to Fargo.
- 6. Upon completion of the construction and installation under Change Order No. 2, Fargo will assume ownership, operation, maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, and removal of the meter vault and associated appurtenances, at its sole cost and expense. West Fargo will not have any responsibility for ownership, operation, maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, or removal of the meter vault or associated appurtenances upon completion of the construction and installation under Change Order No. 2.
- 7. The parties are individually responsible for maintaining insurance as required by the Sewer Agreement, dated July 1, 2017.
- 8. This Agreement is not to be construed as a joint powers agreement. The parties will be individually liable as provided under N.D.C.C. Chapter 32-12.1. The parties' liability will not exceed an amount that is more than the limitations upon liability imposed by N.D.C.C. Chapter 32-12.1. Under no circumstances will either Fargo or West Fargo, regardless of whether it may have waived the limit on liability set forth in Chapter 32-12.1 of the N.D.C.C., be required to pay on behalf of itself or the other party, any amounts in excess of the limits on liability established in N.D.C.C. Chapter 32-12.1 applicable to any one (1) party. The limits of liability for Fargo and West Fargo may not be added together to determine the maximum amount of liability for each party.

- No amendment, modification, or waiver of any condition, provision, or term shall be valid or of any effect unless made in writing signed by the party or parties to be bound, or a duly authorized representative, and specifying with particularity the extent and nature of such amendment, modification, or waiver. Any waiver by any party of any default of the other party shall not affect or impair any right arising from any subsequent default.
- 10. Fargo and West Fargo hereby indemnify and hold the other harmless from any and all claims arising out of the construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances. Said indemnification will include, *inter alia*, attorney's fees, damages, whether punitive, economic, or compensatory, and costs and disbursements. However, this paragraph will not apply to suits against either Fargo or West Fargo arising out of its own negligence or intentional acts, or those of its officers, employees, agents, or representatives. The purpose of creating this duty to defend and indemnify is to simplify the defense of claims by eliminating conflicts among defendants, and to permit liability claims against multiple defendants from a single occurrence to be defended by a single attorney.
- 11. Both Fargo and West Fargo will be responsible for damages to or loss of its own equipment. Both parties waive the right to sue the other party for any damages to or loss of its equipment, even if the damages or losses were caused wholly or partially by the negligence of the other party or its officers, employees, agents, or representatives.
- 12. Each provision, section, sentence, clause, phrase, and word of this Agreement is intended to be severable. If any provision, section, sentence, clause phrase, and word hereof is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- 13. This Agreement will terminate upon completion of construction and installation of the meter vault and associated appurtenances or upon a date that is one (1) year from the Effective Date first written above, whichever occurs first. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days' written notice to the other party of the intent to terminate.
- 14. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same agreement, and shall become effective when one or more counterparts have been signed by each of the parties and delivered to the other party.





Dear Commissioners:

The City of Fargo Transit Department (MATBUS) received a request from Jefferson Lines to rent space at our Ground Transportation Center (GTC). Jefferson Lines is currently located in West Fargo, out by the fair grounds. Their current location does not have access to the MATBUS system. It would better serve Jefferson and MATBUS passengers to have access to both the intercity and interstate transit systems in the same building.

We are currently undergoing a transit facilities study for all transit locations, which makes this an ideal time to discuss a potential partnership. Jefferson would have no more than two vehicles at our facility at any one time and would employ their own staff to sell tickets and assist their passengers. They would also need to have their own office space in the GTC. Jefferson received a grant from NDDOT for \$125,000, or \$150,000 with their local match, which would be used to construct office space for them. Our consultant, KU, is working on incorporating them into our long-term design (attached idea). Jefferson would like to be located at the GTC sometime in the first quarter of 2019 (January – March timeframe).

This request was approved by City of Fargo Finance Committee on September 17, 2018.

Recommended motion is to approve staff to receive commercial appraisals for the space at GTC and being working on a draft lease agreement to submit to City Commission for final approval.





Background:

With the early onset of poor weather conditions, staff is seeing an increase of short notice requests to work on Sunday, which does not allow us the ability to get Commission approval. Nancy Morris, Assistant City Attorney, and myself have reviewed the City Ordinance along with the Century Code and cannot find anything that prohibits the City from allowing Sunday work, except within the contract. Today the contract reads under Miscellaneous:

No work will be done on Sunday except in case of emergency. The City Commission can waive this provision if the Contractor sufficiently establishes an emergency exists.

This Contract with all its forms, plans, profiles, specifications and stipulations shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators or assigns of the said Contractor, and upon the successors or assigns of the City as if each and all of them had been specifically mentioned.

We are recommending that is should read:

Sunday work shall not be permitted without the express permission of the City Engineer or designee a minimum of 48 hours in advance. Sunday work shall only be permitted when work demands require it, or in the event of an emergency, and shall not be considered the normal course of operations. Denial of the ability to work on Sunday shall not warrant a time extension and may be appealed to the board of City Commission.

Decisions will be based on having the appropriate staff available along with material testing.

Recommended Motion:

Authorize the City Engineer or designee to evaluate advanced requests for Sunday work and make a determination of approval for existing contracts and approve the rewording of the Contract under Miscellaneous as follows:

Sunday work shall not be permitted without the express permission of the City Engineer or designee a minimum of 48 hours in advance. Sunday work shall only be permitted when work demands require it, or in the event of an emergency, and shall not be considered the normal course of operations. Denial of the ability to work on Sunday shall not warrant a time extension and may be appealed to the board of City Commission.

Project #FM-14-61 consisted of constructing earthen levees and a floodwall along with relocating underground utilities on 40th Avenue South, west of the Drain #27 crossing.

Attached is the final balancing change order in the amount of -\$24,796.35 that reconciles the estimated quantities used in the contract with the final quantities as measured in the field.

The original contract amount for this project was \$3,491,155.80 and this FBCO will bring the final contract amount to \$3,936,982.96 (11.4% Increase). The largest project increases were centered around the discovery and removal of unsuitable material on the north half of the project around the floodwall footing and the necessary road replacement of 40th Avenue South which account for more than \$370,000.00 of the project overrun costs above the bid amount. This project is funded by a combination of ND State Water Commission and Infrastructure Sales Tax (Fund 460) funds.







Project No. FM-14-81 & FM-14-92

Over the past few years, the City and the Diversion Authority have reconstructed storm sewer lift stations #18 (4th Street S) and #23 (2nd Street N) under larger flood mitigation projects. A component of each of these projects was the installation of stand-by generator systems to provide backup power for the lift stations when power is lost. Adjacent to each of these storm sewer lift stations was other City infrastructure that require backup power as well. Due to the close proximity of this other City infrastructure and as a cost decreasing measure, it was determined during the design phase of the flood mitigation projects that the generators for the storm lift stations should be upsized appropriately to provide backup power to this other infrastructure.

The other City infrastructure served is new City Hall (generator shared with STS LS #23) and Sanitary Sewer Lift Station #1 (generator shared with STS LS #18).

Since the storm sewer lift stations are a necessary component of the overall Fargo-Moorhead Diversion project, the Diversion Authority is responsible to pay for the costs associated with the operation and maintence (O&M) of the storm sewer lift stations. Due to this responsibility, the attached memorandum of understandings (MOU) between the City of Fargo and the Diversion Authority are being proposed to designate which party is responsible to complete the O&M on the generators and associated buildings as well as what the appropriate cost share is between the two parties.

As can be seen in the MOUs, it is proposed that the City of Fargo completes the O&M for each generator and is reimbursed by the DA for the DA's share of the costs. The cost share proposed is based on the power needs for each item being served by the generators. The split at STS LS #18 and SAN LS #1, is 60/40, respectively. The split at STS #23 and City Hall is 35/65, respectively.

A copy of the two MOUs are attached for review.

Recommend Motion:

Approve the MOUs between the City and the Diversion Authority, which specifies O&M and cost share responsibilities for the two standby generator systems.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING GENERATOR

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the City of Fargo, North Dakota, a North Dakota municipal corporation, whose address is 200 N 3rd St., Fargo, ND 58102 ("Fargo"), and the Metro Flood Diversion Authority ("Diversion Authority"), whose address is Post Office Box 2806, 211 Ninth Street South, Fargo, ND 58108 (collectively referred to hereinafter as the "Parties").

WHEREAS, Fargo and the Diversion Authority wish to share the cost of maintenance and operation of a Generator constructed by the Diversion Authority to serve the City of Fargo Storm Sewer Lift Station #23, as well as backup power for City of Fargo City Hall; and

WHEREAS, Fargo will construct the building to house the Generator, and make the necessary arrangements for fuel for the Generator; and

WHEREAS, that coordination of the two entities' construction efforts will foster efficiency and may result in cost savings for both entities; and

WHEREAS, Fargo and Diversion Authority have agreed on a cost-sharing basis for this Project;

- 3. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall be ten (10) years, or the useful life of the Generator, whichever comes first. This Agreement will automatically renew for an additional 10 year term, unless otherwise modified or terminated in accordance with the terms stated herein.

4. <u>Cost Share</u>. The total operation and maintence costs associated with the Project shall be split and apportioned between Fargo and the Diversion Authority in the following manner:

The Diversion Authority shall be responsible for thirty-five percent (35%) of the Project costs, Fargo shall be responsible for sixty-five percent (65%) of the Project costs. Fargo shall take primary responsibility for oversight and maintenance, and shall invoice the Diversion Authority its share of the incurred costs.

- 5. <u>Workers Compensation</u>. Each party shall be responsible for injuries or death of its own personnel.
- 6. <u>Damage to Equipment</u>. Each party shall be responsible for damages to or loss of its own equipment. As pertains to the Generator, the parties shall share the costs of damages to or loss of the Generator before completion of the Project in accordance with the cost share formula established in Section 4 of this Agreement.
- 7. Liability. For the purposes of N.D.C.C. § 32-12.1-03 the employees and officers of a party are deemed to be employees of that party. Under no circumstances shall a party, irrespective of whether it may have waived the limit on liability set forth in N.D.C.C. § 32-12.1-03, be required to pay on behalf of itself or the other party, any amounts in excess of the limits on liability established in N.D.C.C. § 32-12.1-03 applicable to any one party. The limits of liability for some or all of the parties may not be added together to determine the maximum amount of liability for each party.
- 8. Continuing Obligations. Upon completion of the Project:
 - A. Fargo will own, operate and maintain the Generator.
 - B. Fargo will maintain the Generator to a minimum level that will ensure the 2nd Street Levee System will continue to meet USACE minimum requirements for acceptance in the USACE Levee Safety Program.
 - C. Fargo shall own, operate and maintain the building as an integral part to the Project.
 - D. Major repairs and/or maintenance shall be cost shared between Fargo and Diversion Authority in accordance with the cost share formula established in Section 4 of this Agreement, and all applicable Policies and Procedures. Major repairs and/or maintenance items are those items which are estimated to exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00).
 - E. Any enhancements or expansions shall be assessed to the entity requesting or requiring the enhancement or expansion.
 - F. Fargo shall track costs and expenses of maintenance of the Generator, and shall submit a yearly invoice for payment for 35% of the total operational and maintenance costs to the Diversion Authority for payment within thirty (30) days of invoice.

- 9. <u>Merger Clause</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement by and between the parties, and any other prior representations or agreements are deemed merged herein, and those not specified herein do not represent any agreements or promises or covenants or representations on the part of either party hereto.
- 10. Written Amendment Required. No amendment, modification, or waiver of any condition, provision or term shall be valid or of any effect unless made in writing signed by the party or parties to be bound, or a duly authorized representative, and specifying with particularity the extent and nature of such amendment, modification or waiver. Any waiver by any party of any default of another party shall not affect or impair any right arising from any subsequent default. Except as expressly and specifically stated otherwise, nothing herein shall limit the remedies and rights of the parties thereto under and pursuant to this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Grammatical Construction</u>. Whenever the singular number is used herein, the same shall include the plural where appropriate, and the words of any gender shall include any other genders where appropriate.
- 12. <u>Severability Clause</u>. Each provision, section, sentence, clause, phrase, and word of this Agreement is intended to be severable. If any provision, section, sentence, clause, phrase, and word hereof is held by a court with jurisdiction to be illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.
- 13. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable to the other party during any period in which its performance is delayed or prevented, in whole or in part, by circumstance beyond its reasonable control. Circumstances include, but are not limited to, the following: act of God (e.g., flood, earthquake, wind), fire, war, act of a public enemy or terrorist, act of sabotage, strike or other labor dispute, riot, misadventure of the sea, inability to secure materials and/or transportation, or a restriction imposed by legislation, an order or a rule or regulation of a governmental entity. If such a circumstance occurs, the Party claiming the delay shall undertake reasonable action to notify the other Party of the same.
- 14. <u>Agreement Binding on Successors</u>. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective personal representatives, successors and assigns.

Background:

Improvement District #PR-18-C1 is for concrete pavement repairs and incidentals on 25th Street South from 2nd Avenue South to 12th Avenue South. The purpose of the project is to correct deficiencies that have appeared over time. Joint and random spalls, longitudinal and transverse cracking, pavement blowouts, and pavement deterioration are present on this pavement section.

The Prime Contractor (Opp Construction), who specializes in concrete repairs, was available to complete three additional concrete repairs in various locations of the City.

Change Order #2 for \$47,618.50 consists of three (3) repair areas:

- 1. On the week of July 16, 2018, the warmer temperatures caused the concrete to expand excessively, thus causing the concrete pavement to buckle on 25th Street South, just north of the 25th Street and 52nd Avenue intersection. The northbound lanes on 25th Street were nearly impassable and needed immediate repair. The Street Department requested Engineering to complete the repairs. Approximately \$32,714 of attached Change Order was for these repairs.
- Similar to above repair, warmer temperatures buckled a concrete median section located on 23rd Avenue South just on the east side of Veteran's Boulevard. Sections of the median curb had ramped up and posted a potential hazard to passing motorist. Approximately \$10,759 of attached Change Order was for these repairs.
- On June 24, 2018, the City received an email from Jim Meyer, who is the manager of Sundance Square Homeowners Association. Jim asked us to examine one of the Sundance Square Street entrances located off 58th Avenue South. Utility Pot Holing on Main Avenue (BR-18-B1)

Background:

As part of the Main Avenue project (BR-18-B1) there have been numerous private utilities that have been identified as being in possible conflict with the proposed infrastructure on this project. To understand which utilities may be in conflict, we have asked 5 Contractors to submit price quotes to complete this work this fall.

We have identified 14 potential conflict sites throughout the Main Avenue corridor and adjacent street returns between 2nd Street and 11th Street. These sites will require lane closures for multiple days each to accomplish the work needed to collect location data on these utilities.

Deadline for submission is Friday, October 12. We anticipate the cost to be approximately \$60k, but will bring a summary to PWPEC for consideration.

Attached you will find the site map where this work will take place for your review.

This work is necessary to rule out potential conflicts that could otherwise slow down the reconstruction of Main Avenue during next year's construction.


Recommended Motion:


