
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
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
1995: Comprehensive Plan


1999: Last major revisions to Land Development Code (LDC)

#### **Kitchen Table Conversation Method**

- Small group conversation (10 to 15 people) organized and facilitated by small teams of Advisory Committee members or others interested in leading these conversations
- Virtual or in-person, depending on what feels right to you and the participants
- Walk participants through a scenario or discussion points provided by czb
- Take good notes and submit a summary

#### **Kitchen Table Conversation Demonstration**

#### **Hypothetical Scenario #2**

Open and recreational space preservation combined with necessary multi-jurisdictional collaboration

Summary: Should Fargo annex and help pay for the acquisition of large amounts of land west of the city to provide unparalleled open and recreational spaces for the public while also forming barriers to westward land development?
