Victim's Rights North Dakota

Assert Your Rights At Any Time

Disclosure



Right to prevent disclosure of information or records that reasonably could be used to locate or harass you or your family, or disclose confidential information about you, and to be notified of any request for this information.

Notice



Right to receive reasonable notice of all court proceedings. Right to attend all court proceedings.

Refusal



Right to refuse an interview or discovery request made by the defendant, the defendant's attorney or any person acting on behalf of defendant. Right to set reasonable conditions if you do consent to interview or discovery.

Voice



Right to be heard in any proceeding involving release, plea, sentencing, adjudication, disposition or parole and any proceeding where your rights are implicated.

Inform



Right to provide information regarding the impact of the defendant's conduct in any pre-sentence investigation, to have that information considered in sentencing or disposition recommendations and to receive a copy of the pre-sentence report or plan of disposition when available.

Copy



Right to receive a copy of any non-confidential record relevant to the exercise of your rights.

Updates



Right to be informed for the defendant's conviction, adjudication, sentence, disposition, place and time of incarceration, detention or other disposition, any release date or the defendant's escape from custody or commitment.

Property & Restitution



Right to the prompt return of your property when it is no longer needed as evidence.

Right to restitution for all losses suffered as a result of the criminal or delinquent behavior.
