Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was signed into law by President George H.W. Bush on July 26, 1990, in the presence of more than 3,000 disability rights advocates; and

WHEREAS, when signing this landmark legislation, President Bush proclaimed the ADA to be "the world's first comprehensive declaration of the equality of people with disabilities," acknowledging their endowment with the same inalienable rights established in the Declaration of Independence; and

WHEREAS, the ADA has sought to ensure that people with disabilities are recognized and respected as equal citizens, including equal opportunities to access inclusive education, affordable housing and gainful employment, while fully participating in the recreational, social and leisure activities in their communities; and

WHEREAS, the ADA works to ensure that people with disabilities are free from discrimination, treated with respect and dignity, and move freely throughout the community, while living in the least restrictive environment; and

WHEREAS, our nation is stronger today because of the ADA and the contributions of persons with disabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, Dr. Timothy J. Mahoney, Mayor of Fargo, do hereby proclaim July 26, 2025 to be
