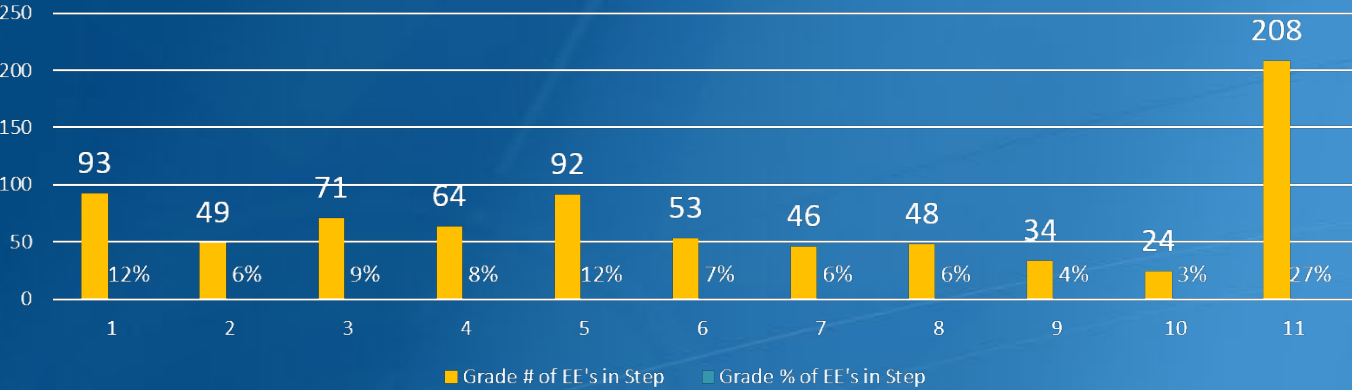

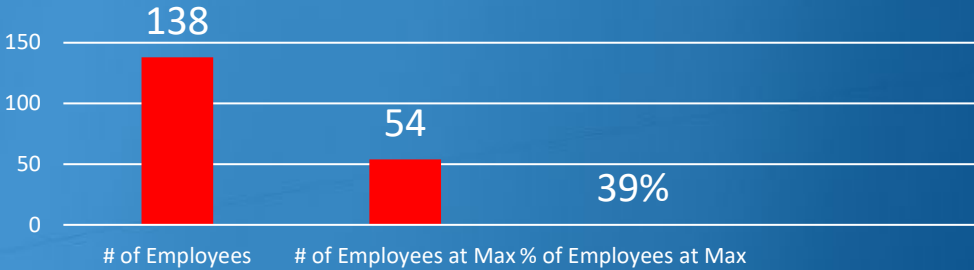

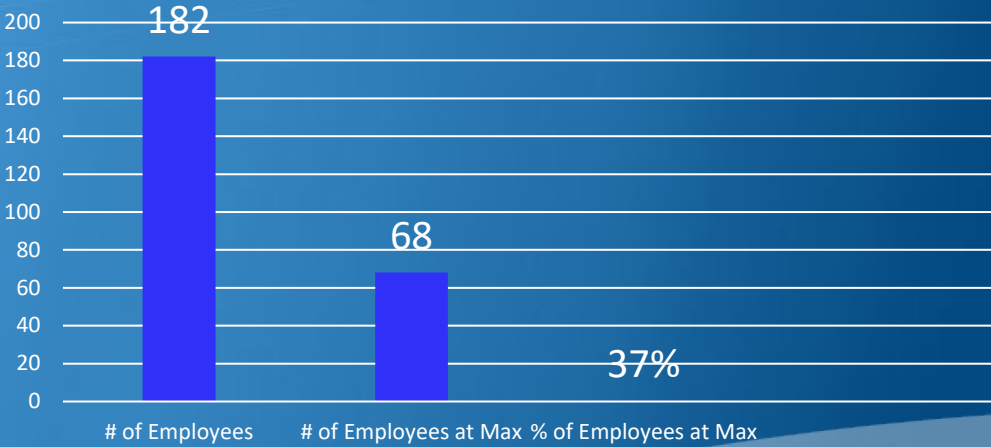
Distribution of Employees (Non-Public Safety) by Step



Fire - Sworn

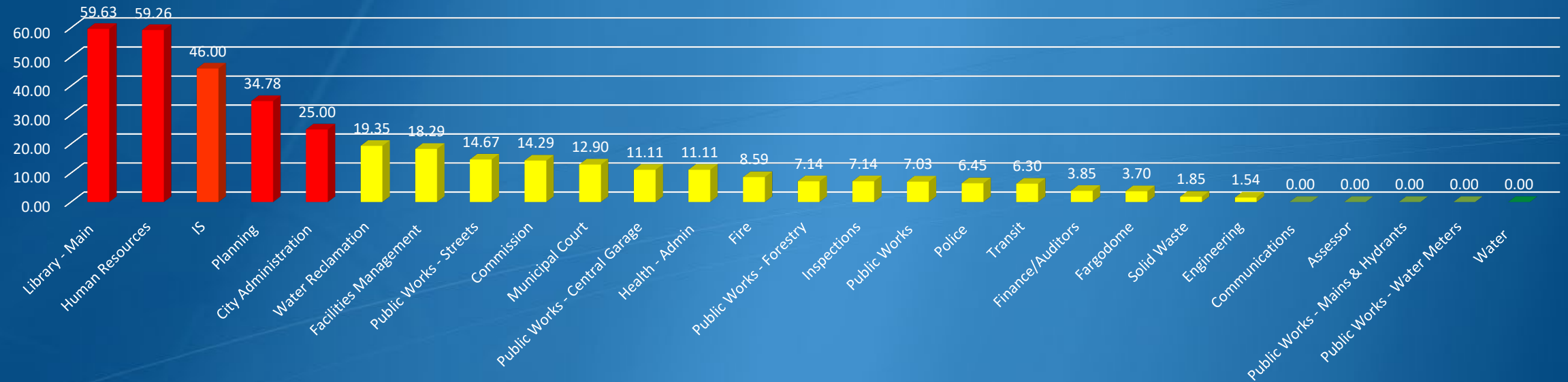

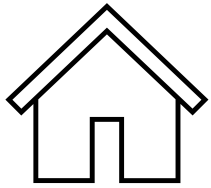

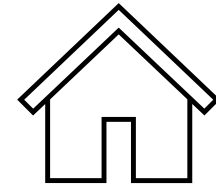

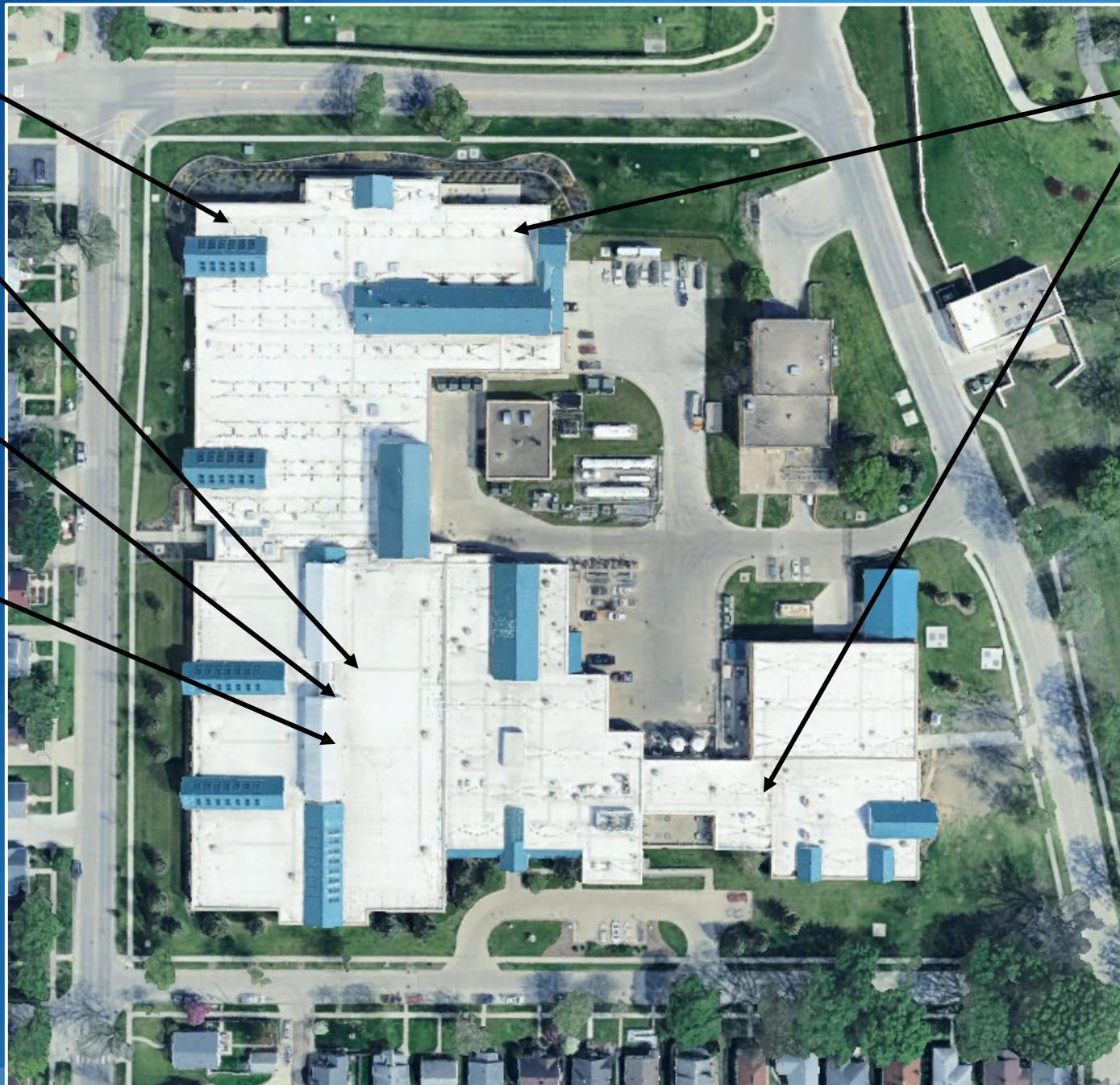

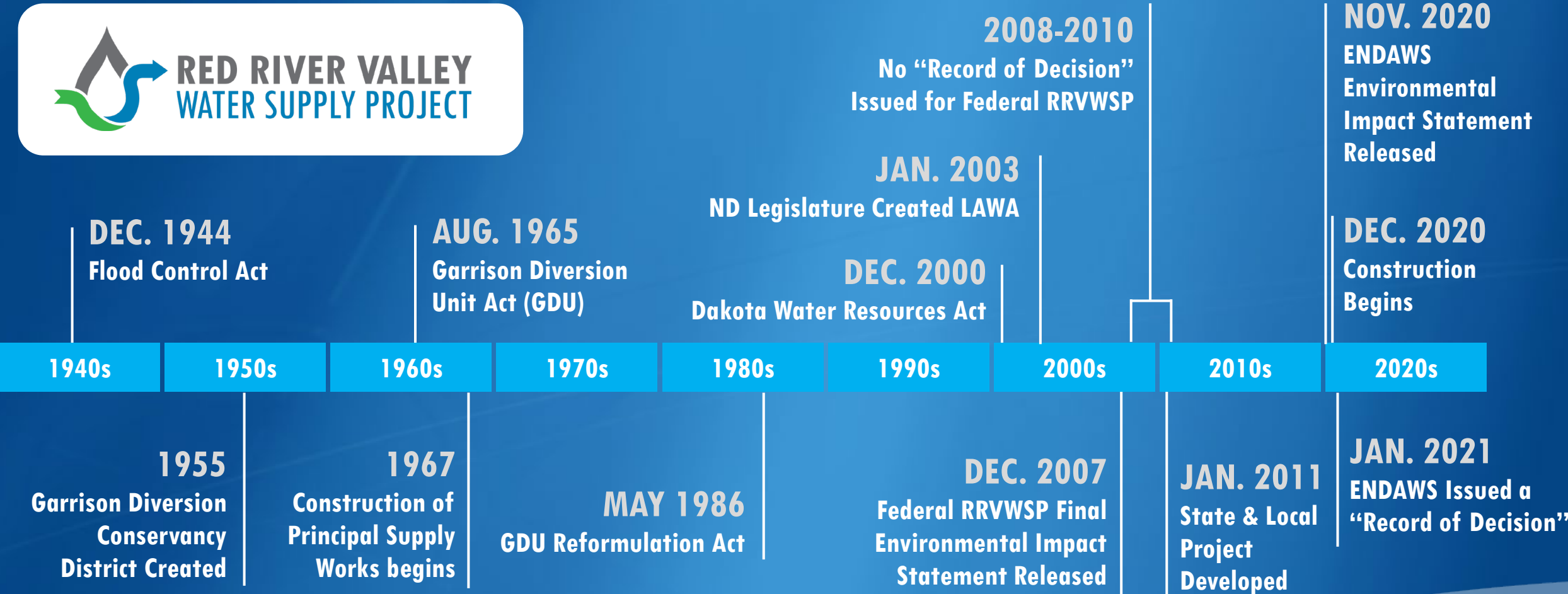

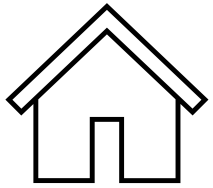

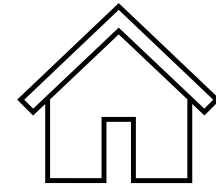

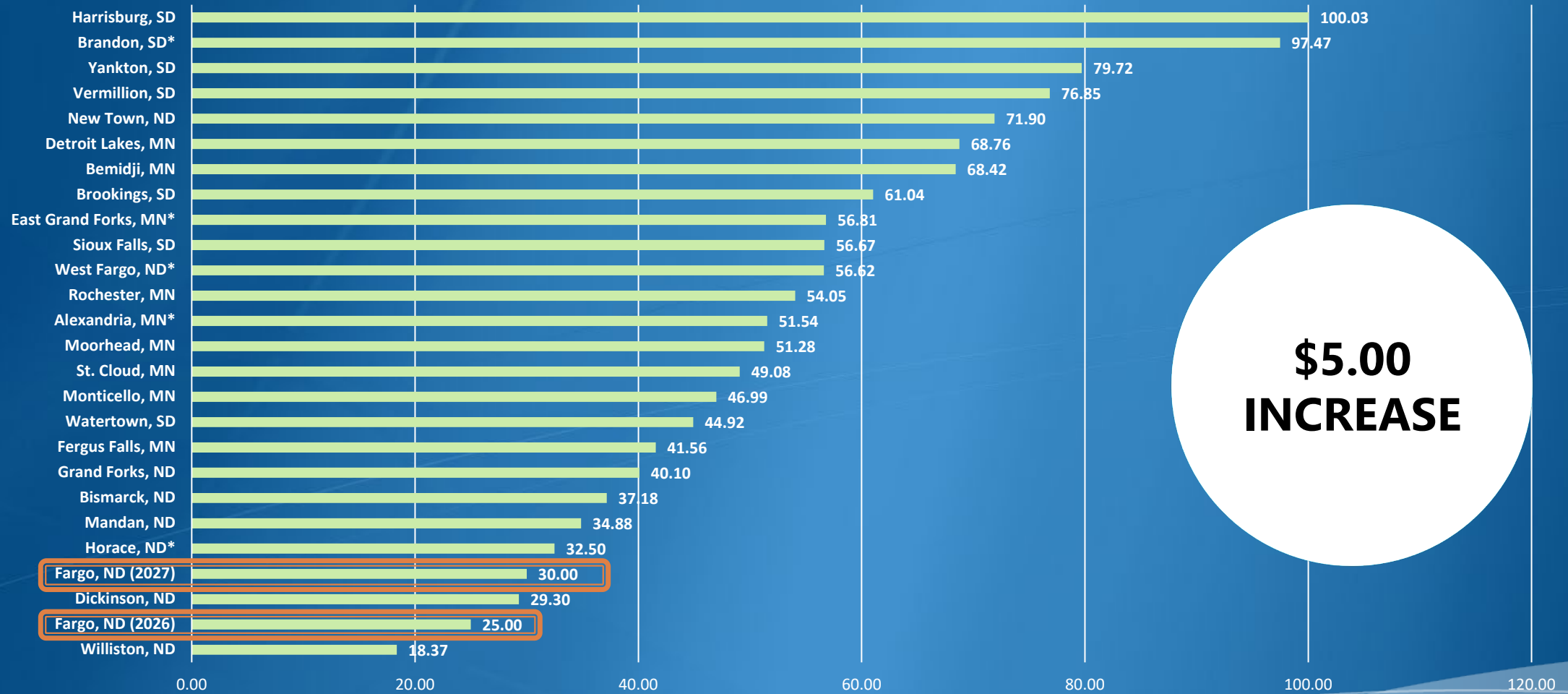

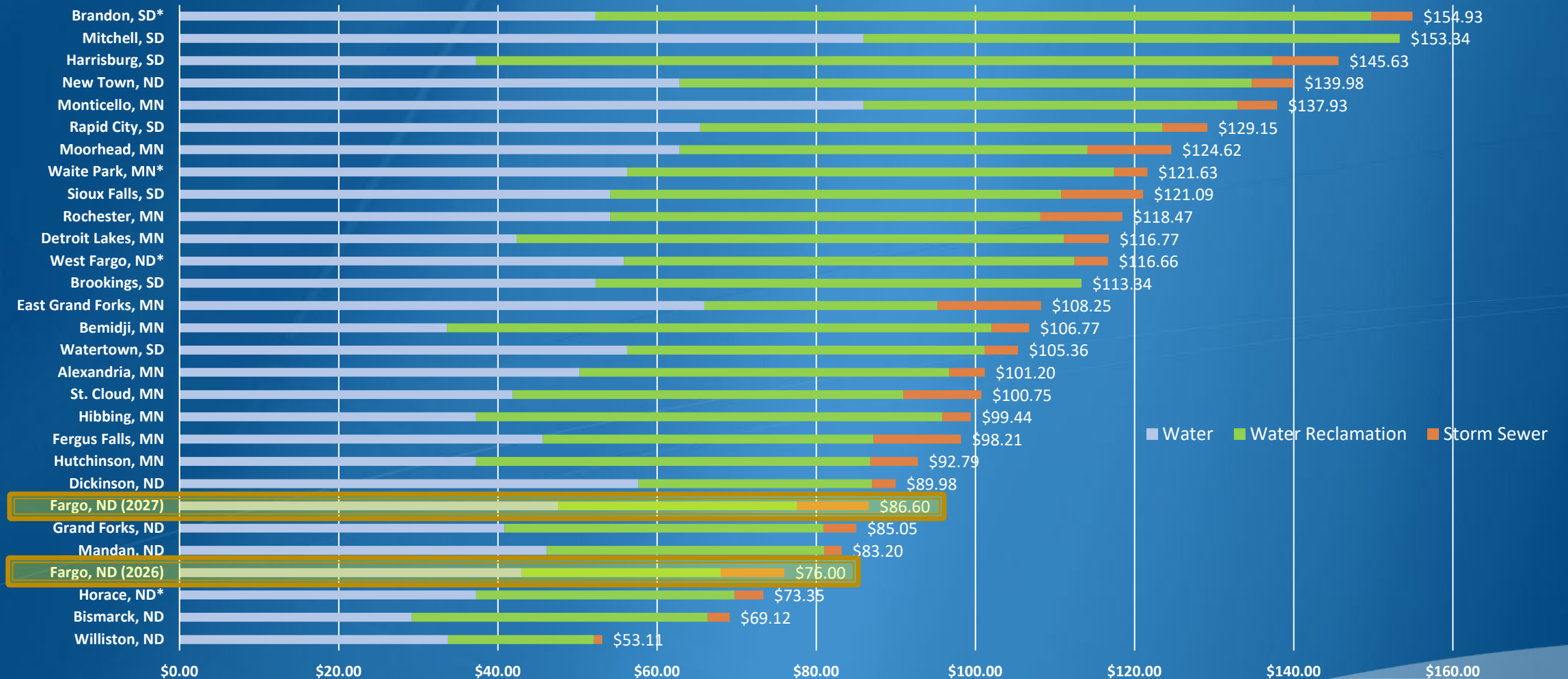
