## 16th Annual Design a Bookmark Contest Kids, Teens, Adults

In 2010, the Fargo Public Library held its first Design a Bookmark Contest. Since then, hundreds of kids have submitted designs hoping that theirs will be the next one chosen. Over the years, we've seen every book, library, and reading pun imaginable, but the thing that keeps us excited is the creativity and care the kids show in their designs. Several years ago, due to demand, we added categories for adults and teens – these too, have demonstrated originality and imagination.

We are continuing the creative tradition this year with the 16th Annual Design a Bookmark Contest. **All ages** are invited to stop by any library location **beginning Sept. 2** and pick up an entry form. Grab your art supplies, fill the space with your most brilliant creation, and **return it before close on Sept. 30**. Need some help with supplies? We've got those too! Ask any library staff for crayons, markers, and more from our Homework Help supplies (in-library use only). The top designs in each age category (as voted on by library staff) will be made into full-color bookmarks that will be printed and distributed throughout the following year at library locations and events. Winners will be announced on Oct. 6.





