City Auditor's Office Directed to Publish Notice of Hearing on an Application Filed by Abdoulie Barry d/b/a F-M Road Force for a Taxicab License: Commissioner Williams Appointed to Serve on the Taxicab License Committee:

The Board received a communication from City Auditor Steve Sprague stating his office received an application from Abdoulie Barry d/b/a F-M Road Force for a taxicab license. He stated in accordance with Article 25, Section 0403, Paragraph B of the Fargo Municipal Code, the application shall be submitted by the City Auditor to the Board of City Commissioners who will set a date for a public hearing and appoint a member of the City Commission to serve on a committee to examine the need for the license. He said the Ordinance calls for the City Auditor's office to publish notice at least 10 days in advance of the time and place for said Hearing, after which the committee would submit their recommendation to the Board.

Commissioner Mahoney moved that the City Auditor's Office be directed to publish a notice of hearing on the application and Commissioner Williams be appointed to serve on the taxicab license committee.

City Attorney Directed to Draft an Ordinance Rescinding Article 25-32 and Amending Articles 25-10 and 25-35 of the Fargo Municipal Code:

The Board received a communication from City Auditor Steve Sprague stating the City of Fargo currently has three articles in the Fargo Municipal Code addressing transactions involving used or secondhand merchandise. He said staff feels the different chapters are somewhat repetitious and believe that the needs of the City and protection of its citizens could be accomplished in just two chapters. Pawnbrokers and secondhand goods dealer's licenses both require a \$250 annual fee, a bond and the use of the LEADS System on-line, while Precious Metals and Gems dealers have a renewal fee of \$100 and no bond, he said. Also, he said, pawnbrokers must record all transactions, while secondhand dealers are only required to record transactions over \$100 or with a unique identifier, and precious metals and gem dealers have no reporting requirements. At this time the required holding period for the two licenses is different and does not require holding within the City limits, he said, therefore, staff is recommending standardizing the holding period for the two licenses and requiring items be held in the City limits. He said if the Ordinance is revoked, the City could provide a more cost effective service to the citizens of Fargo.

Commissioner Sobolik moved the City Attorney be directed to draft an Ordinance Rescinding Article 25-32 and Amending Articles 25-10 and 25-35 of the Fargo Municipal Code to reflect a unified holding period and a requirement that goods be held within City limits.

Second by Mahoney. On call of the roll Commissioners Sobolik, Mahoney, Williams and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.  
The motion was declared carried.

Ordinance Amending Section 10-0311 of Article 10-03 of Chapter 10 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating to Panhandling Tabled Until August 6, 2012:

In response to a question from Commissioner Sobolik regarding how this will impact sororities' and fraternities' fundraising efforts, Assistant City Attorney Jason Loos said these changes should not have an impact as long as they are not within 10 feet of a City intersection.

NDSU Student Body President Luke Brodeur said the sororities and fraternities stand on the corners of 12th Street North and University Drive for 24 hours a day for a week soliciting donations. He said the confusion comes when the individuals come out to the cars for donations and he asked if that would be violation of the Ordinance. He said if it is a violation, the NDSU students would be against the proposed ordinance change, as this is their means of raising money for the charities they support.

Chief of Police Keith Ternes said all activities would be permissible if permission is received from the property owner, or if the individuals are within the same restrictions outlined for any other type of solicitation or panhandling. He said the event at NDSU could take place as it does today, however, the students would have to be within the 10 foot barrier. He said the desire is not to prohibit this in the City, but to improve upon the safety for both the panhandlers and pedestrians who may be approached by someone soliciting or panhandling. Solicitations, panhandling and charitable events will still take place throughout the City, he said, with some reasonable restrictions and barriers to ensure the safety of those individuals engaging in these activities.

In response to a question from Commissioner Sobolik asking whether or not the local homeless coalition or anyone from the homeless community has been contacted about the impacts to those individuals, Mr. Ternes said he has not spoken with anyone and does not believe that the proposed changes will have any direct or immediate impact on the homeless population.

Commissioner Sobolik said she would like to take a step back and get input from the homeless population by having a public input meeting.

Commissioner Sobolik moved the Ordinance Amending Section 10-0311 of Article 10-03 of Chapter 10 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating to Panhandling be tabled for two weeks to allow for a public input meeting with the homeless population.

Second by Mahoney. On call of the roll Commissioners Sobolik, Mahoney, Williams and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

Application to Transfer the Alcoholic Beverage License from Up To Par, Inc. d/b/a Sports Bubble to Cugolfin LLC d/b/a Sports Bubble Approved:

No written protest or objection to the granting of the application has been received or filed in the office of the City Auditor, and said application has been approved by the Police Department as to the character of the applicant.

The Board determined that no person is present at this Hearing to protest or offer objection to the granting of the application.

Planner Nicole Crutchfield said the zoning change is from AG, Agricultural and GC, General Commercial to GI, General Industrial on the entire boundary of the plat.

Commissioner Sobolik offered the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, There have been no written or verbal protests to the request for rezoning and no one is present to protest thereto.

Resolution Adopted Determining Protests Insufficient on Resolution Annexing Approximately 82.10 Acres of Land in a Part of Sections 14, 15 and 23, Township 140 North, Range 49 West:

The Board received a communication from Senior Planner Jim Hinderaker stating on June 11, 2012 the City Commission adopted a Resolution of Annexation to annex approximately 82.10 acres of land located in Sections 14, 15 and 23 of Reed Township. He said the land is located north of 40th Avenue North (Cass Highway 20) and primarily east of 37th Street North. He said notice of the Resolution and the public hearing to determine sufficiency of protest was published in the newspaper and copies were sent to all owners of property in the annexation area. Mr. Hinderaker stated the purpose of the hearing is to determine if protests to the annexation have been filed. He said in the absence of protests filed by the owners of more than one-fourth of the territory proposed to be annexed as of the date of the adoption of the Resolution, the territory described in the Resolution becomes a part of the City. He said the last day to file a written protest was the close of business on Monday, July 23, 2012 and the City Auditors Office did not receive any written protests to this annexation.

Planning Director Jim Gilmour stated the protest period runs up until the end of this meeting and a protest was received today from Luella Holmquist. The written protest constitutes less than 9 acres, he said, and state law reads that the annexation can proceed as long as it is less than 25% of the proposed area. Ms. Holmquist, he said, is concerned that the zoning would change; however, there will be no change in zoning at this time. She also indicates that her property taxes would change when the property is annexed into the City, he said, which is true, however, with only about 8 acres being annexed there would only be an increase of about \$18/year. He stated the City does not annex any more land than is necessary. What could affect her, he said, is special assessments, but a deferral could be done for those, unless there is a change in zoning or development on her property. He said the reason the annexation extends to both sides of the property is due to the fact that it is a section line road and in order for utilities to be put in the City needs to have full jurisdiction of the roadway.

Ron Holmquist, son of Luella Holmquist, said they are concerned about the taxes if annexed into the City and he asked why it is necessary to annex their property.

Mr. Gilmour said this road is under the jurisdiction of the township and in order for the City to be able to maintain it, both sides of the property need to be annexed into the City. He said the most right-of-way that would be acquired is 100 feet and 33 feet of that is already part of the township road, therefore there would only be about a 70 foot strip that may need to be acquired.

In response to a question from Mayor Walaker asking whether or not the City can wait until it is determined how much land is actually needed, Mr. Gilmour said both sides of the road need to be annexed so it was determined that it should be 150 feet. He said if it is something less than that it will have a very nominal change to the property tax or property.

City Engineer April Walker said Mr. Gilmour is correct that the actual right-of-way of the road does not have to be 150 feet; however, that amount was what

had been described as the necessary area to hold the roadway and to provide for the temporary construction easement.

Commissioner Williams said in the future he would like to see the numbers and how those were arrived at. He said he feels that it is important for the property owners to see how the City calculated the numbers.

Commissioner Mahoney offered the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, A Resolution of Annexation was published, as required by law, in the official newspaper for the City of Fargo on June 18 and 25, 2012, annexing approximately 82.10 acres of land located in part of Sections 14, 15 and 23, Township 140 North, Range 49 West of the 5th Principal Meridian, Cass County, North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, The Board of City Commissioners finds protests representing less than 25% of the protest area have been filed with the City Auditor's Office after publication of the Annexation Resolution adopted by the Board of City Commissioners on June 11, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the protests be declared insufficient and that the tract of land described in said Resolution of Annexation be and the same is hereby annexed to, made part of and included within the corporate limits of the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota, and that the City Auditor's Office be and is hereby directed to record said annexation plat in the Cass County Recorder's Office in Fargo, North Dakota.

Second by Sobolik. On the vote being taken on the question of the adoption of the Resolution Commissioners Mahoney, Sobolik and Walaker voted aye.

Commissioner Williams voted nay.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The Resolution was adopted.

#### Defined Benefit Retirement System Plan Design Amendments for City Employees, Police and Fire Pension Systems Approved:

The Board received a communication from the Finance Committee and Pension Boards stating the City Commission has engaged in a thorough review of existing City administered defined benefit pension plans over the past several months. They said based upon the discussions and directive from the City Commission, all of the Pension Boards have met to further discuss potential amendments to the plans with the goal of increasing overall funded status. The pension changes being recommended, they said, will help to reduce City pension obligations and the continuation of prudent and responsible management practices. They said failure to adopt a plan for proactively managing these obligations could have a negative impact on the City's bond rating in the future, which was recently increased due to the City's long history of conservative budgeting and the strength of the local and state-wide economy. They stated funds were restricted in the 2012 budget within the Pension Stabilization Fund for future funding; however, the funds were not formally appropriated for the Police and Fire Pension plans. There is an existing fund balance of \$1,897,000.00, they said, of which \$1,396,000.00 is being recommended to be transferred to the Police and Fire pension plans in the 2012 budget.

Consulting Actuary Mark Meyer said the level of the City's pension benefits is not the problem; however, what has been uncovered is that there have been two problems. The first problem, he said, has been the historical financial problems in the country for over a decade. There were three years in a row, he said, where there were negative stock returns and then the financial crisis of 2008. The next problem that was identified was the contributions from the City have not been adequate to sustain the fund, he said, and there had been the hope that investments would turn around and help solve the problem, but that has not happened. He said a funding policy, is now being recommended which will lessen the liabilities. He said the policy has been arrived at in the right way for the right reasons and still gives the City the flexibility to make real pension reform a reality, to guarantee the security of pension benefits for the employees and to do it in a way that is fiscally responsible and flexible.

At 6:15 the Board took a five-minute recess.

After recess: All Commissioners present except Commissioner Wimmer. Mayor Walaker presiding.

Commissioner Mahoney moved the defined benefit retirement system plan design amendments for the City Employees, Police and Fire Pension Systems be approved as presented, that \$1,396,000.00 be allocated from the Pension Stabilization Fund to the Police and Fire Pension plans and that the pension plans be re-evaluated in six months.

Second by Sobolik. On call of roll Commissioners Mahoney, Sobolik, Williams and Walaker voted aye.

Absent and not voting: Commissioner Wimmer.

The motion was declared carried.

Commissioner Sobolik moved that the Board adjourn to 5:00 o'clock p.m., Monday, August 6, 2012.

Second by Mahoney. All the Commissioners present voted aye and the motion was declared carried.

The time at adjournment was 6:36 o'clock p.m.
