A community garden is a plot of land gardened by people. The land can be owned publicly or privately and can be gardened by either the owners of the land, the people that join the garden, or both. True community gardens are open to everyone and provide an area to grow fruits and vegetables. The garden is divided into plots which can be gardened by individuals or groups. Whether or not there is a cost associated with claiming a plot is up to the owner(s) of the land and/or the organization managing the garden.

This garden has residents who have been gardening there for years that always return to their same plot. If plots are available, additional gardeners are welcome and a meeting is held in the spring (April) to assign plots to newcomers. The garden is part of the Park District and governed by bylaws/rules. A water system is available. Certain chemicals are banned.

We have been instrumental in helping with community garden start-ups in our community and a tool kit is available online. Mentoring is also available at our Market Garden.

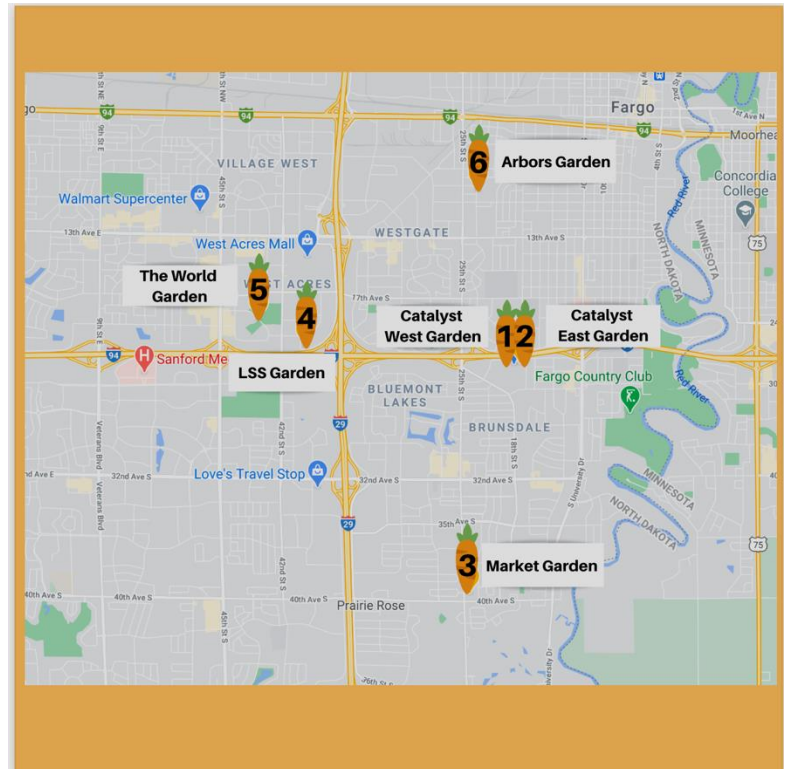
