

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Big Changes at the Main Library New Picture Book Categories

This fall the Children's Services staff have begun the process of rearranging the picture book collection to better serve the browsing needs of children and their families. Over the past few years, library staff have noted several frequently requested topics and have used these as guidelines for the new categories. Colorful stickers on the books' spines indicate their new status. Books that do not fit into any of the categories will continue to be organized by author's last name. Current Children's Favorites (Superheroes, Princesses, Disney, etc.) will be incorporated into the new categories.

Early Literacy and Your Child

Early literacy is what children know about reading or writing before they can actually read or write. Research shows that literacy learning is an ongoing process that begins at birth. The meaningful interactions children have with adults and literacy materials, such as books, at an early age directly affect their development of reading, writing, and speaking skills. Whether your child is four days old or four years old, it is not too early or too late to help them develop important literacy and pre-reading skills.

Children learn early literacy skills through five simple but powerful practices. These five practices are easy to do with children of all ages. They can be done at home, at the doctor's office, in the car, or anywhere you and your child spend time together. The five best ways to help your child get ready to read are:

Talking – talking with children helps them learn oral language, one of the most critical early literacy skills.

Singing – singing, which includes rhyming, increases children's awareness of and sensitivity to the sounds in words. This helps prepare children to decode print (written language).

Reading – reading together, or shared reading, remains the single most effective way to help children become proficient readers.

Writing – writing and reading go together. Writing helps children learn that letters and words stand for sounds and that print has meaning.

Playing – play is one of the primary ways young children learn about the world. General knowledge is an important literacy skill that helps children understand books and stories once they begin





Catch a Train at the Library: Red River Modules Display


November is National Model Railroad Month and once again we're celebrating with trains! The Red River Modules Model Railroad Club returns to display and




Going Places Book Club
