EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



2023 was a year of continued growth in services and increased usage. The library’s collaboration with Fargo Public Schools to allow students to utilize their student IDs as library cards was expanded to K through 12. This was an increase of over 9,900 more students. Another popular project, Read & Share, was initiated in 2023 with the goal of getting books out into the community. It provides collections of withdrawn items at partner sites such as the Downtown Engagement Center, Fargo Cass Public Health Clinic, and Broadway Square. Read and Share books are also popular at community engagement events such as the Red River Market and Boo at the Zoo. The Read and Share book program is a wonderful way to meet our patrons where they are!

The library continued to see significant increase in circulation, library visits, and program attendance in 2023. The library had a record year for program attendance with 33,758 attendees in 2023. This is a thirty-seven percent increase over 2022. We had 401,873 library visits in 2023, which is an eleven percent increase over 2022, and represents an increase of over forty thousand more visits. Circulation numbers increased nine percent over 2022, which represents an increase of 81,686 more items circulated in 2023. It is tremendously exciting to see the Fargo community’s utilization of the wide variety of library programs and services. The significant increases are a credit to library staff for their hard work and creativity.

It was also a year of challenges related to proposed legislation that impacted libraries across the state of North Dakota. House Bill 1205 and Senate Bill 2360 were an unprecedented challenge to citizens’ freedom to read and local control of library policy. Through the course of the legislative session, the Fargo Public Library experienced tremendous community support. The City Commission also went on record in opposition to HB 1205 and SB 2360. I am grateful to all members of the community who offered words of support and provided testimony in opposition to the proposed legislation. It remains to be seen what the impacts will be of the legislation that was signed into law.

The library was future-focused in 2023 with the initiation and development of a new Facilities Master Plan. The plan provides a vision for ensuring the viability of the three current locations into the next decade. The plan also identifies the scope and location of a potential future fourth location. We look forward to partnering with the City to make the plan actionable.

It was a year of unique challenges, but also a very rewarding one. The Fargo community has continued to provide tremendous support for the wide range of programs and collections of the Fargo Public Library. The staff of the Fargo Public Library look forward to serving such an engaged and supportive community.

FARGO PUBLIC LIBRARY FACILITIES MASTER PLAN OVERVIEW

It is essential that the library locations continue to be viable and meet the needs of our growing community. It is also essential to identify the scope and potential location of an additional future location to meet the needs of underserved areas of the community. With these goals in mind, the Fargo Public Library worked with JLG Architects and Library IQ to develop a facilities master plan.

The plan's three phases cover the next ten-plus years. The first phase focuses on updates to the current facilities that will ensure a high level of functionality for the changing needs of library users. An important update in the first phase is the repurposing of the vacant coffee shop at the Main Library. The space will be utilized to provide a nursing space, a gender-neutral restroom, and a laundry unit for Wiggle Room items.

The second phase identifies significant projects that will ensure the viability of our facilities as the community continues to grow. While the 2004 library facilities plan envisioned that the current three locations would serve a population of 108,000 by the year 2020, the actual population was 126,748. To meet the challenges of the continued growth in the community, phase two identifies

the expansion of the Dr. James Carlson Library. The Dr. James Carlson Library is exceptionally located and extremely popular. The expansion will provide improved staff work spaces for increased efficiency, as well as additional services and program spaces to meet the growing needs of the community.

The third phase is future-focused and will enable the library to evolve and expand its services and community profile to meet the needs of citizens as the community continues to grow. The most significant element of the plan is the analysis and identified need of an additional library location. In order to allow for improved workflow efficiencies and the reconfiguration of staff workspaces at the Main Library, the third phase of the plan also identifies the need to move the Children's Department to the expanded Dr. James Carlson Library, and to move the Technical Services Department to an offsite location.

The facilities master plan provides an important roadmap to ensure that the Fargo Public Library will continue to provide the highest level of library services to the citizens of Fargo well into the future.

READ & SHARE

The Read & Share service continues to grow! Read & Share repurposes gently used books that were previously in the library's collection or were donated to the library. The Downtown Engagement Center and Great Plains Food Bank were added to the existing partnering distribution locations of Fargo Public Cass Health Clinic, and the Women, Infants and Children Nutrition Program (WIC) office, and several Little Free Libraries. Read & Share books are very popular at community engagement events as well. In the past year, 3,994 Read & Share books found new readers and were distributed to the members of the community!



FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENT ID PROGRAM

The Fargo Public School Student ID Program expanded in fall 2023 to include ALL Fargo Public Schools (FPS) students! Parents of FPS students in kindergarten – grade 12 are able to register their child for a Fargo Public Library card during the school registration process. Instead of receiving a physical library card, the child is able to use their FPS student ID to access the public library's materials and services. Over 11,000 students were registered for library cards via fall 2023 FPS registration.

KANOPY

Added in June, Kanopy is a video streaming service that provides instant access to thousands of critically acclaimed movies, documentaries, TV series, and kid favorites. This diverse collection has something for everyone and can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by Fargo residents with a valid Fargo Public Library card.

ED CLAPP STORYWALK®

Debating in early October 2023, the permanent Ed Clapp StoryWalk is a joint effort between Ed Clapp Elementary School, the Fargo Public Library, Friends of the Fargo Public Library, and the Fargo Public Schools Development Foundation. The public is welcome to enjoy the StoryWalk after school hours, on weekends, and during school breaks.

LEGAL KIOSK

In partnership with Legal Services of North Dakota, the library installed a Legal Kiosk station as part of the Legal Kiosk Project initiative. Located at the Main Library, the kiosk is a self-help station for North Dakota legal information, is ADA accessible, and is available for use during regular library hours. This kiosk offers residents access to legal education, resources, and information on topics such as housing, custody, immigration, and public benefits. The public can also use the station to apply for civil legal aid services and to contact a legal aid provider.



2023 COLLECTIONS



ED CLAPP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STORYWALK

StoryWalks® are a series of permanent signs designed to connect reading and learning with physical activity. A self-paced, family-friendly activity, the signs are spread out to encourage residents of all ages to read, move, and enjoy the outdoors. In 2023, in conjunction with Fargo Public Schools, the Fargo Public Library added a new, permanent StoryWalk® at Ed Clapp Elementary School. Support for the StoryWalk® comes from the Fargo Public Schools Development Foundation and the Friends of the Fargo Public Library.

The original StoryWalk® project was created by Anne Ferguson of Montpelier, Vt., and developed in collaboration with the Kellogg-Hubbard Library to promote literacy.




