


US CENSUS DATA: AMERICAN POPULATION GROWING OLDER



- Median age rose to 38.8 years
- 65 and older increased 33% between 2010 2020
 (5X faster than total US population in past century)
- Birth rate declined
- Declining percentage of children under 5

This drawing from a 1900 Census report illustrates why this is called a population *pyramid*. The triangular shape with a wide base and narrow peak indicates a growing population.





Figure 2. Population Pyramids for the United States: 2000, 2010 and 2020 (In millions) 2000 2010 2020 Males Females Females Males Females Males Age Age Age 100 and over 100 and over 100 and over 95 to 99 95 to 99 95 to 99 90 to 94 90 to 94 90 to 94 85 to 89 85 to 89 85 to 89 80 to 84 80 to 84 80 to 84 75 to 79 75 to 79 75 to 79 70 to 74 70 to 74 70 to 74 65 to 69 65 to 69 65 to 69 60 to 64 60 to 64 60 to 64 55 to 59 55 to 59 55 to 59 50 to 54 50 to 54 50 to 54 45 to 49 45 to 49 45 to 49 40 to 44 40 to 44 40 to 44 35 to 39 35 to 39 35 to 39 30 to 34 30 to 34 30 to 34 25 to 29 25 to 29 25 to 29 20 to 24 20 to 24 20 to 24 15 to 19 15 to 19 15 to 19 10 to 14 10 to 14 10 to 14 5 to 9 5to9 5 to 9 Under 5 Under 5 Under 5 10M 5M 10M 5M 10M 5M 5M 10M 5M 10M 10M Total population Total population Total population Source: U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000 Summary File 1 (SF1), 2010 Census Summary File 1 (SF1) and

Increasing concern about what the public health needs of an aging population will look like and how sustainable that might be.

UNIVERSAL FLU VACCINE?

- National Institutes of Health started clinical trial for mRNA universal influenza vaccine
- Seasonal flu kills thousands of Americans annually
- Influenza virus changes every year
- Current system: scientists monitor global trends and try to predict which strains are likely to be dominant in upcoming season – these go into seasonal flu vaccine
- Universal vaccine would cover wide array of flu strains and eliminate need for yearly process. If able to induce prolonged immunity, no need for annual shots.
- Universal vaccines could be instrumental in preventing future flu pandemics



US SURGEON GENERAL'S YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH ADVISORY

Dr. Murthy released advisory noting social media can be harmful to youth mental health


- Research continues to show link between social media and anxiety + depression
- 95% of youth 13-17 report using a social media platform
- 2/3 of teenagers report using social media every day; 1/3 report using it "almost constantly"

Parents to model responsible online media use and create social media use plan with kids

Tech companies, federal government, teachers, other groups all have responsibilities too

Positive benefits acknowledged to certain groups

- Majority of young girls of color report regularly viewing "positive and identify-affirming content"
- Social media can connect those otherwise isolated (people with disabilities, LGBTQ+, others)




"I'm issuing this advisory because we're in the middle of a youth mental health crisis and I'm concerned that social media is contributing to the harms that kids are experiencing."

Social media use by youth is nearly universal, and while some uses are beneficial, there is a meaningful risk of harm to children.
