## WIRELESS HOTSPOTS AVAILABLE AT YOUR LIBRARY

The Fargo Public Library has recently added mobile wireless hotspots to its circulating collection to enable individuals and families to access needed digital resources. The library can help residents get connected whether they are doing homework, accessing the latest e-book, or streaming movies at home or on the road.

The hotspots can be checked out the same way as a book or DVD and will provide internet access from almost anywhere to any internet-enabled device, such as a tablet, smartphone or laptop.

The library's wireless mobile hotspots are available at all three library locations and can be checked out for up to three weeks. These hotspots may be renewed if there are no holds or requests for the item. Patrons must have a Fargo Public Library account in good standing to check out a wireless hotspot from the library. The wireless hotspots operate on the Sprint network.

## FINES ELIMINATED ON CHILDREN'S ITEMS

Earlier this year, the Fargo Public Library eliminated overdue fines for all children's materials. This change increases access to books and materials for children and makes it easier for children to continue to check out books and read.

For many, overdue fines and late fees are a barrier that stops children and families from accessing and benefiting from the resources the library offers. With this initiative, the library hopes to increase access to books and reading, boost literacy and remove barriers for all children in Fargo.

Research shows that materials are generally returned on time and the lack of fines does encourage youngsters to check out more books. The library will continue to charge patrons fees for lost, missing, or damaged items.

## **PARKING @ YOUR LIBRARY**

Wondering where to park at the downtown Main Library this winter? Parking is available in the library's west parking lot along 4th Street North. Parking is also available in the Civic Center Quad parking lot located north of the Main Library between the Civic Center and the library. More parking can be found in the Civic Center/Library parking lot located east of the building along 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North. Library patrons park for free when using these lots each day. These spots have a 3-hour time limit in order to accommodate as many library patrons as possible each day. *Handicapped parking spaces are available in all three parking lots.*
