AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 13-0301, 13-0302, 13-0303, 13-0304 and 13-0305
OF ARTICLE 13-03, AND SECTION 13-0401 OF ARTICLE 13-04 OF CHAPTER 13 OF THE
FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO THE CONTROL AND REGULATION OF FOOD
SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in
accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City
shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home
rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict
therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to
implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Amendment.

Section 13-0301 of Article 13-03 of Chapter 13 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby
amended to read as follows:

13-0301. Definitions.--In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires,

1. ~~“Adulterated food” shall mean food which bears or contains any poisonous or deleterious substance in a quantity which may render it injurious to health or which bears or contains added poisonous or deleterious substance for which no safe tolerance has been established by regulation, or in excess of such tolerance if one has been established; a food which consists, in whole or in part, of any filthy, putrid, or decomposed substance, or if it is otherwise unfit for human consumption; a food which has been processed, prepared, packed or held under unsanitary conditions, whereby it may have become contaminated with filth or rendered injurious to health; a food which is, in whole or in part, the product of a diseased animal, or an animal which had died otherwise than by slaughter; a food which is in a container composed, in whole or in part, of any poisonous or deleterious substance which may render the contents injurious to health.~~

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2. ~~“Beverage” shall mean any liquid for drinking, including alcohol and water.~~

3. ~~“Commissary” shall mean a catering establishment, restaurant, or any other place in which food, containers, utensils, equipment, or supplies are kept, handled, cleaned, prepared, packaged, and stored, including a service center or base of operations directly from which catering sites, temporary food units, mobile food units or any other off-premises locations are supplied or services. The term does not include an area or conveyance at a vending machine location used for the temporary storage of packaged food or beverages.~~

4. ~~“Food” shall mean a raw, cooked, or processed edible substance, ice, beverage, or ingredient used or intended for use or for sale in whole or in part for human consumption.~~

5. ~~“Food service establishment” shall mean any restaurant, limited restaurant, coffee shop, cafeteria, short order café, luncheonette, grill, tearoom, sandwich shop, soda fountain, concession stand, tavern, bar, catering kitchen, institutional kitchen, delicatessen, bakery, grocery store, meat market, food processing plant, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other similar place in which food or drink is prepared for sale or service to the public on the premises or elsewhere with or without charge.~~

6. ~~“Food processing facility” shall mean a commercial operation that manufactures, packages, labels, or stores food for human consumption and does not provide food directly to the consumer and is operating under a federal or state inspection program.~~

7. ~~“Limited restaurant” shall mean a food service establishment that is restricted to a specific menu as determined by the public health department or an establishment serving only prepackaged foods, such as frozen pizza and sandwiches, which receive no more than heat treatment and are served directly in the package or on single service articles.~~

8. 1. ~~“License” shall mean a written authorization to operate issued by the public health department.~~

9. 2. ~~“Misbranded” shall mean food, if in packaged form, that lacks a label containing the name and place of business of the manufacturer, packer, or distributor; or an accurate statement of the contents; or if it is offered for sale under the name of another food or if it purports to be or is represented as a food for which a definition and standard identity has been prescribed and it is not.~~

10. ~~“Mobile food unit” shall mean a vehicle-mounted food service establishment designed to be readily movable.~~

11. ~~“Prepackaged food” shall mean any properly labeled processed food, prepackaged to prevent any direct human contact with the food product upon distribution from the manufacturer, and prepared at a facility approved by the public health department.~~

12. ~~“Primal cut” means a basic major cut into which carcasses and sides of meat are separated, including, but not limited to, a beef round, pork loin, lamb flank, or veal breast.~~

13. 3. ~~“Proprietor” shall mean the person in charge of a food service establishment, whether as owner, lessee, manager, or agent.~~

14. 4. ~~“Public health department” shall mean Fargo Cass Public Health, or any name by which such department shall be known hereafter, and its authorized representatives.~~

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15. ~~“Restaurant” shall mean every building or other structure, or any part thereof, and all buildings in connection therewith, that are permanently kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public as a place where meals or lunches are served. The term shall include limited restaurants restricted to a specific menu.~~

16. ~~“Retail food store/grocery” shall mean any establishment or section of an establishment where food and food products are offered to the consumer and intended for off premises consumption. The term does not include an establishment that handles only prepackaged, nonpotentially hazardous foods such as candies and other snack foods, roadside or produce markets that offers only whole, uncut fresh fruits and vegetables for sale, or food and beverage vending machines.~~

17. ~~“Retail meat market” shall mean a commercial establishment and buildings or structures connected with it used to process, store or display meat or meat products for retail sale to the public for human consumption. The term does not include a meat establishment operating under the federal or state meat inspection program.~~

18. ~~“Temporary food service establishment” shall mean any food service establishment that operates at a fixed location, approved by the public health department, for not more than 14 consecutive days in conjunction with a single event or celebration. The term does not include a nonprofit, public spirited organization or person providing a limited type of food service, such as prepackaged, nonpotentially hazardous food items.~~

Section 2. Amendment.

Section 13-0302 of Article 13-03 of Chapter 13 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

13-0302. Food service establishments and food service vehicles to be kept clean.

Every person keeping, maintaining, or being in charge of any public or private market, bakery, bar, restaurant, grocery, meat market, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other food service establishment, stall, shop, store, warehouse, storehouse, or wagon, truck, or other vehicle in, on, or about which any meat, fish, oysters, birds or fowls, vegetables, fruit, or other provisions are held, kept, stored, or offered for sale or other disposition shall keep such public or private market, bakery, bar, restaurant, grocery, meat market, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other food service establishment, stall, shop, warehouse, storehouse, or wagon, truck, or other vehicle in a clean, pure, and wholesome condition; and if any such person shall allow or permit the same to be, become, or remain unclean, impure, or unwholesome, he such person shall be guilty of a violation of this article.

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Section 3. Amendment.

Section 13-0303 of Article 13-03 of Chapter 13 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

13-0303. Inspection of food ~~service~~ establishments.

Every food ~~service~~ establishment shall be inspected by the public health department as often as necessary to determine compliance with this chapter. Frequency of inspections shall be based on a system of risk categorization which involves types of foods served, the preparation steps these foods require, ~~volume of food, and~~ population served, ~~and previous compliance history.~~ It shall be the duty of the public health department to visit, as often as required, each public and private food establishment ~~market, bakery, stall, shop, store, warehouse, and storehouse in the city and each and all wagons, trucks, or other vehicles of vendors or street hawkers in, at, or about which any meat, fish, oysters, birds or fowls, vegetables, fruit, or other provisions are kept, held, or carried for sale or other disposition as human food and~~ to examine and carefully inspect all such meat, fish, oysters, birds or fowls, vegetables, fruit, or other provisions, and if any adulterated, misbranded, mislabeled, unhealthy, unwholesome, or deleterious meat, fish, oysters, birds, or fowls, vegetables, fruit, or other provisions so intended for sale or other disposition as human food is found in or about any such public or private ~~market, bakery, bar, restaurant, grocery, meat market, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other food service establishment, stall, shop, store, warehouse, or storehouse, or in any wagon, truck, or other vehicle of vendors or street hawkers,~~ the public health department shall at once give the person in charge or temporarily in charge of the same notice to remove at once the same out of said city or to such place as the public health department shall direct or to destroy the same. The person in whose custody and possession the same shall be found to be shall at once remove the same out of the city or to such place as the public health department shall direct or destroy the same as may be directed. The public health department, if deemed advisable, may take possession of such unhealthy, unwholesome meat, fish, oysters, birds, fowls, vegetables, fruit, or other provisions so intended for sale or other disposition as human food and destroy the same at the expense of the person in whose custody such unwholesome provisions are found. Furthermore, based upon inspection findings or other evidence, the public health department may impound any food that is found to be, or suspected of being, contaminated or adulterated and impound equipment or utensils that are found to be unsanitary or in such disrepair that food, equipment, or utensils may become contaminated or adulterated. No food, equipment, or utensils impounded shall be used unless the impoundment has been released.

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Section 4. Amendment.

Section 13-0304 of Article 13-03 of Chapter 13 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

13-0304. ~~Bakeries, bars, restaurants, groceries, meat market, mobile units, temporary units, or any other food service establishments--~~Inspection of premises--Inspection fee.--
Suspension or revocation of license.

The public health department shall have free access to all ~~bakeries, bars, restaurants, groceries, meat markets, mobile units, temporary units, or any other food service establishments~~ at any reasonable time for purposes of inspection. The public health department may enter, inspect, photograph, and secure any sample, photographs, or other evidence from ~~every bakery, bar, restaurant, grocery, meat market, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other food service establishment~~, for the purpose of enforcing this chapter. A written report of the inspection shall be made and a copy shall be ~~supplied or mailed~~ provided to the owner, manager, or operator of the food ~~service~~ establishment. If a person or establishment subject to the requirements of this chapter refuses to permit entry or inspection, the taking of samples, photographs, or other evidence or otherwise attempts to conceal samples or evidence, the public health department may obtain an administrative search warrant to obtain the same. All ~~shops, stores, or units as specified in § 13-0301 of this article~~ food establishments shall pay an annual license fee in an amount to be established by resolution of the board of city commissioners, said fee payable prior to January 1st of each year. A license shall be issued when ~~investigation~~ a pre-operational inspection has determined that the proposed food ~~service~~ establishment and its method of operation will conform to the requirements of this chapter. A license, once issued, is nontransferable. A license shall be valid only for the person, location, type of food sales, or distribution activity approved and, unless suspended or revoked for cause, for the time period indicated. The license shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the food ~~service~~ establishment. Fees shall be sufficient to cover the actual expenses of administering and enforcing this program, including the expenses of inspecting.

Whenever the proprietor of a market, bakery, bar, restaurant, grocery, meat market, mobile unit, temporary unit, or any other food service establishment has been convicted of a violation of this chapter and for a period of ten days after the conviction fails to comply with any provision of this chapter, the public health department may suspend or revoke the proprietor's license. Any license may be suspended or revoked by the public health department for violation of this chapter. ~~Bakeries, bars, restaurants, groceries, meat markets, mobile units, temporary units, and any other food service establishments~~ for which the license has been suspended, shall close and remain closed until the ~~license has~~

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~~been reinstated. public health department has conducted a re-inspection and found the food establishment to be in compliance with this chapter. Any food service establishment for which the license has been revoked shall close and remain closed until a new license has been issued.~~

A. The public health department may suspend any license to operate or direct any food service establishment to close if:

~~A. 1.~~ Immediate danger to the public health or safety is found, unless the danger is immediately corrected. The public health department may temporarily suspend the license and order the food service establishment immediately closed. Immediate danger to the public health and safety means any condition, based upon inspection findings or other evidence, that can cause food infection, food intoxication, disease transmission, rodent or insect infestation, or hazardous condition, including, but not limited to, unsafe food temperature, sewage contamination, nonpotable water supply, or an employee who is a carrier of a communicable disease;

~~B. 2.~~ Operations, facilities, or equipment in the food service establishment fail to comply with the requirements of this chapter;

~~C. 3.~~ The operator fails to submit plans as required in this chapter or an inspection indicates that construction or renovation at the facility is not in substantial compliance with the requirements of this chapter;

~~D. 4.~~ The operator fails to submit a license application for a food service establishment or change of operator;

~~E. 5.~~ The operator was not granted a license under the requirements of this chapter;

~~F. 6.~~ The holder of the license does not remit the annual renewal fee;

~~G. 7.~~ The holder of the license does not comply with the requirements of this chapter; or,

~~H. 8.~~ Interference with the public health department or its agents and assistants in the performance of its duties has occurred.

B. When the public health department has suspended a food service establishment license, the person in charge:

~~A. 1.~~ Shall immediately cease all food service operations;

~~B. 2.~~ Shall be notified in writing by the public health department that the food service establishment license is immediately suspended

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upon service of the notice, and that the suspension shall remain in effect until ~~a hearing with the public health department occurs~~. If the public health department finds the operation to be in compliance with the requirements of this chapter, and that the suspension will be lifted;

~~C. 3.~~ May request a hearing by filing a written request for a hearing with the public health department within 10 days of receipt of the notice of suspension; and,

~~D. 4.~~ Shall be notified, if a written request for a hearing is not filed within 10 days, that the suspension is sustain.

Any food ~~service~~ establishment owner whose license has been suspended may, at any time, ~~make request written application for~~ a re-inspection for the purpose of reinstatement of the license. ~~The application shall include a statement, signed by the owner, that, in the owner's opinion, A re-inspection may only be requested if the conditions causing the suspension have been corrected.~~

In the event a license has been revoked by the public health department for violation of this chapter, the provisions of this section pertaining to suspension of said license shall be applicable, including the effect of revocation, the notification requirement and the right to a hearing, except that any food establishment for which the license has been revoked shall be, and remain closed, by the licensee until the public health department has conducted a re-inspection and, thereupon, has determined that the food establishment is in compliance with this chapter and the licensee has paid the re-instatement license fee.

The public health department may, after providing opportunity for a hearing, modify, suspend, or revoke a license for serious or repeated violations of any of the requirements of this chapter or for interference in the performance of the duty of the public health department or its agents and assistants.

~~A license may be reinstated or a new license issued if the public health department determines that conditions which prompted the suspension or revocation no longer exist.~~

Section 5. Amendment.

Section 13-0305 of Article 13-03 of Chapter 13 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

C. "Grilling pushcart" shall mean a pushcart that includes equipment for grilling.

D. "Merchandise" shall include, but is not limited to, plants, flowers, wearing apparel, jewelry, ornaments, art work, household or office supplies, food or beverages of any kind, whether or not for immediate consumption, or other goods or wares.

E. "Mobile food unit" shall mean a food establishment preparing and/or serving foods from a self-contained vehicle, either motorized or within a trailer, located either curbside on a public street or on private property, that may be readily moved without disassembling for transport to another location.

"Pushcart" shall mean a wheeled cart which may be moved by one person without the assistance of a motor and which is designed and used for displaying, keeping or storing any food, beverages or other articles for sale by a vendor. To the extent a pushcart is used for displaying, keeping or storing food or beverages, the pushcart must be limited to service of potentially hazardous foods or commissary-wrapped food maintained at proper temperatures, or limited to the preparation and service of frankfurters, as is defined by North Dakota Administrative Code Chapter 33-33-04. Cooking will only be allowed on an approved grilling pushcart.
- K.L. "Review Committee" shall consist of five members to be appointed by the mayor with the consent of the board of city commissioners. Such membership of the review committee may be comprised of one or more city employees from one or more departments within the city.
- L.M. "Sidewalk entertainer" shall mean a person who engages in sidewalk entertainment.
- M.N. "Sidewalk entertainment" shall mean performances which may include, but not be limited to, music, dance, mimes, magicians, clowns, jugglers and theatrical presentations, but specifically excluding speeches, lectures, and sermons.

 - 1.4.** The account agreement governing the account(s) (each, an "Account") Customer uses in connection with the Service; and
 - 1.5.** User Guides, which include Terms of Use, software, software licenses, price schedules, specifications, instructions, and notices.

The documents and individual provisions of the Service Documentation are intended to complement one another, and the Service Documentation as a whole.

This Agreement and Service Descriptions are posted at Bank's *Commercial Electronic Office*® (*CEO*®) portal. If there is a conflict among the documents comprising the Service Documentation, they will govern in the order listed above. Customer's use of a Service confirms Customer's receipt of and agreement to be bound by the applicable Service Documentation. If an enhancement to a Service or other change requires a change to a Service Description, Bank will post an updated Service Description on the *CEO* portal. When required by Applicable Law (as defined below), Bank will notify Customer of the update. If Customer continues to use the Service after the update takes effect, Customer will be deemed to have agreed to the update.

As used in this Agreement, the term "Applicable Law" means all applicable laws (including common or customary laws), statutes, constitutions, policies, decrees, judgments, treaties, regulations, directives, by-laws, rulings, orders or operating circulars governing the activities of Bank and/or any transaction effected under this Agreement, including, but not limited to, all applicable funds transfer system and

clearing and settlement house rules governing the transactions effected under this Agreement.

- 2. Services.** Bank and Customer will agree upon the Service(s) to be provided. Each Service in the applicable jurisdiction is subject to the approval by the applicable branch or subsidiary of Bank. Customer may not begin using a Service until Bank has received all required and properly executed forms and Customer has successfully completed any testing or training requirements. To assist in Bank's establishment or maintenance of its limits or other processing arrangements, or to assist in Bank's compliance with Applicable Law, Customer will provide Bank with all such financial and/or other information Bank reasonably requests.
- 3. Changes to Services.** Bank may change (or add to) the terms and fees in the Service Documentation at any time. When required by Applicable Law, Bank will notify Customer of the change. If Customer continues to use a Service after the change becomes effective, it will be bound by the change.
- 4. Term and Termination.** Unless earlier terminated in accordance with the Service Documentation, this Agreement and each Service will continue in effect for a term of three (3) years with an option to renew annually thereafter for up to three additional terms of one year each upon written agreement of the Parties. Bank may suspend or terminate any Service: (a) following notice to Customer of a breach of any provision of the Service Documentation or any other agreement with Bank, and Customer's failure to cure the breach (if capable of cure) within 15 days of the date of such notice; or (b) without prior notice to Customer if (i) Bank reasonably suspects that an Account associated with a Service has been compromised or otherwise subject to irregular, unauthorized, fraudulent or illegal activity, (ii) Customer is subject to, voluntarily or involuntarily, or any action or step is commenced or any resolution is passed that may result in Customer being subject to any bankruptcy, insolvency, winding up, liquidation, judicial management, receivership, administrative management, reorganization or other similar proceeding in any jurisdiction, (iii) Bank determines in its sole discretion that its continued provision of a Service may place Bank at risk of financial loss or result in an unacceptable credit exposure, (iv) Customer terminates, liquidates, or dissolves its business or disposes of a substantial portion of its assets, (v) Customer fails to timely pay its debts, (vi) Customer initiates any composition with its creditors, (vii) any guaranty of Customer's obligations to Bank is terminated, revoked, or its validity contested by the guarantor, (viii) Bank determines in its sole discretion that a material adverse change has occurred in Customer's ability to perform its obligations under the Service Documentation, or in the ability of a guarantor of Customer's obligations to Bank to perform its obligations under the applicable guaranty agreement, or (ix) the Account necessary to provide a Service is closed. The termination of a Service will not affect Customer's or Bank's rights with respect to transactions occurring before termination. Bank will not be liable to Customer for any losses or damages Customer may incur as a result of any termination of any Service.
- 5. Service Fees.** Customer will pay Bank the fees described in the Service Documentation and any taxes applicable to each Service however designated exclusive of taxes based on Bank's net income. Bank may debit the Account(s) for any fees not covered by earnings credits and any taxes that are due, or it may send

an invoice to Customer for such amounts, which Customer shall promptly pay. Bank's charges and fees shall be set forth as expressed in Bank's applicable fee schedule for Services used in connection with the Account.

- 6. Confidential Information.** Unless otherwise provided in the Service Documentation, all User Guides and Terms of Use constitute Bank's or its vendor's confidential information ("Confidential Information"), and Customer will not acquire any ownership interest in or rights to Confidential Information as a result of Customer's use of any Service. Customer will (a) maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information; (b) not disclose (or permit its employees or agents to disclose), copy, transfer, sublicense or otherwise make any of it available to any person or entity, other than Customer's employees who have a need to use the Confidential Information in connection with the applicable Service; and (c) not decompile, reverse engineer, disassemble, modify, or create derivative works of any Confidential Information. Customer will notify Bank immediately if it knows or suspects that there has been any unauthorized disclosure, possession, use or knowledge (each, an "Unauthorized Use") of any Confidential Information. If Customer (or its employees or agents) is responsible for the Unauthorized Use, Customer will, at its expense, promptly take all actions, including without limitation initiating court proceedings to recover possession and prevent further Unauthorized Use of the Confidential Information and obtain redress for any injury caused to Bank as a result of such Unauthorized Use. The parties recognize that Customer's obligation to maintain confidentiality is subject to, and limited by, Customer's obligations under the North Dakota open record law, including N.D.C.C. Section 44-04-17.1, et seq. The parties further recognize that North Dakota open record law does recognize that certain documents or other data may be treated as confidential but also that, to the extent documents, data or records are not confidential or are otherwise not exempt from disclosure, the Customer must disclose the same to the requester within a reasonable time as may be defined by law. To the extent Customer encounters any conflict with its obligations under this provision and applicable state open records laws, Customer shall provide Bank with at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of such conflict and the date and time of day, ~~or both~~, by which Customer, in Customer's sole discretion, must make a disclosure.

7.

- 8. Currency.** When Customer requests or instructions require that Bank convert the amount of a payment order from the currency in which the Account is denominated ("Account Currency") to another currency ("Foreign Currency"), Bank will do so using its applicable rate of exchange in effect at the time on the day Bank executes the payment order. If a financial institution designated to receive the funds does not pay the beneficiary specified in the payment order, and the funds are returned to Bank, Bank will not be liable to Customer for a sum in excess of the amount of the payment order after Bank has converted it from the Foreign Currency to the Account Currency using the applicable rate of exchange in effect at the time on the day Bank confirms the cancellation of the payment order. Bank bears no liability if the rate it uses for a particular transaction, i.e., the "applicable rate," differs from rates offered or reported by Bank or by third parties, or based upon different times of day, amounts, locations or involving different systems, agents or procedures. Currency exchange rates fluctuate over time, based upon market conditions, liquidity and risk. Customer acknowledges and accepts the risks of such fluctuations between the time Customer requests a payment order and the time the payment order is either completed or is unwound due to a cancellation, an amendment, a rejection or a return.

- 9. Liability and Indemnification.**

- 9.1.** Bank is under no obligation to honor, in whole or in part, any payment order or other instruction that: (a) exceeds the available balance in the Account, unless otherwise provided in the Service Documentation; (b) is not in accordance with the Service Documentation or Bank's applicable policies, procedures or practices as made available to Customer; (c) Bank has reason to believe may not have been duly authorized, should not be honored for its or Customer's protection, or involves funds subject to a hold, dispute, restriction or legal process; or (d) would possibly result in Bank's contravention of any Applicable Law.
- 9.2.** All uses of Services through Customer's ID codes, passwords, token cards, PINs, or passcodes (each, a "Code") will be deemed to be authorized by and binding on Customer, except as provided for in the Service Documentation. Customer's failure to protect Codes may allow an unauthorized party to: (a) use the Services; (b) access Customer's electronic communications and financial data; and (c) send or receive information and communications to Bank. Customer assumes the entire risk of unauthorized use of Codes and unencrypted electronic transmissions.
- 9.3.** Neither Bank nor any software vendor makes any express or implied representations or warranties with respect to the Services or any software used in connection with the Services including without limitation any warranty as to the merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose, other than those expressly set forth in the Service Documentation.
- 9.4.** Customer will promptly furnish written proof of loss to Bank and notify Bank if it becomes aware of any third party claim related to a Service. Customer will cooperate fully (and at its own expense) with Bank in recovering a loss. If Customer is reimbursed by or on behalf of Bank, Bank or its designee will be subrogated to all rights of Customer.
- 9.5.** Except as otherwise provided in the account agreement governing the Account, any claim, action or proceeding against Bank for losses or damages arising from a Service, must be brought within one year from the date of the act or omission.
- 9.6.** Bank will have no liability for failure to perform or delay in performing a Service if the failure or delay is due to circumstances beyond Bank's reasonable control. If Bank determines that any funds transfer or communications network, Internet service provider, or other system(s) it has selected to provide a Service is unavailable, inaccessible or otherwise unsuitable for use by Bank or Customer, Bank may, upon notice to Customer, suspend or discontinue the affected Service.
- 9.7.** Except in the case of Bank's negligence or intentional misconduct, Customer will indemnify and hold Bank, its directors, officers, employees and agents harmless from all losses or damages that arise out of: (a) the performance of a Service in accordance with the Service Documentation including without limitation any warranty Bank is required to make to a third party in connection with a Service; (b) an act or omission of any agent, courier or authorized representative of Customer; and (c) if the Service includes a

license or sublicense of any software to Customer, the use or distribution of the software by Customer or any person gaining access to the software through Customer that is inconsistent with the license or sublicense.

- 9.8.** Bank will only be liable to Customer for actual damages incurred as a direct result of Bank's failure to exercise reasonable care in providing the Services. Reasonable care requires only that Bank follow standards that do not vary unreasonably from the general standards followed by similarly situated banks. Bank's policies and procedures are general internal guidelines for Bank's use and do not establish a higher standard of care for Bank than otherwise established under Applicable Law. A mere clerical error or an honest mistake will not be considered a failure of Bank to perform any of its obligations. Bank's liability to Customer will be limited to an amount not to exceed 10 times Bank fees incurred during the calendar month immediately preceding the calendar month in which such loss or damages were incurred (or, if no Bank fees were incurred in such month, Bank fees incurred in the month in which the losses or damages were incurred).
- 9.9.** Except as expressly provided otherwise in the Service Documentation, neither party to this Agreement nor its respective directors, officers, employees or agents will be liable to the other party for: (a) any special, consequential, incidental (including without limitation court costs and attorneys' fees), indirect, or punitive losses or damages; or (b) business interruption, loss of profits, loss of business, loss of revenue, loss of goodwill, loss of opportunity, loss or injury to reputation or loss of anticipated savings, whether any claim is based on contract or tort, or whether the likelihood of such losses or damages was known to the other party and regardless of the form of the claim or action.
- 9.10.** Where Customer sends payments on behalf of its third party customers, Customer agrees it is solely liable to its customers for any and all losses such customers may suffer. Bank hereby excludes all and any liability of whatever nature (including those losses enumerated in subsection 8.9 of this Agreement) arising out of Customer's relationship with its customer.
- 10. Governing Law.** The Service Documentation shall be governed by: (a) U.S. federal law and (b) the law of (i) the U.S. state in which the office of Bank that maintains the Account is located or, if there is no such state or no account associated with such Service, (ii) the State of New York, without reference to its principles of conflicts of laws ("Governing Law").
- Non-Binding Mediation.** The parties agree to consider the use of non-binding mediation in the event of any dispute.
- 11. Jurisdiction.** For any proceedings regarding this Agreement (not subject to arbitration in Section 10), Customer hereby irrevocably submits to the jurisdiction of the courts of Cass County in the State of North Dakota or the federal courts located therein over any action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement and irrevocably agrees that all claims in respect of such action or proceeding may be heard or determined in such courts.

12. Miscellaneous.

12.1 Severability. Any portion of the Service Documentation which is inconsistent with Applicable Law or Governing Law will be deemed modified and applied in a manner consistent therewith, and Bank will incur no liability to Customer as a result of the inconsistency or modification and application to any dispute regarding the Service Documentation. If any portion or provision of the Service Documentation is deemed unenforceable, it will not affect the legality, enforceability or validity of the remaining Service Documentation nor the legality, enforceability or validity of such portion or provision under the law of any other jurisdiction.

12.2 Entire Agreement. The Service Documentation (and any documents referred to therein) constitutes and represents the entire agreement between Bank and Customer regarding the Services we provide for all Accounts opened at Bank and supersedes and extinguishes all prior agreements, understandings, representations, warranties and arrangements of any nature (including requests for proposals and other sales material), whether oral or written, between Customer and Bank relating to any such Service (including any other Master Agreement for Treasury Management Services, but excluding the current Commercial Account Agreement or Global Commercial Account Agreement, as applicable).

12.3 No Waiver. Neither the failure nor any delay by Bank in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege shall be deemed to be a waiver of such right, remedy, power or privilege. No course of dealing or waiver of any right on one occasion will constitute a modification of the Service Documentation or be a waiver of that right on a subsequent occasion.

12.4 No Third Party Beneficiaries. Except as otherwise provided in the Service Documentation, no person or entity other than Customer and Bank will be deemed to be a third party beneficiary under the Service Documentation.

12.5 Financial Condition. Customer will provide Bank promptly upon Bank's request any existing financial statements or other information pertaining to Customer's financial condition or any previously unprepared financial statements which Bank may require Customer to prepare and/or to be audited or reviewed by independent certified public accountants acceptable to Bank.

12.6 Customer's Representations and Warranties. Customer represents and warrants that: (a) it will not use any Service in a manner that could result in a contravention of Applicable Law by Customer or Bank; and (b) if Customer employs an agent in connection with its use of any Service, Customer represents and warrants to Bank that: (i) Customer's governing body has duly authorized the agent and (ii) Customer will exercise appropriate controls to ensure each agent so authorized does not exceed the authority so granted to it.

12.7 Customer Communications. Any communication to Bank regarding Customer's use of a Service from Customer's agent will be deemed to be a communication from Customer, and Customer authorizes Bank to communicate with Customer's agent regarding any such communication or Service.

12.8 Notice. Either party may provide notice to the other party by mail, personal delivery, or electronic transmission. Customer will notify Bank promptly in writing of any change in its name, Address, legal status, electronic contact information (including an e-mail address or otherwise), or any other changes relevant to the conduct of the Account or affecting Customer's business relationship with Bank. The term "Address" as used herein refers to a mailing or electronic address. Customer will use the Address where Customer's relationship manager or other manager is located and will address any notice to the attention of such manager.

Bank will be entitled to rely on any notice from Customer that it believes in good faith was authorized by an authorized representative of Customer and, except as expressly stated in another agreement between Customer and Bank, will have no obligation to verify the signature (including an electronic signature). Each party will have a reasonable time after receipt of any notice to act on it

12.9 Survival. Sections 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 will survive termination of this Agreement.



A total of eleven (11) sealed proposals were received, all of which were reviewed and fully analyzed by an evaluation committee made up of City staff from Information Services, Building Inspections, Engineering, Planning, and Fire.

In the fall of 2016, the City developed an RFP to base their storm water utility fee on individual property's parcel parameters rather than the existing method that charges a fixed rate per water meter based on whether a parcel is residential or non-residential. The Consultant was tasked to review current utility fees, analyze the costs assigned to storm water with an emphasis on system operation and maintenance, and look at areas where storm water system maintenance is being funded by other City sources. The goal of the study is to develop a funding model to make sure there is sufficient funding to operate and maintain the existing and projected storm water system needs as the City grows. The final report was intended to include recommendations on how to improve the level of service for operations and maintenance. On January 26, 2017, a contract was entered into with AE2S/Houston for \$77,500.00 to provide the study services. Through the winter, the Consultant set about the study and collecting data.

Contract Amendment #1 was approved in May of 2017 for \$17,000.00 for the additional rate and revenue design efforts to bring the existing financial model to take into effect the change in overall funding of the several multiple year scenarios without the use of flood sales tax dollars.

Contract Amendment #2 was approved in August of 2017 for \$50,725.00 for the additional commission outreach and education, modeling of the storm water fee implementation scenarios, fee structure benchmarking, outreach research assistance with several large parcel owners and continued face to face and conference call meetings.

Contract Amendment #3 is proposed to fund the following requested tasks:

1. Identify and Address Issues with Updated Parcel Data: Billing database was updated in 2018 for newly collected parcel impervious area data.
2. Alternative Rate Design Scenarios and Supporting Coordination: Additional rate modeling scenarios were developed to address large stakeholder parcels concerns. Rate design options based on scaled/capped (tiered intensity of development).

3. Additional Progress Reports and Documentation: Additional progress memo work was completed to realign the process with the approval and implementation schedules.
4. Preparation for Finance Committee Presentation/Discussion: A project summary and update was provided to the Finance Committee as to the proposed path forward at the April 30, 2018 meeting. This included the financing aspects of long-term debt versus the cash on hand for all improvements.

The next step in this process is the inclusion of this proposed storm sewer fee into the 2019 City budget and if approved, work will be necessary for the billing process refinement for deployment of the storm sewer fee for 2019. City staff has been meeting individually with NDSU, the Park District, the Airport and the School District to address any questions they may have and to review parcel listings for owner accuracy. The latest fee schedule information has been presented to each of these entities to allow for their budgetary processes for the upcoming year.

The quoted request for Contract Amendment #3 from AE2S is \$34,530.00 and the request is attached. The memo identifies the additional tasks requested along with the original tasks remaining for project completion and implementation during the remainder of 2018.

Recommended Motion

To approve Contract Amendment #3 to AE2S for \$34,530.00 for additional work on their study contract. Funds to cover this contract amendment will come from the Storm Sewer Utility fund budget.

The purpose of this letter is to request a scope and fee amendment under Section 3 of the existing Agreement between the City of Fargo and Advanced Engineering and Environmental Services, Inc. (AE2S) for the Storm Water Utility Fee Study, Project # MS-15-P0. Section 3 of the Agreement, dated January 26, 2017, notes that the consultant will provide a contract amendment setting out the fees for the requested change. In consideration of current project budget status, additional requested tasks, proposed changes to the project implementation schedule, and adjusted tasks required to completion, AE2S is requesting additional payment in an amount up to **\$34,530**, increasing the total contract maximum to **\$179,755**.

The following outlines the rationale for the additional project costs that comprise the total requested amendment:

- I. **Additional Tasks Requested:** Additional tasks requested since the time of the last contract amendment have largely centered on alternative rate design scenario development as well as development of additional progress reports and documentation. More specifically, this additional work has included:
 - i. **Identify and Address Issues with Updated Parcel Data:** The billing database was updated with 2018 parcel and impervious area data as originally planned, however, upon review of updated parcel data, it was found that multiple parcels were “stacked” and needed to be addressed. This included replicated parcels with the same owner (i.e. replicated parcels for multiple buildings on a single parcel), replicated parcels with different owners (i.e. condos and twin homes), and island parcels within common parcel (i.e. condos with green space).
 - ii. **Alternative Rate Design Scenarios and Supporting Coordination:** Additional rate modeling scenarios were developed at the request of the City to further address large stakeholder concerns. Alternative rate designs such as the scaled/capped (tiered intensity of development) rate design were developed and reviewed. Ultimately, an inclining tiered model with P/I adjustment was selected as the preferred rate structure to carry forward and the multi-year rate model was updated to reflect this scenario.
 - iii. **Additional Progress Reports and Documentation:** To support the delay in implementation timing, additional progress reports and documentation have been requested. An abridged tech memo progress report was completed in late 2017 with the finalization of this memo consuming more project budget than originally anticipated. More recently, a progress memo was prepared to provide an update to the Finance Committee. It is anticipated the more robust progress memo and the Finance Committee memo will be useful in the development of the final project summary memorandum.
 - iv. **Preparation for and Attendance at Finance Committee Meeting:** City staff requested a progress summary and update be provided to the Finance Committee. A presentation summarizing the project progress and path forward was prepared and presented at the April 30th Finance Committee Meeting.



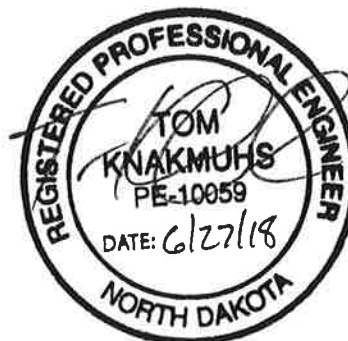



**Re: Project WW1402—Amendment #5-Time Extension
Hazard Mitigation Grant Program-Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project**

Background

If you recall, the City of Fargo (City) amended the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) application for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) levee project (DR-1981-ND-9R) to include the Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project. In February 2014, the amended application outlining the Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project was submitted to the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services (NDDDES). In July 2014, the City was notified that the amended application was authorized. Since the award of the original scope of the project in December 2013, there have been four amendments approved for the project summarized below:

Prior Approved Amendments

The approved amendments are described below:

Amendment #1-Consisted of creating wet weather relief for the Broadway Interceptor through the installation of a relief sanitary sewer force main from a modified Lift Station #1 and Lift Station #2, flowing north to the WWTP. The purpose of this project is to prevent the Broadway Interceptor from backing up during wet weather conditions that may cause potential sanitary sewer backups or overflows into public and private property.

Amendment #2-This included replacement of the existing pumps at Lift Station #1. With the modifications and addition of the new wet weather pumps, the new electrical equipment was incompatible with the existing electrical system and pumps. New dry weather pumps were included to eliminate the compatibility issues and reduce operation and maintenance (O/M) costs.

Amendment #3-This amendment included routing changes to the force main. The original scope called for the force main to be installed in five (5) segments, but coordination with City Engineering, it was decided to proceed with incorporating the force main with other City projects to coordinate the route with other planned capital improvement projects. This resulted in additional costs for both construction and engineering. The original scope called for the force main to be installed in five (5) segments, but now the force main is planned to be installed in 14 segments to coincide with these other projects.

HMGP Amendment #4- includes multiple Scope of Work (SOW) changes that include the request to withdraw the WWTP Levee Project and a request to change various components of the Broadway SSO Reduction Project that includes additional funds for the change in scope:

Amendment #5

With the large scale of construction required, the project was divided into 14 segments to allow each segment to be properly managed. In order to achieve completion of all the components, the Wastewater Utility requested a one-year extension from March 24, 2018 to March 24, 2019. A one-year time extension will allow for the completion of construction, closeout of project components and adequate time to meet all FEMA HMGP Grant requirements. The one-year extension will allow for potential time delays and the administrative tasks required.

Your consideration in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Recommended Motion

Approve the attached FEMA HMGP Amendment #5 with the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services for the Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project for a one-year time extension from March 24, 2018 to March 24, 2019.

The intent of this letter is to request a one (1) year time extension from March 24, 2018 to March 24, 2019 for the above referenced project. Significant progress has been made on the overall project; however, due to the size of the project, overall coordination with other construction activities and environmental influences affecting the timeline of the project, the time extension is necessary.

With the large scale of the project, the project was broken-up into 14 segments to allow each segment to be properly managed. Considering the winter months bring weather that does not allow construction activity to take place, this put restrictions on the timeline when this project could be constructed. A brief update on the overall project progress to date is provided along with a schedule to outline activities remaining in the project scope.

Project Scope

The original scope was approved on December 17, 2013 for \$255,900 that included grant award for flood mitigation at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Following the approval of the original contract, a Hazard Mitigation Program (HMGP) Subgrant Agreement was submitted and approved on July 16, 2014 for \$16,394,265 and included the following components:

- **Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main:** This component included the design, bidding, and construction of approximately 23,000 feet of relief force main from the Lift Station 1 area to the Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF).
- **West Side Interceptor (WSI) Bypass:** This component included the design, bidding, and construction of a bypass between the WSI and the 45th Street Interceptor.
- **Effluent Pump Station (EPS) Modifications:** This component included the design, bidding, and construction of modifications to the existing EPS to accommodate additional wet weather flows from the Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main.
- **Vault C & Gravity Sewer:** This component included the design, bidding, and construction of modifications to the existing Vault C outside of the WWTF, in addition to gravity sewer from Vault C to the EPS to accommodate additional wet weather flows from the Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main.

- **Lift Stations No. 1 and No. 2 Modifications:** This component included design, bidding, and construction of modifications for Lift Stations No. 1 and No. 2 to accommodate wet weather flows within the Lift Stations.
- **Effluent Force Main Modifications:** This component included design, bidding, and construction of the replacement of 2,000 feet of 30-inch Effluent Force Main.

As design of the project progressed, and the project began to evolve, changes to the scope were accounted for within Amendment 3 and Amendment 4. In general, the overall scope remained the same, with exception of the removal of the EPS Modifications and the Vault C & Gravity Sewer improvements. To date, the proposed project cost is \$22,194,840.

Project Progress to Date

Since the approval of the additional changes to the original project scope on July 16, 2014, work has continued to progress and is nearing the final portion of the overall project to be completed. The progress that has been completed to date includes the following:

- **Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main:** The design, bidding and construction of approximately 22,000 feet of the Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main, which was completed from 2015 to 2017.
- **West Side Interceptor (WSI) Bypass:** The design was completed in the fall of 2016, with bidding and construction completed in the fall of 2017.
- **Effluent Pump Station (EPS) Modifications:** This was submitted under proposed Amendment 4 for removal from the project. No further work will be done with this portion of the project.
- **Vault C & Gravity Sewer:** This has been submitted under the proposed Amendment 4 for removal from the project. No further work will be done with this portion of the project.
- **Lift Station No. 1 and No. 2 Modifications:** This portion of the project was delayed a year to accommodate other construction activities within the vicinity of Lift Stations No. 1 and 2. Construction activity for the lift stations began in August 2017 and will continue through October 2018.
- **Effluent Force Main Modifications:** This portion of the project was designed, bid, and constructed in the fall of 2015.
- **WWTP Flood Protection:** After further review of the original application, the flood protection portion of the project was determined to no longer be technically or financially feasible to complete. Thus, the flood protection project has been decommissioned from the overall project.

Remaining Project Items to Complete and Estimated Completion Timeline

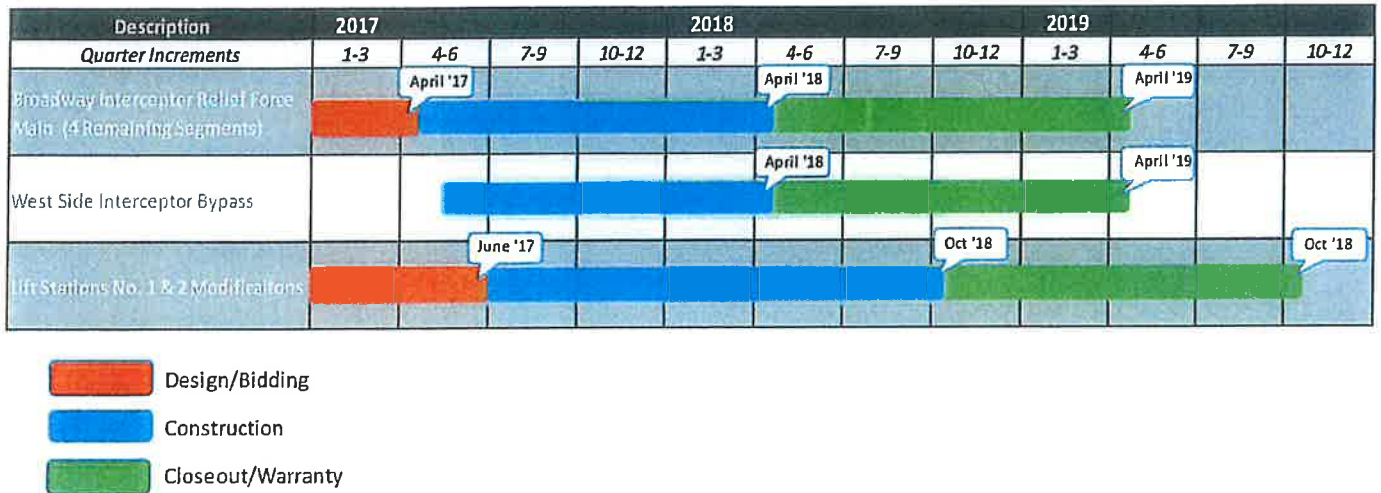


Figure 1: Estimated Completion Timeline for Broadway Interceptor SSO Reduction Project

Although a significant amount of the project has been constructed, there are still project components left to be completed. An overview of what is remaining to be completed for the overall project is provided below. Additionally, Figure 1 graphically represents the anticipated completion timeline for the project.

- **Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main:** The construction of approximately 1,000 feet of the Broadway Interceptor Relief Force Main will be completed in the spring of 2018.
- **West Side Interceptor (WSI) Bypass:** The construction of this portion of the project will be completed in the spring of 2018.

- **Lift Stations No. 1 and No. 2 Modifications:** It is anticipated construction activity of the modifications of Lift Stations No. 1 and 2 to be complete in October of 2018.

Summary

In order to achieve completion on all of the project components outlined within the revised project scope, the City is requesting a one-year time extension from March 24, 2018 to March 24, 2019. A one-year time extension will allow for the completion of construction and closeout of all project components.

Although the construction of this project is anticipated to be complete by late fall 2018, a one-year extension will allow for potential delays in construction activities caused by weather, as well as the completion of all administrative tasks required after the construction activities are finished. These administrative tasks include items such as processing reimbursement requests, documenting the City's compliance with all environmental requirements, and final project closeout. Based on the scope, budget, and complexity of this project, the additional time will allow the City to complete this project to the best of their abilities.

The City of Fargo will create wet weather flow relief for the Broadway Interceptor through installation of a relief sewer from Lift Station #1 (LS #1) and Lift Station #2 (LS #2) north directly to the City of Fargo Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP). The Broadway Interceptor is one of three main sanitary sewer interceptors in Fargo, ND and serves the oldest parts of the city including the downtown area and the high density residential developments both north and south of downtown. The purpose of this project is to prevent the Broadway Interceptor from backing up during wet weather conditions and causing sanitary sewer backups or overflows into public and private property. Due to the current format of the Broadway Interceptor, wet weather conditions are currently posing significant hazards to both public and private property, as well as the functionality of the City's sanitary sewer system. This scope of work includes the installation of a dedicated force main from LS #1 and LS #2 directly to the Effluent Force Main at the WWTP, allowing LS #1 and LS #2 to pump wet weather flows directly to the City's wastewater stabilization ponds. Modifications to LS #1 include wet well and piping modifications; architectural modifications; installation of odor control equipment, new pumps, and a backup generator. Modifications at LS #2 include wet well and piping modifications; architectural modifications; installation of odor control equipment, new pumps, and a backup generator; and a bypass from the West Side Interceptor to the 45th Street Interceptor. The Effluent Force Main will also be modified to allow wet weather flows to be sent directly to the Waste Stabilization Ponds.

Other Conditions:

Environmental requirements, as noted below and in the attached FEMA award letter dated 16 July 2014 must be met and documented. The attached environmental form must be completed and submitted before grant can be closed out.

1. All necessary measures must be taken to minimize fugitive dust emissions created during construction activities. Any complaints that may arise are to be dealt with in an efficient and effective manner.
2. Noise from construction activities may have adverse effects on persons who live near the construction area. Noise levels can be minimized by ensuring that construction equipment is equipped with a recommended muffler in good working order. Noise effects can also be minimized by ensuring that construction activities are not conducted during early morning or late evening hours.
3. All necessary measures must be taken to minimize the disturbance of any asbestos-containing material and to prevent any asbestos fiber release episodes. Any facility that is to be renovated or demolished must be inspected for asbestos. Notification of the Department's Division of Air Quality (701-328-5188) is required before any demolition. Removal of any friable asbestos containing material must be accomplished in accordance with section 33-15-13-02 of the North Dakota air pollution control rules.
4. This project may require a Section 404 permit from the Corps of Engineers. The sub-applicant shall consult with USACE regulatory office in Bismarck, ND to determine any project requirements. The Applicant is responsible for obtaining any needed permits and verifying and complying with all permit requirements, including wetland mitigation, any permit conditions, pre-construction notification requirements, and regional conditions as provided by the Army Corps of Engineers. The applicant is responsible for implementing, monitoring, and maintaining all Best Management Practices (BMPs) and Pre-Construction Notification (PCN) conditions of applicable NWP. This is to include any requirements per the North Dakota Dept. of Health 401 Water Quality Certification for Clean Water Act permits.
5. For any work in the SFHA, the sub-applicant must apply for a floodplain permit from the floodplain administrator of the respective community where the action is proposed. All required permits should be maintained as part of the permanent record.

6. Per the ND State Water Commission, a construction permit for the floodwall is needed from the State Engineer. Please contact the ND State Water Commission if you have any questions regarding the permit.
7. Per the ND Dept. of Parks and recreation, the sub-applicant is responsible for complying with the conditions illustrated in the Parks and Recreation letter dated 2/13/14 regarding Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) project sites. Should any public or private utilities need to be added or relocated on the LWCF recreational lands, the ND Dept of Parks and Recreation must be consulted prior to any action taken.
8. Applicant shall comply with proper construction practices and environmental disturbance requirements as outlined in the NDDOH letter dated 12/5/11 and 2/5/14.
9. Care is to be taken during demolition activity near any water of the state to minimize adverse effects on a water body. This includes minimal disturbance of streambeds and banks to prevent excess siltation, and the replacement and revegetation of any disturbed area as soon as possible after work has been completed. Caution must also be taken to prevent spills of oil and grease that may reach the receiving water from equipment maintenance, and/or the handling of fuels on the site. Guidelines for minimizing degradation to waterways during construction are attached to the letter.
10. Projects disturbing one or more acres are required to have a permit to discharge storm water runoff until the site is stabilized by the reestablishment of vegetation or other permanent cover. Further information on the storm water permit may be obtained from the Department's website or by calling the Division of Water Quality (701-328-5210). Projects disturbing less than one acre are also required to have a permit to discharge storm water runoff if the site is part of a larger common plan of development or sale, and the larger common plan will ultimately disturb equal to or greater than one acre. A permit is not required for routine maintenance activities performed to maintain the original line and grade, hydraulic capacity, or original purpose of the facility. The city of Fargo may require additional construction site sediment and erosion control measures. The city also may require post-construction considerations for storm water quality by ordinance, or as part of its NDPES Small Municipal Separate Storm Water System (MS4) General Permit obligations. Check with the local officials to be sure any local storm water management considerations are addressed.

Troy Hall, Water Utility Director, presented the attached memo related to change orders for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction with Alberici Constructors, Inc. (ACI), the General Contractor, and Wrigley Mechanical, Inc. (WMI), the Mechanical Contractor. The total proposed cost increase is \$363,071.28. In the change order proposals, there are 22 listed changes with the two contractors. The highest cost line item change was with WMI for fire sprinkler system changes in the electrical gear rooms and computer server room. These changes will reduce the probability of electrical equipment getting wet and damaged in a fire situation and are consistent with other City of Fargo facilities. The bid cost for the electrical gear was about \$3.8 million. Overall, Water Utility staff suggests that the MWTP construction project is going well and is on schedule to meet the substantial completion date at the end of July.

Water Utility staff thinks that all of the changes are in the best long-term interest of the City of Fargo. The overall status of cost change orders was discussed at the Utility Committee meeting for MWTP construction. After some research inquiring about comparable projects, Water Utility staff suggests that the industry average for cost change orders is an increase of about 3% to 5% of the bid price at completion. If the currently proposed contract changes are approved, the cost change orders for the MWTP will total an increase of 4.19% from the original bid price. However, only 2.87% is attributed to errors/omissions and other minor changes typical in a construction project. The other 1.32% of changes were implemented related to capacity increases with West Fargo water service and a project contribution from Black & Veatch. Water Utility staff also suggests that we are at a reasonable level for overall cost change orders at this point in construction.

After bidding, contracts were approved on April 27, 2015, for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction to the three prime contractors as follows:

Introduction

Construction of the Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) began in May, 2015. This is Water Utility Project - WA1301. There have been previous change orders for this project approved by the Utility Committee and City Commission. Water utility staff is recommending additional changes to two of three contracts at this time. Letters of explanation from AE2S and change order forms are attached.

After bidding, contracts were approved on April 27, 2015, for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction to the three prime contractors as follows:

MWTP Project Status Related Change Orders and Overall Cost

The MWTP is a large, complicated, and expensive project for the City of Fargo and its water service customers. As such, it is normal for projects of this nature to have adjustments that result in cost change orders. Since the MWTP exceeded \$100 million in bid prices, the following is intended to help provide perspective for this project compared to the cost impacts of change orders commonly seen in the industry.

While it may be difficult to find exact comparators to the MWTP project, the following are typical observations and goals for change order cost increases in the industry at project completion:

- Industry average: **3% to 5% of bid price**
- Typical Project Goal: **<2% of bid price**

- Excellent Project: **<1% of bid price**
- Percentages for change order costs reflect (1) Errors & Omissions and (2) Owner Requested

Change Order (CO) statistics for MWTP project in percentages:

- Prior to Current CO Recommendations: **3.84%**
- Adjusted Value Prior to Current CO Recommendations: **2.52%**
- After Current CO Recommendations: **4.19%**
- Adjusted Value After Current CO Recommendations: **2.87%**
- Total Adjusted Value Dollar Amount: \$1,369,585 (Different funding source)
 - Generator Switchgear – West Fargo: \$137,816.00 (previously approved CO)
 - 7th Reverse Osmosis Train – West Fargo: \$1,068,769.00 (previously approved CO)
 - Black & Veatch contribution to HVAC Changes: \$163,000

Since the MWTP construction project is approaching completion and through a number of the higher risk project components for change orders, Water Utility personnel think the project is at a reasonable position from a change order perspective. 'Value Engineering' and teamwork between contractors, City staff, and consulting engineers has been an important factor in containing costs. The 'Value Engineering' for the foundation system was an important item for cost savings in the project, reducing the contract price by nearly \$300,000 early in construction.

Related to cost change orders, some higher risk project components include:

- Utility Infrastructure Rerouting (removal from excavation/construction areas) - **Complete**
- Mass Excavation (unforeseen underground conditions) - **Complete**
- Foundation (Pile) Installation - **Complete**
- Major Equipment/Treatment Process Submittals – **Complete**
- Concrete for Lower Level & Main Level - **Complete**
- Building Structural Steel, Exterior Brick, and Roof – **Nearly Complete**
- Process Piping, Building Electrical, and Mechanical Piping – **In progress**

Since the construction of the MWTP is approaching completion, startup of the front-end process equipment has been in progress for a few months. The MWTP is scheduled to be operational in August of 2018. Currently, most of the construction is to the interior of the building, including process piping installation, equipment installation, electrical installation, mechanical/HVAC installation, room finishes, and painting.

A complicating factor for the MWTP construction is the agreement in July 2015, to provide drinking water to West Fargo. With the addition of West Fargo, Water Utility staff needs to gauge what design adjustments should be recommended for the MWTP, looking at the best long-term interest of the City and customers. These adjustments in most cases will be cost increases. Two significant cost changes attributed to West Fargo water service have previous approval – 7th Reverse Osmosis train and electrical switchgear. Costs for the two changes will be funded by State Water Commission regionalization grant funding and infrastructure sales tax (Fund 450). Please be aware that there is annual water sales revenue from West Fargo.

Enclosed please find four (4) copies of Change Order No. 18 for the above referenced project for your review and approval. This Change Order pertains to the following changes to the project:

1. Air injector assemblies will be installed in front of the diverter valves to the existing lime silos SB-301 and SB-303 to reduce the compaction of lime at the closed valve which has led to plugging in the transfer line.
2. Modifications will be made to the PVC/CPVC piping on the MF/UF and RO CIP lines to account for thermal expansion in the lines during CIP operations. The modifications will include added expansion joints and rigid stainless steel tees to provide expansion and anchor points in the piping.
3. The retaining wall for the new driveway planned at the Residuals Facility will be moved to the south side of the existing clarifier and will be changed from concrete retaining walls to block retaining walls with handrail, similar to the existing retaining walls on the north side of the Residuals Facility.
4. The openings for the dampers in the Generator Building need to be modified slightly to account for the size of the dampers to be installed.
5. Companions flanges will be provided for the instrumentation to mount to on the FRP tanks. The provided flanges will match the piping material of the associated system.
6. Drains will be added on both raw water lines to allow the flow meter section of the raw water lines to be drained for maintenance.
7. The bypass around VPR-6054 will be removed on the MF/UF MIT air line to eliminate the potential to over-pressurize the membranes and a spare VPR-6054 valve will be provided to the City.
8. The network switches and modules in the MF/UF System PLC will be replaced with a larger capacity units (1783-BMS10CGA switches and 1783-SFP1GLX modules).
9. Granular base material will be added under the ramp at the west entrance to the Membrane WTP.

12. The existing pipe trench grating in the Generator Building will be modified to accommodate the new generator pipe installation.

1. The fire suppression system in both Electrical Rooms and in the Server Room will be modified to include both a clean agent system and a pre-action sprinkler system. This change is to avoid a filled water sprinkler system in these rooms that would jeopardize the electrical gear in the rooms if there was a leak. The clean agent system will be triggered first to extinguish a fire before water is used from the pre-action system.

Introduction

Attached, please find a task order proposal from AE2S for engineering services related to Preliminary Design Phase services for WTP Residual Facility (WTPRF) Improvements. The current residuals facility was constructed in 1974 and is likely the highest maintenance (per square foot) facility in the Water Utility. Planning phase engineering services for WTPRF improvements are in the 2018 budget. Moorhead Public Service has approached Fargo Water Utility staff about a potential partnership in building a regional facility to serve both Fargo and Moorhead.



The current Residuals Facility, showing sludge truck garage, along 13th Avenue South. This facility was constructed in 1974 and is high-maintenance for Water Utility personnel.

Background

The following are key points related to WTP Residuals Facility Improvements planning for the City of Fargo Water Utility:

- The current residuals facility was constructed in 1974 and is a very high-maintenance facility for the City of Fargo.
- 'Residuals Management Facility' is a specific line item in the 20-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the Water Utility.
- Any recommended construction for Residuals Facility Improvements is shown to be State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan funded in the 20-year CIP. The Water Utility has not applied for an SRF loan for this project, yet.
- Moorhead Public Service (MPS) has expressed interest in collaborating with us on WTP Residuals Facility Improvements and making it a 'regional facility'.
- The addition of West Fargo as a regional water customer and harder water in both the Red River and Sheyenne River has significantly increased the sludge production from the existing WTP.
- Water Utility staff is approaching the WTP Residuals Facility Improvements as a blank slate and open to significant change in residuals handling for several reasons:
 - MWTP solids will be different from the lime sludge produced in the existing WTP.
 - Automation capabilities have significantly improved since the 1970s.
 - Extended operating hours through automation may reduce equipment sizing and, therefore, reduce the cost of improvements.

ENGINEER shall review and compile previous planning documents and concepts developed for retrofitting the existing Residuals Treatment for Facility and for development of a new Residuals Treatment Facility. Previous planning documents to be reviewed include:

- Fargo WTP Facility Plan – Phase 1 (July 2012)
- Draft Fargo Residuals Treatment Concept Tech Memo (September 2013)
- Draft PDM Grant Application Memo (Fall 2017)

ENGINEER shall work with OWNER to develop objectives and planning criteria for the new Residuals Treatment Facility. Key criteria include:

- Development of two (2) operating scenarios (hours per day and days of week to operate the facility) to carry forward into the Residuals Treatment Technology Evaluation
- Development of planning-level construction phasing requirements
- Establish residuals production projections for 45 mgd of WTP treatment capacity with considerations for expansion to 60 mgd of WTP at the current site
- Coordinate with Solid Waste Utility to determine landfill capacity and criteria for the planning horizon for dewatered residuals disposal
- Identify feasible alternatives (if any) to landfill disposal (i.e. agricultural cover material, transportation applications, etc.)
- Determine allowable footprint and identify site constraints
- Establish automation needs and requirements, maintenance simplification, and other OWNER requested criteria

In conjunction with the “Project Kick-Off” meeting, ENGINEER shall host a “Planning Criteria” meeting with OWNER to assist in developing the objectives and planning criteria of the new Residuals Treatment Facility.

Task 03 – Residuals Treatment Technology Evaluation

ENGINEER shall review, evaluate, and document residuals treatment technologies including the following:

- Sludge Thickening and Conditioning
- Mechanical Dewatering (Belt Press, Plate and Frame Press, Centrifuge, etc.)
- Sludge Conveyance and Pumping
- Dewatered Solids Storage

The general Treatment Technology Evaluation approach shall be as follows:

- Develop a process flow schematic showing key processing steps. Include mass balance data from Task 02
- Identify key equipment that will be evaluated (thickening and dewatering systems). Develop fact sheets/tables on the technologies available. Fact sheets will include advantages and disadvantages
- Develop a summary of what regional and national utilities are doing for thickening and dewatering based on the ENGINEER’S experience
- Coordinate with manufacturers for analyzing sludge samples
- Develop conceptual design criteria, obtain dewatering performance evaluation results and establish budget level planning costs for treatment technologies
- Summarize results in a technical memorandum, present to OWNER, meet to discuss, and develop final recommended treatment technology plan

ENGINEER shall work with OWNER to submit residual samples to up to five (5) dewatering technology manufacturers for dewatering performance evaluation. Technologies shall be evaluated based on dewatering performance, the ability to meet the objectives and planning criteria (from Task 02), and other various criteria such as capital cost, operational cost and maintenance requirements. Performance shall be gaged against dewatering results of lime softening water treatment plant (LSWTP) only sludge, membrane water treatment plant (MWTP) only sludge, and a combined LSWTP and MWTP sludge. ENGINEER shall work with OWNER to recommend and select up to two (2) residuals treatment technologies to be carried forward into concept development. ENGINEER shall host a “Residuals Treatment Technology and

Screening” meeting with OWNER to review findings and affirm technology recommendations from this Task.

Task 04 – Concept Development

Engineering shall develop up to four (4) concepts (new building-technology A, new building-technology B, building renovation-technology A or B, do nothing concept) based on the operating scenarios and residuals volumes (Task 02). ENGINEER shall facilitate a “Concept Development” workshop with the OWNER to discuss potential concepts for the recommended alternatives, including operator recommendations and concerns. Comments received from the OWNER shall be incorporated into each respective concept. Each concept shall include the following key components:

- Block flow diagram of key process components
- Hydraulics and capacity assessment
- Preliminary equipment sizing
- Concept layout with approximate spatial requirements (including mechanical and electrical)
- Planning level construction phasing
- Planning level cost analysis (capital and operating and maintenance (O&M))

Task 05 – Economic Analysis and Recommendations

ENGINEER shall develop total life-cycle cost estimates for the improvement and expansion concepts. It is anticipated that the economic analysis will be based upon planning level cost factors with appropriate contingencies and mark-ups for legal, administration, and engineering services as well as inflation and other cost escalators. ENGINEER shall conduct a “Concept Review and Recommendation” meeting to review the concepts and the life-cycle costs with the OWNER to get input. Once the OWNER has reviewed the concepts, the ENGINEER shall make a recommendation on a preferred concept. ENGINEER shall consider all OWNER comments prior to making a recommendation.

Task 06 – Facility Plan Documentation

ENGINEER shall document findings and recommendations from the Study and Report Phase within a Draft Facility Plan. It is assumed project will be funded through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program. Therefore, the Draft Facility Plan shall include necessary documentation to fulfill requirements of the DWSRF program. ENGINEER shall provide the OWNER with three (3) hard copies and one (1) electronic PDF copy of the Draft Facility Plan.

The OWNER shall review and provide comments on the Draft Facility Plan within 30 days of receipt. The ENGINEER shall incorporate OWNER comments and revisions before finalizing. The ENGINEER shall provide the OWNER with three (3) hard copies and one (1) electronic PDF copy of the Final Facility Plan.

Any Project development or support documents or work beyond the Draft Facility Plan, including presentations to the Utility Committee or City Commission are outside of the Scope of Services for this project. Actual DWSRF application, comment solicitations, etc. are not included with this Scope of Services. A proposed Facility Plan outline is provided on Page 5 of this Scope of Services.

Phase 030 – Preliminary Design Phase Services

In accordance with Paragraphs A1.02 and A1.08 of Exhibit A of the Original Task Order Agreement, dated January 1, 2018, ENGINEER shall perform the following additional Preliminary Design Phase services under Water Consulting Task Order No. 9:

CenturyLink Utility relocation

Project DN-18-A1 improves an existing drainage ditch starting at Drain 27 south of 53rd Ave S. The ditch improvements go west thru 63rd St S over to Grayland Addition. The second phase of this project will be bid later this summer to install a pumping station on this improved ditch at Drain 27 for flood control during high water times on the Drain 27. These are the first of several projects that will provide improved drainage control in this developing area and will be coupled with pumped water from the Sheyenne River to provide drinking water for Fargo and the region in times of low flow on the Red River. Project DN-18-A1 includes a box culvert structure thru 63rd St that will require the relocation of private utilities contained in a 30-foot wide utility easement.

The attached agreement is for CenturyLink to relocate their existing fiber wire along 63rd St, south of 52nd Ave S, at the crossing with the new drainage ditch and constructed box culvert.

CenturyLink has provided a proposal to complete this necessary work, which is estimated to be \$22,420.48. For your review, the proposal is attached with this memo. We will need to send a check to CenturyLink, along with the agreement once approved.

Funding for this utility relocation will be 74.9% from the Water Utility and 25.1% from Special Assessments. Troy Hall, the Water Utility Director has been consulted on these relocation costs and agrees to proceeding with the relocation work.

Background:

Improvement District BN-16-H1 consists of improving 53rd Ave S by installing asphalt pavement, storm sewer, concrete curb & gutter, street lighting and sidewalk between 52nd Ave S and 63rd St S in South Fargo.

Border States Paving (Border States) is the prime contractor for this Improvement District.

On May 10, 2018, Border States requested a 1-month extension due to the following:

- Delay in road restrictions lifting;
- Additional Items added to the project.
 - Seeding and mulching of the boulevard and disturbed areas;
 - Remove and re-set an additional nine (9) private mailboxes;
 - Modification to an existing inlet to manage drainage in the ditch along 63rd St S north of the project;
 - Remove, store and replant trees located within city ROW at 5908 53rd Ave S.

The cost to add these additional items is approximately \$21,000.

Along with these requests, it was discovered in the field that an Xcel gas line will need to be relocated to accommodate a portion of the storm sewer. When we originally calculated the substantial completion date in the fall of 2017, we anticipated that the Contractor would be able to start work on April 15, 2018. Due to weather and ground conditions, the Contractor was not able to start until May 14, 2018. Because of this unanticipated delay, the added work, and the gas line relocation, we are recommending an additional 30 days be added to the substantial and final completion dates.

Background:

Attached you will find a request from Ace Brandt requesting infrastructure for 28th Ave S in Urban Plains by Brandt Third Addition.

The Developer intends to hire a Consultant to design the necessary infrastructure for 28th Ave S. The City of Fargo will bid and inspect (either through the MSA or utilizing City staff) the project. The Developer requested substantial completion of the project by October 19, 2018, assuming 2.5 months of construction and an August 1, 2018 start. In order to start by August 1, the construction contract will need to be approved at the July 30 Commission meeting. In order to meet this timeline, the Developer's Consultant will need to have final plans and documents to the City no later than June 8, 2018. This is an aggressive timeline for plan development, but achievable if the Developer's Consultant submits the necessary documents in a timely manner and in conformance with City of Fargo Standards. Engineering will coordinate and work deliberately with the Consultant to achieve this timeline.





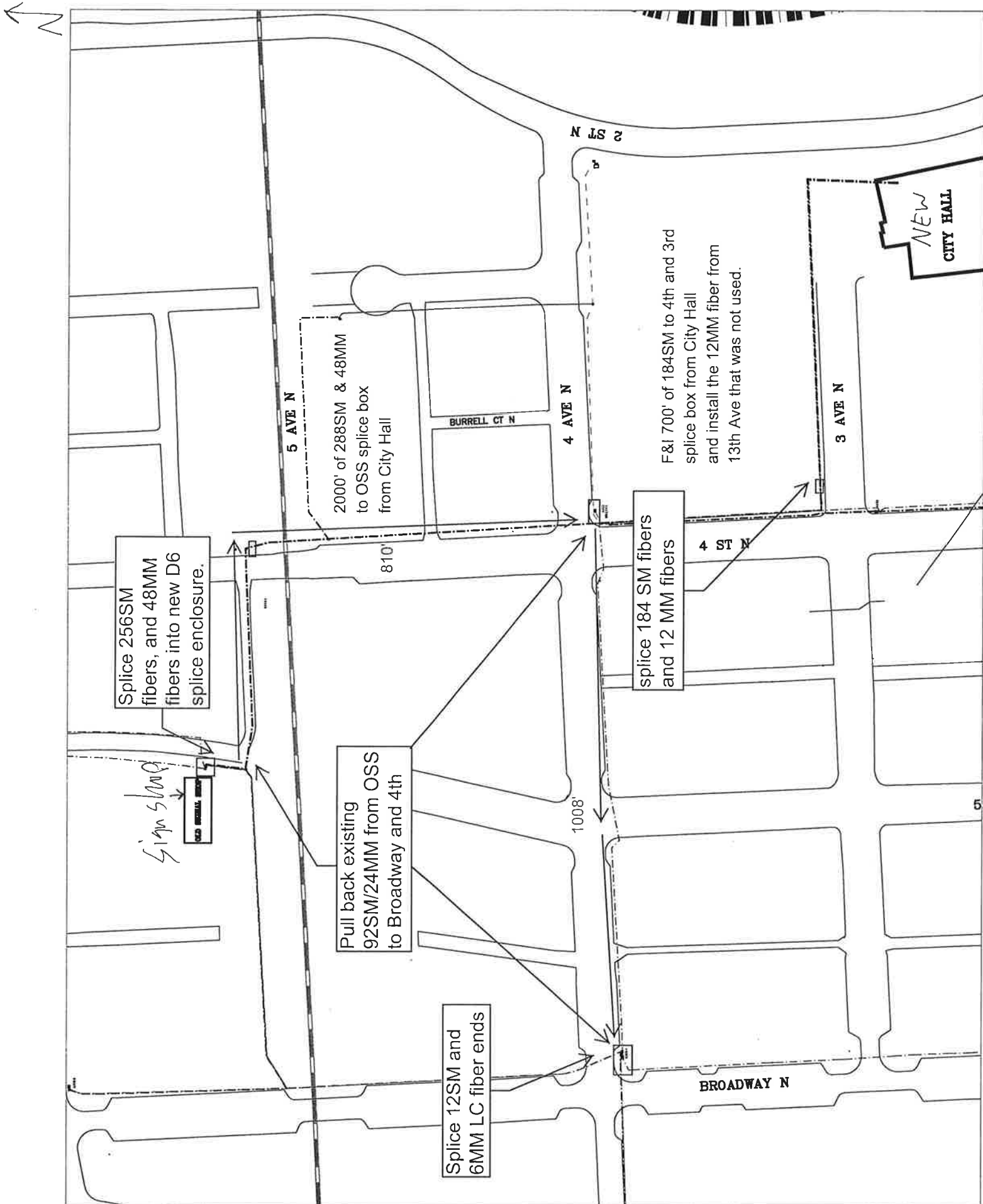
