*WHEREAS, Our country is made up of people from every nation on earth, who are declared equal not only in freedom but also in justice, both of which are essential for a healthy human civilization; and*

*WHEREAS, Our nation was conceived on July 4th, 1776 with the Declaration of Independence, the classic statement being: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness;" and*

*WHEREAS, On January 1, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, providing that all persons held as slaves within any State or designated part of a State "shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free;" and*

*WHEREAS, On June 19, 1865 Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas, and announced the end of both the Civil War and slavery; and*

*WHEREAS, celebration of the end of slavery, which became known as Juneteenth, is the oldest known public celebration of the end of slavery in the United States; and*

*WHEREAS, Juneteenth commemorates African American freedom and celebrates the successes gained through education and greater opportunity; and*




