RE: Amendment of Tall Grass and Noxious Weed Ordinances

Dear Commissioners:

Pursuant to your direction, I have prepared the enclosed ordinance amending various provisions in our city code that address noxious weeds, tall grass and the like. I have worked with Grant Larson from the Environmental Health Division of the Health Department regarding these changes. By way of explanation, these changes are intended to address the following:

- 1. Removal of 30% Presumption. It has been the experience of the Environmental Health Division that the inclusion in the ordinance of the presumed violation to exist whenever there is more than 30% of grass plants in excess of 8 inches causes more confusion and harm than good. The 30% presumptive violation was inserted into Article 11-08 in 2006. The enclosed amendments remove that language. As a result, the ordinance returns to the previous language that simply states that the grass not be allowed to exceed 8 inches in length.
- 2. Simplify Enforcement on Prior Offenders. The amendment to Section 11-0819 will authorize Environmental Health to send a single notice in the spring of each year to those property owners who were offenders in the prior summer. The single letter will consist of a notice of the prior violation and a standing order that the property owner or occupant is required to maintain the appropriate grass length throughout the summer and, if Environmental Health identifies a violation during the period of the standing order, then Environmental Health will simply order the property to be mowed and the appropriate charge levied for such mowing. This change is intended to simplify the enforcement process.
- 3. Costs of Administration. The Environmental Health Division finds that the administrative burden of enforcing the tall grass and noxious weed ordinances is significant—it is not limited to merely the charge for mowing the offending property. Quite rightly, the cost associated with the abatement of the tall grass and noxious weed nuisance includes a significant amount of administrative time. This amendment will authorize those costs to be quantified and approved by resolution of the board of city

commissioners so that those costs can be assessed against the property along with the actual mowing fees.

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

#### Section 1. Amendment.

Section 11-0805 of Article 11-08 of Chapter 11 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-0805. Control of stagnant water, noxious or other weeds, tall grass.—No stagnant water shall be allowed to stand or remain, noxious or other weeds, or grass allowed to grow more than eight inches (8") in length upon or along the line of any railroad, street, highway, alley, public place, along or upon any vacant or other lot or real estate parcel, public or private, or other place within the city. An area having more than thirty percent (30%) of grass plants in excess of eight inches (8") in length shall be deemed a violation of this section. For purposes of this article, "noxious weeds" shall mean any species of plant or vegetation recognized by the North Dakota State Weed Board as a noxious weed.

#### Section 2. Amendment.

Section 11-0806 of Article 11-08 of Chapter 11 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Duty of property owners to control stagnant water, fill excavations, remove dirt piles, noxious or other weeds, tall grasses.—It shall be the duty of all property owners, occupants, or persons having control over private property to remove or drain stagnant water, to fill excavations, to remove dirt piles, to remove noxious or other weeds, and to maintain the growth of grass on such property so that it does not exceed eight inches (8") in length. These requirements apply to areas along and upon any railroad, street, highway, alley, public place or along or upon any vacant or other lot or place within the city. An area having more than thirty percent (30%) of grass plants in excess of eight inches (8") in length shall be deemed a violation of this section.

#### Section 3. Amendment.

Section 11-0807 of Article 11-08 of Chapter 11 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-0807. Failure to drain stagnant water, fill excavations, remove dirt piles, remove weeds, maintain grass.--Notice of violation.--Notice of a violation of this article shall be mailed to the registered record property owner as shown in the property tax records maintained in the city assessor's office, upon any agent of the property owner, and upon any occupant of the property when appropriate. The owner, agent, tenant or person in charge of the property shall take appropriate action to remove the stagnant water, fill excavations, remove dirt piles, fill holes or depressions, cut and/or keep down the growth of any noxious or other weeds, and maintain all grasses not to exceed eight inches (8") in height, as directed by the health department within the specified period of time. If the property owner, tenant, or agent fails to take such appropriate action within the time period as directed by the health department, the health department shall have authority to remove or drain off any stagnant water, fill all excavations, holes, or depressions, and cut or mow any noxious or other weeds and grasses.

#### Section 4. Amendment.

Section 11-0819 of Article 11-08 of Chapter 11 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-0819. Violations and nuisances, health officer's duty to remedy violations and abate,

notice.--Upon finding a violation of any section in article 11-08, the health officer, or his designee thereof, shall provide notice to the owner, occupant, or person in control of the property of the violation, ordering its abatement or corrected and along with a stating a deadline within which to correct the violation for such abatement or correction to occur. If the violation is not abated or corrected by the deadline, the health officer, or his designee thereof, is authorized to take further enforcement action to remedy the violation or to abate the nuisance. In the event a property owner has been found to be in violation of one or more provisions of this article within the prior 18 months, the health department is authorized to issue a single written notice of the violation, delivered as provided in this article, said notice to contain a standing order that requires compliance with such maintenance requirement or requirements for such period of time as stated therein, said period to not exceed 8 months from the date of the order. After such standing order has been provided, should the health department determine that the lot, parcel or other place that is the subject of the notice and standing order has not been maintained in accordance with said order, the health department is authorized to take further action to remedy the violation or to abate the nuisance. Any costs associated with correcting the violation or abating the nuisance shall be chargeable to the property as otherwise authorized under this article. <u>In addition, the health officer</u> is authorized to include within such costs the costs of administration of the nuisance abatement program pertaining to this article and to establish a schedule of such costs to be approved by resolution of the board of city commissioners.

#### Section 5. Amendment.

Section 11-0821 of Article 11-08 of Chapter 11 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-0821. <u>Penalties for violation</u>.--Any person, firm, company, or corporation violating any provision in article 11-08, other than section 11-0814, shall upon conviction, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500\\$1000, with the court having such power and discretion to suspend such fine and to revoke suspension thereof. Each day any person, firm, company, or corporation shall violate the provisions of this article shall constitute a separate offense.

#### Section 6. Penalty.

A person who willfully violates this ordinance is guilty of an infraction. The landscaping plan shall be implemented within the easement area within 12 months following issuance of any building permit. Trees shall be a minimum of 2-inch caliper.

i. All landscaping, buffers and street trees shall be in place and healthy within 12 months following issuance of any building permit.

The City of Fargo has been managing a purchasing card program for the past several years. This allows us to make vendor payments by credit card and receive volume rebate revenue each year.

The City of Moorhead will be initiating a purchasing card program this year and would like to leverage the success of the City of Fargo's program to achieve maximum efficiency and level of rebate revenue.

Your review and approval of a memorandum of understanding relating to their purchasing card program is requested. The Finance Committee endorses sharing of information and business strategies to help other communities.

#### Suggested Motion:

Approve a memorandum of understanding with the City of Moorhead for their implementation of a purchasing card program.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as the "Effective Date") by and between the City of Moorhead, a political subdivision of the state of Minnesota, 500 Center Avenue, Moorhead, MN 56561-0779 (hereinafter referred to as "Moorhead"), and the City of Fargo, a political subdivision of the State of North Dakota, 200 3rd Street North, Fargo, ND 58102 (hereinafter referred to as "Fargo").

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Government Finance Officer Association ("GFOA") recommends that governmental units consider implementation of a purchasing card program as a best business practice; and

WHEREAS, Moorhead desires to implement a purchasing card ("PCard") program in Moorhead (the "PCard Program") to increase administrative efficiency and to grow a new revenue stream by using the PCard Program for all of its departments; and

WHEREAS, Fargo has been operating a PCard program with PFM Financial Services, LLC since 2012 and can provide detailed implementation information and program administration guidance to implement the PCard Program; and

WHEREAS, PCard rebates are typically based upon purchasing volumes attained by each governmental unit and are progressive in nature; and

WHEREAS, Fargo achieved approximately \$20,000,000 in its PCard program purchasing volume for the fiscal year of 2016-2017 and the City of Fargo is willing to offer Moorhead a commensurate rebate based upon a combined level of purchasing; and

WHEREAS, Moorhead has established a PCard purchasing goal of \$7,000,000 per year that would produce rebate revenue of \$105,000; and

WHEREAS, it is mutually beneficial for the parties to cooperate in the PCard Program to maximize its rebate revenues and to adopt a GFOA best business practice; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding to govern the parties' cooperation in the implementation of PCard Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements contained in this Memorandum of Understanding, and other valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which the parties acknowledge, Fargo and Moorhead agree as follows:

#### **AGREEMENT**

- 1. <u>PCard Program.</u> The parties agree to take the following actions regarding the implementation the PCard Program:
  - a. Moorhead shall be responsible for establishing the PCard Program, developing reasonable protocols and regulations regarding its implementation, and developing any technical protocols and regulations regarding its use or refinement.
  - b. Moorhead will coordinate directly with PFM Financial Services, LLC to implement the PCard Program.
  - c. The parties agree to comply with all reasonable requests for documentation and expertise within a reasonable time.
  - d. The parties agree to send employees, contractors, or assignees, whichever may be reasonable under the circumstances, to meet with the other party for purposes of coordination and implementation of the PCard Program or for any other purpose under this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2. <u>Costs of PCard Program Implementation.</u> Moorhead agrees to bear all costs of the PCard Program implementation, and to hold Fargo harmless from any such costs, except to the extent provided for in this Memorandum of Understanding. Explicitly excluded from this obligation are any costs incurred by Fargo or its employees, contractors, or assignees, incurred in the ordinary course of business. These include, but are not limited to, wages or other employment compensation paid to Fargo employees or contractors who are performing Fargo's obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be from the Effective Date until December 31, 2021. The parties may agree terminate this Memorandum of Understanding at an earlier date with prior written consent signed by both parties.
- 4. <u>Indemnity.</u> Neither party shall be liable to the other party for any claims, demands, liabilities, causes of action, penalties losses, costs, damages and expenses, including reasonable investigation and attorneys' fees and expenses and court costs, that may arise against or incurred by the other party in any way related to, caused by, or arising out of or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding, except where such was caused by wrongful acts or omissions of the other party, its agents, or employees. This provision shall survive the Term of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 5. <u>Liability</u>. Under no circumstances shall either party be required to indemnify the other party to an extent greater than the statutory damages cap for municipal subdivisions in their respective states, irrespective of the extent of its liability or whether it may have waived any applicable statutory limit on damages. The limits of liability for some or all of the parties may not be added or stacked together to determine a maximum amount of liability for each party.
  - 6. <u>General Provisions.</u> The parties agree to the following provisions:

- a. Good Faith and Fair Dealing. The parties affirmatively represent that they are entering into this Memorandum of Understanding in good faith, complete cooperation, due diligence, and honesty, and with the full and complete intention to uphold the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding. The parties agree to deal fairly and cooperate with the other party regarding the purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding. The parties must perform their obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding with reasonable skill and diligence and may not intentionally interfere with or prevent the other party's performance of its obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding.
- b. <u>Time of Essence</u>. The parties agree that time shall be of the essence in the performance of their obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding and of implementation and execution of the PCard Program.
- c. <u>No Assignment.</u> Neither party may assign or transfer their rights or obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding without the other party's prior written consent.
- d. <u>Modification</u>. No modification, amendment, or waiver of the terms and conditions of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be binding upon either party unless approved in writing and signed by an authorized representative of both parties.
- e. <u>Mediation</u>. The parties agree that they will seek to resolve any dispute arising under or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding through cooperation and informal mediation before instigating or filing any legal or equitable cause of action. The parties will split the costs of mediation.
- f. <u>Choice of Law and Forum.</u> This Memorandum of Understanding is a Minnesota contract which shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota. Any action or proceeding arising from or relating to this Memorandum of Understanding shall be venued in the appropriate Minnesota court having jurisdiction located in Clay County, Minnesota.
- g. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Memorandum of Understanding is solely for the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns and shall not be deemed to confer upon third parties any remedy, claim, liability, or reimbursement, claim of action, or other right.
- h. <u>Representations.</u> Each of the parties hereto represents and warrants to the other that the party executing this Memorandum of Understanding has the authority to do so knowing that each of the other parties to this Memorandum of Understanding are acting in reliance upon such representation. The provisions of this section shall survive the termination of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- i. <u>Notices.</u> Any notice, demand, request, payment, or other communication which any party hereto maybe required or may desire to give hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been properly given if sent to the addresses set forth below:

- j. Merger. Except as provided for above, this Memorandum of Understanding shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. This Memorandum of Understanding supersedes all previous agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter of this Memorandum of Understanding and incorporates all previous negotiations and consents given by the parties relating to the subject matter of this Memorandum of Understanding. The existence of this Memorandum of Understanding does not preclude the parties from entering into further agreements regarding the subject matter of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- k. <u>Severability</u>. Any provision of this Memorandum of Understanding that is prohibited or unenforceable shall be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions hereof.
- l. <u>Captions</u>. The captions in this Memorandum of Understanding are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of any provisions or sections of this Memorandum of Understanding. They shall not be interpreted as part of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- m. <u>Interpretation.</u> This Memorandum of Understanding shall be interpreted so as to enforce its purpose and the parties' mutual intentions to the fullest extent allowable under law and equity.
- n. <u>Numbers and Gender</u>. Except when otherwise indicated by the context or by definition, masculine terms used in this Memorandum of Understanding shall include feminine and neuter, and vice versa, and singular terms shall include the plural, and vice versa.
- o. <u>Additional Action.</u> The parties agree to promptly execute and deliver to each other any further documentation and any further action required or requested in order to more effectively carry out the intent and purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- p. <u>Mutuality.</u> All terms, agreements, and covenants in this Memorandum of Understanding are mutual and dependent.

- q. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Memorandum of Understanding shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective personal representatives, successors and assigns.
- r. <u>Execution in Counterparts.</u> This Memorandum of Understanding may be simultaneously executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument. This Memorandum of Understanding shall not be effective until a counterpart has been signed by each party to be bound by it. Signatures provided by electronic transmission or facsimile shall be deemed as valid as original signatures.

### Commissioners:

The Fargo Dome Authority requests your approval of the sole-source procurement of the agreement between FARGODOME and Twin City Garage Door to demolish/remove the existing 27'7" x 16'6" Cookson interior overhead door located in the FARGODOME loading dock and replace with a new Cookson overhead door to fit the space.

The original door was manufactured by Cookson and Twin City Garage Door is the authorized dealer for Cookson in the Fargo area. The need to replace the door with the same manufacture is because the operating mechanism for the door is located in a very confined space in the ceiling of the loading dock. When initially installed in 1992, some areas of the wall above the loading dock were removed to allow for installation of, and working space, for the operating mechanism. Since the door will be manufactured by the same company, the operating mechanism will be located in the same position and certain other operating parts will be able to be re-used. As Twin City Garage Door is the authorized dealer of this brand, it allows for local service should anything be needed with regards to the door.

The budget dollars for this project have been re-allocated from within the existing FARGODOME Capital Budget that has been previously approved by both the Fargo Dome Authority and the Fargo City Commission.

The Fargo Dome Authority requests your approval of their sole-source provider selection of CEIA USA to purchase divesting tables for metal detector screenings. As background, the FARGODOME purchased 30 walk-through metal detectors from CEIA USA in late 2017 following a competitive bid process. As we develop strategies for efficient patron ingress with the new metal detectors, we are focusing on patron education regarding what may and may not be brought into the venue (communicated in advance through our website, press releases, and patron emails and communicated onsite via specific signage) and actual logistics of the walk-through process. On April 17<sup>th</sup>, the Community Development Committee recommended unanimous approval to consider a land exchange between the City owned parcel at 11 11<sup>th</sup> Street North with the DFI AV, LLC owned parcel at 708 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue North.

This exchange will allow the City of Fargo to further consolidate city owned properties located on the west side of 7<sup>th</sup> Street North, between 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue North (see attached map). These properties were acquired over time with Community Development Block Grant funds and city general funds.

The consolidation of land at this location meets a longstanding Community Development Committee goal of finding opportunities for developments that encourage affordable housing, particularly in areas of our core neighborhoods that might be blighted or deteriorating.


If approved, the consolidated properties present an opportunity for further conversations to strategize methods for promoting affordable housing. The applicant is seeking approval of a minor subdivision, entitled **The Basins At 100th Addition**, which is a replat of Lot 6, Block 1, Commerce on I29 Addition. ### Background:

Project UR-17-C1 consists of lowering the water service lines within the City of Fargo right-of-way to a minimum of 7.5' below finished road grade to decrease the potential for freezing water service lines within the City right-of-way.

The attached change Order #1 is for work at three additional locations near locations already included in the project.

Item #1 – Addition of two (2) residences on 5<sup>th</sup> Street S. Two locations have been determined by the Public Works Department to have water services lowered below the frost line in the near future:

- 1410 5<sup>th</sup> St South
- 1414 5<sup>th</sup> St South

These two residences are located directly south of a home that is included in project UR-17-C1 and would be easy additions given the proximity, and traffic control has been designed and will be in place along 5<sup>th</sup> Street. Item #2: Repair of Private Drive and Sod from Previous Project: Following a previous service improvement project to 807 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue S, areas within the property have settled over trench locations disturbed by the City. This needed repair has been known for some time and has been held until the proper project structure was found. Adding this repair to project UR-17-C1 is justified as the service lowering project is funded by the water main replacement fund (Fund 501).

To repair the settled areas would include removing and replacing a portion of the existing concrete driveway, and conditioning and re-compacting clay soils. Within this, an additional bid item (Embankment) for handling, placing and compacting approximately 25 cubic yards of clay soils would need to be added, with the other items being completed at the current unit bid prices. The cost to add this repair to the project is \$4,060.00

The total Change Order #1 amount is \$21,795.00 with an original contract amount of \$141,505.00 making the new contract amount \$163,300.00.

The Committee reviewed the accompanying correspondence from Division Engineer, Jody Bertrand, related to a change order for the removal and replacement of concrete sidewalk/path along both sides of 40th Avenue South, just west of the bridge crossing of Rose Coulee. This Change Order #10 is for the removal and replacement of concrete sidewalk/path along both sides of 40th Avenue South just west of the bridge crossing of Rose Coulee.

### Background

The flood mitigation project along 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue South started in 2014 with the flood components and a portion of sidewalk completed that year. Due to construction issues and required time extensions, the project was substantially completed in the fall of 2015 with final turf acceptance occurring in the spring of 2016. During the spring of 2016 while completing the final walk-thru, major surface scaling/defects were encountered on the sections of sidewalk/path poured during the 2015 construction season. Several meetings were held on-site to evaluate the sidewalk condition and possible reasons for the issue and solutions. The Contractor initially proposed to grind the entire sidewalk area to provide a new finish surface. Engineering was skeptical of this method due to the possible smoothness of the finished surface (roughness/grip) and this method would also not remedy the deeper defects appearing at the saw-cut joints.

Through materials testing and observation results, a definitive cause could not be determined. The parties involved in the process proposed to resolve the issue through the cost sharing of the removal and replacement of the sidewalk/path. A settlement was reached, because of the uncertainty of the cause, for an equal cost share per party.

### Recommended Motion

Approve Change Order #10 for the removal and replacement of the 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue South sidewalk/path and to cost participate with ICS and Strata for a 1/3 share of the removal and replacements. The present total contract amount of \$3,906,247.31 will be increased by \$55,532.00, for an increased project cost of 1.5% for a new final contract amount of \$3,961,779.31.

This letter is being sent to inform you of the flood mitigation project status along 40<sup>th</sup> Avenue South. City staff and our consultants from Houston Engineering and Braun Intertec have reviewed the supplied materials testing report supplied by ICS and Strata performed by American Engineering Testing Inc.

Through Braun's evaluation of Terracon's conclusions of the materials testing conducted, they are not in agreement with two of the major statements. The first being the use of deicing chemicals being a significant contributor to the surface scaling defects. Sidewalk throughout the City over decades and the most recently installed sidewalk by ICS on this project the year prior to this installation and a separate sidewalk project the following year just east of this project area do not have similar surface defects.

The second is the ability of the use of a grinding operation to correct the problem for a long life concrete pavement. Our consultant believes that if grinding were to be accomplished the likelihood of future similar distresses is probable within a couple of years. As a note, it should be mentioned that a large portion of the saw joints have pop-outs which would be a more substantial depth than could be corrected by the grinding of 1/8 of an inch of the entire surface.

With multiple factors possibly contributing to the existing condition of the sidewalk from materials to placement, finishing and curing, it has become difficult to definitively specify one item which has led to the present situation.

The City wishes to come to an agreement to closeout this project and make the necessary repairs to obtain a long lasting useable concrete product and to that end, the City will entertain the possibility of a City cost participation. The City of Fargo believes a full replacement is necessary. To enable a cost participation level to be determined, some additional information as to the overall material costs for removal and replacement, along with necessary labor to complete the replacement will be needed. After the costs have been received, the negotiations can proceed.

We appreciate your cooperation and patience as we work towards a compromise to enable the completion of this important project.

#### **Purpose**

The infrastructure work for this area will be bid under the project noted above. A deposit will be required of \$9,500.

Staff is recommending approval.

Attached you will find a request for an early building permit from West Fargo Public School for the new elementary school on Lot10, Block 4 in Grayland First Addition.

Site access can be maintained during the construction of 54<sup>th</sup> Avenue South, since it is adjacent to 63<sup>rd</sup> Street.

The applicant will need to sign the agreement noting their access location.

As part of the early building permit, the applicant has provided a deposit that could be used to repair any impacts from the site construction to the municipal project. We used 475' frontage at \$20/ff. This brings the total to \$9,500 for their deposit.

#### **AGREEMENT**

#### EARLY BUILDING PERMIT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between THE CITY OF FARGO, a North Dakota municipal corporation, 200 North Third Street, Fargo, North Dakota 58102, hereinafter referred to as "City", and WEST FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT #6, a North Dakota political subdivision, hereinafter referred to as "Owner", and LEE JONES & SON CONSTRUCTION CO., a North Dakota corporation, hereinafter referred to as "Builder" (collectively hereafter "Builder").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, building permits are not available until sewer and water main connections are functional, except under limited circumstances and by agreement of the parties; and,

WHEREAS, for large building projects (commercial, industrial and multi-family [8-plex or greater]), permits may be issued prior to completion of said underground utilities, provided certain criteria are met; and,

WHEREAS, installation of utilities and paving can take place during the time said building projects are under way; and,

WHEREAS, City requires a deposit, cash, check or letter of credit, as one of the conditions for granting early building permits, said deposit to be utilized, if necessary, to reimburse City for any costs incurred by City arising out of Owner's, Builder's, Developers', Agents' or Subcontractors' activities under the early building permit; and,

**WHEREAS**, City requires an agreement with Owner and Builder relative to the issuance of early building permits.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, for good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. City agrees to issue an early building permit to Owner and Builder for the project, provided all conditions precedent are met.

- 2. In consideration of the issuance of said early building permit for the project stated, Owner agrees to deposit with City a cash deposit or letter of credit in the amount of Nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$9,500.00) (\$20.00 per front foot of lot covered by the permit). Said cash deposit may be utilized by City for any building site impacts, municipal project impacts, including utilities or paving, payment for corrective measures such as debris removal, drain maintenance, damages caused by unauthorized access, and cleaning adjacent streets impacted by building construction. It is specifically understood and agreed that this list is not exhaustive or exclusive, and that the City may use the deposited funds for any costs incurred by City due to Builder's activities.
- 3. Owner and Builder agree to be bound by the terms of the City of Fargo's policy on early building permit waivers. Builder agrees to provide a building site plan drawing showing access points and exact service utility connections before any construction activities may take place, such drawing and/or site plan must clearly show sanitary sewer, water sewer service, and storm sewer plans. Builder shall specify the following:
  - a. Site access to the building that will not impact municipal utilities/paving installation.
  - b. Temporary measures to address nonfunctional sewer, water and storm sewer on the building site.
  - c. Building construction and occupancy schedule.
  - d. Contact person for notification including name, address and phone.
- 4. City agrees to provide Builder 48-hour notice of project start-up. Builder agrees to clear right-of-way for such public construction. During construction, City shall give Builder two (2) hour notice to clear any area impacted by the City project.
- 5. Owner and Builder agree to indemnify and hold City harmless for any delays in municipal projects (i.e. utilities or paving) resulting from Builder's activities including, but not limited to, site interference, storage of construction materials, or any other activities permitted by the Early Building permit.

- 6. Owner and Builder understand and agree to accept all risks of proceeding with the building project in advance of the installation and operation of the municipal improvements. Owner and Builder waive, for themselves and successors, any and all claims for damages against City as a result of any delay in the installation of the municipal projects, for whatever reason. City will enter into a standard contract for the municipal project. Owner and Builder are not third party beneficiaries of the City contract and has no rights thereunder.
- 7. Owner and Builder agree to acquire any easements deemed necessary for site access to the building site. City shall not be responsible for easements.
- 8. Owner and Builder understand and agree that without installation of streets there is limited access to the site for fire and police protection. Builder agrees it is solely responsible for any access limitations, and Owner and Builder agree to indemnify and hold the City harmless from any all claims or damages alleged as a result of the limited site access.
- 9. The parties agree that any cash deposit or letter of credit remaining unused upon completion of the paving project (thus completing the public construction) shall be returned to the remitter upon application.
  - 10. The project and project location are as follows: 5565 63<sup>rd</sup> Street South, Fargo, ND

#### Background:

Improvement District No. BR-18-B2 was initiated to provide the design services to replace the storm sewer lift station on 10<sup>th</sup> Street N between 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue and the BNSF underpass as part of a larger project being designed by the NDDOT (Federal Aid project NHU-CPU-8-081(038)927) for 10<sup>th</sup> Street reconstruction from 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue, in 2018.

The lift station on 10<sup>th</sup> Street N, north of 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue was last upgraded in 1977. The 1977 project provided for separation of storm sewer flow from sanitary sewer flow. The lift station is currently on BNSF property and has seen limited maintenance by them. The intent is to replace the existing lift station and relocate it to City right-of-way for long-term ease of maintenance by the City. The cities "Master Services Agreement" was used as the vehicle to solicit cost proposals from already pre-approved consultants to perform storm sewer lift station replacement design services. Houston Engineering was selected as the project consultant. The original approved agreement was for \$25,862.00.

During the design process, it was determined that the following items would be necessary to provide a complete design for relocation of the storm sewer lift station: Additional Design Services-Hydrologic & Hydraulic analysis for pipe and lift station sizing, Additional Design Services-Structural Analysis for the chosen lift station new location off Railroad Right of Way, Additional Design Services- for design of detours to install the force main pipe from the new lift station location, Additional Design Services-Project Management/Coordination/Right of Way was required beyond the original project scope to integrate the City's work with the NDDOT project and design schedule. This change order for \$62,000.00 was approved by PWPEC 9-26-17.

During the right of way purchase negotiations additional land surveyor services were needed to clear up land ownership with the railroad of the chosen location for the new lift station. This extra work amounted to \$3,887.18.

The overall corridor project has been bid and awarded thru the NDDOT. NDDOT projects require specialized record keeping, full time inspection services, and construction staking. It is

#### Roger,

Please see the attached proposal. I tried to get in contact with Jason Winter, who I believe will be the PM from Master Construction on this project, to get some information on expected commencement/completion dates for the lift station portion of the project and estimated weekly/daily working hours. He answered once but told me he hadn't looked at the plans yet (a). So, without much information to go on, we made some assumptions as follows:

- 1. We will have a full-time (40 hrs/week) RPR on-site for the months of June, July, and August. In reality, we expect it to be more like 60 hours some weeks, 20 hours other weeks, and possibly some weeks where we aren't required to be there at all. The RPR on this project will be Tom Kornkven. Tom has been an engineer with us for 3 years. He has spent the bulk of those 3 years performing observation on the downtown flood control projects. He did so under the guidance of Mike Buerkley, who is our construction inspection lead at HEI. Tom has a lot of experience with reinforced concrete projects.
- 2. We assumed 8 hrs/week for reporting and coordination in the office. Adam Walker will lead the reporting. Adam performs the same services for the majority of NDDOT projects in our Fargo office and has over 10 years of experience doing so.
- 3. We assumed 4 hrs/week for general project management, coordination meetings, and additional observation. I will be performing the overall project management for this project. Time under this task will cover any required contractor, City, or NDDOT coordination meetings, as well as additional observation time required of myself, or of our structural engineers.
- 4. The remaining cost in the proposal includes costs for submittal review, construction staking, construction material testing, electrical and controls (submittal review, observation as needed, and start-up services), project closeout and "as-constructed" documents.

Also, we have some outstanding time that hasn't been billed yet for the assistance that Jim Schlieman provided for the BNSF property acquisition. I was waiting to see if we were asked to provide construction services before submitting an amendment to our original contract. If our proposal is acceptable, I could add that on as a separate task and submit the whole package as a contract amendment. If not, I can do a separate contract amendment for that work. Please advise.

For this project, we will provide technicians that are NDDOT certified in each specialized field. For the proposed scope of services, our staff will have the following certifications:

- ACI Concrete Field Testing Technician Grade 1

#### **Scope of Services**

We will provide NDDOT certified technicians working under the direction of a registered professional engineer to perform our testing services. Our testing services will be performed on an on-call, asneeded basis as requested and scheduled by you or the project contractors. We have reviewed the available project information and based on our discussions with you propose to provide the testing items listed below.

#### **Soil Related Services**

- Observe and evaluate the soils exposed in the bottoms of excavations to evaluate if the soils are similar to those encountered by soil borings associated with the referenced geotechnical report, and suitable for support of excavation backfill, additional required fill, and the project's structural design loads.
- Perform laboratory mechanical analyses (gradations) of prospective granular materials.



- Sample and perform laboratory Proctor tests to evaluate the maximum standard Proctor dry densities and optimum moisture contents of prospective backfill and subgrade materials.

#### Cost

We will furnish the services described in this proposal for an estimated fee of \$25,696.00. A cost estimate table showing hourly and unit rates associated with our proposed scope of services is attached. The actual cost of our services will be based on the actual units or hours expended to meet the requirements of the project documents.

Invoices for our services will be based on the actual number of hours provided for the project and the units tested. It is difficult to project all of the services and the quantity of services that may be required for any project. If services are required that are not discussed above, we will provide them at the rates shown in the attached table or, if not shown, at our current Schedule of Charges. We will invoice you on a monthly basis.

#### **General Remarks**

#### **General Conditions**

Construction Material Testing and Special Inspections



#### Section 1: Agreement

- 1.1 Our agreement with you consists of these General Conditions and the accompanying written proposal or authorization ("Agreement"). This Agreement is the entire agreement between you and us. It supersedes prior agreements. It may be modified only in a writing signed by us, making specific reference to the provision modified.
- **1.2** The words "you," "we," "us," and "our" include officers, employees, and subcontractors.
- 1.3 In the event you use a purchase order or other documentation to authorize our scope of work ("Services"), any conflicting or additional terms are not part of this Agreement. Directing us to start work prior to execution of this Agreement constitutes your acceptance. If, however, mutually acceptable terms cannot be established, we have the right to terminate this Agreement without liability to you or others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.

#### Section 2: Our Responsibilities

- 2.1 We will provide Services specifically described in this Agreement. You agree that we are not responsible for services that are not expressly included in this Agreement. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, our findings, opinions, and recommendations will be provided to you in writing. You agree not to rely on oral findings, opinions, or recommendations without our written approval.
- 2.2 In performing our professional services, we will use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by reputable members of our profession practicing in the same locality. If you direct us to deviate from our recommended procedures, you agree to hold us harmless from claims, damages, and expenses arising out of your direction. If during the one year period following completion of Services it is determined that the above standards have not been met and you have promptly notified us in writing of such failure, we will perform, at our cost, such corrective services as may be necessary, within the original scope in this Agreement, to remedy such deficiency. Remedies set forth in this section constitute your sole and exclusive recourse with respect to the performance or quality of Services.
- 2.3 We will reference our field observations and sampling to available reference points, but we will not survey, set, or check the accuracy of those points unless we accept that duty in writing. Locations of field observations or sampling described in our report or shown on our sketches are based on information provided by others or estimates made by our personnel. You agree that such dimensions, depths, or elevations are approximations unless specifically stated otherwise in the report. You accept the inherent risk that samples or observations may not be representative of things not sampled or seen and

further that site conditions may vary over distance or change over time.

- 2.4 Our duties do not include supervising or directing your representatives or contractors or commenting on, overseeing, or providing the means and methods of their services unless expressly set forth in this Agreement. We will not be responsible for the failure of your contractors, and the providing of Services will not relieve others of their responsibilities to you or to others.
- **2.5** We will provide a health and safety program for our employees, but we will not be responsible for contractor, owner, project, or site health or safety.
- 2.6 You will provide, at no cost to us, appropriate site safety measures as to work areas to be observed or inspected by us. Our employees are authorized by you to refuse to work under conditions that may be unsafe.
- 2.7 Unless a fixed fee is indicated, our price is an estimate of our project costs and expenses based on information available to us and our experience and knowledge. Such estimates are an exercise of our professional judgment and are not guaranteed or warranted. Actual costs may vary. You should allow a contingency in addition to estimated costs.

#### **Section 3: Your Responsibilities**

- **3.1** You will provide us with prior environmental, geotechnical and other reports, specifications, plans, and information to which you have access about the site. You agree to provide us with all plans, changes in plans, and new information as to site conditions until we have completed Services.
- 3.2 You will provide access to the site. In the performance of Services some site damage is normal even when due care is exercised. We will use reasonable care to minimize damage to the site. We have not included the cost of restoration of damage in the estimated charges.
- 3.3 If we notify you that radiographic or gamma ray equipment or other nuclear testing or measuring device will be used, you will be responsible for the cooperation of your employees and your contractors in observing all radiation safety standards.
- 3.4 You will notify us of any knowledge or suspicion of the presence of hazardous or dangerous materials present on any work site. If we observe or suspect the presence of contaminants not anticipated in this Agreement, we may terminate Services without liability to you or to others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.
- 3.5 The time our field personnel spend on the job site depends upon the scheduling of the work we are observing or testing. You agree that any changes in scheduling may result in additional

costs and agree to pay for those services at the rates listed in our cost estimate.

3.6 You agree to include us as an indemnified party in your contracts, if any, for work by others on the project, protecting us to the same degree as you are protected. You agree to list us as an Additional Insured under your liability insurance policies and to require subrogation be waived against us and that we will be added as an Additional Insured on all policies of insurance, including any policies required of your contractors or subcontractors, covering any construction or development activities to be performed on the project site.

#### Section 4: Reports and Records

- **4.1** Unless you request otherwise, we will provide our report(s) in an electronic format.
- 4.2 Our reports, notes, calculations, and other documents and our computer software and data are instruments of our service to you, and they remain our property. We hereby grant you a license to use the reports and related information we provide only for the related project and for the purposes disclosed to us. You may not transfer our reports to others or use them for a purpose for which they were not prepared without our written approval. You agree to indemnify, defend, and hold us harmless from claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorney fees, arising out of such a transfer or use.
- **4.3** If you do not pay for Services in full as agreed, we may retain work not yet delivered to you and you agree to return to us all of our work that is in your possession or under your control.
- 4.4 Electronic data, reports, photographs, samples, and other materials provided by you or others may be discarded or returned to you, at our discretion, unless within 15 days of the report date you give us written direction to store or transfer the materials at your expense.

#### Section 5: Compensation

- 5.1 You will pay for Services as stated in this Agreement. If such payment references our Schedule of Charges, the invoicing will be based upon the most current schedule. An estimated amount is not a firm figure. You agree to pay all sales taxes and other taxes based on your payment of our compensation. Our performance is subject to credit approval and payment of any specified retainer.
- 5.2 You will notify us of billing disputes within 15 days. You will pay undisputed portions of invoices upon receipt. You agree to pay interest on unpaid balances beginning 30 days after invoice dates at the rate of 1.5% per month, or at the maximum rate allowed by law.
- **5.3** If you direct us to invoice a third party, we may do so, but you agree to be responsible for our compensation unless the third party is

Page 107 credit worthy (in our sole opinion) and provides written acceptance of all terms of this Agreement.

- 5.4 Your obligation to pay for Services under this Agreement is not contingent on your ability to obtain financing, governmental or regulatory agency approval, permits, final adjudication of any lawsuit, your successful completion of any project, receipt of payment from a third party, or any other event. No retainage will be withheld.
- 5.5 If you do not pay us in accordance with this Agreement, you agree to reimburse all costs and expenses for collection of the moneys invoiced, including but not limited to attorney fees and staff time.
- 5.6 You agree to compensate us in accordance with our Schedule of Charges if we are asked or required to respond to legal process arising out of a proceeding related to the project and as to which we are not a party.
- 5.7 If we are delayed by factors beyond our control, or if project conditions or the scope or amount of work changes, or if changed labor conditions result in increased costs, decreased efficiency, or delays, or if the standards or methods change, we will give you timely notice, the schedule will be extended for each day of delay, and we will be compensated for costs and expenses incurred in accordance with our Schedule of Charges.
- 5.8 If you fail to pay us in accordance with this Agreement, we may consider the default a total breach of this Agreement and, at our option, terminate our duties without liability to you or to others, and you will compensate us for fees earned and expenses incurred up to the time of termination.
- 5.9 In consideration of our providing insurance to cover claims made by you, you hereby waive any right to offset fees otherwise due us.

You agree not to make a claim against us unless you have provided us at least 30 days prior to the institution of any legal proceeding against us with a written certificate executed by an appropriately licensed professional specifying and certifying each and every act or omission that you contend constitutes a violation of the standard of care governing our professional services. Should you fail to meet the conditions above, you agree to fully release us from any liability for such allegation.

If you are unwilling to accept this allocation of risk, we will increase our aggregate liability to \$100,000 provided that, within 10 days of the date of this Agreement, you provide payment in an amount that will increase our fees by 10%, but not less than \$500, to compensate us for the greater risk undertaken. This increased fee is not the purchase of insurance.
- 6.5 You agree to indemnify us from all liability to others in excess of the risk allocation stated herein and to insure this obligation. In addition, all indemnities and limitations of liability set forth in this Agreement apply however the same may arise, whether in contract, tort, statute, equity or other theory of law, including, but not limited to, the breach of any legal duty or the fault, negligence, or strict liability of either party.

- **8.6** No waiver of any right or privilege of either party will occur upon such party's failure to insist on performance of any term, condition, or instruction, or failure to exercise any right or privilege or its waiver of any breach.
