AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ARTICLE 39-01 OF CHAPTER 39 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO COLLECTION OF UTILITIES AND SERVICES

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the city shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, the board of city commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of paying for the construction, reconstruction, repair, improvements, maintenance, operation and use of the storm sewer system, the board of city commissioners wishes to establish a storm sewer system charge to be made against all properties located within the city limits. All charges shall be established, collected and accounted for in the manner as set forth under Article 39-01.

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the board of city commissioners of the city of Fargo:

Section 1. Enactment.

Article 39-01 of Chapter 39 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby enacted as follows:

CHAPTER 39 – STORM WATER UTILITY SERVICE

Article 39-01- Storm Water Service Charge

Section 39-0101- <u>Generally.</u> A monthly storm water service charge shall be collected for each property located within the city of Fargo.

Section 39-0102- Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this Article:

- (1) Land use or zoning classification is that classification identified in the Land Development Code, Fargo Municipal Code Chapter 20.
- (2) Area is the total square footage of all the improved and unimproved property contained within the boundaries of each parcel of land in the city as determined by the City Engineer or designee, in conjunction with the city Geographical Information System (GIS).
- (3) Storm water system rate is that portion of the total annual expenses which the board of commissioners of the city of Fargo determines is to be charged to a parcel with a specific land use or zoning classification to provide such services as the management and operation of the storm water system as well as the construction, reconstruction, repair, enlargement, maintenance, use and operation of all storm water utility improvements.
- (4) Storm water service charge is the actual charge imposed against each parcel of land within the city.

Section 39-0103- <u>Collection</u>. The storm water service charge shall be collected from each parcel on a monthly billing.

Section 39-0104-<u>Calculation</u>. The storm water service charge shall be a flat rate or based on the percentage of impervious surface and the size of the property draining into the city's storm sewer system.

Section 39-0105. <u>Fees for Residential and Nonresidential Properties.</u> Property within the city shall be assessed a monthly storm water service charge. The amount of the monthly storm water

service charge for all Residential and Nonresidential properties shall be established by Resolution of the board of city commissioners of the city of Fargo.

Section 39-0106-<u>Exemptions or Reduced Charges.</u> Exemptions and reduced charges may be adopted by Resolution of the board of city Commissioners of the city of Fargo.

Section 39-0107.- Review of Storm Water System Charge.

- (1) Property owners, as determined by the city of Fargo parcel information, may seek review of the storm sewer system charge by filing a written request for review with the City Engineer. The request shall be filed within thirty (30) days of the mailing of the monthly bill and shall set forth the particular grounds upon which the review is sought.
- (2) Grounds for review include questions relating to the city's determination of the parcel's area and its determination of the parcel's impervious surface determination.
- (3) The board of commissioners, by resolution and upon the recommendation of the City Engineer shall adopt guidelines and policies for the review of these petitions. The City Engineer shall follow these guidelines and policies and consider all pertinent data including that provided by the property owner before making a determination of the merits of each petition.

Section 39-0108.- <u>Certification of unpaid charges</u>. The balance of any unpaid storm water service charges shall be certified for collection with real estate taxes in the following year in accordance with Article 3-23.

Section 2. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval.

SUBJECT: PARKING LEASE

The City of Fargo has leased 110 parking spaces for city employees in the City Centre Lofts building that is under construction north of City Hall. This lease was approved and executed in 2017, and included both indoor and outdoor parking.

The developer of the project, Northland Hospitality, has established a condominium ownership plan and has recorded those documents. Because of the City lease for a portion of the building, Northland needs the City's consent for the condominium ownership documents. This consent does not amend the terms of the parking The City Attorney has reviewed the consent document and the condominium documents. The consent document is attached.

There will be a need to amend the parking lease prior to the completion of the building due to the changes in the design of the building and the delay in the completion of the project. The indoor parking was not available on July 1, 2018 as expected. We anticipate the parking will be available in November, but full enclosure of the space will not occur until sometime in 2019. The amount that the City pays will not increase until the parking is fully enclosed.

I will protest any increase to the estimated market value of the property as a result of the dwelling being resided.

The dwelling had to be resided as a result of the existing steel siding failing. The steel siding that was on the structure experienced paint failure. The paint was not adhering to the siding. The paint was flaking and peeling. Gentek, the steel siding supplier, was trying to correct the failure under their warranty policy. However, every effort Gentek attempted continued to experience almost yearly failure of the paint adhering to the siding.

It was became apparent the only remedy, available to Gentek and the property owner, was a complete residing of the property. Otherwise the property owner would continually be required to repaint on an almost yearly basis in order to address the historical yearly paint failure.

Having to repaint yearly is not something that is conducive to a potential buyer. Having to repaint yearly is a red flag for a potential buyer to negotiate lowering a selling price, not selling at a premium, much less being able sell at the full estimated market value. Therefore, it is my opinion that this does not justify an increase to the estimate market value. It is maintenance that was required in order to maintain the current estimated market value.

You have requested that we audit the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of City of Fargo as of December 31, 2018, and for the year then ended, and the related notes, which collectively comprise City of Fargo's basic financial statements. In addition, we will audit the entity's compliance over major federal award programs for the period ended December 31, 2018. We are pleased to confirm our acceptance and our understanding of this audit engagement by means of this letter. Our audits will be conducted with the objectives of our expressing an opinion on each opinion unit and an opinion on compliance regarding the entity's major federal award programs.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that Required Supplementary Information (RSI) be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to the RSI in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. These limited procedures will consist primarily of inquiries of management regarding their methods of measurement and presentation, and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries. We will not express an opinion or provide any form of assurance on the RSI. The RSI is required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. This RSI will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited:

- 1. Management's Discussion and Analysis
- 2. Schedule of Changes in Net OPEB Liability and Related Ratios
- 3. Schedule of OPEB Contributions
- 4. Schedule of Employer's Share of Net Pension Liability and Schedule of Employer Contributions

Supplementary information other than RSI will accompany City of Fargo's basic financial statements. We will subject the following supplementary information to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling the supplementary information to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. We intend to provide an opinion on the following supplementary information in relation to the financial statements as a whole:

- 1. Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards
- 2. Combining and Individual Fund Statements

Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards

We will subject the schedule of expenditures of federal awards to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling the schedule to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. We intend to provide an opinion on whether the schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented fairly in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

Also, the document we submit to you will include the following other additional information that will not be subjected to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the financial statements:

- 1. Introductory section
- 2. Capital Assets used in the Operation of Governmental Funds
- 3. Statistical section

Data Collection Form

Prior to the completion of our engagement, we will complete the sections of the Data Collection Form that are our responsibility. The form will summarize our audit findings, amounts and conclusions. It is management's responsibility to submit a reporting package including financial statements, schedule of expenditure of federal awards, summary schedule of prior audit findings and corrective action plan along with the Data Collection Form to the federal audit clearinghouse. The financial reporting package must be text searchable, unencrypted, and unlocked. Otherwise, the reporting package will not be accepted by the federal audit clearinghouse. We will assist you in the electronic submission and certification. You may request from us copies of our report for you to include with the reporting package submitted to pass-through entities.

The Data Collection Form is required to be submitted within the *earlier* of 30 days after receipt of our auditors' reports or nine months after the end of the audit period, unless specifically waived by a federal cognizant or oversight agency for audits. Data Collection Forms submitted untimely are one of the factors in assessing programs at a higher risk.

Audit of the Financial Statements

We will conduct our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS), the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States of America; the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Those standards and the Uniform Guidance require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the basic financial statements are free from material misstatement. An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, fraudulent financial reporting, misappropriation of assets, or violations of laws, governmental regulations, grant agreements, or contractual agreements.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. If appropriate, our procedures will therefore include tests of documentary evidence that support the transactions recorded in the accounts, tests of the physical existence of inventories, and direct confirmation of cash, investments, and certain other assets and liabilities by correspondence with creditors and financial institutions. As part of our audit process, we will request written representations from your attorneys, and they may bill you for responding. At the conclusion of our audit, we will also request certain written representations from you about the financial statements and related matters.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, together with the inherent limitations of internal control, an unavoidable risk that some material misstatements or noncompliance (whether caused by errors, fraudulent financial reporting, misappropriation of assets, detected abuse, or violations of laws or governmental regulations) may not be detected exists, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with U.S. GAAS and *Government Auditing Standards* of the Comptroller General of the United States of America. Please note that the determination of abuse is subjective and *Government Auditing Standards* does not require auditors to detect abuse.

In making our risk assessments, we consider internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. However, we will communicate to you in writing concerning any significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control relevant to the audit of the financial statements that we have identified during the audit. Our responsibility as auditors is, of course, limited to the period covered by our audit and does not extend to any other periods.

We will issue a written report upon completion of our audit of City of Fargo's basic financial statements. Our report will be addressed to the governing body of City of Fargo. We cannot provide assurance that an unmodified opinions will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinions, add an emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraph(s), or withdraw from the engagement.

In accordance with the requirements of *Government Auditing Standards*, we will also issue a written report describing the scope of our testing over internal control over financial reporting and over compliance with laws, regulations, and provisions of grants and contracts, including the results of that testing. However, providing an opinion on internal control and compliance over financial reporting will not be an objective of the audit and, therefore, no such opinion will be expressed.

We also will issue a written report on the items listed below upon completion of our audit:

- 1. Independent Auditor's Report on Internal Control over Financial Reporting and Compliance and Other Matters based on an Audit of Financial Statements Performed in Accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*.
- 2. Independent Auditor's Report on Compliance for the Major Federal Program; Report on Internal Control over Compliance; and Report on the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by the Uniform Guidance.

Audit of Major Program Compliance

Our audit of City of Fargo's major federal award program(s) compliance will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Single Audit Act, as amended; and the provisions the Uniform Guidance; and will include tests of accounting records, a determination of major programs in accordance the Uniform Guidance, and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such an opinion on major federal award program compliance and to render the required reports. We cannot provide assurance that an unmodified opinion on compliance will be expressed. Circumstances may arise in which it is necessary for us to modify our opinion or withdraw from the engagement.

The Uniform Guidance requires that we also plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the entity has complied with applicable laws and regulations and the provisions of contracts and grant agreements applicable to major federal award programs. Our procedures will consist of determining major federal programs and performing the applicable procedures described in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget *OMB Compliance Supplement* for the types of compliance requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each of the entity's major programs. The purpose of those procedures will be to express an opinion on the entity's compliance with requirements applicable to each of its major programs in our report on compliance issued pursuant to the Uniform Guidance.

Also, as required by the Uniform Guidance, we will perform tests of controls to evaluate the effectiveness of the design and operation of controls that we consider relevant to preventing or detecting material noncompliance with compliance requirements applicable to each of the entity's major federal award programs. However, our tests will be less in scope than would be necessary to render an opinion on these controls and, accordingly, no opinion will be expressed in our report.

We will issue a report on compliance that will include an opinion or disclaimer of opinion regarding the entity's major federal award programs, and a report on internal controls over compliance that will report any significant deficiencies and material weaknesses identified; however, such report will not express an opinion on internal control.

Management Responsibilities

Our audit will be conducted on the basis that management and, when appropriate, those charged with governance, acknowledge and understand that they have responsibility:

- 1. For the preparation and fair presentation of the basic financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America;
- 2. For the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error;
- 3. For identifying, in its accounts, all federal awards received and expended during the period and the federal programs under which they were received, including federal awards and funding increments received prior to December 26, 2014 (if any), and those received in accordance with the Uniform Guidance (generally received after December 26, 2014);
- 4. For maintaining records that adequately identify the source and application of funds for federally funded activities;
- 5. For preparing the schedule of expenses of federal awards (including notes and noncash assistance received) in accordance with the Uniform Guidance requirements;
- 6. For the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control over federal awards;
- 7. For establishing and maintaining effective internal control over federal awards that provides reasonable assurance that the nonfederal entity is managing federal awards in compliance with federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the federal awards;
- 8. PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT

The state of North Dakota, acting through its North Dakota Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Division (State), has determined the services identified in the Scope of Service paragraph below should be purchased.

City of Fargo (Vendor), 1240 25th Street South, Fargo, ND 58103-2367, proposes to provide those services.

State and Vendor therefore enter into the following:

TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

This Agreement runs from October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2019. This Agreement will not automatically renew.

2. SCOPE OF SERVICE

Vendor shall:

- A. Increase implementation of effective prevention at the community-level:
 - 1) By November 30th, Vendor shall identify a community coalition or workgroup to serve as the local advisory/work group to the community's prevention work.
 - 2) Vendor shall collaborate with existing substance abuse prevention organizations and programs in order to maximize benefit, avoid duplication and leverage, redirect and realign resources.
 - 3) Vendor is required to participate in Training and Technical Assistance (T/TA) opportunities provided by State, to include quarterly in-person trainings and an annual onsite TA visit, dates will be determined by State.
 - 4) Each month, Vendor shall participate in the following capacity-building activities: meeting with stakeholders (can include a coalition meeting, or other meeting with community stakeholders/partners), disseminate at least two messages to increase community readiness (utilize resources available at the Prevention Resource and Media Center), including what prevention is and how it is effective, community coalition and ways to get involved, general data, and other as approved by State.
 - 5) By May 1, 2019, Vendor shall ensure at least one individual from the community completes the Substance Abuse Prevention Skills Training (SAPST), a four-day training offered by State.
- B. Following the Strategic Prevention Framework, address State's data-driven priorities:
 - 1) Decrease underage drinking;
 - 2) Decrease adult binge drinking and related consequences; and
 - 3) Decrease opioid misuse and related consequences.
- C. By October 10, 2018, Vendor shall submit identified priorities and local conditions, following template in Attachment A.

- D. By September 30, 2019, Vendor shall submit implementation plans (following templates provided State) and implement activities, following information in Attachment B.
- E. On or before the 10th of each month, Vendor is required to submit monthly reports to the State, following the template in Attachment C.
- F. By October 15, 2019, Vendor is required to submit a final evaluation report to include the following information: detailed summary of progress made for each implemented strategy, clear analysis of process measures (total people reached, number of resources disseminated, etc.), outcome measures based on identified priority areas, identified barriers to implementation for each strategy, and possible solutions.

3. COMPENSATION

State, upon receipt and approval of SFN 1763 Request for Reimbursement and monthly report, shall pay Vendor monthly for completed deliverables. Monthly amount requested must not exceed \$5,000. Total payment under this Agreement may not exceed \$50,000. Vendor shall submit its request for reimbursement to State monthly. Vendor shall submit its final payment request to State no later than 15 days after the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

4. TERMINATION

a. Termination by Mutual Agreement or Notice

This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of both parties executed in writing, or upon 30-days' written notice by either party, with or without cause.

Early Termination in the Public Interest

State is entering into this Agreement for the purpose of carrying out the public policy of the state of North Dakota, as determined by its Governor, Legislative Assembly, and Courts. If this Agreement ceases to further the public policy of the state of North Dakota, State, in its sole discretion, by written notice to Vendor, may terminate this Agreement in whole or in part.

c. Termination for Lack of Funding or Authority

State may terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement, effective upon delivery of written notice to Vendor or on any later date stated in the notice, under any of the following conditions:

1) If funding from federal, state, or other sources is not obtained and continued at levels sufficient to allow for purchase of the services or supplies in the indicated quantities or term.

- 2) If federal or state laws or rules are modified or interpreted in a way that the services are no longer allowable or appropriate for purchase under this Agreement or are no longer eligible for the funding proposed for payments authorized by this Agreement.
- 3) If any license, permit, or certificate required by law or rule, or by the terms of this Agreement, is for any reason denied, revoked, suspended, or not renewed.

Termination of this Agreement under this subsection is without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of either party already accrued prior to termination.

d. Termination for Cause

State may terminate this Agreement effective upon delivery of written notice to Vendor, or any later date stated in the notice:

- 1) If Vendor fails to provide services required by this Agreement within the time specified or any extension agreed to by State; or
- 2) If Vendor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this Agreement, or so fails to pursue the work as to endanger performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms.

The rights and remedies of State provided in this section are not exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Agreement.

5. NONPERFORMANCE

Failure by Vendor to perform the terms of this Agreement constitutes a breach of contract and will result in the termination of the Agreement. If a breach by Vendor renders the Agreement impossible of performance by Vendor and is caused by circumstances beyond the control of Vendor, and through no fault of Vendor, the Agreement will be terminated and State may set off, against any liability or obligations owed to Vendor under this Agreement or otherwise, any amounts paid for individual items of work which are incomplete at the time of the breach.

6. FORCE MAJEURE

Vendor shall not be held responsible for delay or default caused by fire, flood, riot, acts of God, or war if the event is beyond Vendor's reasonable control, and Vendor gives notice to State immediately upon occurrence of the event that caused, or is reasonably expected to cause, the delay or default.

7. <u>VENDOR'S UNDERSTANDING OF TERM OF FUNDING</u>

Vendor understands that this Agreement is a one-time agreement, and acknowledges that it has received no assurances that this Agreement may be extended beyond its expiration date.

8. <u>VENDOR ASSURANCES</u>

This Agreement will be construed according to the laws of the state of North Dakota. In connection with furnishing supplies or performing work under this Agreement, persons who contract with or receive funds to provide services to State are obligated and agree to comply with all local, state, and federal laws, regulations, and executive orders related to the performance of this Agreement, including the following: Fair Labor Standards Act, Equal Pay Act of 1963, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the North Dakota Human Rights Act, the Comprehensive Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism Prevention, Treatment, and Rehabilitation Act of 1970, the Drug Abuse Prevention, Treatment, and Rehabilitation Act of 1970, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Mental Health Administration Reorganization Act of 1992, and the Pro-Children Act of 1994.

By signing this Agreement Vendor certifies that neither Vendor, Subcontractor, nor their principals are presently debarred, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in transactions with the state or federal government by any department or agency of the state or federal government.

Vendor must be an approved vendor with the Office of Management and Budget within the state of North Dakota as required by North Dakota Century Code § 54-44.4-09.

9. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT

Vendor may subcontract with qualified vendors of services, provided that any subcontract acknowledges the binding nature of this Agreement, and incorporates this Agreement, together with its attachments, as appropriate. Vendor is solely responsible for the performance of any subcontractor. Vendor may not contract for or on behalf of or incur obligations on behalf of State. Vendor may not assign or otherwise transfer or delegate any right or duty without State's express written consent.

10. INDEPENDENT ENTITY

Vendor is an independent entity under this Agreement. Vendor, its employees, agents, or representatives are not employees of State for any purpose, including the application of the Social Security Act, the Fair Labor Standards Act, the Federal Insurance Contribution Act, the Federal Unemployment Act, the North Dakota Unemployment Compensation Law, and the North Dakota Workforce Safety and Insurance Act. No part of this Agreement may be construed to represent the creation of an employer/employee relationship between State and Vendor. Vendor retains sole and absolute discretion in the manner and means of carrying out Vendor's activities and responsibilities under this Agreement, except to the extent specified in this Agreement.

11. INDEMNITY

State and Vendor each agree to assume their own liability for any and all claims of any nature, including all costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees which may in any manner result from or arise out of this Agreement.

12. INSURANCE

Vendor shall secure and keep in force during the term of this Agreement, from insurance companies, government self-insurance pools, or government self-retention funds, authorized to do business in North Dakota, the following insurance coverages:

- 1) Commercial general liability, including premises or operations, contractual, and products or completed operations coverages (if applicable), with a minimum liability limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- 2) Automobile liability, including Owned (if any), Hired, and Non-Owned automobiles, with minimum liability limits of \$250,000 per person and \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- 3) Workers compensation coverage meeting all statutory requirements.

The insurance coverages listed above must meet the following additional requirements:

- 1) Any deductible or self-insured retention amount or other similar obligation under the policies shall be the sole responsibility of the Vendor. The amount of any deductible or self-retention is subject to approval by the State.
- 2) This insurance may be in policy or policies of insurance, primary and excess, including the so-called umbrella or catastrophe form and must be placed with insurers rated "A-" or better by A.M. Best Company, Inc., provided any excess policy follows form for coverage. Less than an "A-" rating must be approved by the State. The policies shall be in form and terms approved by the State.
- 3) The insurance required in this Agreement, through a policy or endorsement, shall include a provision that the policy and endorsements may not be canceled or modified without 30 days' prior written notice to the undersigned State representative.
- 4) Vendor shall furnish a certificate of insurance to the undersigned State representative prior to commencement of this Agreement. An updated, current certificate of insurance shall be provided in the event of any change to a policy.
- 5) Failure to provide insurance as required in this Agreement is a material breach of contract entitling State to terminate this Agreement immediately.

13. NOTICE

Any notice or other communication required under this Agreement must be given by registered or certified mail and is complete on the date mailed when addressed to the parties at the following addresses: City of Fargo 1240 25th Street South Fargo, ND 58103-2367

Notice provided under this provision does not meet the notice requirements for monetary claims against State found at North Dakota Century Code § 32-12.2-04.

14. <u>INTEGRATION, MODIFICATION, AND CONFLICT IN DOCUMENTS</u>

This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between Vendor and State. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified within this Agreement. No alteration, amendment, or modification of this Agreement is effective unless it is reduced to writing, signed by the parties, and attached to the Agreement.

If any inconsistency exists between this Agreement and other provisions of collateral contractual agreements, which are made a part of this Agreement by reference or otherwise, the provisions of this Agreement control.

15. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If any term of this Agreement is declared by a court having jurisdiction to be illegal or unenforceable, the validity of the remaining terms will not be affected and, if possible, the rights and obligations of the parties are to be construed and enforced as if the Agreement does not contain the illegal or unenforceable term.

16. APPLICABLE LAW AND VENUE

This Agreement is governed by and construed according to the laws of the state of North Dakota. Any action to enforce this Agreement must be adjudicated exclusively in the state District Court of Burleigh County, North Dakota. Each party consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of such court and waives any claim of lack of jurisdiction or *forum non conveniens*.

17. ASSIGNMENT

Neither party may assign this Agreement or the party's rights under this Agreement without the written approval of the other party. Approval to assign may not be unreasonably withheld. This Agreement is equally binding on the respective parties and their successors and assigns.

18. SPOLIATION - PRESERVATION OF EVIDENCE

Vendor shall promptly notify State of all potential claims that arise or result from this Agreement. Vendor shall also take all reasonable steps to preserve all physical evidence and information that may be relevant to the circumstances surrounding a potential claim, while maintaining public safety, and grants to State the opportunity to review and inspect the evidence, including the scene of an accident.

19. WORKS FOR HIRE

Vendor acknowledges that all work(s) under this Agreement is "work(s) for hire" within the meaning of the United States Copyright Act (Title 17 United States Code) and hereby assigns to State all rights and interests Vendor may have in the work(s) it prepares under this Agreement, including any right to derivative use of the work(s). All software and related materials developed by Vendor in performance of this Agreement for State shall be the sole property of State, and Vendor hereby assigns and transfers all its right, title, and interest therein to State. Vendor shall execute all necessary documents to enable State to protect State's intellectual property rights under this section.

20. WORK PRODUCT, EQUIPMENT, AND MATERIALS

All work product, equipment, and materials created for State or purchased by State under this Agreement belong to State and must be delivered to State at State's request upon expiration or termination of this Agreement.

21. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

Vendor shall not use or disclose any information it receives from State under this Agreement that State has previously identified as confidential or exempt from mandatory public disclosure except as necessary to carry out the purposes of this Agreement or as authorized in advance by State. State shall not disclose any information it receives from Vendor that Vendor has previously identified as confidential and that State determines, in its sole discretion, is protected from mandatory public disclosure under a specific exception to the North Dakota open records law found in North Dakota Century Code chapter 44-04. The duty of State and Vendor to maintain confidentiality of information under this section continues beyond the term of this Agreement, including any extensions or renewals.

22. COMPLIANCE WITH PUBLIC RECORDS LAWS

Vendor understands that, except for disclosures prohibited in this Agreement, State must disclose to the public upon request any records it receives from Vendor. Vendor further understands that any records obtained or generated by Vendor under this Agreement, except for records that are confidential under this Agreement, may be open to the public upon request under certain circumstances under the North Dakota open records law. Vendor agrees to contact State immediately upon receiving a request for information under the open records law and to comply with State's instructions on how to respond to the request.

23. ATTORNEY FEES

If a lawsuit is filed by State to obtain performance due under this Agreement, and State is the prevailing party, Vendor shall pay State's reasonable attorney fees and costs in connection with the lawsuit, except when prohibited by North Dakota Century Code § 28-26-04.

24. <u>ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION – JURY TRIAL</u>

State does not agree to any form of binding arbitration, mediation, or other forms of mandatory alternative dispute resolution. The parties may enforce their rights and remedies in judicial proceedings. State does not waive any right to a jury trial.

25. NONDISCRIMINATION AND COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

Vendor shall comply with all laws, rules, and policies, including those relating to nondiscrimination, accessibility, and civil rights. Vendor shall timely file all required reports, make required payroll deductions, and timely pay all taxes and premiums owed, including sales and use taxes, unemployment compensation, and workers' compensation premiums. Vendor also shall have and keep current at all times during the term of this Agreement all licenses and permits required by law.

26. ACCESS TO BOOKS AND RECORDS

Vendor shall provide State, the federal government, and their duly authorized representatives access to the books, documents, papers, and records of Vendor, which are pertinent to the services provided under this Agreement, for the purpose of making an audit or examination, or for making excerpts and transcripts. All records, regardless of physical form, and the accounting practices and procedures of Vendor relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the North Dakota State Auditor, the Auditor's designee, or federal auditors. Vendor shall maintain all of these records for at least three years following completion of this Agreement and be able to provide them at any reasonable time. State, State Auditor, or Auditor's designee shall provide reasonable notice.

Background:

Project BP-00-43 is for abating asbestos in the old City Hall prior to demolition.

Terracon was hired by the City in September 2017 to survey City Hall for asbestos containing materials that need to be abated prior to demolition. The report that Terracon generated was used as a bidding document for asbestos abatement contractors to quote their removal lump sum cost.

In September of 2018 the City solicited quotes from 15 asbestos abatement contractors. VCI and Horsley Specialties were the only two contractors to submit quotes. VCI was ultimately hired by the City.

VCI was preparing rooms identified on the survey to remove a 9x9 asbestos containing black floor tile. The 9x9 floor tile is located under several other layers of tile and carpeting. A VCI employee discovered 9x9 black floor tile in a room that was not identified on the survey. Searching throughout first floor it was discovered that an additional 10,700 SF of 9x9 floor tile was not accounted for in the survey. A few rooms were found to have had the black floor tile previously removed on a remodel project. VCI provided a unit price of \$4.00/SF to dispose of the black floor tile discovered in rooms not on the survey. This equates to \$42,800 additional cost to the project.

Additional 400 SF of black mastic under yellow floor tile that was not on the survey was found and needs to be abated. A unit price of \$3.50/SF equates to \$1,400 additional cost to the project.

VCI found asbestos in duct pipes associated with the wall uninvent system supplying the 1st and 2nd floors. VCI will need to abate around the support columns around the building to remove these. 110 ducts need to be abated at a cost of \$200/duct. This equates to \$22,000 additional cost to the project.

VCI also performed destructive testing and found additional lineal footages of pipe insulation in walls that fed plumbing fixtures and the radiators. 306 If of insulation at a cost of \$18.50/LF equates to \$5,661 in additional cost.

Federal Aid Projects

Pavement Preservation Projects

Overview

Pavement Preservation Projects are arguably the most important projects in our annual capital improvement plan.

Pavement preservation is a proactive approach that implements a series of low-cost, preventative maintenance treatments that are aimed at preserving the investment of our roadway network, extending the pavement life, and meeting our citizens' needs. No pavement will last forever, but with timely applications of these projects we can extend the pavement life resulting in cost savings.

Pavement Preservation: Repair and Rehabilitation Projects

Overview

Repair projects include asphalt crack seal and concrete spot repairs. The annual crack seal project is located in the same areas as the seal coat project and aids in preserving and extending the life of the asphalt roadway. The citywide concrete spot repair project repairs relatively small concrete issues that arise throughout the city each year. The concrete rehabilitation project is performed on a roadway corridor and is utilized to extend the overall pavement life of that project corridor.

Pavement Preservation: Seal Coat Projects

Overview

Seal Coat Projects take place throughout the city and are a way to extend the life of asphalt pavement. As the name implies, they are utilized to seal the pavement to keep water from penetrating the road structure. They also prevent deterioration of the asphalt surface from the effects of aging and oxidation due to water and the sun. Many state DOTs have studied the benefits of seal coats and have found that seal coats are most effective when placed within one or two years after the surface layer (asphalt wear course) is placed. After two years, the pavement has already been damaged from the effects of the sun and will no longer benefit from a seal coat. Studies also recommend a seal coat be reapplied approximately every eight years.

Based on that research, seal coats are installed on new wear course projects two years after installation and are funded 100% by special assessments. Seal coats are installed on mill and overlay projects two years after installation and are funded 100% by city funds. Subsequent seal coats are installed every eight years and are also funded 100% by city funds.

Seal coat projects are performed on arterial, collector, and local roadways. Combined those three roadway classifications account for 5,177,670 SY of asphalt pavement in the City of Fargo. This year our seal coat project includes 63,970 SY of seal coating on projects that received a wear course in 2017 and will be funded by special assessments. Our project will also include 540,710 SY of seal coating on projects that received a mill and overlay in 2017 or a seal coat approximately eight years ago. The total amount of asphalt pavement to receive a seal coat in 2019 is 604,680 SY or about 11.7% of our asphalt roadway network.

Pavement Preservation: Wear Course Projects

Overview

Wear Course Projects place the final surface layer of asphalt in new developments. These projects take place anywhere from just a couple of years up to 15 years after the initial construction of a new development and include drainage correction and installation of the final surface of asphalt. Wear course projects don't typically take place until approximately 90% of the lots in a new development have been built on. This allows private contractors time to construct buildings without fear of damaging the final surface of asphalt. It also allows for settlement to occur, which we correct during the wear course project.

Proposed Projects

Locations for the wear course project will be evaluated in the early part of 2019. This will allow us to make the best determination of the appropriate locations based on the percentage of build out in new developments. Based on previous capital improvement projects, we anticipate the project to be approximately \$1 million.

Pavement Preservation: Mill and Overlay Projects

Overview

Mill and Overlay Projects extend the life of the pavement and improve the ride quality. As part of these projects we also correct drainage issues and replace sidewalk curb ramps that do not meet Federal ADA requirements.

The anticipated frequency of asphalt mill and overlay projects can vary greatly depending on a number of factors, such as pavement subgrade and drainage, traffic volumes, weight of vehicle traffic, and initial quality of asphalt pavement, but is typically once every 25 years. Mill and overlay projects are performed on arterial, collector, and local roadways. Combined those three roadway classifications account for 5,177,670 SY of asphalt pavement in the City of Fargo. This year our proposed mill and overlay projects include 177,200 SY of asphalt paving or about 3.4% of our network. Based on a 25 year cycle, our goal should be to mill and overlay approximately 4% of our asphalt roadway network each year.

Sidewalk Projects

Overview

Miscellaneous Projects

Overview

Miscellaneous Projects vary from year to year, but this year they include tree planting, water service lowering, sanitary sewer/manhole rehabilitation, new water main installation, public relations/communications, and bridge maintenance.

The tree planting project is for plantings along arterial roadways and is funded utilizing city funds.

The water service lowering project is an annual project to lower water services throughout the city that are known to be susceptible to freezing. Currently these property owners need to run water continuously during winter in order to reduce the risk of a frozen water service. This project will reduce the risk of freezing water services and eliminates the need to continuously run water.

The sanitary sewer lining/manhole rehabilitation project is to repair sanitary sewer mains and manholes that have been discovered by Public Work's televising program. This project will use "no dig" repairs as much as feasible and is necessary to prevent what will otherwise become very costly repairs in the near future.

The water main project on 19th Ave N is necessary to provide looping and adequate fire flows for the continued development along the 19th Ave N corridor.

The public relations/communications project is to aid in the communication of capital improvement projects. This project is critical to the successful construction of our projects as it allows us to effectively communicate with the public by giving updates of progress, road closures, and other items that aid in a positive public perception of roadway projects.

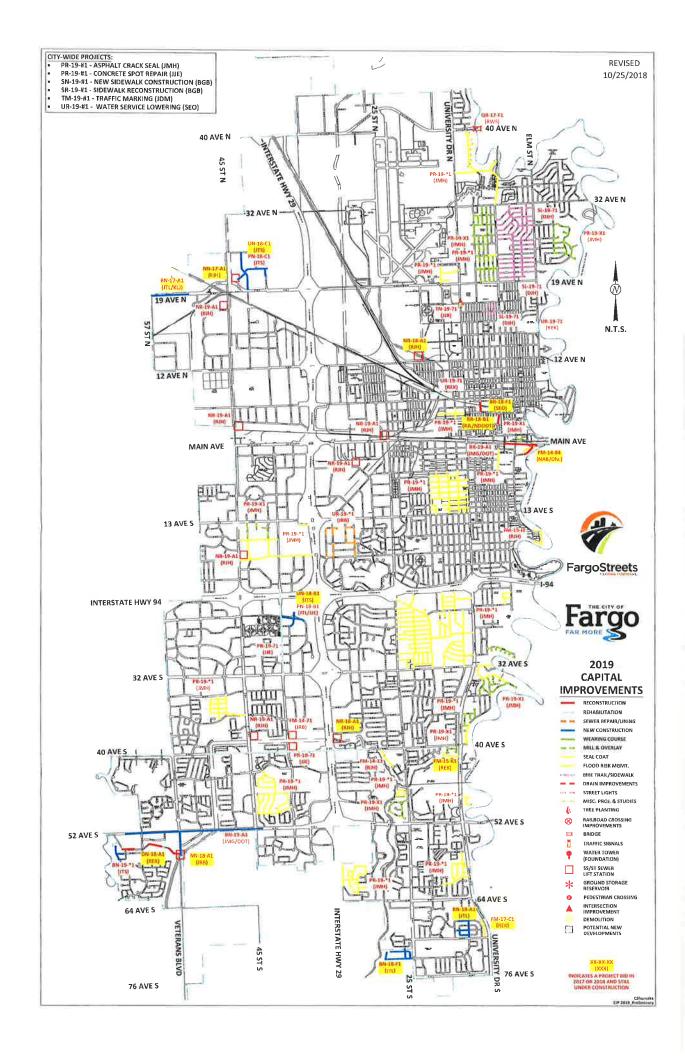
The bridge maintenance projects are in collaboration with other local entities and the City of Fargo will cost share in the projects utilizing city funds.

Terry Ludlum, Solid Waste Utility Director, presented the attached Task Order with Wenck Associates, Inc., for providing construction management services for the Landfill Gas Compressor Station Expansion Project.

SW16-03 has been a multi-phase project that began in 2016. Phase I of the project included a design basis analysis and procurement of the new and replacement equipment necessary for the compression and treatment of landfill gas to be used with current and potential renewable energy projects. Phase II will include installation of the equipment, required building modifications, building site improvements, and system start-up.

Wenck Associate's proposal includes a scope of work divided in five tasks as shown below. The proposed level of effort to complete the work on a rate per hour basis is approximately \$177,270.

Attached for your reference is a task order from Wenck Associates. The proposal is for Construction Management Services of Project SW16-03 (Phase II), the Landfill Gas (LFG) Compressor Station Expansion Project. The proposed work will be performed on a Time and Expense basis for a sum not to exceed \$177,270 without prior authorization.

Background

Since 2002, LFG has been captured in an effort to control odors and to take advantage of potential revenues associated with the utilization of a renewable energy (RE) source.

Current end-users of the landfill gas include:

- Cargill used as a boiler fuel in oil seed operation.
- Landfill Gas Generator electricity produced and sold to Minnkota Power.
- Transfer Station Boilers offset heating cost along with captured exhaust heat from generator.

With ongoing landfill operations and the resultant expansion of the LFG collection system. Solid Waste staff continues to explore emerging technologies that may be applicable to the RE program. To prepare for the potential implementation of additional RE projects, it is necessary to replace original equipment that has mostly run on a continuous basis since original installation, as well as enhance the collection and treatment system with updated technologies.

Project SW16-03 - Phase I

Project SW16-03 has been a multiple-phase project due to the overall complexity and individual nature of the necessary compression and landfill gas treatment equipment. Phase I of the project began in 2016 and included completion of the following tasks:

Task 1 – Design Basis Analysis

Perform a thorough analysis of all current and proposed end users relative to quality and quantity of LFG needs. Analysis included design flow, delivery pressure, moisture content tolerance, allowable H2S concentration, and allowable siloxane concentration. Gas quality parameters were then used to prepare a detailed process flow diagram that included the major pieces of equipment necessary for the compression and treatment of the LFG. The analysis also included the integration of new and existing control systems, review and compliance with applicable building codes, electrical codes, fire codes, and process equipment standards.

Task 2 – Procurement of Equipment

Utilizing information derived from the Design Basis Analysis, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was prepared that included specifications for the compressors, moisture removal systems, H2S treatment systems, siloxane treatment system, and the new flare. Conformance with determined design specifications and proposed capital cost for the equipment were used to select the preferred supplier for each major piece of equipment.

Task 3 – Detailed Design

Upon formal award of the separate equipment components, work began with each individual supplier to prepare the detailed design to complete the construction project. Detailed design included a process flow diagram, preparation of shop drawings, and preparation of piping / instrumentation diagrams for the complete system. Also included within this task was the formal advertisement and award for Phase II construction of SW16-03.

Project SW16-03 - Phase II

Bids for the construction of SW16-03 were approved by the City Commission on October 8th, 2018. Contracts have been or will be approved in a *Multiple Prime Contractor* format with the following contractors for Phase II of the project:

Proposed Task Order

Wenck's proposed task order is for construction management services associated with SW16-03 Phase II. These services will include installation of the previously procured equipment, required compressor station building modifications, building site improvements, and system start-up.

Specifically, Wenck has divided the scope of work into five distinct tasks:

Task 1 – Shop Drawing Review and Controls Programming

 Complete review of submittals to ensure compliance with project design and local code requirements.

Task 2 – Meetings and Construction Observation

 Facilitate pre-construction meeting, weekly progress meetings, and monthly design meetings, with all contractors throughout construction phase of the project. Also includes construction oversight on a part-time basis.

Task 3 – Progress Payment Applications

Review submitted contractor payment applications and verify quantities.

Task 5 – Contractor management and Coordination

 Includes Request for Information (RFI) responses, change order preparation and execution, ongoing contractor discussions to resolve minor issues, submittal tracking, progress reports and analysis to City staff, and project management to include budget tracking.

Task 2 - Meetings and Construction Observation

Wenck has assisted the City with facilitating a pre-construction meeting with Gast Construction, Rickard Electric, Robert Gibb & Son's, and City Staff. Wenck will also facilitate weekly construction meetings throughout the construction phase of the project. We have had good success with weekly meetings on past projects and believe this project will benefit greatly from the routine weekly meetings to assure that all team members are in agreement. These weekly meetings will be used to keep everyone informed of work being completed, any issues, and look at upcoming work tasks to be completed. In addition we are proposing monthly meetings that will incorporate the larger design team as well as all contractors to confirm major milestones are met.

Wenck will complete site visits and provide construction oversight on a part-time basis. We have anticipated this to be an average of 8 hours per week for 20 weeks knowing that some weeks will require more or less depending on actual work being completed at the time. The following meetings are included in this task:

Task 3 - Progress Payment Applications

Jim Hausauer, Wastewater Utility Director, presented attached Change Order #1 from CC Steel, Inc. for Project WW1708. If you recall the Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF) operates an Effluent Reuse Facility (ERF) that treats secondary effluent to reverse osmosis quality water for use at the Tharaldson Ethanol Plant in Casselton, ND. The ERF treats and provides (sells) over a million gallons of water a day that would ordinarily be discharged into the river. One of the critical components of the treatment process is the Ultra Filtration (UF) Skid/Membranes. The UF skids are essentially the "first step" in the filtration process and are exposed to a constant and rigorous cleaning regimen. Essentially the UF membranes are the most scrutinized component of the treatment process, as a failure of one of the skids would result in 40% less water produced and greater wear and tear of the remaining 2 skids.

The Tharaldson Ethanol Plant has completed a recent expansion and the Wastewater Utility has seen a gradual increase of water demand; with record volumes recorded in 2016, 2017 and 2018. Currently the three UF skids are producing maximum volumes as per the original design, with little redundancy for cleaning, repairs and/or failures. As the Wastewater Utility has been in contact with Tharaldson Ethanol over the last few year regarding the ERF limitations, they offered to purchase a fourth UF skid and have asked the City of Fargo to finance the infrastructure and installation over a 12-month period. At the end of the finance period, the City of Fargo will own the infrastructure. The addition of a fourth UF Skid will increase water volumes ~ 110,000 gallons per day as well as providing needed redundancy. With approval from the Finance Committee, the Wastewater Utility utilized an unused placeholder in fund 455 to provide 12 month financing for repayment from Tharaldson Ethanol. Tharaldson will remit the actual capital costs of this improvement in 12 equal monthly payments as per the MOU that was approved by the City Commission.

Change Order #1: CC Steel incurred unforeseen costs associated with piping in the new ERF membrane skid. The plan set shows a continuation of piping in the existing trench and plumbing it into the skid. The existing conditions did not allow the continuation of piping without significant rework. The existing piping was fabricated so tight and skewed out of line that it made it nearly impossible to pipe into the new skid. CC Steel hired Standard Industries (SI) to complete the field welding. SI felt it would be easier to cut the lines apart and fabricate a new manifold to continue the hook-up. The associated time for cutting and fabricating beyond the scope was determined to be \$3,750.00.

The plan set also did not show the 3" CIP return line that was needed to complete the installation. The additional stainless steel and fittings were required to connect the 3" CIP return line. The material and time to complete this line is \$2150.00

CC Steel was asked to provide additional lateral pipe supports to reduce lateral movement in the existing pipe after the skid was installed. Threaded rod and clamps were used to insure the least amount of movement as possible. This was completed for \$1150.00.

Change Order #1 will also result in the extension of the final completion date of 11/30/2018. This extension was necessary for the procurement of unique pipes and fittings identified in the plan set as well as a delay in the availability and delivery of the Ultra Filtration Membrane Skid package by the selected vendor

CC Steel has incurred unforeseen costs associated with piping in the new ERF membrane skid. The plan set shows to continue piping in the existing trench and plumbing it into the the skid. The existing conditions did not allow us to continue the piping without a fair amount of rework. The existing piping was fabricated so tight it made it nearly impossible to continue on without cutting it all apart. The existing piping also was skewed out of line that would have eventually made it impossible to pipe in the new skid. CC Steel hired Standard Industries (SI) to complete the field welding. SI felt it would be easier to cut the lines apart and fabricate a new manifold to continue the hook-up. The associated time for cutting and fabricating beyond our scope was determined to be \$3,750.00.

The plan set also did not show the 3" CIP return line that was needed to complete the installation. The material and time to complete this line is \$2150.00

CC Steel was asked to provide additional lateral pipe supports. We will use threaded rod and clamps to insure the least amount of movement as possible. This task can be completed for \$1150.

CC Steel also incurred 91 extra man hours to assemble the skid. The plan set shows a one piece skid when in fact the skid came in 3 pieces. It required extra unloading time and assembly time. CC Steel is charging a rate of \$85 an hour. 61 hrs \times \$85 = \$5185. I know there has been some discussion related to this topic but I would ask you to reconsider your position based upon the way the skid is represented in the drawings.

Let me know if you need further clarification or documentation on any of the items.

The plan set depicts the fully assembled skid and the specifications state that the "unit shall be pre-assembled, to the maximum extent possible, by the BIDDER for installation by the CONTRACTOR." This is a dispute between the supplier (Vessco/Memcor) and the contractor (CC Steel) based on the information exchanged between the two parties prior to bidding the project. It is not the responsibility of the Owner.

Proposal:

The applicant, the City of Fargo, is requesting a minor subdivision, entitled **Parkview South Eighth Addition**, which is a replat of Lot 32, Block 2, Parkview South Second Addition, and a Subdivision Waiver for lot size on Lots 1, and 3-16, Block 1, of the proposed plat. Lots 1, and 3-16 do not meet the minimum lot size for the SR-2, Single-Dwelling zoning district. The subject property is located at 3210 26th Avenue South and is comprised of approximately 2.06 acres.

The Parkview Development was developed to use this and other similar lots as amenities. However, the city acquired the property from Cass County from non-payment of taxes. The City of Fargo is preparing the properties to allow adjacent property owners in the original Parkview Development or other adjacent development to have the opportunity to acquire the property in the future. This process is yet to be determined and may serve as a template for other lots similar to this in the Parkview Development.

This project was reviewed by the City's Planning and Development, Engineering, Public Works, and Fire Departments ("staff"), whose comments are included in this report.

Surrounding Land Uses and Zoning Districts:

- North: Across 26th Avenue South, SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential, with detached homes.
- East: SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential, with detached homes.
- South: SR-4, Single-Dwelling Residential, with attached homes.
- West: SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential, with detached homes.

Area Plans:

No area plans apply.

Schools and Parks:

Schools: The subject property is located within the Fargo School District and is served by Ed Clapp Elementary, Carl Ben Middle, and South High Schools.

Neighborhood: The subject property is located in the Bluemont Lakes neighborhood.

Parks: There is Woodbury Park (3501 23rd Avenue South) and Bluemont Park (2751 32rd Avenue South) located within .5 mile from the subject property. Together they offer playground amenities, a basketball court, gazebos, and open space.

Pedestrian / Bicycle: There are off-road bike facilities located along 23rd Avenue South, 25th Street South, and 32rd Avenue South. All facilities are components of the metro area bikeways system.

Staff Analysis:

Minor Subdivision

The LDC stipulates that the following criteria is met before a minor plat can be approved:

1. Section 20-0907.B.3 of the LDC stipulates that the Planning Commission recommend approval or denial of the application, based on whether it complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. Section 20-0907.B.4 of the LDC further stipulates that a Minor Subdivision Plat shall not be approved unless it is located in a zoning district that allows the proposed development and complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.

The subdivision is intended to subdivide Lot 32, Block 2, Parkview South Second Addition into eighteen lots and one block. Lots 1, and 3-16 are included in the subdivision wavier and are below the minimum lot size of 8,000 square feet in the SR-2 zoning district, as required by Section 20-0501 Residential District Standards. It is intended these lots will be acquired by adjacent property owners and the properties combined; however, that will be determined at a later date. It should be noted that Lots 2, 17 and 18 meet minimum lot sizes and would be considered buildable. In accordance with Section 20-0901.F of the LDC, notices of the proposed plat have been sent out to property owners within 300 feet of the subject property. To date, staff has received approximately 10 inquiries on the property, with questions regarding the future of the lots; however, there was no noted concern for the subdivision application. Staff has reviewed this request and finds that this application complies with standards of Article 20-06 and all applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. (Criteria Satisfied)

Section 20-907.C.4.f of the LDC stipulates that in taking action on a Final Plat, the Board of City Commissioners shall specify the terms for securing installation of public improvements to serve the subdivision.

While this section of the LDC specifically addresses only major subdivision plats, staff believes it is important to note that any improvements associated with the project (both existing and proposed) are subject to special assessments. Special assessments associated with the costs of the public infrastructure improvements are proposed to be spread by the front footage basis and storm sewer by the square footage basis as is typical with the City of Fargo assessment principles. (Criteria Satisfied)

Subdivision Waiver

The LDC stipulates that the following criteria are met before a subdivision waiver can be approved:

 Section 20-0907.D.3.a of the LDC stipulates that a Subdivision Waiver must not be detrimental to the public safety, health, or welfare, or injurious to other property or improvements in the area in which the property is located.

The subdivision waiver is to allow Lots 1, and 3-16 to be smaller than the minimum lot size of 8,000 square feet in the SR-2 zoning district. Lots range in size from 2,949 square feet to 4,866 square feet. It is intended

these lots will be acquired by adjacent property owners and the properties combined; however, that will be determined at a later date. It should be noted that Lots 2, 17 and 18 meet minimum lot sizes and would be considered buildable. All adjacent properties are zoned SR-2 and meet minimum lot size standards. Staff finds that the application will not be detrimental to the public safety, health or welfare, or injurious to other property or improvements in the area. (Criteria Satisfied)

Section 20-0901.D.3.b of the LDC stipulates that a Subdivision Waiver must represent the least deviation from this Land Development Code that will mitigate the hardship or practical difficulty that exists on the subject property.

Lots 1, and 3-16, Block 1, of the subdivision do not meet minimum requirements for lot size in the SR-2, single-dwelling, zoning district. This application requests for only a waiver for the minimum lot size in fifteen of the eighteen lots. There are no other deviations from standards of Article 20-06. The property may be acquired by an adjacent property owner in the future, which currently are zoned SR-2 and meet minimum lot sizes. (Criteria Satisfied)

Section 20-0907.D.3.c of the LDC stipulates that a Subdivision Waiver shall not have the effect of
waiving any provisions of this development code other than the Subdivision Design and
Improvement Standards of Article 20-06.

This application requests for only a waiver for the minimum lot size in fifteen of the eighteen lots. There are no other deviations from standards of Article 20-06. (Criteria Satisfied)

Update from 7/3/18 Planning Commission meeting: Property owners spoke at the meeting and stated concerns of the amount of time and money invested in the property, maintaining the original intent of the greenspace, questions of potential increase in fees due to specials and property taxes, and the division of land. Some people that provided testimony had questions about the application or future process, but were all generally in support of the application.

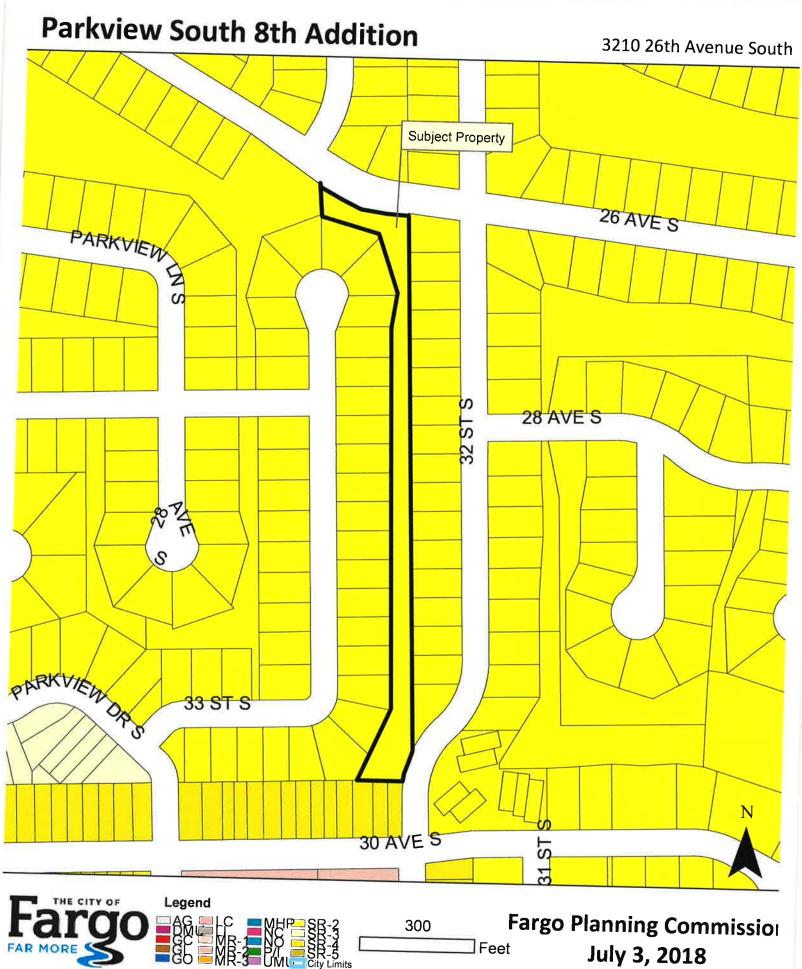

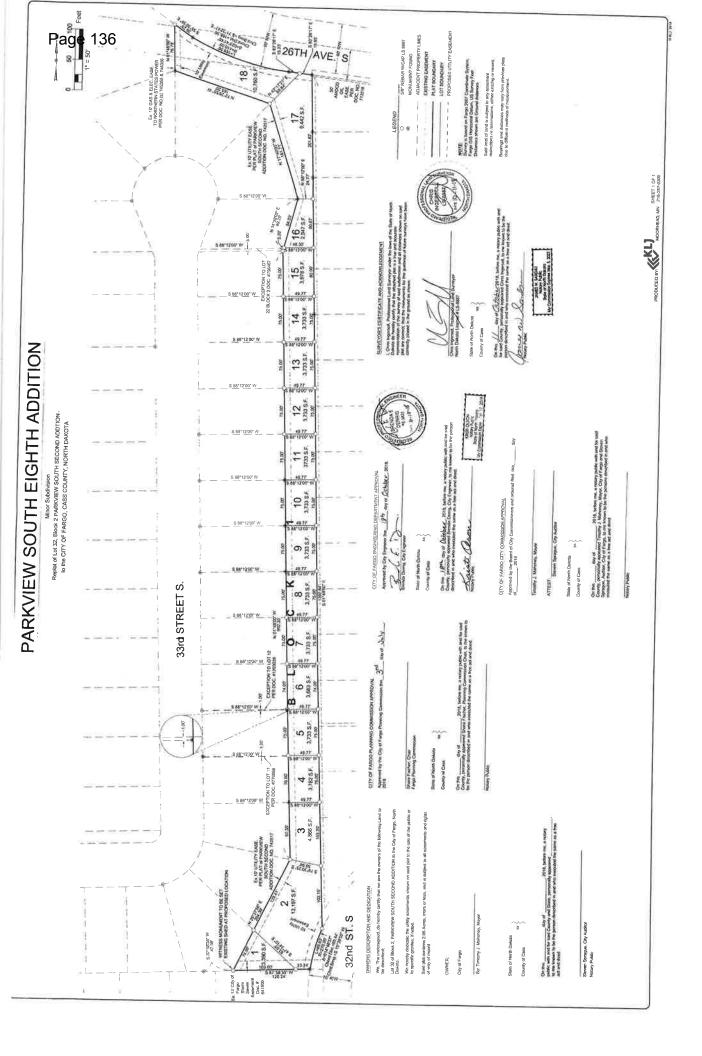

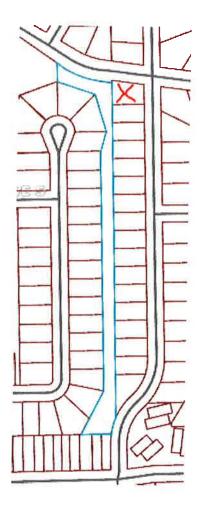

This agreement is between the state of North Dakota, acting by and through its Director of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as NDDOT, whose address is 608 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, North Dakota 58505-0700, and the Local Public Agency (LPA) of , North Dakota, hereinafter referred to as the LPA, who agree that:

It is in the best interest of both parties to have the LPA construct and maintain this project according to the terms and conditions set forth in this agreement. NDDOT will assist the LPA with the preparation and distribution of the bid documents and include the project in a scheduled bid opening.

The LPA agrees to the terms and conditions required for this project by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).

NDDOT will procure federal funds for the construction of the project, pursuant to Title 23 of the United States Code.

Federal funds obligated for this project shall not exceed percent of the total eligible project cost. The total cost of the project is \$, with the LPA's estimated share being \$.

Additional Funding Clause

The total eligible project costs include the cost of those items shown in the engineer's detailed estimate as approved for federal funds and any project changes approved by NDDOT for the use of federal funds.

Federal funds may not be obligated by the LPA, prior to FHWA approval of the program documents for the project.

LPA Obligation:

1. To comply with the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) requirements established by NDDOT for the project.

The LPA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of any USDOT-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR Part 26. - 5. To comply with the procedures outlined in the current edition of NDDOT's Local Government Manual.
- 6. To comply with the current edition of NDDOT's Right of Way Acquisition Procedures for Local Public Agency Federal Aid Projects.
- 7. The LPA will be responsible for any consideration, avoidance, and minimization of impacts upon real property related to this project, such as changes in the grades of streets, inconvenience to property or business, and any loss of light, air, view, access, egress, drainage, support, or nuisance,
- 8. To comply with the requirements of Appendices A and E of the Title VI Assurances, attached and incorporated by reference herein.

PART II

Contracting and Construction:

- 1. On behalf of the LPA, NDDOT will:
 - a. Prepare the bid package, solicit proposals, and include the project in a scheduled bid opening as provided in the North Dakota Century Code, Chapter 24-02.
 - b. Evaluate the bids as to the sufficiency of Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation and the bidder's good faith efforts in satisfying the requirements of the current edition of the DBE special provision, and 49 CFR Part 26. NDDOT shall have exclusive authority in evaluating the adequacy of DBE participation.
 - c. Tabulate the bids and send to the LPA.
 - d. Concur in the award of the contract, after the LPA has executed the contract, for the sole purpose of enabling the LPA to procure federal aid for the construction of the project.

2. The LPA will:

- a. Review bids to determine the lowest responsible bidder.
- Execute the contract.
- c. Distribute copies of the executed contract and contract bond to NDDOT.
- 3. During the construction of the project, the LPA will:
 - a. Provide engineering services, material testing, and inspection of the work as required by the contract documents and the current editions of NDDOT's Sampling and Testing Manual and the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
 - b. Keep all project records and documentation as required in NDDOT's current editions of the Construction Records Manual and the Construction Automated Records System.
 - c. Make all records available to NDDOT and FHWA for inspection upon request. The LPA will submit all documents and records to NDDOT for review before final payment is made. NDDOT will maintain the project records for three years from the final voucher date of FHWA and then return them to the LPA.
 - d. Be responsible for any changes in plan, character of work, quantities, site conditions, or any claim for extra compensation. NDDOT will review all contract adjustments to determine if the adjustments are eligible for federal aid. Federal aid shall be limited to the amount stated on page one of this agreement.

PART III

Post Construction:

After the project is completed the LPA agrees to:

1. Control the length and location of curb openings for access. The width of such access opening shall not exceed that shown on the plans. Additional access points will be allowed on the project if the design adequately considers all effects the access point will have on the entire traffic corridor.

- 2. Prohibit double parking and diagonal parking within the limits of the project. Additional parallel parking will be allowed within the limits of the project if designed considering the effects the added parking will have on the entire traffic corridor. The design will meet the requirements of 23 CFR Part 625, Design Standards for Highways.
- 3. If the traffic corridor intersects a state highway, the LPA must justify to NDDOT that any new access allowed will have minimal impact to the state highway. The design will meet the requirements of 23 CFR Part 625, Design Standards for Highways.
- 4. Maintain the signing and marking of the project according to the current edition of the *Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways*, as supplemented and amended.
- 5. Restrict the speed limit on the project at or below the maximum design speed. Any changes to the speed limit will be pursuant to North Dakota Century Code, Chapter 39-09.
- 6. Provide maintenance to the completed project at its own cost and expense.
- 7. Prohibit access and encroachments upon the right of way pursuant to 23 CFR Part 1.23, Rights of Way, and Part 710 Subpart D, Right of Way, Real Property Management.

PART IV

General:

- NDDOT will make all contract payments on behalf of the LPA. Payment will be made upon receipt of the engineer's estimate. The LPA will reimburse NDDOT for payments made less the amount paid by FHWA. No costs will be incurred by NDDOT for the construction and maintenance of this project.
 - If the LPA fails to reimburse NDDOT within 60 days after billing for funds advanced on behalf of the LPA, this document will constitute an assignment of funds now or hereafter coming into the hands of the state treasurer, which would otherwise be distributed to the LPA out of the highway tax distribution fund, NDCC 54-27-19. The state treasurer is hereby directed to pay NDDOT all such funds until the total equals the sum billed pursuant to this agreement.
- 2. The Risk Management Appendix, attached, is hereby incorporated and made a part of this agreement.
- 3. No official, employee, or other person performing services for the LPA who is authorized to negotiate or approve any contract or subcontract in connection with the project shall have any financial or other personal interest in any such contract or subcontract. No officer or employee of such person retained by the LPA shall have any financial or other personal interest in any real property acquired for the project unless such interest is openly disclosed upon public records of NDDOT and of the LPA, and such officer, employee, or person has not participated in such acquisition for and in behalf of the LPA.
- 4. The failure of the state to enforce any provisions of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the state of that or any other provision.
- 5. Entities that receive federal funds through NDDOT may be required to obtain an audit in accordance with 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Subpart F. A copy of such audit shall be submitted to NDDOT. Entities that spend less than \$750,000 of federal funds from all sources may be subject to reviews by NDDOT at its discretion. Additionally, all entities receiving federal funds through NDDOT shall certify whether a Single Audit has been completed as part of the annual Federal award process. These requirements are

applicable to counties, cities, state agencies, Indian tribes, colleges, hospitals, and non-profit businesses.

6. All notices, certificates, or other communications shall be sufficiently given when delivered or mailed, postage prepaid, to the parties at the respective places of business as set forth below or at a place designated hereafter in writing by the parties.

Troy Hall, Water Utility Director, presented the attached memo regarding Change Order #2 for Project WA1510 – Sheyenne River Pump Station Reliability Improvements. Change Order #2 is a cost increase in the amount of \$576 involving one (1) individual change to the project. This change was to reroute a downspout in which there was a routing conflict. Troy Hall, Water Utility Director, presented the attached memo related to change orders for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction with Alberici Constructors, Inc. (ACI), the General Contractor. The total proposed cost increase is \$43,944. In the change order proposals, there are four (4) listed changes. The highest cost item relates to partial irrigation system replacement around the existing WTP. Overall, Water Utility staff suggests that the MWTP construction project is going well. Currently, plant startup is continuing and finished water from the new plant will be delivered to customers soon.

Water Utility staff thinks that all of the changes are in the best long-term interest of the City of Fargo. The overall status of cost change orders was discussed at the Utility Committee meeting for MWTP construction. After some research inquiring about comparable projects, Water Utility staff suggests that the industry average for cost change orders is an increase of about 3% to 5% of the bid price at completion. If the currently proposed contract changes are approved, the cost change orders for the MWTP will total an increase of 4.59% from the original bid price. However, only 3.27% is attributed to errors/omissions and other minor changes typical in a construction project. The other 1.32% of changes were implemented related to capacity increases with West Fargo water service and a project contribution from Black & Veatch. Water Utility staff also suggests that we are at reasonable level for overall cost change orders at this point and are nearing the end of construction.

After bidding, contracts were approved on April 27, 2015, for Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) construction to the three prime contractors as follows:

MWTP Project Status Related Change Orders and Overall Cost

The MWTP is a large, complicated, and expensive project for the City of Fargo and its water service customers. As such, it is normal for projects of this nature to have adjustments that result in cost change orders. Since the MWTP exceeded \$100 million in bid prices, the following is intended to help provide perspective for this project compared to the cost impacts of change orders commonly seen in the industry.

While it may be difficult to find exact comparators to the MWTP project, the following are typical observations and goals for change order cost increases in the industry at project completion:

- Industry average: 3% to 5% of bid price
- Typical Project Goal: <2% of bid price
- Excellent Project: <1% of bid price
- Percentages for change order costs reflect (1) Errors & Omissions and (2) Owner Requested

Change Order (CO) statistics for MWTP project in percentages:

- Prior to Current CO Recommendations: 4.55%
- Adjusted Value Prior to Current CO Recommendations: 3.23%
- After Current CO Recommendations: 4.59%
- Adjusted Value After Current CO Recommendations: 3.27 %
- Total Adjusted Value Dollar Amount: \$1,369,585 (Different funding source)
 - Generator Switchgear West Fargo: \$137,816.00 (previously approved CO)
 - o 7th Reverse Osmosis Train West Fargo: \$1,068,769.00 (previously approved CO)
 - Black & Veatch contribution to HVAC Changes: \$163,000

Since the MWTP construction project is approaching completion and through a number of the higher risk project components for change orders, Water Utility personnel think the project is at a reasonable position from a change order perspective. 'Value Engineering' and teamwork between contractors, City staff, and consulting engineers has been an important factor in containing costs. The 'Value Engineering' for the foundation system was an important item for cost savings in the project, reducing the contract price by nearly \$300,000 early in construction.

Related to cost change orders, some higher risk project components include:

- Utility Infrastructure Rerouting (removal from excavation/construction areas) Complete
- Mass Excavation (unforeseen underground conditions) Complete
- Foundation (Pile) Installation Complete
- Major Equipment/Treatment Process Submittals Complete
- Concrete for Lower Level & Main Level Complete
- Building Structural Steel, Exterior Brick, and Roof Complete
- Process Piping, Building Electrical, and Mechanical Piping Nearly Complete
- Exterior Landscaping, Paving, and Site Work Nearly Complete

Startup process equipment has been in progress for several months. The MWTP is nearly operational as of October 2018. At this time, construction is occurring mostly in the interior of the building, including electrical installation, room finishes, painting, clean up, punch-list items, and minor start-up related modifications.

A complicating factor for the MWTP construction is the agreement in July 2015, to provide drinking water to West Fargo. With the addition of West Fargo, Water Utility staff needs to gauge what design adjustments should be recommended for the MWTP, looking at the best long-term interest of the City and customers. These adjustments in most cases will be cost increases. Two significant cost changes attributed to West Fargo water service have previous approval – 7th Reverse Osmosis train and electrical switchgear. Costs for the two changes will be funded by State Water Commission regionalization grant funding and infrastructure sales tax (Fund 450). Please be aware that there is annual water sales revenue from West Fargo.

Troy Hall, Water Utility Director, presented the attached memo and proposal from Aqua-Pure for a contract time extension to the WTP's Guaranteed Cost program. The WTP typically uses polymers in the pretreatment and softening processes, as well as, periodically to help reduce turbidity as a filter aid. The Guaranteed Cost contract with Aqua-Pure has a cost guaranteed based on the volume of water treated at the WTP. Since inception, the Guaranteed Cost program has achieved savings in polymer costs and the Agua-Pure products have performed extremely well in the WTP processes. As such. WTP staff have recommended a one-year extension to the Guaranteed Cost Contract with Agua-Pure, Inc. Compared to 2018 rates, there will be a 5% increase for applicable plant flows up to 17 million gallons per day (MGD). There will be a 10% increase for applicable plant flow above 17 MGD. Costs for this contract are factored into the 2019 water treatment budget.

Aqua-Pure Contract Extension – Guaranteed Cost Program

Introduction

Currently, there is a one year contract extension with Aqua-Pure, Inc. (Aqua-Pure) to provide chemical products. These chemical products help settle out solids in our water treatment processes. The contract extension is to cover the 2018 calendar year and will expire at the end of December. The original 3-year contract with Aqua-Pure from 2011-2013 was for these same products. The contact with Aqua-Pure has a guaranteed cost based on the water volume treated. Aqua-Pure has provided the City of Fargo with an option to extend this contact for one additional year (see attached letter dated October 26, 2018). According to the attached letter, it is projected that Aqua-Pure will finish 2018 in the red due to poor source water quality, higher plant flows with West Fargo, and other factors. For 2019, a tiered approach for pricing is being proposed based on plant flows. A higher price would be charged for higher flows in the Lime Softening Water Treatment Plant (LSWTP). Usage of the Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP) will help limit charges at the higher rate. Previously, there has been only one price increase of 2.5 percent in the past seven years. Staff in the water treatment plant recommends a one year extension to the contract. According the Aqua-Pure proposal, the rates would be as follows:

Normal flows of 8 MGD to 17 MGD – Prices will increase by 5% over the present contract - \$26.175 per million gals for presed and \$13.635 per million gals for the softening basins.

Flow rates over 17 MGD – Prices will increase by 10% over the present contract - \$27.422 per million gals for presed and \$14.285 per million gals for the softening basins.

Background

The water treatment plant uses chemicals, typically polymers, to help settle out solids in the presedimentation process and the lime softening process. Periodically, a filter aid polymer is used to help reduce turbidity (or improve water clarity) as well. With the guaranteed cost contract, Aqua-Pure provides coagulation products in sufficient quantity to attain performance targets for turbidity in two processes: pretreatment and softening. Aqua-Pure has provided products that have worked well in our

plant. Additionally, the experienced personnel for Aqua-Pure have provided excellent technical support as needed under the contract.

There has been interest expressed by another company to provide products under a guaranteed cost program for this same purpose as the Aqua-Pure contact. They would also use a volume charge formula for the quantity of water treated. However, their products have not been fully tested for our treatment process. We are requesting a 1-year extension to the contract with Aqua-Pure to allow additional time for testing products from the other company. It is likely that we will need to explore other options in addition to Aqua-Pure in the future.

Plan of Financing

Funding for the products under this contract is from the Water Treatment budget (Account: 501-3051-441.65-10). The Guaranteed Cost Program costs are factored into the 2019 budget.

Approve a one-year extension to the contract with Aqua-Pure, Inc. for chemical products for water treatment. Funding for the products under this contract is from the Water Treatment budget (Account: 501-3051-441.65-10).

This past year was a difficult one as we had much higher than normal flow rates and the river water quality was the worst that we have seen it in the 30+ years that I have worked with the City of Fargo. To date we are \$40,000 in the red due to excessive chemical feed to maintain the parameters that were established in the contract. By years end we anticipate being about \$15,000 in the red assuming that water conditions maintain. Some of these costs can be offset in the coming year by being prepared better on our part for what conditions we saw this year. In addition to the increased flow rates and water quality changes we were hit with freight increases (about 20%) and chemical cost increases (15%). This is the first year in the 15+ years on the "Guaranteed Cost" contract that we have experienced any loses so for the long haul it has been good for both parties.

AQUA-PURE INC will give a one year extension on the "Guaranteed Cost" contract. Pricing will increase by 5% due to chemical cost and freight increases. The 5% will be in effect based on normal flow rates. Normal flow rates are considered to be in the 8 MGD to 17 MGD range. Average flow rate above the normal range for the month will see a 10% price increase.

Normal flows of 8 MGD to 17 MGD – Prices will increase by 5% over the present contract - \$26.175 per million gals for presed and \$13.635 per million gals for the softening basins.

Flow rates over 17 MGD – Prices will increase by 10% over the present contract - \$27.422 per million gals for presed and \$14.285 per million gals for the softening basins.

This Agreement has been properly vetted by all parties and is now ready for approvals. SE Cass WRD met earlier this month to approve the agreement. Cass County will be approving it at their November 5 meeting. This project is set to be bid on November 9 in Bismarck and be constructed in the 2019 calendar year.

JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the Southeast Cass Water Resource District, a North Dakota political subdivision (the "District"); County of Cass, North Dakota, a North Dakota political subdivision (the "County"); and the City of Fargo, North Dakota, a North Dakota political subdivision (the "City").

RECITALS

- A. The District owns and operates Cass County Drain No. 27 ("Drain 27"), a legal assessment drain under Chapter 61-16.1 of the North Dakota Century Code.
- B. The City operates and maintains that portion of 52nd Avenue South ("52nd Avenue") within its city limits, and the County operates and maintains 52nd Avenue outside of the City.
- C. The City and the County plan to reconstruct 52nd Avenue from County Road 17 to 45th Street South, including reconstruction of a bridge over Drain 27 (the "Bridge"); attached as **Exhibit A** is a map of the Bridge and the proposed bridge reconstruction project (the "Bridge Project").
- D. Under N.D. Cent. Code § 61-16.1-43, whenever construction or reconstruction of a bridge or culvert that intersects or crosses a legal assessment drain on a county or township road is necessary, the District must provide 60% of the costs and the County must provide 40% of the costs.
- E. The County currently owns, operates, and maintains the Bridge, but the County and the City have agreed that, following the Bridge Project, the City will take ownership of the Bridge; with that in mind, the County and the City are constructing the Bridge Project to meet North Dakota Department of Transportation ("NDDOT") specifications for bridges.
- F. The County and the City have requested cost-share from the District regarding the Bridge Project, in accordance with Section 61-16.1-43; the District is willing to provide its 60% cost-share, but only to the extent necessary to meet the County's bridge standards for rural bridges on County or township roads, and not to meet the higher bridge standards of the City.
- G. Under N.D.C.C. § 54-40.3-01, the District, the County, and the City have the authority to enter into a joint powers agreement to provide for the cooperative administration of a project, and the parties wish to enter into this Agreement to provide the parties' duties and obligations regarding the development, design, financing, funding, construction, operation, and maintenance of the Bridge Project.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which the parties acknowledge, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. The Bridge Project. The District, the County, and the City agree the Bridge Project is necessary, both to ensure proper drainage within Drain 27 for the benefit of the Drain 27 watershed, and for purposes of completing the reconstruction of 52nd Avenue from County Road 17 to 45th Street South. The parties will cooperate to develop, establish, construct, administer, finance, fund, and maintain the Bridge Project as provided in this Agreement.
- 2. The District's Cost-Share Obligations. The BRIDGE BID SHEET attached as Exhibit B is an estimate of the costs of the Bridge Project. In accordance with Section 61-16.1-43, the District will provide its 60% cost-share for the costs of constructing or reconstructing the Bridge to meet the County's standards for bridges on rural County or township roads. The estimate contained in the BRIDGE BID SHEET includes the estimated cost for the full Bridge Project, including all costs necessary to meet the City's bridge specifications, as well as the estimated cost of reconstructing the Bridge to meet the County's standards for bridges on rural County or township roads (the "Typical County Bridge Estimate"). The Typical County Bridge Estimate is \$810,260; therefore, the District will provide its 60% cost-share for the Bridge Project in the total maximum amount of \$486,156. The City is administering the Bridge Project; with that in mind, following completion of the Bridge Project, the City will prepare an Engineer's Statement of Costs that outline final project costs and provide copies to the District and the County; in the event the Bridge Project costs less than anticipated, and the Engineer's Statement of Costs indicates a reduction of the Typical County Bridge Estimate, the District's 60% cost-share obligations will similarly decrease. However, even if the Bridge Project costs exceed the estimated costs, in no event will the District's cost-share obligation exceed \$486,156. Following the District's receipt of the City's Engineer's Statement of Costs, the District will provide its cost-share to the City within 60 days. Upon completion of the Bridge Project, ownership of the Bridge will transfer from the County to the City, and the City will be solely responsible for the ownership, operation, construction, reconstruction, repair, maintenance, modification, replacement, and improvement of the Bridge. The District will not have any additional responsibility for cost-share regarding the Bridge or the Bridge Project, and will not have any other obligations regarding the Bridge. The City will not operate, construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain, modify, replace, or improve the Bridge in any manner that interferes with Drain 27.

- 3. The District's Obligations. In addition to the District's cost-share obligations under this Agreement, the District will perform the following regarding the Bridge Project:
 - a) cooperate with the City and the County regarding the design of the Bridge Project;
 - b) review the City's design of the Bridge Project;
 - c) continue to own, operate, construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain, modify, replace, and improve Drain 27 as a legal assessment drain; and
 - d) comply with all applicable laws regarding the District's obligations under this Agreement.
- 4. <u>The County's Obligations.</u> The County will perform the following regarding the Bridge Project:
 - a) cooperate with the City and the District regarding the design of the Bridge Project;
 - b) review the City's design of the Bridge Project;
 - c) contribute \$500,000 to the Bridge Project; and
 - d) comply with all applicable laws regarding the County's obligations under this Agreement.
- 5. The City's Obligations. The City will perform the following regarding the Bridge Project:
 - a) develop and design the Bridge Project, subject to approval by the District and the County;
 - b) obtain all necessary permits, licenses, registrations, and approvals from all applicable federal, state, and other applicable government entities regarding the Bridge Project;

- c) following approval of the design of the Bridge Project by the County and the District, administer and construct the Bridge Project, including bidding, awarding of contracts, and administration of contracts, in accordance with the Bridge Project design approved by the District and the County;
- d) acquire any additional right of way necessary for the Bridge Project, including the necessary title to all land, easements, and other property interests, as well as any fixtures, equipment, or personal property, as necessary for the Bridge Project:
- e) following approval of the design of the Bridge Project by the County and the District, construct the Bridge Project, in accordance with the final design approved by the District and the County;
- f) pay all costs related to the Bridge Project not paid by the District and the County;
- g) following construction of the Bridge Project in accordance with the design approved by the County and the District, own, operate, construct, repair, maintain, modify, replace, and improve the Bridge and 52nd Avenue, in a manner that does not interfere with Drain 27; and
- h) comply with all applicable laws regarding the City's obligations under this Agreement.
- 6. **Joint Obligations.** The District, the County, and the City will share responsibility regarding the following obligations for the Bridge Project:
 - cooperate regarding the City's obligations to obtain all necessary permits, licenses, registrations, and approvals from all applicable federal, state, and other applicable government entities regarding the Bridge Project;
 - b) cooperate regarding the design of the Bridge Project;
 - c) execute other reasonable documents and agreements as necessary to accomplish the objectives of this Agreement;
 - d) provide each other with reasonable assistance as necessary or as requested in the performance of the parties' obligations under this Agreement; and
 - e) mutually agree which party will be responsible for any other obligations regarding the Bridge Project not identified in this Agreement.

- 7. Project Access Rights. The Bridge Project is located on property owned by the District. Under this Agreement, the District grants and conveys to the City and the County a nonexclusive license over the District's right of way for purposes of constructing the Bridge Project, and to the City for purposes of operating, constructing, reconstructing, repairing, maintaining, modifying, replacing, and improving the Bridge and related improvements on the property identified in Exhibit C (the "License Property"). The District will continue to own the License Property; the access rights granted to the City and the County by the District for purposes of the Bridge Project under this Agreement constitute a license, revocable by the District for cause or for protection of Drain 27, and the license does not create for or on behalf of the City or the County any interest or estate of any kind in the License Property, either by virtue of this Agreement or by the City's or the County's entry upon or use of the License Property. The City's and the County's access rights are limited to access, ingress and egress rights upon, over, and across the License Property, including the right to construct the Bridge Project. With the exception of the City's additional access rights regarding future ownership of the Bridge as identified in this Agreement, neither the City nor the County may use the License Property for any other purpose, and the City's and the County's use, access, ingress and egress rights will not disrupt or interfere with Drain 27 or the District's use of the License Property.
- 8. Bridge Access Rights. The Bridge is located on property owned by the District. Under this Agreement, the District grants and conveys to the City a non-exclusive license over the District's right of way for purposes of operating, constructing, reconstructing, repairing, maintaining, modifying, replacing, and improving the Bridge and related improvements on the License Property, and grants the City, as well as the public and the City's invitees, at the City's discretion, to utilize the Bridge on the License Property for access as a City street. The District will continue to own the License Property; the access rights granted to the City by the District for purposes of the Bridge under this Agreement constitute a license, revocable by the District for cause or for protection of Drain 27, and the license does not create for or on behalf of the City any interest or estate of any kind in the License Property, either by virtue of this Agreement or by the entry upon or use of the License Property by the City, the public, or the City's invitees. Neither the City, nor the public or the City's invitees, may use the License Property for any other purpose, and any use as a public street will not disrupt or interfere with Drain 27 or the District's use of the License Property. The District will not be liable or responsible for any duties or obligations regarding operation of the Bridge or 52nd Avenue, nor will the District be liable or responsible for any injuries or damages regarding the public's use of or entry upon the License Property as a public street.

- 9. Indemnity. The City will release, defend, indemnify, protect, and hold harmless the District and the District's officers, agents, representatives, employees, consultants, and contractors from and against any and all claims, actions, administrative proceedings, judgments, damages, penalties, fines, costs, liabilities, interests, or losses, including costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees, arising out of or as a result of the use, operation, construction, reconstruction, repair, maintenance, modification, replacement, and improvement of the Bridge or the License Property by the City or the City's officers, agents, representatives, employees, consultants, or contractors, or any of the City's other invitees; any entry upon, use of, or access, ingress, and egress upon, over, or across the License Property by the City or the City's officers, agents, representatives, employees, consultants, and contractors, or any of the City's other invitees; or any act, error, or omission of the City or the City's officers, agents, representatives, employees, consultants, contractors, or any of the City's other invitees; including any failure to perform under this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Consultant Costs.</u> The parties will be responsible for paying their own consultants regarding their various obligations under this Agreement.
- Drain 27. The parties understand and agree Drain 27 is a public facility that provides 11. drainage benefits, flood protection, and other important public benefits to residents of Cass County, including the City and the County, and further agree the District's use of Drain 27, including the License Property, as a drainage and flood protection facility takes priority over any other use of the License Property, including the City's or the County's use of the License Property for purposes of the Bridge Project. The parties further understand and agree Drain 27 is subject to certain laws, rules, regulations, requirements, and directives under the jurisdiction of the United States Army Corps of Engineers ("COE"), the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA"), and the North Dakota State Engineer ("OSE"), and the City's or the County's use of Drain 27 right of way for purposes of the Bridge Project is subject to any applicable laws, rules, regulations, requirements, or directives from or regarding COE, FEMA, or OSE; the District does not have any control over, and does not make any representations or warranties regarding, COE, FEMA, or OSE, or the City's or County's use of, or inability to use, the License Property for purposes of the Bridge Project. The District will not unreasonably interfere with the Bridge Project or the City's or the County's rights under this Agreement. However, the District's priority use of Drain 27 as a drainage and flood protection facility purposes may require and include disruptions or interference with the Bridge Project. The District has not made any warranties, express or implied, that the License Property is now, or will be in the future, suitable for the Bridge Project, or regarding the condition of

the License Property or the Bridge, and the District has not made any other representations, warranties, or promises regarding the License Property or the Bridge.

- 12. <u>Improvements and Repairs</u>. Any reconstruction, improvements, repairs, or maintenance on the License Property by the City or the County, including the Bridge Project, are subject to the following:
 - neither the City nor the County will construct or install, or permit any third party to construct or install, any improvement on the License Property without prior consent from the District;
 - b) neither the City nor the County will construct, or permit any third party to construct, any structural repair, modification, or improvement to the Bridge that require excavation on the License Property, without prior consent from the District;
 - c) the City and the County will design and construct any future improvements to the Bridge in a manner that ensures the Bridge will not interfere with Drain 27;
 - d) with the exception of the Bridge Project and related appurtenances, neither the City nor the County will construct any improvements in, upon, under, over, across, or through any portion of the License Property; place any fixtures, equipment, or other personal property on any portion of the License Property; encumber any portion of the License Property; or otherwise alter any portion of the License Property without prior consent from the District; and
 - e) the City and the County will promptly cease any activity and remove any structure or obstruction that interferes with the District's use of the License Property or with Drain 27, at the expense of the responsible party.
- 13. <u>Utilities</u>. Neither the City nor the County will construct or install any utility, including but not limited to, sanitary sewer lines, storm sewer, electric power, telephone, cable, television, fiber optic, internet, communication, data transmission, oil, natural gas, water, or other utility lines or facilities, on, over, in, across, under, or through any portion of the Bridge Project or the License Property without obtaining a UTILITY PERMIT from the District. In addition, the City and the County will require any third party to obtain a UTILITY PERMIT from the District before permitting any party to construct or install any

utility line or facility on, over, in, across, under, or through any portion of the Bridge Project or the License Property.

- 14. Duty to Repair and Remedies. The City and the County will repair the License Property and will repair or replace any of the District's other structures, facilities, right of way, or any other property owned by the District, including Drain 27, damaged as a result of the Bridge Project or otherwise damaged as a result of any entry upon or use of the License Property by the City, the County, or any of their respective contractors, licensees, or other invitees. The City and the County will otherwise repair and return the License Property as near as practicable to its original condition following any disturbance or damages, at the expense of the City or the County. If the City or the County fails to repair or replace within a reasonable time following request or demand from the District, the District may perform the City's or the County's obligations and the City or the County will reimburse the District for all of the District's costs and expenses.
- 15. All of the City's and the County's contracts with any Contractor Indemnity. contractors performing any design, construction, cleaning, inspection, reconstruction, modification, operation, maintenance, repair, or improvement of the Bridge Project will require each contractor to release, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the District, the County, and the City, and those parties' officers, employees, agents, consultants, subcontractors, and representatives, from and against any and all claims, losses, liabilities, damages, expenses, demands, suits, fines, judgments, costs, expenses, and fees (including all fees and charges of attorneys, engineers, and other professionals and all court, arbitration, mediation, or other resolution costs) arising out of or relating to any act or omission of any contractor regarding any design, construction, cleaning, inspection, reconstruction, modification, operation, maintenance, repair, or improvement of the Bridge Project, including all costs, expenses, and fees incurred by the District, the County, and the City in establishing and litigating the existence, scope, or any other matters relating to each contractor's obligations to release, defend, indemnify, and hold harmless. Those contractors' obligations to defend will be free of any conflicts of interest, even if retention of separate legal counsel is necessary.
- Insurance. Before permitting any contractor to enter upon the License Property, the City will require each contractor to deliver to the City copies of the insurance policies and endorsements required under this Agreement, and will otherwise ensure all requisite evidence that the insurance required under this Agreement is in full force and effect. All contracts with any contractors will require each contractor to provide insurance policies and endorsements in accordance with NDDOT requirements.

- Remedies. If the City or the County fail to perform any of their respective obligations under this Agreement within a reasonable time following request or demand from the District, the District may perform the City's or the County's obligations and the responsible party will reimburse the District for all of the District's costs and expenses. The District's remedies provided in this Agreement are cumulative and not exclusive, and are in addition to any and all other remedies available to the District under North Dakota law. The City and the County will reimburse the District for all of the District's other costs and expenses incurred in enforcing, collecting, or attempting to collect under this Agreement, or incurred in litigating the terms or validity of this Agreement.
- Term. The parties' respective rights and obligations under this Agreement will commence upon its execution, and this Agreement will only terminate if necessary to protect the integrity of Drain 27 as a drainage and flood protection facility; as necessary to comply with any laws, rules, regulations, requirements, or directives of COE, FEMA, OSE, the State of North Dakota, or any other federal or state agency with regulatory jurisdiction over Drain 27; or in the event of an uncured default by the City or the County. The District must give the City and the County reasonable notice, not less than 2 years, prior to termination. In the event of any termination, and in the event removal or relocation of the Bridge is necessary, the City will remove or relocate the Bridge and associated appurtenances at no expense to the District.
- 19. **Forbearance.** The failure or delay of any party to insist on the timely performance of any of the terms of this Agreement, or the waiver of any particular breach of any of the terms of this Agreement, at any time, will not be construed as a continuing waiver of those terms or any subsequent breach, and all terms will continue and remain in full force and effect as if no forbearance or waiver had occurred.
- 20. Severability. If any Court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision or part of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable, all remaining terms and provisions of this Agreement will remain binding and enforceable; however, the parties will reconvene negotiations and will reform or replace any invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision or portion of this Agreement with an alternative provision that is enforceable and bears as close resemblance as possible to any provision determined invalid, illegal, or unenforceable.
- 21. Successors. The covenants, terms, conditions, provisions, and undertakings in this Agreement, or in any amendment, will be binding upon the parties' successors and assigns.

- 22. Applicable Law. This Agreement will be construed in accordance with and governed by North Dakota law.
- 23. <u>Assignment.</u> None of the parties may transfer or assign this Agreement or any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the express written consent of the other parties.
- 24. <u>Amendments</u>. Any modifications or amendments of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties to this Agreement.
- 25. Interpretation. This Agreement will be construed as if prepared by all three parties.
- 26. <u>Headings</u>. Headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and will not be used to interpret or construe its provisions.
- 27. <u>Cooperation</u>. The parties agree to cooperate fully, to execute any and all additional documents, and to take any and all additional actions that may be necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the basic terms and intent of this Agreement and to accomplish the purposes of this Agreement.
- 28. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement will become effective on the date of execution by the last party to sign.

Staff has been working diligently on the Main Avenue design since August, coordinating with the NDDOT, SRF Consulting, and adjacent property owners. The project is set to bid on March 9th in Bismarck, with final plans due January 4, 2019. There are a significant amount of easements from BNSF as part of the project, and the discussions have just begun with them. As such, we have decided to break the project into two separate projects divided at the west side of the Broadway intersection. We plan to bid the eastern portion on March 9, 2019, and the western portion in October or November of 2019. The eastern portion has only one easement required from BNSF, hence the reason to complete this portion first. We believe that completing this work over two construction seasons is best, as this project is a large and complicated project with some potential unknowns underground once the contractor starts replacing the water and sewer mains along the corridor.

Improvement District #NN-17-A1 is for the installation of a storm sewer lift station, a retention pond to supply the lift station and for an earthen levee around the Laverne's Addition located north of 19th Avenue North and east of 45th Street.

The Contractor is asking for a time extension due to supplier delays. Modifications to the lift station structure resulted in a delay for the sluice & flap gates. The openings for the pipes entering and exiting the box culvert structure were needed prior to approving the sluice and flap gates so the bolts holding the gates to the walls could be drilled into the box culvert structure. Gate delivery is expected to be mid-December and installation will follow.

The delivery of the pumps has also been delayed by the pump provider, Electric Pump. Pumps are expected to be delivered by mid-November.

The Xcel Energy gas line mentioned in the letter has been addressed and is not an issue anymore.

Background/Description of Work:

Apex Engineering Group, Inc. was hired by the City of Fargo (in partnership with the City of West Fargo) to provide engineering services for the above project on 10/19/17. This amendment includes the following:

- Additional time for construction engineering: As a result of the contractor not finishing 25% of the concrete work, traffic signals, lighting, permanent signing, topsoil & seeding, and pavement markings by the substantial completion date of October 19th, 2018. This amendment includes 5 more weeks of construction inspection (October 20th to November 24th) this fall. It also includes some time in the spring of 2019 for pavement markings, final traffic signal inspection, and final inspection / punch list items. Please see the attached fee estimate for further information. Also, it should be noted that the contractor will be liable for liquidated damages during this same time frame that could reach as high as \$140,000. This is what liquidated damages are for, to cover the additional costs incurred by the agency when project deadlines are not met.
- Additional Materials Testing: The original estimated number of field density tests (100), gradations (30), concrete slump tests (100), concrete air tests (100), and compressive cylinder tests (400) were not enough to ensure that all material incorporated into the project met project specifications. We have conducted approximately 213 density tests to-date with a large percentage of the overrun due to falling tests. Also, all the concrete testing elements of the project were increased slightly due to the fact that the prime contractor hired several subcontractors to break up the concrete pours. Although this strategy was implemented to expedite the project schedule it also created smaller pours and more concrete testing. The City will only be charged for the actual number of tests run at the same unit cost as the original contract.
- Additional PIC time: Additional time will be required by our project PIC (Flint Communications) during the
 construction phase of the project. The bulk of this additional time will be allocated to the extended
 construction phase this fall. Also, some additional time has been dedicated to unexpected revisions to press
 releases and construction maps. (See attached Flint Addendum Request)

Background:

Improvement District No. BN-18-K1 is for the new construction of underground utilities, concrete pavement, street lights and incidentals on Sheyenne Loop North.

Fox Underground is the Contractor for this project. They are requesting a time extension of 13 days due to weather related delays. After evaluating the delays caused by rain, I am recommending an extension of 11 calendar days for the weather delays to be applied to the substantial completion date.

During the design and bidding period of this project, the Developer directed Engineering to not install driveways, as they were not far enough along with the site plan designs. Now that the site plans have progressed, the Developer is requesting that the driveways be installed with the COF Improvement District BN-18-K1. Fox Underground reached out to their concrete subcontractor for the installation of 435 SY's of driveway concrete and submitted a price of \$87/SY for a total of \$37,845.00. All work associated with the installation of the 7" driveways shall be completed by the current final completion date of November 15, 2018.

We are requesting additional time for the substantial completion of Improvement District # BN-18-K1 Storm Sewer, PC Concrete Paving, Street Lights and Incidentals.

We are asking for an additional thirteen (13) days due to delays beyond our control. The reason and basis for the requested additional time is due to the amount and duration of rain and snow over the first two weeks of October. This along with the below average air temperatures made the site unworkable during this time. Below is a list of day and amount of rain, the amount of rain was not a great amount each day but precipitation on consecutive days compounded on each other and never giving a chance to dry out.

The Contractor shall allow for normal weather delays when developing the Progress Schedule. The Department will extend the Contract Time, except as limited by 1806.4, "Extension of Contract Time Due to Weather on calendar Day and Completion Date Contracts," for delays in excess of the anticipated work days lost to inclement weather as specified in Table 1803-2; the days in Table 1803-2 are cumulative and prorated when Contract Time starts or ends mid-month. For example, if Contract Time starts May 15 and there are days lost to weather in May or June, then the Contract must lose 7 days to weather (2 days from May and 5 days from June) in addition to the anticipated days in July before a time extension would be considered due to weather days lost in July.
