RE: Wine Education Alcohol License

Dear Commissioners,

As you may recall, the Liquor Control Board recommended the creation of a new liquor license for a concept, proposed by Ellen Wall, to be located in the lower level of the Block 6 building, formerly occupied by the VIP Room. The recommendation was presented to City Commission on July 26, 2021 and the approved motion was to direct the City Attorney to draft a license for consideration. After several meetings and license iterations, the attached VWB license was presented to the Liquor Control Board on September 15, 2021. The Liquor Control Board recommended approval of the license which is now presented to you for consideration.

The license was proposed as an event license, to be used in a designated space. Thus, the V designation, for Venue. The proposal was also a very specific request for Wine Educational Events, thus the W for Wine. The B is an off-sale license, which was requested as a component of this license for the stock acquired from the Wine Educational Events, only available to those attending the Wine Educational Event at the time of the ticketed event. In other words, there is no store front off-sale being added to downtown, but ticket holders of a Wine Educational Event only may purchase off-sale on the night of the event.

Steve Sprague and I met several times with Ellen to "brainstorm" the proposed terms and conditions of this new license, taking into account the existing license structure and whether the new license unfairly usurped any existing licensed entities. To this end, the license is intended to be very narrow. The biggest challenge was defining what constitutes a Wine Educational Event. The definition in the proposed license is an attempt to ensure that the events are for a defined time, as determined by the license holder, for a defined purpose, with presentations by professionals in the wine industry, including wine, vintners and associated services. Persons attending the Wine Educational Events must be at least 21 years of age, and will be required to purchase a ticket for the particular event at a predetermined price, again as determined by the license holder. Only ticket holders will be permitted on the premises and allowed to consume



alcohol, or buy wine at retail, for one hour before and one hour after the educational component of the event. The number of attendees is limited to the number of seats available, and bar service is limited.

Other relevant components of the VWB license include the provision that there is no food sales requirement, the initial license fee is recommended to be \$7,500, the annual license fee is recommended at \$750, and only 10 such licenses would be initially available. The license holder may take the show on the road by holding a Wine Educational Event in a different venue with an E permit, with all of the same requirements- ticketed sales, time limitation, seating, etc. However, the off-sale portion of this license would not be eligible for the E permit- no off sale would be permitted at any other venues.

SUGGESTED MOTION: I move to receive and file the following Ordinance Amending Section 1506 (DD) and (H), Section 25-1507, and Section 25-1508 of Article 25-15 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code Relating Alcoholic Beverages and to place the ordinance on for first reading at the next regularly-scheduled city commission meeting.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 25-1506, 25-1507 AND 25-1508 OF ARTICLE 25-15 OF CHAPTER 25 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW. THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Amendment.

Section 25-1506 of Article 25-15 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

* * *

- H. Class E. A "Class E" license, in the nature of a special permit, shall authorize the holder of an existing "on-sale" license to engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages (on-sale only) on such licensed premises as may be designated in the "Class E" license, subject to the following restrictions and conditions:
 - 1. A Class "E" license may be issued only to persons currently holding a Class "AB", Class "ABH", "ABH-RZ", Class "A", Class "C", Class "F", Class "FA", Class "G", Class "H", Class "I", Class "N", Class "W", Class "FA-Entertainment", "RZ-V", <u>VWB</u> or Class "Z" license.

<u>DD.</u> A Class VWB license shall authorize the licensee to sell "on-sale" and "off-sale", subject to the following restrictions and conditions:

1. The VWB license may sell and/or deliver on-sale wine only when a qualifying Wine Educational Event is in progress, commencing 60 minutes before the educational component, and must cease sales and delivery 60 minutes after the educational event ends, but in no event later than midnight of the day of the Wine Educational Event.

<u>2.</u> <u>Definitions.</u>

*

- a) Wine Educational Event: A particular set time for an event in which a particular wine or vintner is featured and a sommelier or other professionals, trained experts recognized in the wine industry or otherwise associated with the wine industry and complementary services, is engaged to make presentations intended to educate event ticket holders regarding particular aspects of the featured wine, vintner or associate services.
- b) Venue: A particular event space identified in the license application and approved by the board of City Commissioners. Such venue may have a permanent bar for service, and may have limited seating at the bar for ticketed attendees only while a Wine Educational Event is in progress. The venue must provide seating for all attendees at the Wine Educational Event.
- c) Controlled Access: Only those persons in possession of a ticket from the licensee may be permitted access or otherwise be permitted to consume wine on the premises during the designated times.
- 3. All Wine Educational Events must be ticketed by the licensee for a predetermined price with limited capacity seating for the Wine Educational Event with a specific start time for such event. Only ticket holders for the specific Wine Educational Event may consume wine on-sale.
- 4. A Class VWB shall not have a food requirement.
- 5. There shall be no limit on the number of Wine Educational Events that a license holder may hold in the approved venue on a yearly basis.
- <u>6.</u> A holder of a Class VWB license may engage in limited off-sale of wine only.

- a) Off-sale may only be made to ticketed attendees of the Wine Educational Event during the time in which the Wine Educational Event is permitted herein.
- b) There shall be no store front or retail off-sale at any other times. Off-sale may only be to ticket holders of the specified Wine Educational Event and no off-sales shall be permitted to walk-in public. There shall be no signs or other announcement of off-sale wine except in association with a ticketed Wine Educational Event.
- 7. There shall be no charitable or licensed gaming of any kind in the licensed premise.
- 8. VWB license holders may secure an e-permit to conduct a qualifying Wine Education Event off the licensed premise.
 - a) No off-sale is permitted at events held pursuant to an e-permit for a qualifying Wine Educational Event off premise.
- 9. All attendees of the Wine Education Events must be 21 years old.
- 10. A Class VWB license shall be non-transferable. In the event the holder of a Class VWB shall close business (at the licensed venue), the license shall revert to the city.

Section 2. Amendment.

Section 25-1507 of Article 25-15 of Chapter 25 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE REZONING CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND LYING IN THE DISTRICT OF FARGO FOURTH ADDITION TO THE CITY OF FARGO, CASS COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

WHEREAS, the Fargo Planning Commission and the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo have held hearings pursuant to published notice to consider the rezoning of certain parcels of land lying in the proposed The District of Fargo Fourth Addition to the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota; and,

WHEREAS, the Fargo Planning Commission recommended approval of the rezoning request on July 6, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, the rezoning changes were approved by the City Commission on September 20, 2021,

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. The following described property:

Lots Three (3) and Four (4), Block One (1), and Lot Three (3), Block Two (2) of The District of Fargo Fourth Addition to the City of Fargo, Cass County, North Dakota;

is hereby rezoned from "LC", Limited Commercial, District, with a "C-O", Conditional Overlay, District, as established by Fargo Municipal Ordinance No. 5127, to "MR-3", Multi-Residential, District, repealing the existing "C-O", Conditional Overlay, District to the above-described property and replacing with the following "C-O", Conditional Overlay, District:

A. Commercial Developments.

Building Form and Style.

1.1. All building elevations/façades greater than 200 feet in length, measured horizontally from vertical edge to vertical edge, shall incorporate wall plane projections or recesses. Each projection and/or recess shall have a depth of at

least two (2) feet, and the cumulative total horizontal width of all projections and/or recesses within a façade shall equate to at least an accumulated total of twenty (20) percent of the overall horizontal length of the façade. No uninterrupted length of any façade shall exceed 200 horizontal feet.

- 1.2. Ground floor facades that are within 150 feet of the right of way, measured from the exterior wall, shall have arcades, display windows, entry areas, awnings, spandrel glass, ground level landscaping, or other such features along no less than fifty (50) percent of its horizontal length.
- 1.3. Principal Materials. Unless otherwise deemed acceptable by the Zoning Administrator, all exterior walls shall be constructed or clad with natural stone, synthetic stone, brick, stucco, integrally-colored and textured concrete masonry units or systems, exterior insulation finishing systems (EIFS), fiber cement, architectural metal panels, curtain walls, rainscreen systems or glass. All materials shall be commercial grade, durable, and have a multigenerational life span.
- 1.4. Accent Materials. In conjunction with the principal materials listed above in Section 1.3., finished wood and vinyl accent materials may also be used to construct or clad exterior walls. Accent materials shall be applied to no greater than twenty (20) percent of each building façade.
- 1.5. Loading/unloading areas, building service entrances, loading docks, overhead doors, and ground level HVAC units within 150 feet of public right-of-way shall be visually screened from adjacent public right-of-way by structures and/or landscaping. All structures used for visual screening shall be constructed or clad with the same materials used for the primary building.
- 1.6 Dumpsters, refuse containers, and outdoor storage areas shall be located at the side or rear of buildings and shall be visually screened from adjacent public right-of-way, when located within 150 feet of public right-of-way, by permanent walls. The permanent walls shall be constructed or clad with the same materials used for the primary building. Dumpsters and refuse containers shall contain permanent walls on at least three (3) sides with the service opening not directly facing any public right-of-way or residentially zoned property. The fourth side

shall incorporate a metal gate to visually screen the dumpsters or refuse containers.

1.7. Service, loading, and utility areas visible from residential areas shall be screened with a wall, berm, trellising or combination.

2. Site Design.

- 2.1. A minimum of five (5) percent of the internal surface area of the parking lot shall be landscaped through the use of planter islands and peninsulas.
- 2.2. Separate vehicular and pedestrian circulation systems shall be provided. Adjacent properties may share pedestrian circulation systems that connect to public sidewalks with Zoning Administrator approval. An on-site system of pedestrian walkways shall be provided between building entrances and the following:
 - 2.1.1. Parking lots or parking structures;
 - 2.1.2. Any public sidewalk or multi-use path along the perimeter of the lot;
 - 2.1.3. Entrances of other buildings on the site;
 - 2.1.4. Any public sidewalk system along the perimeter streets adjacent to the development; and
 - 2.1.5. Adjacent pedestrian origins and destinations—including but not limited to transit stops, residential development, office buildings, and retail shopping buildings—where deemed practical and appropriate by the Zoning Administrator.
- 3. <u>Prohibited Uses</u>. The following uses are prohibited:
 - 3.1. Detention facilities;
 - 3.2. Self-service storage;
 - 3.3. Vehicle repair;
 - 3.4. Vehicle service, limited;
 - 3.5. Industrial uses; and
 - 3.6. Adult entertainment centers.

 - 4.1. Animated Sign: a sign having an intermittent or continuing variation in the illumination or physical position of any part of the device, except variations required for displaying time or temperature information.
 - 4.2. Fence Signs: a sign affixed in any way to or painted on a fence.
 - 4.3. Off Premises Sign: a sign which directs attention to a business, profession, product, service, activity or entertainment not conducted, sold or offered on the premises upon which the sign is located. One pylon sign to be shared with all three (3) businesses is allowed for proximity next to the interstate with a height limit of sixty (60) feet.
 - 4.4. Pennant: a flag tapering to a point usually strung together by line or rope.
 - 4.5. Portable Sign: any sign designed to be moved easily and is not permanently affixed to the ground, structure or building.
 - 4.6. Roof Sign: a sign erected above the highest point of a flat roof or mounted on a gable pitched or hipped roof.
 - 4.7. Vehicular Sign: a sign or business identification affixed to any vehicle, including, but not limited to automobiles, trucks, tractors, trailers, wagons, carts, manufactured homes, and similar vehicles and their accessories.
 - 4.8. Window Sign: a sign painted or applied directly on a window or affixed to the outside or inside of a window.

B. Residential Developments.

- Building Form and Style.
 - 1.1. Principal Materials. Unless otherwise deemed acceptable by the Zoning Administrator, all exterior walls shall be constructed or clad with natural stone,

synthetic stone, brick, stucco, integrally-colored and textured concrete masonry units or systems, exterior insulation finishing systems (EIFS), fiber cement, curtain walls, rainscreen systems or glass. All materials shall be commercial grade, durable, and have a multi-generational life span. Metal panel, finished wood and vinyl shall be allowed on residential structures but should not exceed 75% of the building elevation.

1.2. Dumpsters, refuse containers, and outdoor storage areas shall be located at the side or rear of buildings and shall be visually screened from adjacent public right-of-way, when located within 150 feet of public right-of-way, by permanent walls. The permanent walls shall be constructed or clad with the same materials used for the primary building. Dumpsters and refuse containers shall contain permanent walls on at least three (3) sides with the service opening not directly facing any public right-of-way or residentially zoned property. The fourth side shall incorporate a metal gate to visually screen the dumpsters or refuse containers.

Site Design.

- 2.1. A minimum of five (5) percent of the internal surface area of the parking lot shall be landscaped through the use of planter islands and peninsulas.
- 2.2. Separate vehicular and pedestrian circulation systems shall be provided. Adjacent properties may share pedestrian circulation systems that connect to public sidewalks with Zoning Administrator approval. An on-site system of pedestrian walkways shall be provided between building entrances and the following:
 - 2.1.1. Parking lots;
 - 2.1.2. Any public sidewalk or multi-use path along the perimeter of the lot;
 - 2.1.3. Entrances of other buildings on the site;
 - 2.1.4. Any public sidewalk system along the perimeter streets adjacent to the development;
 - 2.1.5. Adjacent pedestrian origins and destinations—including, but not limited to transit stops, residential development, office buildings,

- and retail shopping buildings—where deemed practical and appropriate by the Zoning Administrator; and
- 2.1.6. Upon approval of the Zoning Administrator, adjacent properties may share pedestrian circulation systems that connect to public sidewalks.

Findings, Conclusions and Order of the Board of City Commissioners of the city of Fargo regarding the License Revocation of the International African Restaurant and Nightclub, LLC

A hearing was held before the Liquor Control Board ("LCB") of the city of Fargo on September 15, 2021, pursuant to a Notice of Special Meeting at 2:00 p.m., and before the Board of City Commissioners ("City Commission") on September 20, 2021, pursuant to a Notice of Special Meeting at 4:00 p.m. regarding the Class A license held by the International African Restaurant and Nightclub, LLC (hereinafter "Africa Club" or "Licensee"). Mr. Adam Richard and Mr. Brett Brudvik (virtually) appeared as counsel on behalf of the License holders, Mballu Brown and Corey Schultz, and further admitted service of the Notices of such hearings. Mballu Brown appeared in person, Corey Schultz appeared virtually.

Factual Background

This matter was presented on reapplication to the LCB pursuant to the Findings, Conclusion and Order of the City Commission dated August 9, 2021, wherein the City Commission extended the suspension of the license pending approval of reapplication by the LCB and City Commission. The LCB took up the matter of the reapplication at the Special Meeting on September 15, 2021, at which time it considered the testimony of Police Chief David Zibolski and City Auditor Steve Sprague relative to various and numerous applications submitted, culminating in the application dated September 10, 2021 ("September 10th Application"), submitted on behalf of the Licensee by counsel. Prior to the final application being received Police Chief Zibolski had prepared a written report to the LCB dated August 12, 2021, based on a previously submitted application wherein Daniel Kwame Omane was identified as the General Manager of the Licensee. Mr. Schultz and Ms. Brown were identified as the Owners on the prior application, and therefore background investigations and credit checks had been completed and were available for consideration for the application received September 10, 2021.

Chief Zibolski recommended denial of the new application due to discrepancies in the applications, conduct of the named applicants, and ongoing concerns with the operational plans of the Licensee. In response to argument by counsel and questioning of Mballu Brown, identified in the reapplication as the Owner and General Manager, the LCB recommended continued suspension of the license for a period of 30 days in order to allow Ms. Brown to secure proper training to operate the establishment.

The City Commission held a Special Hearing on September 20, 2021, to consider further the recommendation of the LCB and to conduct a full hearing on the reapplication. City Auditor Steve Sprague advised the City Commission of the status of the reapplication, calling the City

Commission's attention to the last application received as proper for consideration, relayed the LCB recommendation, and further presented a factual basis pertaining to potential Fargo Municipal Code Ordinance violations. In particular, Mr. Sprague noted that the reapplication was essentially the same as the first application approved in June 2019, with the same people identified as owners. Mr. Sprague identified a document for consideration wherein Mr. Schultz and Mr. Frances Brown confirmed that Mr. Brown would transfer his "ownership interest to his wife, Mballu Brown," and further that Mr. Brown will be removed as the Manager "and that Mballu Brown will be appointed to be the new Manager of the LLC." (Exhibit "A" attached hereto). The September 10th application identifies Ms. Brown as Owner and Manager, with a hire date of August 31, 2021. Mr. Sprague advised that pursuant to ordinance, the City Commission may in its discretion find cause exists to suspend or revoke a license if an applicant has made any false statement in his application for a license. Fargo Municipal Code §25-1512 (B) (5).

Mr. Sprague further highlighted the conduct of Mr. Schultz that resulted in a charge of Disorderly Conduct, a Class B misdemeanor, in 2020. Captain Chris Helmick appeared at the City Commission hearing in Chief Zibolski's stead and further detailed the nature of the Disorderly Conduct conviction, advising that Mr. Schultz resisted arrest, was combative to police officers, and used derogatory and offensive language.

Mr. Sprague called the City Commission's attention to the Resolution Establishing License Application Qualification Guidelines ("Guidelines") adopted by the City Commission on February 26, 2018 (Exhibit "B" attached hereto) and suggested that Mr. Schultz's conduct may be determined by the City Commission to be in violation of existing ordinance and these Guidelines. Captain Helmick reiterated Chief Zibolski's previously stated concerns that the facts of this event are incompatible to operating a liquor establishment, calling into question Mr. Schultz's suitability to hold a liquor license.

Findings of Fact, Conclusions and Order

Following a full and complete hearing and the submission of the evidence, including consideration of the evidence and testimony presented to the LCB on September 15, 2021, and this City Commission on September 20, 2021, the City Commission hereby finds cause exists for the revocation of the Class A alcoholic beverage license issued to the International African Restaurant and Nightclub, LLC. The City Commission finds that the applicants have made false and misleading statements in the application granted in 2019 in violation of FMC §25-1512 (B)(5), and further that the present application does not rectify or address the concerns for which the Licensee was suspended pursuant to the Findings, Conclusions and Order dated August 9, 2021. The license was granted in 2019 based on the written affirmation from Owner Corey Schultz and the prior co-applicant Mr. Francis Brown stating that Mr. Brown would not be the Owner and/or General Manager for the establishment due to Mr. Brown's inability to qualify for the license in his own name. Owners Corey Schultz and Mballu Brown represented to the City Commission that Mballu Brown was the Owner and Manager of the liquor establishment. This representation was false. Further, Owner Corey Schultz's behavior resulting in a Disorderly Conduct charge following the issuance of the license to Mr. Schultz and Ms. Brown was

problematic given the public safety concerns resulting in the suspension of the license in the first instance, with at least one Commissioner stating his opinion that there needs to be a "clean slate" on the roster of Owners and Managers of the liquor license. The City Commission approved a motion to revoke the Class A license issued to the International African Restaurant and Nightclub, LLC, such revocation suspended for a period of thirty (30) days in order to allow the Licensees the ability to enter into an agreement to transfer the license to acceptable Owners.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING LICENSE APPLICATION QUALIFICATION GUIDELINES

WHEREAS, the City of Fargo has enacted Article 25-15 of the Fargo Municipal Code for the purposes of licensing retail liquor in the city of Fargo; and

WHEREAS, Section 25-1505 of the Fargo Municipal Code mandates the Police Chief investigate the applicant, including the character, reputation, and fitness of the applicant to hold a license, and make a recommendation to the Board of City Commissioners as to whether or not a license should be granted under this Article; and

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commission of the City of Fargo desires to establish guidelines for purposes of considering the character, reputation, and fitness of an applicant for a license pursuant to Article 25-15.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS,

- 1. Applicant may not have had revoked, in the previous 5 years, any license for the sale of alcoholic beverages.
- 2. Property taxes and special assessments for the building in which the licensed premises are located may not be delinquent.
- 3. Applicant may not be in default on any obligation owed to the city of Fargo.
- 4. Applicant may not have sought any form of Bankruptcy protection within the past 5 years.
- 5. Applicant's credit must be in good standing. Applicant must not have any outstanding/unsatisfied civil or criminal judgments, including restitution judgments.
- 6. Applicant must be identified as in Good Standing with the North Dakota Secretary of State and the North Dakota Attorney General's Office.
- 7. Any false statement in the application process shall result in automatic refusal of the license application, or immediate withdrawal of prior issuance.
- 8. Applicant and/or manager may not have been convicted of any of the following offenses within the previous five (5) years, or if the applicant is not otherwise considered rehabilitated within the meaning of NDCC 12.1-33-02.1, or the offense has a direct bearing on the owner or manager's ability to serve the public in a liquor business:

- a. A felony;
- b. Conviction of an offense involving the manufacture, sale, distribution or possession of alcoholic beverages;
- c. Forfeiture of a bond or failure to appear in court pursuant to court order;
- d. Conviction of an offense involving the sale or felony possession of drugs;
- e. Conviction of any offense of Domestic Violence, Child Endangerment, or Sexual Assault;
- f. Conviction of a Prostitution offense;
- g. Conviction of an Obscenity or Pornography offense.

In the application of this section, it shall be presumed that a violation of paragraphs 7 (b), 7 (d-g) has a direct bearing on the applicant's ability to serve alcoholic beverages to the public.

- 9. Applicant must not have two (2) or more convictions in the two (2) years immediately prior to the application of the following offenses:
 - Actual physical control of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs;
 - b. Minor in possession of alcohol;
 - Sale or delivery of alcohol to a minor;
 - d. Consuming in public.
- 10. Any other offense determined by the Board of City Commission to have a direct bearing on the applicant's or manager's ability to serve alcoholic beverages, and in the protection of the public interests.
- 11. Pending charges of either a felony of misdemeanor in any jurisdiction will result in the application being held until disposition of the charges, at which time the application will be considered in accordance with the foregoing criteria. Applications will be processed as they are received, and applications held for pending charges will be withdrawn from que until fully reviewable.

The Committee reviewed the accompanying correspondence from Division Engineer, Jody Bertrand, regarding the purchase of an easement for storm sewer along with incidental construction costs due to the misalignment of the storm sewer pipe.

A storm sewer pipe was recently discovered during an adjacent basement excavation for a home being built by Plecity Kowalski Construction, Inc. The adjacent storm sewer pipe was misaligned. The builder was able to flip the house to accommodate the existing storm sewer pipe alignment. Additional work was required to modify the building layout and re-stake and excavate for the new footprint. The builder's cost of this work was \$5,000 and the easement purchase for the installed alignment is \$3,850.

Staff is recommending approval of the easement purchase and builder construction costs for a total amount of \$8,850. This purchase will be paid from the Storm Sewer Utility Fund.

Re: Storm Sewer Easement and Incidental Construction Cost in Crofton Coves

In 2014, the City of Fargo completed the largest construction season to date of infrastructure improvements, which was nearly 3 times the normal level. Due to the volume of work planned in the Capital Improvement Plan and the multiple developer requested infrastructure requests, Engineering Consultant Firms were utilized to complete a portion of the design and construction work. Moore Engineering was awarded the design and construction administration of the Crofton Coves improvements.

A storm sewer pipe was recently discovered during an adjacent basement excavation for a home being built by Plecity Kowalski Construction, Inc. The adjacent storm sewer pipe was installed at the improper alignment. The builder worked with the present pipe alignment and was able to make the lot still buildable but additional work was required to modify the building layout and re-stake and excavate for the new footprint. The builder's cost of this work was \$5,000.00 and the easement purchase for the installed alignment is \$3,850.00. The total cost to obtain the new easement and necessary construction activities is \$8,850.00.

Attached to this memorandum is the Offer to Landowner document, site GIS map and additional construction cost items identified.

Recommended Motion

Approve easement purchase and builder construction costs for an amount of \$8,850.00 to Plecity Kowalski Construction, Inc. This purchase will be paid from the Storm Sewer Utility Fund.





Background:

Project No. FM-19-A3 is for the installation of an earthen levee and storm water pumping station in the Riverwood Addition located north of 40th Avenue North and east of 10th Street North.

The General Contractor (Sellin Brothers) has been delayed on this project due to private utility (Lumen) conflicts. Sellin was unable to complete the levee in this area along with new sidewalk construction at 40th Avenue North and tree/landscape plantings. Lumen completed their new service line installation on Thursday, September 16, which will now allow the Contractor to complete the project. Sellin is asking that the Substantial Completion date be extended to October 15, 2021 to complete the project.

Material supplier delays are also impacting lift station completion. Due to the uncertainty of material delivery the Contractor would like to include fencing, sluice & flap gates, hatches and the control panel to be included in the Milestone No. 3 date of March 1, 2022 which coincides with lift station startup.

Extra Items:

- A new outfall pipe to the river was installed on this project. The old outfall rip rap in the river was exposed with the low water level. The old rip rap was removed and disposed at a total cost of \$1,420.00.
- At the north end of the project an existing drain tile pipe draining a low area needed to be cored into the new inlet structure. Total cost is \$582.93.
- When paving was removed on 41st Avenue North damage to the manhole cover was observed. The old cover was 5" thick and that is not the standard thickness of new covers. To replace the cover the top section of manhole had to be removed and a shorter barrel section was installed along with a new cover slab. The Contractor covered the installation costs and the City covered the material costs. Total cost is \$796.58.

Recommended Motion:

Approve the Change Order #2 for extra items described above in the amount of \$2,799.51, changes to the Milestone 3 date as described above and the Substantial Completion date as shown below:

Sellin Brothers, Inc. is requesting a modification to the contract Substantial Completion date as well as a modification to the scope of Milestone No. 3. Sellin is also requesting additional payment for several change order items. These items are discussed in more detail below.

TIME EXTENSION REQUEST

Substantial Completion Date Extension: As outlined the attached Request for Time Extension from Sellin Brothers, Inc. dated September 7, 2021, continued delays due to the Lumen (CenturyLink) utilities in 40th Ave N have caused delays in completing the levee construction and exporting excess clay material from the site. The most recent correspondence with Lumen stated that their utilities would not be clear until September 16, 2021. The current contract Substantial Completion date is September 15, 2021. As a result, Sellin is requesting that the Substantial Completion date be extended until October 15, 2021.

Milestone No. 3 Scope Modification: Sellin is requesting a modification to the scope of Milestone No. 3 as a result of manufacturing delays for the pump station fencing and gates, hatches, and the control panel. The current contract states that Milestone No. 3 shall consist of installation of the pump station pumps, wiring of the pumps to the control panel, and pump station startup. Sellin is requesting that the installation of the pump station gates, fence, hatches, and control panel be moved from substantial completion to Milestone No. 3. They state in their request that they will install the items as they are received.

ADDITIONAL PAYMENT ITEMS

Outfall Rubble Removal: When removing the existing storm water outfall as outlined in the plans, the contractor encountered large pieces of concrete along the river bank that had to be removed. These items were not visible at the time the project was bid, but due to the low river levels this summer are now visible and accessible. Per the attached Work Order No. 14901, Sellin is requesting \$1,420 to cover the cost to excavate, load, and dispose of this debris.

Install DT Boot in ST-6: While excavating the inspection trench for the levee, Sellin encountered an unknown driantile pipe that drains a low area in the rear yards to the west of ST-6. In order to allow this area to drain adequately, ST-6 was cored and a booted connection was installed to accept the draintile pipe. Per the attached Work Order No. 14903, Sellin is requesting \$582.93 to cover the costs of this work.

Replace 41st Ave N Sanitary Manhole Top Section: After removing the pavement from the 41st Ave N cul-desac damage to the top section of the sanitary manhole was observed. The manhole had a flat top section with a

non-standard thickness that could not be replaced. As a result, the flat top and first barrel section was removed and replaced with a transition section and new cover. As discussed during our weekly construction meetings, the City agreed to pay the price of the new manhole sections and Sellin would be responsible for the installation. Per the attached Work Order No. 14904, the cost for these materials is \$796.58.

We have reviewed the attached request and agree with the Time Extension requests listed above. We have also reviewed the costs of the Additional Payment Items listed above and find these costs to be justified and reasonable. These items will result in a total increase to the current contract amount of \$2,799.51. Therefore, we recommend approving this request.

Background:

Project No. FM-19-E1 is for the installation of an earthen levee in the Elm Circle neighborhood.

The General Contractor (Key Contracting) has been delayed on this project due to subcontractor material delays. Fencing along the top of the retaining wall behind 1375 & 1385 Elm Circle is delayed by the subcontractor's (Precision Fence) supplier. A Substantial Completion date revised to November 15, 2021 and a Final Completion date of November 30, 2021 is being requested for this material delay. All other aspects of the project have been completed prior to the contract Substantial Completion date of September 15, 2021.

Extra Items:

- More topsoil was exposed under the levee footprint than anticipated. We directed Key to use more topsoil on the levee embankment slopes than originally designed narrowing the 4:1 clay core to a 3:1 clay core. Key needed to revise their GPS model at a cost of \$330 and machine time to move and place the topsoil that would have been loaded on a truck and hauled away totaling \$1,215.
- Three coniferous trees were spaded and relocated at the request of the homeowner at 1355 Elm Circle. By relocating three trees we saved the cost of removing three trees (3 @ \$300/ea) and planting six new trees (6 @ \$575/ea) totaling \$4,350. Relocating and watering three existing pine trees totaled \$1,650.

Mr. Hasey:

Key Contracting is requesting a modification to the contract Substantial Completion date as well as additional payment for several change order items. These items are discussed in more detail below.

ADDITIONAL PAYMENT ITEMS

Request No. 1: ITEM 1 - While striping the project site, the contractor encountered more topsoil than originally anticipated. The project plans estimated that there would be 3,470 CY of excess topsoil on the project that would need to be exported from the site. After consulting with the project Geotechnical Engineer, the proposed levee section was modified to have a 3:1 clay core instead of the 4:1 core originally shown on the plans. This modification allowed for more of the topsoil to be used on site and also reduced the amount of clay import needed for the project. In order to construct the levee per the revised section, the contractor is requiring an additional \$1,545 to revise their machine control and adjust their earthwork operations. ITEM 2 - At the request of the resident at 1355 Elm Circle, 3 of the existing trees originally identified for removal were relocated to another location on their property. The contractor is requesting \$1,650 to spade and provide periodic watering of the three trees. The total cost for Request No. 1 is \$3,195. Request No. 1 dated July 15, 2021 is attached for reference.

TIME EXTENSION REQUEST

Substantial Completion Date Extension: As outlined the attached Request 2 dated August 31, 2021, the contractor is requesting that the substantial completion date for the installation of the fencing material on the project be extended to November 15, 2021. This is being requested due to a manufacturing delay for the fence material.

Final Completion Date Extension: As outlined the attached Request 2 dated August 31, 2021, the contractor is requesting that the Final Completion Date for the installation of the fencing material on the project be extended to November 30, 2021. This is being requested due to a manufacturing delay for the fence material.

RECOMMENDATIONS

We have reviewed the Additional Payment Items and Time Extension Request listed above and find them to be reasonable. These items will result in a total increase to the current contract amount of \$3,195 and will extend the Substantial Completion and Final Completion dates to November 15, 2021 and November 30, 2021, respectively. Therefore, we recommend approving this request.





AGREEMENT ADDENDUM FOR THE OPERATION OF THE SPECIAL SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION PROGRAM FOR WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN (WIC)

The following is an addendum to the Notice of Grant Award signed with the North Dakota Department of Health for operation of the WIC Program.

Neither the State agency nor the local agency has an obligation to renew the agreement and expiration of an agreement is not subject to appeal. The State Agency shall provide local agencies with advance written notice of not less than 60 days of the termination of an agreement.

Local Agency Responsibilities include:

- Assuring the agency does not discriminate against person on the grounds of race, color, national origin, age, sex
 or disability and compiles data, maintains records and submits reports as required to permit effective enforcement
 of the non-discrimination laws.
- Compliance with all the fiscal and operational requirements prescribed by the State agency pursuant to 7 CFR
 part 3016 of the WIC Regulations. Agency service provided and expenditures made will be in accordance with the
 approved plan and budget.
- Assuring that the information obtained from program applicants and participants is restricted to its use and
 disclosure, according to WIC Regulations. Client Information can only be shared with the express written consent
 of the WIC participant, or the Department of Health, unless that disclosure is expressly authorized by the Notice of
 Grant Award, or expressly authorized by North Dakota law, yet remains in compliance with Section 246.26 of the
 Federal WIC Regulations.
- Assuring that WIC records shall be maintained in accordance with the Privacy Act of 1974, (Public Law 93-579),
 Freedom of Information Act, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1966 (HIPAA), and Section 246.26 of the Federal WIC Regulations.
- Maintaining complete, accurate, documented and current accounting of all Program funds received and expended.
- Maintaining on file and have available for review, audit, and evaluation all criteria used for certification, including
 information on the area served, income standards used and specific criteria used to determine nutritional risk.
- Ensuring the presence of a competent professional authority on staff and the capabilities necessary to perform the certification procedures.
- Provides or makes available appropriate health services to participants and informs applicants of the health services available. When health services are provided through referral, has a plan for continued efforts to make health services available to participants at the clinic or through a written agreement with health care provider.
- Prohibiting smoking in the space used to carry out the WIC Program during the time any aspect of WIC services are performed.
- Providing nutrition education services in compliance with 246.11 and FNS guidelines and instructions.
- Implementing a food delivery system prescribed by the State agency pursuant to 246.12 and approved by FNS.
- Assuring that when a health and a human service agency or when one of these and a private physician comprise
 a local agency, that all will meet all of the contract requirements. No program funds shall be used to reimburse the
 health agency or the private physician for health services provided.
- Any major changes in the type of service delivery and training must be submitted to the State WIC Director for prior approval. The guidelines outlined in the WIC Job Descriptions must be applied in the hiring of all new staff members for WIC positions.

We have several benefit plan renewals that will be occurring on January 1, 2022. The renewals and proposed changes are listed below:

Health Insurance

Our health insurance provider is Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota (BCBSND). The proposed renewal for the BlueAccess Grandfathered Plan for 2022 includes a 15.8% premium increase which was included in the 2022 budget. In addition, the change in premium cost-sharing for family coverage was approved resulting in the City paying 80% of the premium. The City will continue paying 86% of the single premium. These changes equate to a monthly increase of \$22.28 for employees enrolled in single and a monthly decrease of \$29.78 for employees enrolled in family coverage.

The proposed health premiums are attached. The plan design (deductibles, co-payments and out-of-pocket maximums) remains the same. A summary of mandatory changes for fully insured grandfathered plans is attached. A summary of the plan utilization is also attached for your reference. The utilization information is valuable in implementing targeted wellness initiatives.

Dental Insurance

Our dental insurance provider is Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota (BCBSND). Their proposed renewal for 2022 includes a 6.7% increase to premiums. The City contributes the cost of the single premium for all full-time employees (pro-rated for benefited employees scheduled less than 40 hours per week) regardless of the level of coverage elected. The 2022 dental premiums are attached.

Vision Insurance

Our vision insurance provider is Superior Vision. The current premiums are guaranteed through December 31, 2022.

Life Insurance

Our current life insurance provider is Mutual of Omaha. The life insurance renewal for 2022 provides no increase to employee premiums, which are paid entirely by COF employees.

Long-Term Disability (LTD) Insurance

Our current long-term disability provider is Mutual of Omaha. There is no change to the premium for 2022. The maximum monthly benefit is \$10,500. The plan's elimination period remains 120 days. The City of Fargo pays the LTD premium of .20% of insured income entirely.

Short-Term Disability Insurance

In conjunction with BlueConnect, the benefit enrollment platform, Unum will continue to be offered as an individual short-term disability plan. The plan is voluntary and the premium will be paid entirely by participating employees. The plan has an elimination period of 14 days and a benefit period of six months at 60% of base income.

Flexible Spending Accounts

The City of Fargo will continue to offer employees the opportunity to participate in flexible benefits administered by WEX (formerly Discovery Benefits). Participants utilize pre-tax dollars to pay for eligible health and dependent care expenses.



Membership and Claims Trend



Cable One has been providing cable TV services to the City of Fargo for many decades. In 2014, Midco was awarded a Franchise agreement with the City of Fargo to also provide Cable TV services to the City of Fargo.

In the summer of 2019, Cable One began branding themselves as Sparklight, but the franchise agreement is still with Cable One, Inc.

One of our goals with the renewal of the franchise agreements has been to keep the agreements with both cable companies very similar to each other.

This franchise agreement with Cable One is very close to the previous franchise agreement and to the MidCo franchise agreement from 2014. One significant difference, though, is that this agreement will co-term with the MidCo agreement. This means both franchise agreements will be up for renewal in April of 2029.

Suggested motion: Approve the Cable TV Franchise agreement with Sparklight.

FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT IS DATED THIS ___ DAY OF _____, 2021, BY AND BETWEEN CABLE ONE, INC. DBA SPARKLIGHT ("GRANTEE") AND THE CITY OF FARGO, NORTH DAKOTA ("CITY").

THIS AGREEMENT is subject to the laws of the State of North Dakota, the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), the Communications Act of 1934, the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984, the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992, and the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as amended, or as superseded by new statutes.

WHEREAS, the City adopted a Cable Television Franchise Ordinance on September 13, 2004 (the "Ordinance"), which authorizes the City to issue cable franchises to operate Cable Systems in the City and which provides terms for cable franchises; and

WHEREAS, Grantee has requested a renewal of its cable service franchise and a new Franchise Agreement from the City authorizing the use of the City Rights-of-Way to construct, install, maintain, and operate its Cable Television System within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City, in response to Grantee's proposal for a non-exclusive renewed Franchise Agreement to serve the residents of the City with cable television facilities and services, has undertaken an evaluation of the existing and proposed facilities and services and conducted a process of renewal based on the federal Cable Act; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that Grantee has offered an acceptable proposal for the provision of Cable Service within the City and City finds that Grantee can be granted a renewed Franchise Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that grant of a Franchise and approval of this Franchise Agreement should be approved and that the Franchise and Franchise Agreement hereinafter set forth should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, In consideration of the faithful performance and strict observance by the Grantee of all the terms hereinafter set forth or provided for, and in consideration of the grant to the Grantee of the Franchise by the City, the parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 Grant.

A. The City hereby grants to the Grantee a non-exclusive Franchise to construct, operate, and maintain a Cable System within the Rights-of-Way of the City in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Franchise. This Franchise Agreement shall supersede and replace any existing agreement or franchise with Grantee.

- B. The Grantee agrees to abide by all the provisions of this Franchise; the Ordinance, as it existed on its effective date and as may be amended from time to time as required by applicable law or agreement; and other relevant and generally applicable regulations and supplemental specifications as to construction, operation, or maintenance promulgated by the City. The Grantee hereby acknowledges that it has examined all the provisions of the Ordinance which is incorporated herein in full and made part hereof, and agrees that the provisions thereof are valid and binding.
- C. The Grantee and City hereby agree that they have negotiated this Franchise Agreement in good faith and with due knowledge of its rights and responsibilities under relevant local, state, and federal laws.
- D. The City will not grant additional franchises for the provision of Cable Services in City on terms more favorable or less burdensome than this Franchise Agreement based on consideration of the Franchises as a whole and not on a provision-by-provision basis. Any additional Grantee will be required to serve the entire franchise area within a reasonable time of the grant of said additional franchise.
- E. Reference in this Franchise Agreement and the Ordinance to applicable laws or regulations shall mean such laws or regulations as amended from time to time during the term of this Franchise Agreement.
- All other Franchises or parts of Franchises between the City of Fargo and Grantee are hereby repealed and superseded by this Franchise, except as herein provided. City does not, by approving this Franchise Agreement, waive its rights to enforce full compliance of terms and conditions of Grantee's current franchise obligations, including audit and enforcement of unpaid franchise fees, as provided under the terms of its franchise in effect at the time this Franchise Agreement is approved and accepted.

1.2 Definitions.

The definitions contained in the Ordinance are incorporated herein by reference and adopted as fully as if set out verbatim.

1.3 Effective Date.

The Parties agree that this Franchise renewal is effective as of November 26, 2020 conditional upon signatures by both Parties and Grantee's provision of all warranties, insurance, proofs, bonds, and other documents required by the Franchise. Signature by an authorized representative of Grantee with power and authority to accept the Franchise shall satisfy the certified resolution requirement of Section 24-0212(B)(3) of the Fargo Municipal Code.

1.4 Franchise Term.

This Franchise Agreement shall commence upon its effective date, as described in Section 1.3, and shall expire at midnight on April 17, 2029 unless renewed, revoked or terminated sooner as herein provided.

1.5 Written Notice.

All notices, reports, or demands required to be given in writing under this Franchise Agreement will be deemed given when actually received by person designated below by personal delivery, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid thereon, by express mail or overnight courier.

Such addresses may be changed by either party upon notice to the other party given as provided in this Section.

1.6 Conflict with Cable Services Code and Reservation of Rights.

The provisions of the Ordinance are incorporated herein by reference as if set out in full, and form part of the terms and conditions of this Franchise Agreement. In the event of any conflict between the terms and conditions of this Franchise Agreement and the provisions of the Ordinance, the specific terms or provisions of this Franchise Agreement that conflict with a term or provision of the Ordinance will control subject to applicable laws. The City and Grantee reserve all rights that they may possess under the law unless expressly waived herein.

1.7 Service Area.

This Franchise is granted for the entire geographic area of the City. In the event of annexation by the City, any new territory will immediately become part of the Service Area covered.

1.8 Police Powers.

Grantee's rights are subject to the police powers of the City to adopt and enforce ordinances of general applicability necessary to the health, safety, and welfare of the public. Grantee will comply with all such generally applicable laws and ordinances enacted by the City pursuant to that power.

1.9 City's Principles and Intent

The following provisions are statements of the City's intent in entering into this renewed Franchise Agreement and shall not supplant or modify specific provisions of this Franchise Agreement:

- A. Provide for the installation and operation of a Cable System with features meeting the current and future cable-related needs and interests of the community;
- B. Encourage diversity of programming and other services to all City residents and business that is consistent with community needs and interests;
- C. Encourage communications services of all kinds to be offered to City residents on a non-discriminatory basis;
- D. Encourage prompt implementation of technical advances in communications technology;
- E. Provide for ample and fairly allocated access to cable facilities for program producers of government, educational, and public service programming;
- F. Ensure that rates and charges for basic cable programming, equipment, and service are fair, reasonable and consistent with federal standards:
- G. Require that the Grantee provide high quality customer service;
- H. Ensure that the installation and maintenance of cable facilities comply with all applicable City regulations, and do not interfere with the City's legitimate use of its own facilities and property;
- I. Protect the City's interests and health, safety and welfare of its citizenry;
- J. Ensure the universal availability of Cable Services within franchise areas on a non-discriminatory basis;
- K. Receive the maximum permissible compensation for the private commercial use of Rights-of-Way.

SECTION 2. GENERAL FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS

2.1 Payment to City.

A. Franchise Fee. As compensation for this Franchise and the use of Rights-of-Way within the City for the provision of Cable Service, Grantee shall pay a Franchise Fee of five percent (5%) of its Gross Revenues as defined in the Ordinance and as illustrated in the payment worksheet, revised from time to time consistent with service changes, and attached hereto as Exhibit E. Grantee agrees that it will continue to pay to City the five percent (5%) of Gross Revenue, minus bad debt, as a Franchise Fee payment throughout the term of this Franchise unless this provision is preempted by subsequent applicable law.

B. To the extent permitted under applicable law, this grant of Franchise shall not relieve Grantee from any future obligation to pay Right of Way use fees, including Occupancy Permit fees, relating to facilities for the provision of communications services other than Cable Service.

2.2 Payment and Audits.

Payments due the City under the terms of this Franchise will be computed monthly for the preceding month and will be paid and delivered to the City via wire transfer as directed by the Finance Director on or before the thirtieth (30th) calendar day from each said computation date to the City. The City will be furnished via email with each payment, certified as correct by the Grantee, the payment worksheet, Appendix D, reflecting the total amount of Gross Revenues and the computations for the month payment period covered by the payment not more than once per year and upon thirty (30) days prior written notice, the City will have the right to conduct an independent audit of Grantee's records once every three (3) years, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Any additional amount due the City as a result of such audit will be paid within thirty (30) days following written notice by the City to the Grantee, which notice will include a copy of the audit report. The audit cost will be paid by Grantee if payments have been underpaid by five percent (5%) or more. In lieu of, or in addition to, an independent audit, as aforesaid, City shall have the right to review Grantee's records. Grantee's records shall at all times be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), unless Grantee clearly and specifically indicates and fully describes to the City any substantial variations therefrom.

2.3 Acceptance of Payment.

No acceptance of any payment will be construed as a release or accord and satisfaction of any claim the City may have for further or additional sums payable as a franchise fee under this Franchise Agreement or for the performance of any other obligation hereunder.

2.4 Failure to Pay.

Failure to pay any fees required by this Section within thirty (30) days of receipt of written notice of such failure from the City shall be deemed a material violation of the Franchise.

2.5 Penalty for Late Payment.

In the event that any franchise fee payment or recomputed amount is not made on or before the dates specified above, Grantee will pay as additional compensation an interest charge, computed from such due date, at an annual rate equal to the prime lending rate during the period for which payment was due and unpaid.

2.6 Bundled Services

If Cable Services are provided to subscribers in conjunction with non-Cable Services (collectively, "bundled services"), and the Grantee provides a discount to Subscribers who receive bundled services, then the calculation of Gross Revenues shall in no event be less than the pro rata share of Cable Services in relation to all bundled services. As used herein, "pro rata share" shall be based on the retail price charged by the Grantee to its Subscribers for each service on a standalone basis. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Grantee bundles Cable

Services with non-Cable Services, the Grantee agrees that it will not intentionally or unlawfully allocate such revenue for the purpose of evading Franchise Fee payments under this Franchise.

2.7 Nature of Franchise Fees.

- A. Grantee expressly acknowledges and agrees that the compensation payments due from the Grantee to the City pursuant to Section 2.1 hereof, shall take precedence over all other payments, contributions, services, equipment, facilities, support, resources, or other activities to be paid or supplied by Grantee pursuant to this Franchise Agreement and the compensation and other payments to be made pursuant to Section 2.1 of this Franchise Agreement shall not be deemed to be in the nature of a tax, and shall be in addition to any and all taxes or general applicability or other fees or charges which Grantee shall be required to pay to the City or to any state or federal agency or authority, all of which shall be separate and distinct obligations of a Grantee.
- B. Unless specifically authorized by applicable law, Grantee shall not have or make any claim for any deduction or other credit of all or any part of the amount of the Franchise Fee related to other compensation made by Grantee to the City. Any such claim for deduction or other credit made by Grantee shall be accompanied by a detailed statement itemizing and describing the basis for such deduction or credit.
- C. Unless otherwise authorized under applicable law, Grantee shall not apply or seek to apply all or any part of the amount of the Franchise Fee in the above Paragraph 2.1 A as a deduction or other credit from or against any City or other government taxes of general applicability (other than income taxes) or other fees or charges, each of which shall be deemed to be separate and distinct obligations of the Grantee.

SECTION 3. INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

3.1 Liability Insurance.

- As of the effective date of this Franchise Agreement, the Grantee will, at its sole expense, maintain during the entire term of this Franchise public liability insurance with a company licensed to do business in the State of North Dakota with a rating by Best of not less than "A" that will protect the Grantee, the City, and the City's officials, officers, employees, and agents from claims which may arise from operations under this Franchise, whether such operations are by the Grantee, its officials, officers, directors, employees, or agents, or any subcontractors of Grantee. This liability insurance will include, but will not be limited to, protection against claims arising from bodily and personal injury, death, and damage to property resulting from the Grantee's automobiles, products, and completed operations. The amount of such insurance shall be subject to periodic changes as described in this Section or as may be required by applicable law, will be not less than the following:
 - 1. General liability insurance:

- B. The liability policy will provide for the following, by endorsement or otherwise:
 - 1. The policy will cover personal injury as well as bodily injury.
 - The policy will cover blanket contractual liability subject to the standard universal exclusions of contractual liability included in the carrier's standard endorsement as to bodily injuries, personal injuries, and property damage.
 - 3. Broad form property damage liability will be afforded.
 - 4. The City will be included as an additional insured on the policy.
 - 5. The coverage is primary insurance and no other insurance or fund of the City will be called upon to contribute to a loss under this coverage.
 - 6. Standard form of cross-liability will be afforded.
 - 7. The policy will not be canceled without thirty (30) days prior written notice of such cancellation to the City.
- C. The automobile insurance policy will provide for the following, by endorsement or otherwise:
 - 1. The City will be included as an additional insured on the policy.
 - 2. The policy will not be canceled without thirty (30) days prior written notice of such cancellation to the City.
- D. Upon ninety (90) days prior written notice to Grantee, the City reserves the right to adjust the limit coverage requirements no more than every five (5) years. Any such adjustment by the City will be no greater than the increase in the State of North Dakota Consumer Price Index for such five (5) year period, unless otherwise required by applicable law.

- E. Grantee will submit to the City documentation of the required insurance including a certificate of insurance signed by the insurance agent and companies named, as well as all properly executed endorsements required by this Section 2.2. The certificate of insurance should confirm that the required endorsements are in effect.
- F. Any deductible or self-insured retention must be declared to the City.
- Grantee will have insurance coverage to cover any valid claim arising before sale or transfer of the System or termination of this Franchise.
- H. It will be the obligation of the Grantee to notify the City promptly of any pending or threatened litigation likely to negatively impact its ability to provide the insurance coverage required herein.

3.2 Indemnification.

Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless the City, its Commission, individual Commission members, employees and/or agents, at all times during the term of this Franchise Agreement, from and against any and all claims, and including reasonable attorney's fees and legal costs, for injury or damage to persons or property, both real and personal, caused by the construction, erection, operation and maintenance of the system. It is expressly understood that the City has no control, standard, or regulation pertaining to the subject matter of video programming distributed by the Grantee. The Grantee agrees to hold harmless the City, its Commission, individual Commission members, employees, and/or agents from any and all claims, suits, and actions at law or in equity, for libel, slander, patent or copyright infringements, to the extent that the City is made a party defendant in any action arising out of the subject matter of video programming transmitted by Grantee's system. Grantee shall at its sole cost and expense defend such actions and appeals there from including those involving the City. City shall be responsible for the content of government access programming produced by it and shall indemnify the Grantee for any liability arising from such programming.

3.3 Workers' Compensation Insurance.

The Grantee will obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance for all Grantee's employees, and in case any work is sublet, Grantee will require any subcontractor similarly to provide workers' compensation insurance for all subcontractor's employees, in compliance with state laws, and to fully protect the City from any and all claims arising out of work-related occurrences. Grantee hereby indemnifies City for any damage resulting to it from failure of either Grantee or any subcontractor to obtain and maintain such insurance. Grantee will provide the City with a certificate of insurance indicating workers' compensation insurance prior to operations under this Franchise and the commencement of any construction, System Upgrade, reconstruction, or maintenance of the System. The certificate of insurance should confirm that the required endorsements are in effect.

SECTION 4. REMEDIES

4.1 Procedure for Remedying Franchise Violations.

In addition to any other applicable legal remedy, if Grantee fails to perform in a timely manner any material obligation required by the Ordinance or this Franchise Agreement, following notice from the City, the City may remedy such violation in accordance with the following procedures:

- A. The City will first notify Grantee of the violation in writing by delivery of registered or certified mail, and demand correction within a reasonable time, which will not be less than ten (10) days in the case of the failure of the Grantee to pay any sum or other amount due the City under the Ordinance or this Franchise Agreement, and not less than thirty (30) days in all other cases. If Grantee fails to correct the violation within the time prescribed or if Grantee fails to commence corrective action within the time prescribed and diligently remedy such violation thereafter, the Grantee will then be given a written notice no earlier than thirty (30) days of a public hearing to be held before the City Commission. Said notice will specify the violations alleged to have occurred.
- B. At the public hearing, the City Commission will hear and consider all relevant evidence, and thereafter render findings and its decision.
- In the event the City Commission finds that Grantee has corrected the violation or has diligently commenced correction of such violation after notice thereof from the City and is diligently proceeding to fully remedy such violation, or that no material violation has occurred, the proceedings will terminate and no penalty or other sanction will be imposed.
- D. In the event the City Commission finds that a material violation exists and that Grantee has not corrected the same in a satisfactory manner or has not diligently commenced correction of such violation, the City and Grantee will submit to arbitration. If the issue is not resolved in arbitration, the City Commission may establish a date, no earlier than thirty (30) days, by which Grantee must comply with the obligation. The City Commission may also implement the Franchise termination procedures outlined in this Franchise Agreement and the Ordinance. However, any termination procedures will be stayed until a final ruling is obtained in accordance with subsection F below.
- E. In determining whether a violation is material, the City will take into consideration the reliability of the evidence of the violation, the nature of the violation, and the damage, if any, caused to the City or the City's residents thereby, whether the violation was chronic, and any justifying or mitigating circumstances, and such other matters as the City may deem appropriate.
- F. If the violation as proposed depends on a finding of fact, such finding of fact will be made by the City only after an administrative hearing providing the Grantee with a full and fair opportunity to be heard. The Grantee will have the right to appeal any such decision to a state court or a federal district court as the Grantee may choose and the revocation or penalty will not become effective until any such appeal has become final or the time for taking such appeal will have expired.

Gity has not required that Grantee furnish to City a security deposit to secure payment of liquidated damages that may be imposed by City for defaults of this Franchise Agreement. City has waived such a requirement in this Franchise Agreement based on consideration of the past performance of Grantee. However, City reserves the right to require a reasonable security deposit if Grantee continuously violates this Franchise or if there is a change in ownership or control.

4.2 Revocation or Termination of Franchise.

- A. Upon completion of the term of this Franchise Agreement, if a new, extended, or renewed Franchise is not granted to the Grantee by the City, the Grantee's right to occupy the Public Rights-of-Way for the provision of Cable Service or any other communication service shall terminate, subject to applicable federal law.
- B. The City shall have the right to revoke the Franchise for the Grantee's failure to construct, operate or maintain the Cable System as required by this Franchise Agreement or the Ordinance; for defrauding or attempting to defraud the City or Subscribers; or for any other material breach or violation of this Franchise Agreement or of the Ordinance.
- C. To invoke the provisions of this Section, the City shall give the Grantee written notice of the default in its performance. If within ninety (90) calendar days following such written notice from the City to the Grantee, or such other period as the Grantee and the City shall agree, the Grantee has not taken corrective action to the satisfaction of the City, the City may give written notice to the Grantee of its intent to revoke the Franchise, stating its reasons; provided that no opportunity to cure shall be provided where the Grantee is declared bankrupt or has filed a petition in bankruptcy.
- D. Prior to revoking a Franchise, the City shall hold a public hearing, upon thirty (30) calendar days' advance notice to the public and by certified mail to the Grantee, at which time the Grantee and the public shall be given an opportunity to be heard. Following the public hearing, the City may determine whether to revoke the Franchise based on the information presented at the hearing, and other information of record, or, where applicable, grant additional time to the Grantee to affect any cure. If the City determines to revoke a Franchise, it shall issue a written decision setting forth the reasons for its decision. A copy of such decision shall be transmitted to the Grantee.
- E. If the City revokes the Franchise, or if for any other reason the Grantee abandons, terminates, or fails to operate or maintain service to its Subscribers, the following procedures and rights are effective.
 - 1. The City may require the former Grantee to remove its above-ground facilities and equipment at the former Grantee's expense and restore affected sites or permit the former Grantee to abandon such facilities in place. If the former Grantee fails to do so within a reasonable period of time, the City may have the removal done at the former Grantee's expense.
 - 2. The City may require the former Grantee to continue operating the Cable System for a period of time not to exceed one (1) year.

- 3. If a Cable System is abandoned by the Grantee, the ownership of all portions of the Cable System in Public Rights-of-Way shall revert to the City and the City may sell, assign, or transfer all or part of the assets of the System. Upon the City's assumption of ownership, Grantee shall have no further responsibility for the Cable System and all liability shall also revert to the City.
- F. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Grantee may appeal a revocation decision by the City to a court of competent jurisdiction and such appeal shall stay the implementation of such revocation if a stay or injunction is obtained from the court.

4.3 <u>Required Reports.</u>

Grantee is required to submit to the City upon request all reports and information as provided in the Ordinance.

SECTION 5. SYSTEM SERVICES AND COMMUNITY NEEDS

5.1 System Services.

Grantee shall provide additional or new facilities and equipment, expand channel capacity and otherwise upgrade or rebuild its system throughout the franchise term, as required to incorporate improvements in technology to reasonably meet the needs and interests of the community in light of the costs thereof.

In furtherance of the general policy of the City that the Grantee's services be innovative and modern, Grantee will pursue a continuous policy of incorporating new technical developments into the System and will identify and respond to changing community interests and desires regarding services, including such services as are typically offered by cable operators, where economically and technically feasible.

5.2 Periodic Subscriber Survey.

Commencing the year after this Franchise takes effect and not more than every two (2) years thereafter, the Grantee at the request of the City shall conduct a random survey, if current surveys conducted by Grantee, if any, do not meet the scope of the survey as outlined in this Paragraph 5.2, of a representative sample of Subscribers. Each questionnaire shall be prepared and conducted in good faith so as to provide reasonably reliable measures of Subscriber satisfaction with:

- 1. Audio and signal quality;
- 2. Responses to Subscriber complaints;
- 3. Billing practices;
- 4. Programming services.

5.3 State-of-Art Review.

- A. Subject to the provisions of this section, the City may require the Grantee to upgrade the System to meet the needs of its Subscribers. The City shall not require the Grantee to upgrade the System until it has conducted a review as provided in this Section of this Franchise Agreement. The review by the City shall take place not more than twice during the term of this Franchise Agreement. A review may not commence prior to the fourth (4th) or after the tenth (10th) anniversary of the effective date of this Franchise Agreement as described in Section 1.3.
- B. The following factors shall be considered in a review:
 - 1. Characteristics of the existing System;
 - 2. The State-of-the-Art (as defined below);
 - 3. Characteristics of other systems utilizing State-of-the-Art;
 - 4. The additional benefits provided to customers by requiring the installation of the State-of-the-Art;
 - 5. The marketplace demand for the State-of-the-Art determined by a third party independent research company chosen by both parties;
 - 6. Any associated rate increases and the costs of any State-of-the-Art upgrades or changes;
 - 7. Availability of market competition; and
 - 8. Any additional factors deemed relevant by the City or the Grantee.
- C. If the City determines after review of the factors described in this Section and discussions with Grantee that such upgrade is warranted, it will order a public hearing to consider such action and to receive public comment. Notice of such hearing shall be provided to Grantee and the public no later than thirty (30) days prior to such hearing. If, after such hearing, the City and Grantee reasonably determine that the upgrade is warranted and that provision has been made to allow Grantee a fair rate of return on its investment, the City and Grantee will negotiate in good faith to amend this Franchise Agreement as required. In examining the economic feasibility of required system improvements, the parties shall consider whether to extend the term of this Franchise Agreement to permit a lengthier recovery of the cost of the improvements in order to lessen the burden on subscribers.
- D. "State-of-the-Art" shall mean:
 - 1. Equipment that is readily available with reasonable delivery schedules from two (2) or more sources of supply; and/or
 - 2. Equipment that is presently installed and activated to fully use existing capabilities; and

Equipment that is in widespread, regular use throughout at least three (3) other systems operated by the Grantee in markets with characteristics similar to the City (including, but not necessarily limited to size, population, density, demographics, infrastructure, and subscriber penetration) or other systems owned by others in the State of North Dakota with characteristics similar to the City.

5.4 Access Channels.

Consistent with applicable law, Grantee shall offer the following Access Channels to each of its Subscribers who receive all or any part of the Cable Services offered on the Cable System.

- A. The Grantee shall designate and make available to the City up to three (3) HD channels to be used for public, educational and government (PEG) cablecast HD programming (Access Channels) as determined by City. Initially, Grantee will provide the City two Access Channels, a Public Access Channel and a Government Access Channel. When first-run programming on the first two (2) Access Channels occupies sixty percent (60%) of the hours between Noon and 10:00 p.m. for any twelve (12) consecutive weeks, the City may require Grantee to provide the City a third (3rd) Access Channel. Access Channels shall always be cablecast by Grantee on its lowest tier and made available to all Subscribers. Subject to provisions of the Cable Act, 47 U.S.C. § 531(d)(1), Grantee may use an Access Channel(s) for commercial programming when it is unused by the City.
- B. To support the PEG-related capital expenditures of the City, Grantee shall pay to the City a one-time PEG capital grant payment in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), payable to the City within ninety (90) days of the Grantee's signature of this Franchise Agreement.
- C. Grantee agrees to provide wiring or a return path for audio and video signals (including transmitter) to a point for rebroadcast on the Cable System Access Channels from Fargo City Hall located at 200 N 3rd St., and upon request from the Public School Administration Building located at 415 N 4th St., and upon request from North Dakota State University located at 1301 12th Ave N, and up to three (3) other public government and school buildings as determined from time to time by the City. Grantee will provide the City with the necessary equipment to self-activate live feeds from the locations. Grantee will provide the necessary equipment within ninety (90) days after the date of this Agreement for the initial locations identified by the City. City will furnish its initial list of locations to Grantee within ten (10) days after City approval of this Franchise Agreement.
- D. The City will be responsible for developing and implementing reasonable rules and procedures relating to its equipment, facilities, and programming for the Access Channels, including the scheduling of programming and the use of said access Channels by the Grantee when not in use for PEG access purposes. A set of Access Channel operating rules and procedures is included as Appendix E.
- E. No charges may be assessed by Grantee for Channel time or playback of pre-recorded programming on the Access Channels.

5.5 Additional Requirements Regarding Access Channels.

- A. The Access Channels will be provided to all Subscribers by Grantee as a part of the Lifeline Tier Service and Basic Cable Service.
- B. The Access Channels will be made available by Grantee for use by the City in accordance with the rules and procedures established by the City or any lawfully designated Person, group, organization, or agency authorized by the City for that purpose.
- C. The location of the Access Channels shall not be changed without sixty (60) days notice to the City. Reasonable costs for promotion of change shall be paid by Grantee.
- D. Grantee shall insure that all Access Channels meet the technical standards of the FCC; provided, however, the Grantee shall not be responsible for defects, flaws or other impairments in the programming delivered to the Grantee.
- E. Grantee will coordinate with City and develop educational and promotion information to increase community awareness and interest in PEG Channels including the availability of a studio, equipment, and training.

5.6 Free Service to Public Buildings; Dark Fiber; Innerduct Construction Option

- A. Free Service to Public Buildings. Upon written request from the City, Grantee shall provide a free drop and free basic Cable Service to any accredited existing public K-12 school location and any public library location within the City boundaries, as well as existing and future Public Buildings and facilities, as defined in Appendix B. In the event a drop to such a facility may extend beyond 200 feet from Grantee's facilities, City may, at City's expense, require Grantee to undertake construction of a drop, but Grantee will remain obligated to provide free service as described in this paragraph. Grantee will not be responsible for inside wiring.
- B. Dark Fiber. For the purpose of expanding City's Institutional Network, Grantee will provide City two (2) strands of "dark" fiber optics upon the initial construction, modification, or substantial expansion by Grantee of fiber optic facilities throughout the Term. Such dark fiber shall be limited to the exclusive use of City or its governmental entity designee for any noncommercial, public purpose. All costs relating to the use, maintenance, or repair of the dark fiber shall be the responsibility of the City as calculated on a pro-rata basis with reference to the total number of fiber(s) in the strand. City and Grantee may execute an additional agreement addressing the disposition and maintenance of such dark fiber in greater detail.
- C. Innerduct Construction Option. Grantee shall provide City the option of causing the installation of additional innerduct by Grantee along any and all routes upon the initial construction, modification, or expansion by Grantee of fiber optic routes within the franchise area, throughout the Term. Such innerduct shall be and remain under the exclusive control of City, or its designated governmental entity, and shall be limited to the exclusive use of City for any noncommercial, public purpose. City shall be responsible for all marginal costs relating to the installation of such innerduct and its maintenance by Grantee. Grantee shall cooperate with and assist the City in identifying likely routes, build-out

schedules, and cost estimates. City and Grantee may execute an additional agreement addressing the City's innerduct option in greater detail, The foregoing limit on use shall not be construed to limit the City's ability to transmit, interconnect, and otherwise enable services using such facility for noncommercial, public purpose with any other public sector entity, including federal, state, or local agencies and/or political subdivisions.

5.7 Geographical Coverage.

Grantee will provide service to all areas within the City with a minimum density of thirty (30) households per linear mile. Throughout the term of the Franchise, Grantee will extend service to newly developed areas within ninety (90) days, weather permitting and subject to obtaining any permits or authorizations, after a request is made for service to the area and the area has a minimum density of thirty (30) households per mile. Other areas not meeting the minimum standard may receive Cable Services by an agreement with the Grantee based on a proportional cost for extension of the System in an amount based on the cost of labor, materials, overhead, tax, and freight.

5.8 <u>Programming</u>.

Programming decisions are within the sole discretion of Grantee subject to federal law regarding notice to the City and Subscribers prior to any Channel additions, deletions, or realignments. Grantee will make available, in keeping with the requirements of Appendix C, at least the broad categories of programming set forth therein.

5.9 Emergency Alert System.

In accordance with FCC rules and/or by federal law or regulation, the Grantee will operate an Emergency Alert System (EAS) as required by the FCC. If the FCC discontinues the requirement to provide EAS, Grantee will negotiate with City to devise a plan for emergency situations. Grantee acknowledges that City may develop an EAS, Amber Alert, or another similar plan and it will provide without cost such necessary and reasonable equipment as may be required by such a plan.

5.10 Notice of Shutdown.

A. At least twelve (12) hours before any planned shutdown, when possible, the Grantee will give notice on a Cable Channel or other means of notifying customers of maintenance or major equipment change-outs which may result in a loss of service to twenty (20) or more dwelling units for a period of one (1) hour or more in duration if such planned shutdown is outside of a maintenance window of midnight to 5:00 a.m. Grantee shall also provide similar advance notice to the City of any such planned shutdowns if such planned shutdown is outside of a maintenance window of midnight to 5:00 a.m. Upon oral or written request by a Subscriber, the Grantee will provide a rebate for any outage in excess of twelve (12) hours and provided such request is made within seven (7) days of the outage.

- B. Upon notification by a Subscriber of a service interruption, Grantee shall give the Subscriber a credit for one (1) day of cable service if cable service is interrupted for more than twelve (12) hours in one (1) day and the interruption is caused by the Grantee.
- C. Upon notification by a Subscriber of a service interruption, Grantee shall give the Subscriber a credit for each hour that cable service is interrupted if cable service is interrupted for more than four (4) hours in one (1) day and the interruption is caused by the Grantee.

5.11 Technical Standards.

To the extent required by applicable law, the Grantee will comply with FCC regulations, Part 76, Subpart K (Technical Standards), as may be amended from time to time.

5.12 Customer Service Standards.

Customer service standards shall be those described in the Ordinance.

5.13 Right of Inspection.

The City will have the right to inspect all construction, reconstruction, or installation work performed by Grantee under the provisions of the Franchise and other pertinent provisions of law, to ensure Grantee's compliance and to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of City's citizens. Grantee will have the right to be present at such inspection.

SECTION 6. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

6.1 Periodic Evaluation.

To provide for a maximum degree of flexibility in this Franchise, and to help achieve a continued advanced and modern System, the following evaluation provisions shall apply:

- A. Upon thirty (30) days written notice to Grantee, the City may require an evaluation session. Evaluation sessions may occur no more than once every three (3) years beginning three (3) years from the Effective Date, as described in Section 1.3, of this Franchise, unless otherwise mutually agreed to.
- B. All evaluation sessions shall be open to the public and notice of sessions published in the same way as a legal notice.
- C. Topics which may be discussed at any evaluation session may include, but are not limited to, application of new technologies, System performance, programming offered, access channels, facilities and support, municipal uses of cable, customer complaints, amendments to this Franchise, judicial rulings, FCC rulings, line extension policies, and any other topics City and Grantee deem relevant.

- As part of a periodic review, the City or Grantee may contract with an independent research organization to conduct an objective subscriber survey to identify ongoing community needs.
- E. As part of a periodic evaluation, the City or Grantee may contract for or perform a technical review and performance evaluation. The City and Grantee shall be notified of all such testing and designate representatives to be in attendance and shall also be provided with the results of such tests including any recommendations resulting from such tests along with City or Grantee's proposed satisfaction of any such recommendations.
- F. As a result of a periodic review or evaluation session, City and Grantee, in good faith, may develop such changes and modifications to the terms and conditions of the Franchise as are mutually agreed upon.

6.2 Privacy Policy.

Grantee will comply with all applicable privacy policies and rules.

6.3 Rights of the Grantee.

- A. The Grantee will have the right to construct, erect, operate, and maintain in, on, along, across, above, over, and under the Rights-of-Way of the City, poles, wires, cable, underground conduits, manholes, and other conductors and fixtures necessary for the maintenance and operation in the City of a Cable System as provided in the Ordinance and this Franchise Agreement.
- B. The rights herein granted will be subject to the provisions, terms, conditions, and limitations described in the Ordinance and this Franchise Agreement.

6.4 <u>Changes in Federal Law</u>.

The City reserves the right to regulate the Grantee and its communications services to the extent permitted by valid applicable law as applicable from time to time, during the term of this Franchise.

6.5 Late Charges.

Grantee may impose a monthly fee for any delinquent balance owed by a Subscriber, provided such charges are consistent with applicable law. Grantee s provide written information regarding its policies for late charges to Subscribers and the City.

6.6 Entire Agreement.

The Ordinance and this Franchise represent the entire understanding and agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and when approved by City and accepted by Grantee shall be a binding contract. This Franchise Agreement may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or changed by a written document executed by the parties, unless as otherwise provided herein.

6.7 <u>Severability</u>.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or other portion of this Franchise Agreement is, for any reason, declared invalid, in whole or in part, by any court, agency, commission, legislative body or other authority of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed to be a separate, distinct and independent portion. Such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof, which other portions shall continue in full force and effect.

6.8 Governing Law.

This Franchise Agreement and the Ordinance shall be deemed to be executed in the State of North Dakota, and shall be governed in all respects, including validity, interpretation and effect, and construed in accordance with applicable federal law and the laws of the State of North Dakota as applicable to contracts entered into and performed entirely within the State.

SERVICE TO PUBLIC BUILDINGS

Pursuant to Section 5.6 of the Agreement, Grantee shall, upon written request, provide free drops and free monthly basic cable service to the following locations within the Franchise Area:

All Public Buildings, defined in the Ordinance to mean buildings "owned or for the greater part occupied by the city or on behalf of the city by other governmental units performing traditional municipal governmental functions." (24-0202(32)). In addition to city- owned or leased public building or facilities, eligible Public Buildings shall include all Public Library locations, municipal court locations, each police and fire station, the Park District of the City of Fargo, and related facilities.

For clarity, and without limiting the foregoing, Grantee shall, upon written request, provide free drops and free monthly basic cable service to K-12 school buildings and administrative locations within the Franchise Area.

APPENDIX C

BROAD CATEGORIES OF PROGRAMMING

The City acknowledges Grantee's exclusive right to select the programming and services to be offered to Subscribers. Grantee will nonetheless monitor the needs of the community, consider the results of surveys regarding those needs, and comply with all FCC cable programming rules. APPENDIX F

ACCESS CHANNEL RULES

The purpose of these operating rules and procedures is to clearly define the rights, responsibilities and privileges of Fargo Public Access ("FPA"), its staff and the community members in the use of the access channel, facility, and equipment. The primary reason for the existence of this facility is to encourage residents of this area to utilize the opportunities provided by access television in the production and cablecasting of localized programming.

DEFINITIONS

Access — The ability for community members to use the available video equipment, studio and access channel time to produce and display community programming.

Access Cablecasting — Refers to programs provided by access users on access channel time provided by FPA Access Channel Time — Refers to the designated cable access time on a specific signal path provided by FPA Access User — Any individual, partnership, group or organization that makes proper application for using access equipment and/or access channel time and presents access cablecasting material or programming for distribution over the cable system access channel(s).

Advertising - Various methods of attracting attention to commercial goods and services, including candidates for public office.

Cablecasting — The origination of programming by a Cablevision system exclusive of broadcast signals and usually other that automated services.

Community — Refers to any resident, business, businessperson, group, organization, or any other entity, located within the boundaries of the service in areas of a Fargo cable provider.

Community Producer — Any individual, group or organization, who becomes certified through FPA's workshops, applies for & uses FPA's channel(s).

Copyright - The exclusive legal right of publication, duplication, imitation, or sale of literacy, music or artistic work. All necessary copyright clearances are the responsibility of the access user.

Defamation - Anything which exposes a person, group, organization, business, class, race, or association to hatred, contempt, ridicules, degradation, or disgrace within society or community, or injury to his/her or its business or occupation and any matter which renders and individual issuing defamatory subject matter liable for damages. Legally Qualified Candidates - Any person who has publicly announced the he/she is a candidate for nomination by a convention of a political party, or for nomination by a convention of a political party, or for nomination or election in a special primary or general election for municipal, county, state or national office, so that he/she may be voted for by the electorate directly or by means of delegate, or electors, and who has qualified for a place on the ballot, or is eligible under applicable law to be voted for by sticker, by writing his/her name on the ballot, or other methods, and had been duly nominated by a political party which is commonly known, or makes a substantial showing the he/she is a bona fide candidate for nomination for office.

Libel - Any written, printed, or pictorial statement that damages a person by defaming his/her character or exposing him/her to ridicule. Also, the act of presenting such a statement to the public.

Lottery — Any device, scheme, plan, promotion, contest, or other program which involves directly, or indirectly the elements of prize, change and consideration, or any such act which is declared a lottery under applicable local, state, or federal law.

Obscene or Indecent Material — Any material in a program or character generated message which would subject a producer or supplier of it to the prosecution under local, state or federal law for the production and/or presentation of obscene or indecent materials.

Sponsored Programs — A program that has been financed in part or in its entirety through monetary grants or donations and or material contributions. Sponsored programs may not resemble an advertisement or any commercial products or services.

ACCESS CHANNEL TIME

Channel time shall be made available for access cablecasting to any community member, group or organization on a first come, first served, non-discriminatory basis after completion of the necessary filings of the Request for Channel Time forms and Responsibility From, and dependent upon the availability of the cablecast channel time. When competing claims for the same channel time arises, the priority rules shall be resolved by the Access Coordinator on a non-discriminatory bas in a manner that will ensure that no one community member, group or organization monopolized the equipment to the disadvantage of others and the will maximize fairness and diversity of expression. Productions produced by members of the community will have priority over any pre-packaged programs. Local educational authorities and local governmental bodies, both for playback or pre-recorded programming and live presentations, shall share the same priority for access channel time on a first come, first served basis. Use of channel time for productions funded, sponsored or underwritten in part or in full With grant monies donated by an individual, group or organization or business shall also share the first come, first served basis for channel time. A message identifying the sponsor or underwriter may appear at the beginning and end of a program in the following manner: "This program was made possible with funds provided by (name of supporter)." No street addresses, slogans or other descriptive messages may be used. (Reference to town or city is permissible.) The only audio message in this announcement is a voice-over which may be read during the ten seconds that the visual message appears.

The program content of a funded access production shall not resemble an advertisement of the individual business or organization who is supporting it.

The Access Coordinator may reserve a block of time each day for regularly scheduled programs, and shall be responsible for scheduling programs within this block.

CONTENT

The community producer or organization producing the program bears sole responsibility for the content and materials used in the program. The producer's signature must appear beneath the indemnification clause on the Cablecast Request Form (and remain on file of a period of two (2) years) for each program submitted before that program will be cablecast. This responsibility includes libel, defamation, copyright and any other legal accountability that may arise from the production or cablecasting of that program.

The following announcement will be cablecast at the beginning of each programming day:

"You are viewing community access programming made available by Fargo Public Access . The contents and opinions presented in the following programs are not necessarily those of FPA

The following announcement will be cablecast after the last scheduled program for the day:

"We now end our cablecast of scheduled programming for today, A list of names and addresses of all persons or organizations using FPA access channel time, facilities and equipment is kept on file at the FPA offices. Upon determination by the Access Coordinator that a program 's subject matter may cause some viewer or parental concern due to its' content, the following message may precede and / or during breaks in cablecast of that program:

"The following program may be considered offensive to some viewers. Viewer/Parental discretion is encourages.

The Access Coordinator may suggest a block of time each day for the programs that may contain potentially offensive material. Access producers have the right to reject such a suggestion.

A program produced or cablecasted with FPA equipment or channel time shall not contain any of the following:


Advertising material designed to promote the sale of commercial products or services

Promotion by or on behalf of legally qualified candidates

Soliciting of funds for any group, organization, or individual with the exception of the public access channel (FPA) to raise funds for operating revenues as needed.

Obscene, indecent, libelous, or slanderous material Lottery or lottery information

All media submitted for cablecast on FPA's Channel must be received by the Coordinator one week in advance before cablecast time. Persons submitting the program for cablecast should indicate any possible cause for concern with regard to the technical standards of the program. The Access Coordinator may not censor by editing the submitted program. However, if the Access Coordinator finds that the program contains any of the items described in Section IV, F, 1-6, they may reject the program or message on the grounds that it is unsuitable for cablecasting. Playback time on the access channel shall be limited to ten (10) hours per calendar month by any one Access User, group or organization. All programs produced with FPA's equipment, studio equipment and videotape must be cablecast on the local access channel.

The City of Fargo has received a special allocation and associated grant agreement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to assist individuals or households who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, and other vulnerable populations, by providing housing, rental assistance, supportive services, and non-congregate shelter to reduce homelessness and increase housing stability. This allocation was authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

Upon execution, the City of Fargo will receive the following allocation in the form of HOME Investment Partnership – American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP) funds. These funds will undergo a citizen participation process, including a public input meeting and significant coordination with area service providers and the North Dakota Continuum of Care as required by HUD. Once an allocation plan is written, submitted to HUD, and approved, funds will be allocated through an amendment to the City's 2021 HUD Action Plan.

\$1,697,107 in HOME (CFDA #14.239 – grant number M-21-MP-38-0220)

Proposal:

The applicant is seeking approval of a minor subdivision located at 5201 42nd Street South and 4211 53nd Avenue South. The request is to plat the existing two lot minor subdivision into a two lot minor subdivision entitled **First Community Addition**. The lots are being adjusted so that the current parking for the financial institution is on the same lot as the financial institution.

This project was reviewed by the City's Planning and Development, Engineering, Public Works, and Fire Departments ("staff"), whose comments are included in this report.

Surrounding Land Uses and Zoning Districts:

- North: Across 52nd Ave S the properties are zoned SR-2, Single-Dwelling Residential, with single-family dwelling units
- East: Across 42nd St S the properties are zoned LC, Limited Commercial, with retail sales and service uses.
- South: Across 53rd Ave S the properties are zoned MR-3, Multi-Dwelling Residential, with multi-family dwelling units
- West: The property is zoned LC, Limited Commercial and is currently vacant land

Area Plans:

The subject property is located within the 2007 Growth Plan for the southwest area of the City of Fargo. Within this growth plan, the subject property is identified as being suitable for commercial uses.

Schools and Parks:

Neighborhood: The subject properties are located in The District Neighborhood.

Schools: The subject properties are located within the Fargo School District and are served by Kennedy Elementary, Discovery Middle and Davies High schools.

Parks: The subject properties are located within half a mile of The Pines Park (5371 42nd Street South), Woodhaven South Park (4802 Woodhaven Drive South) and Cottagewood Park (4896 38th Street South), which offer amenities such as playgrounds, picnic shelters, a basketball court, recreational trails, and fishing pond.

Pedestrian / Bicycle: Shared Use Paths exist along 52nd Avenue South and on the south side of 53rd Avenue South.

Staff Analysis:

Minor Subdivision

The LDC stipulates that the following criteria is met before a minor plat can be approved:

1. Section 20-0907.B.3 of the LDC stipulates that the Planning Commission recommend approval or denial of the application, based on whether it complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. Section 20-0907.B.4 of the LDC further stipulates that a Minor Subdivision Plat shall not be approved unless it is located in a zoning district that allows the proposed development and complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06 and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code.

This subdivision is intended to replat two existing lots into two new lots. The properties within this plat are currently zoned LC, Limited Commercial, which is consistent with that land use designation. No zone change is proposed. In accordance with Section 20-0901.F of the LDC, notices of the proposed plat have been sent out to property owners within 300 feet of the subject property. To date, staff has received no inquiries about the application. Staff has reviewed this request and finds that this application complies with standards of Article 20-06 and all applicable requirements of the Land Development Code. (Criteria Satisfied)

2. Section 20-907.C.4.f of the LDC stipulates that in taking action on a Final Plat, the Board of City Commissioners shall specify the terms for securing installation of public improvements to serve the subdivision.

While this section of the LDC specifically addresses only major subdivision plats, staff believes it is important to note that any improvements associated with the project (both existing and proposed) are subject to special assessments. Special assessments associated with the costs of the public infrastructure improvements are proposed to be spread by the front footage basis and storm sewer by the square footage basis as is typical with the City of Fargo assessment principals. (Criteria Satisfied)

Staff Recommendation:

Suggested Motion: "To accept the findings and recommendations of the Planning Commission and staff and hereby approve the proposed subdivision plat, **First Community Addition** as outlined within the staff report, as the proposal complies with the adopted Area Plan, the standards of Article 20-06, and all other applicable requirements of the Land Development Code".


Planning Commission Recommendation: August 3, 2021



Acceptance of North Dakota Department of Transportation Grant Funding for Seat-Belt, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving Enforcement, Speed Enforcement and Underage Drinking Enforcement and Education Activities (CFDA #20.616 and 20.600).

Dear Commissioners:

The North Dakota Department of Transportation is again offering to provide Fargo Police Department with grant funding for the purpose of conducting seatbelt, impaired driving, distracted driving, speed enforcement and underage drinking enforcement and education activities. The funding made available through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is intended to reimburse the police department for overtime expenses associated with having officers work extra hours towards conducting the enforcement and education activities.

The DOT is making a total of \$62,000 in grant money available to the Police Department, \$17,500 of which is intended for impaired driving enforcement and \$7,000 of which is intended for impaired driving media campaigns. Of the remaining grant funding, \$14,000 is to be used for seatbelt enforcement, \$8,500 for underage drinking enforcement, \$5,000 for speed enforcement, and \$10,000 for distracted driving enforcement. There is no requirement for the City of Fargo to match any of the grant funding provided.

Recommended Motion:

Sign the North Dakota Department of Transportation Traffic Safety Contract, accept the grant funding in the amount of \$62,000 and adjust Police Department's budget line items as follows:

- Occupant Protection: Account #101-5045-411-11-01 PD11 in the amount of \$14,000
- Underage Drinking Account # 101-5045-411-11-01 PD12 in the amount of \$8,500
- Impaired Driving Account # 101-5045-411-11-01 PD31 in the amount of \$17,500
- DUI Media Campaign Account # 101-5045-411-34-20 PD31 in the amount of \$7,000
- Distracted Driving Account # 101-5045-411-11-01 PD37 in the amount of \$10,000
- Speed Enforcement Account# 101-5045-411-11-01 PD36 in the amount of \$5,000

I.

The Contractor shall perform the project(s) set forth in Appendix A, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Appendix B, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The term of this contract shall begin October 1, 2021, and shall end September 30, 2022.

III.

NDDOT shall reimburse the Contractor for costs incurred under the terms of this contract, not to exceed \$62,000. Reimbursement of all costs under this contract is contingent on federal participation. Expenses incurred by the Contractor for travel, meals, and lodging, shall be reimbursed according to applicable state rates. Allowable costs are covered under 2 CFR Part 200. All requests for reimbursement must be submitted to NDDOT within 45 days of the termination date of this contract.

IV.

Equipment acquired under this agreement for use in highway safety program areas shall be used and kept in operation for highway safety purposes by the Contractor; or the Contractor, by formal agreement with appropriate officials of a political subdivision or State agency, shall cause such equipment to be used and kept in operation for highway safety purposes. (Reference: 23 CFR 1200.31 and 2 CFR Part 200)

V.

Appendices A and E of the Title VI Assurances, attached, are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this agreement.

VI.

The Contractor agrees to cooperate with NDDOT in meeting its commitments and goals with regard to the maximum utilization of disadvantaged business enterprises and will use its best efforts to ensure that disadvantaged business enterprises shall have the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for subcontract work under this agreement. The Contractor shall comply with requirements of 49 CFR Part 26.

VII

The Contractor shall ensure that no qualified individual with a disability, as defined in 29 USC 794 and 49 CFR Part 27 shall, solely by reason of this disability, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity that receives benefits from the assistance under this agreement.

VIII.

Grants or services that generate revenues as a result of funding through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) must be reported. Written notification of the source and amount of such income must be made to the NDDOT at the earliest opportunity. A separate account must be maintained for the collection, expenditure, and disposition of program income. Program income generated shall be

used to further the objectives of the grant or service or reduce current grant or service costs. Records shall be maintained in accordance with state and federal guidelines.

IX.

The Contractor certifies that it will comply with the retention and access requirements for records established by 2 CFR Part 200. The required records and documentation relating to the grant and/or subcontract shall be retained for a minimum of three years after the starting date of the retention period as defined in 2 CFR Part 200. The NDDOT or their authorized representative shall have the right of access to any books, documents, papers, or other records of grantees, contractors, or subcontractors which are pertinent to the grant and/or contract, in order to make audits, examinations, excerpts and transcripts. The right of access is not limited by the required retention period and shall last as long as the records are retained.

The Contractor will comply with all applicable state, local, and federal procurement procedures and will maintain a financial management system that complies with the minimum requirements of 2 CFR Part 200.

X.

The Contractor must have a seat belt use policy, a drug and alcohol driving policy, and a distracted driving/texting policy in place before requesting reimbursement for any work completed under this agreement. The NDDOT's Safety Division's program managers will locate and review the policies during scheduled on-site monitoring visits, if applicable. Absence of any policy may result in the NDDOT withholding payment until said policy is in place.

All contracted personnel are required to wear seat belts and obey traffic laws while on official business of this project.

XI.

Termination:

- a. This contract may be terminated by mutual consent of both parties, or by either party, upon 30 days' notice in writing or delivered by certified mail or in person.
- b. In addition, NDDOT may terminate this contract effective upon delivery of written notice to the contractor, or at such later date as may be established by NDDOT, under any of the following conditions:
 - i. NDDOT funding from federal, state, or other sources is not obtained and continued at levels sufficient to allow for purchase of the indicated quantity of services. The contract may be modified by agreement of the parties in writing to accommodate a reduction in funds.
 - ii. If federal or state regulations or guidelines are modified, changed, or interpreted in such a way that the services are no longer allowable or appropriate for purchase under this contract or are no longer eligible for the funding proposed for payments authorized by this contract.
 - iii. If any license or certificate required by law or regulation to be held by the contractor to provide the services required by the contract is for any reason denied, revoked, or not renewed.

Any such termination of this contract under (i), (ii), or (iii) above shall be without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of either party already accrued prior to such termination.

- c. NDDOT, by written notice to the contractor, may terminate the whole or any part of this agreement:
 - If the Contractor fails to provide services called for by this contract within the time specified herein or any extension thereof; or
 - ii. If the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this contract, or so fails to pursue the work as to endanger performance of this contract in accordance with its terms, and after receipt of written notice from NDDOT, fails to correct such failures within ten days or such longer period as NDDOT may authorize.

XII.

The Contractor shall not assign any portion of the work under this agreement, execute any contract, or obligate itself in any manner with a third party with respect to its rights and responsibilities to this agreement without written consent of NDDOT. Any agreement with a subcontractor does not create a contractual relationship between the NDDOT and the subcontractor.

XIII.

The Contractor agrees that NDDOT and NHTSA, or their designated representative(s), shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this agreement. The Contractor agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of three years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. The Contractor agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interview of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, the Contractor agrees to include a similar right of the state to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to the performance of this agreement.

Audits must be in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200, Subpart F. The Contractor shall submit copies of audits covering the term of this agreement to NDDOT. This requirement is applicable to counties, cities, state agencies, Indian tribes, colleges, hospitals, and nonprofit businesses.

XIV.

This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification, or change of terms of this agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties. Such waiver, consent, modification, or change, if made, shall be effective only in the specific instance and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this agreement. The Contractor, by the signature below of its authorized representative, hereby acknowledges that the Contractor has read this agreement, understands it, and agrees to be bound by its terms and conditions.

XV.

The Risk Management Appendix, attached, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of this agreement.



XVI.

The Contractor is advised that his or her signature on this contract certifies that the company or any person associated therewith is not currently under suspension, debarment, voluntary exclusion, or determination of ineligibility by any federal agency; has not been suspended, debarred, voluntarily excluded, or determined ineligible by any federal agency within the past three years; and has not been indicted, convicted, or had a civil judgment rendered against it by a court of competent jurisdiction on any matter involving fraud or official misconduct within the past three years.

XVII

The Contractor shall not assign nor transfer the Contractor's interest in this agreement without the express written consent of the state.

XVIII.

The provisions of this agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, and their respective successors and assigns.

XIX.

The failure of the state to enforce any provisions of this contract shall not constitute a waiver by the state of that or any other provision.

XX.

All notices, certificates, or other communications shall be sufficiently given when delivered or mailed, postage prepaid, to the parties at their respective places of business as previously set forth.

XXI.

No official or employee of a state or any other governmental instrumentality who is authorized in his official capacity to negotiate, make, accept, or approve, or to take part in negotiating, making, accepting, or approving any contract or subcontract in connection with a project shall have, directly or indirectly, any financial or other personal interest in any such contract or subcontract. No engineer, attorney, appraiser, inspector, or other person performing services for a state or a governmental instrumentality in connection with a project shall have, directly or indirectly, a financial or other personal interest, other than his employment or retention by a state or other governmental instrumentality, in any contract or subcontract in connection with such project. No officer or employee of such person retained by a state or other governmental instrumentality shall have, directly or indirectly, any financial or other personal interest in any real property acquired for a project unless such interest is openly disclosed upon the public records of NDDOT and of such other governmental instrumentality, and such officer, employee, or person has not participated in such acquisition for and in behalf of the state.

Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the state of North Dakota, its agencies, officers and employees (State), from and against claims based on the vicarious liability of the State or its agents, but not against claims based on the State's contributory negligence, comparative and/or contributory negligence or fault, sole negligence, or intentional misconduct. The legal defense provided by Contractor to the State under this provision must be free of any conflicts of interest, even if retention of separate legal counsel for the State is necessary. Contractor also agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold the State harmless for all costs, expenses and attorneys' fees incurred if the State prevails in an action against Contractor in establishing and litigating the indemnification coverage provided herein. This obligation shall continue after the termination of this agreement.

Contractor shall secure and keep in force during the term of this agreement, from insurance companies, government self-insurance pools or government self-retention funds authorized to do business in North Dakota, the following insurance coverages:

- 1) Commercial general liability and automobile liability insurance minimum limits of liability required are \$250,000 per person and \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- 2) Workers compensation insurance meeting all statutory limits.
- 3) The State of North Dakota, its agencies, officers, and employees (State) shall be endorsed as an **additional insured** on the commercial general liability and automobile liability policies.
- 4) Said endorsements shall contain a "Waiver of Subrogation" in favor of the state of North Dakota.
- 5) The policies and endorsements may not be canceled or modified without **thirty (30) days prior written notice** to the undersigned State representative.

Contractor shall furnish a certificate of insurance evidencing the requirements in 1, 3, and 4, above to the undersigned State representative prior to commencement of this agreement.

The State reserves the right to obtain complete, certified copies of all required insurance documents, policies, or endorsements at any time. Any attorney who represents the State under this contract must first qualify as and be appointed by the North Dakota Attorney General as a Special Assistant Attorney General as required under N.D.C.C. Section 54-12-08.

When a portion of a Contract is sublet, the Contractor shall obtain insurance protection (as outlined above) to provide liability coverage to protect the Contractor and the State as a result of work undertaken by the Subcontractor. In addition, the Contractor shall ensure that any and all parties performing work under the Contract are covered by public liability insurance as outlined above. All Subcontractors performing work under the Contract are required to maintain the same scope of insurance required of the Contractor. The Contractor shall be held responsible for ensuring compliance with those requirements by all Subcontractors.

Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary (i.e., pay first) as respects any insurance, self-insurance or self-retention maintained by the State. Any insurance, self-insurance or self-retention maintained by the State shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it. The insolvency or bankruptcy of the insured Contractor shall not release the insurer from payment under the policy, even when such insolvency or bankruptcy prevents the insured Contractor from meeting the retention limit under the policy. Any deductible amount or other obligations under the policy(ies) shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor. This insurance may be in a policy or policies of insurance, primary and excess, including the so-called umbrella or catastrophe form and be placed with insurers rated "A-" or better by A.M. Best Company, Inc. The State will be indemnified, saved, and held harmless to the full extent of any coverage actually secured by the Contractor in excess of the minimum requirements set forth above.

The North Dakota Department of Transportation's (NDDOT) Safety Division administers the North Dakota Vision Zero initiative to reduce motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries to zero. The Safety Division receives and provides state and federal funding to local entities to assist the NDDOT to achieve the traffic safety goals identified in the Vision Zero Plan and the annual Highway Safety Plan. This contract will assist in achieving the following plan goals to:

- Decrease the number of alcohol and/or drug related crashes.
- Decrease the number of speed related crashes.
- Decrease the number of distracted driving related crashes.
- Increase seat belt use to decrease the severity of injuries and trauma sustained in crashes.
- Increase the public's knowledge and understanding of roadway safety and strategies.

APPENDIX A

The purpose of this contract is to provide funding to the **Fargo Police Department** (hereinafter referred to as Contractor) to:

- Participate in statewide occupant protection (OP) enforcement programs
- Participate in statewide impaired driving (ID) enforcement programs, including sobriety checkpoints and saturation patrols
- Participate in statewide underage drinking (UA) enforcement programs
- Participate in statewide distracted driving (DD) enforcement program
- Participate in statewide speed (SC) enforcement program
- Develop and place media ads for the enhancement of impaired driving campaigns

OCCUPANT PROTECTION (OP) ENFORCEMENT SCOPE OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPOP2205-05-08

The *Click It or Ticket (CIOT)* enforcement campaign exists to increase OP use for both adults and children through heightened enforcement of OP laws in the state. The campaign's success is built upon the strategy that education, along with highly visible and consistent enforcement, is an effective means to change driver behavior and increase OP use.

Participating law enforcement agencies are required to work overtime during scheduled CIOT campaigns to achieve high visibility within their jurisdictions to deter motorists from driving or riding in a motor vehicle without the appropriate use of an OP device (i.e., seat belt or child passenger safety seat).

The Contractor is encouraged to use speed as a trigger violation to stop vehicles for seat belt and child passenger safety seat compliance.

The Contractor may <u>only</u> work during the scheduled CIOT enforcement periods as identified in Attachment 1. The Contractor may not work outside the scheduled periods.

During each identified enforcement period, the Contractor must:

Conduct a minimum of two shifts (no minimum number of hours per shift) per high visibility
enforcement period within corridors and at times (including nighttime) where the occurrence of
unbelted serious injury and fatal crashes is greatest. When possible, the Safety Division will
coordinate with the Contractor to determine these locations based on North Dakota (ND) crash
data.

- Issue Citations *not warnings* for failure or improper use of an OP device. This is to assure the integrity of the *CIOT* message to the public. Each stop is an opportunity to educate the public on taking personal responsibility on driving behaviors and safety measures.
- Ensure that all officers working the overtime grant funding for OP have completed the Traffic
 Occupant Protection Strategies (TOPS) training. The Contractor must provide verification of the
 completed training upon request by the Safety Division for each officer conducting overtime
 enforcement through the grant.
- Coordinate with the Safety Division to complete earned media requirements (pre- and post-news releases).
- Submit an electronic enforcement log sheet for participating officers by the date indicated in the schedule, "Enforcement Log Due Date." IMPAIRED DRIVING (ID) ENFORCEMENT SCOPE OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPID2210-02-07

The *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over (DSOGPO)* enforcement campaign exists to deter ID through heightened enforcement of ID laws in the state. The campaign's success is built upon the strategy that education, along with highly visible and consistent enforcement, is an effective means to change driver behavior.

The Contractor is required to work during the scheduled ID enforcement periods as outlined in Attachment 1. The Contractor may conduct additional enforcement activity beyond the required regional calendar events within their jurisdiction, if the budget allows, and if the Contractor can justify the purpose of additional enforcement. The Contractor must notify the Safety Division of the additional enforcement activity prior to conducting the additional enforcement activity.

During each identified enforcement period of the contract period, the Contractor must:

- Conduct a minimum of two shifts (no minimum number of hours per shift) per enforcement period, except for the National Labor Day *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign.
- Conduct a minimum of four shifts (no minimum number of hours per shift) during the dates identified as the National Labor Day *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign.

- Ensure that officers working the ID grant have been SFST (Standardized Field Sobriety Testing)
 certified and have attended a SFST refresher or ARIDE course at least once every five years. The
 Contractor must provide verification of the completed training upon request by the Safety Division
 for each officer conducting overtime enforcement through the grant.
- Determine the best enforcement strategy (e.g., sobriety checkpoints vs. saturation patrols, time of day, locations, etc.) that will most effectively deter ID within the Contractor's jurisdiction. Data indicates this would typically be at night on weekends and holidays, or during special community events justifying the need for additional traffic enforcement. Some jurisdictions may have varying times based on demographics (e.g., college communities).
- Conduct high visibility enforcement within corridors and times where the occurrence of injury and death from ID is greatest. When possible, the Safety Division will coordinate with the Contractor to determine these locations based on ND crash data.
- Coordinate with the Safety Division to complete earned media requirements (pre- and post-news releases).
- Submit an electronic enforcement log sheet for participating officers by the date indicated in the schedule, "Enforcement Log Due Date." The report will include: (1) number of enforcement hours, (2) dates and times of enforcement, (3) number and type of citations issued, and (4) number of enforcement contacts/stops made.
- Submit a reimbursement voucher by the date indicated in the schedule, "Reimbursement Voucher Due Date."
- Work with other area law enforcement within the region to conduct multi-agency enforcement efforts to maximize the visibility of law enforcement during the ID enforcement period.

UNDERAGE DRINKING (UA) ENFORCEMENT SCOPE OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPID2210-12-03

The UA enforcement program supports and enhances efforts by law enforcement to reduce the availability of alcohol to minors. Tragic social consequences can result when youth use alcohol, including traffic injuries and fatalities. The objective of the program is to prohibit the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages to minors. (For the purpose of this solicitation, "minors" are defined as individuals under the age of 21.)

Please note that funds for operations may be utilized to cover the costs of overtime for officers, stipends for underage buyers, and direct expenses for server training (printing, postage, and other approved direct expenses). **These funds may not be used for food or refreshment.**

Activities under this program are for Non-Saturation events only. The Contractor is required to work two (2) scheduled UA enforcement periods chosen by your agency and relay plans to the Safety Division. The Contractor may conduct additional non-saturation enforcement activity beyond the two (2) scheduled required calendar events within their jurisdiction, if the budget allows, and if the Contractor can justify the

purpose of additional non-saturation enforcement. The Contractor must notify the Safety Division of the additional non-saturation enforcement activity before conducting the additional non-saturation enforcement activity.

Qualifying Non-Saturation Events include:

The following types of enforcement activities will be reported as a non-saturation event in the Law Enforcement Web Reporting (LEWR) online report system.

- Compliance Checks Compliance Checks <u>must utilize an underage buyer</u> working under the direction of a law enforcement agency. The underage buyer enters a licensed liquor establishment and attempts to purchase alcoholic beverages. This operation may be conducted at on-premises sites (bars, restaurants, clubs, etc.) and off-premises businesses (convenience stores, grocery stores, gas stations, etc.).
- Shoulder Tap Shoulder tap activities <u>must involve an underage buyer</u> working under the direction of a law enforcement agency. The underage buyer will approach an individual who is about to enter an off-sale establishment and ask them to purchase alcohol for them from an off-sale establishment.
- **Server Training** Training provided to servers, sellers, and consumers of alcohol to prevent intoxication, drunk driving, and UA.
- Controlled Party Dispersal Controlled Party Dispersal goes hand in hand with Party Prevention
 Patrols. If patrol personnel encounter an UA party, the officer calls for backup and then uses
 proper party dispersal protocol as set out by the Pacific Institute for Research and Evaluation (PIRE)
 document A Practical Guide to Preventing and Dispersing Underage Drinking Parties.

- Evidence-Based Alcohol Prevention Educational Presentations —Evidence-based curricula have been proven to be effective in reducing underage drinking and driving. Examples of evidence-based programs include but are not limited to Lifeskills Training, Positive Action, and D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) Costs eligible for reimbursement are the purchase or printing of teaching guides, and workbooks for students. Please contact the Safety Division, Law Enforcement Coordinator, to determine if officer time is eligible for reimbursement (regular time is not reimbursable). Promotional items are not an allowable expense.

During each fiscal year of the contract, the Contractor must:

- Conduct a minimum of two (no minimum number of hours per shift) **planned** non-saturation events. Provide the Safety Division a calendar of scheduled events for the fiscal year that identifies the type of events to be conducted and when. The calendar of events must be provided to the Safety Division by October 1.
- Determine the best enforcement strategy (e.g., shoulder tap, server training or compliance checks, etc.) that will most effectively deter underage access and consumption of alcohol within the Contractor's jurisdiction.

- Coordinate with the Safety Division to complete earned media requirements (pre- and post-news releases).
- Submit an electronic enforcement log sheet for participating officers within five days after completing the event.
- For Evidence-based activities documentation of actual curricula expenses need to be supported by an invoice when submitting a voucher for reimbursement. A separate paper voucher will be provided to you from the Safety Division.
- Submit a reimbursement voucher by within 45 days after completing the event.

DISTRACTED DRIVING (DD) ENFORCEMENT OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPDD2211-02-05

The DD enforcement campaign exists to decrease the use of handheld electronic devices and other activities that are a distraction or cause inattentiveness by the driver through heightened enforcement of DD laws in the state. The campaign's success is built upon the strategy that education, along with heightened and consistent enforcement, is an effective means to change driver behavior and decrease crashes caused by driver distraction.

Participating law enforcement agencies are required to work overtime during scheduled DD campaigns to achieve heightened enforcement within their jurisdictions by enforcing the ban on all cell phone use by minors (under the age of 18) and activities by all drivers which cause inattentiveness resulting in traffic violations.

The Contractor is required to work during the scheduled DD enforcement periods as identified in Attachment 1. The Contractor may conduct additional enforcement activity beyond the required events within their jurisdiction, if the budget allows, and if the Contractor can justify the purpose of additional enforcement. The Contractor must notify the Safety Division of the additional enforcement activity prior to conducting the additional enforcement activity.

During each identified enforcement period, the Contractor must:

- Conduct a minimum of two shifts (no minimum number of hours per shift) per DD enforcement period.
- Determine the best enforcement strategy that will efficiently use available resources and conduct heightened enforcement within corridors and at times where the occurrence of DD and electronic device usage is most prevalent.
- Issue Citations **not warnings** when observing a driver violating North Dakota's DD law. This is to assure the integrity of the DD message to the public. Each stop is an opportunity to educate the public on taking personal responsibility for their driving behaviors.

SPEED (SC) ENFORCEMENT SCOPE OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPSC2207-04-09

The speed (SC) enforcement campaign exists to decrease speed violations through heightened enforcement of speeding laws in the state. The campaign's success is built upon the strategy that education, along with highly visible and consistent enforcement, is an effective means to change driver behavior and decrease excessive speed

Participating law enforcement agencies are required to work overtime during scheduled Speed campaigns to achieve high visibility within their jurisdictions to deter motorists from driving above the posted speed limits.

The Contractor may <u>only</u> work during the scheduled Speed enforcement periods as identified in Attachment 1. The Contractor may not work outside the scheduled period.

During each identified enforcement period, the Contractor must:

- Conduct a minimum of two shifts (no minimum number of hours per shift) per high visibility
 enforcement period within corridors and at times (including nighttime) where the occurrence of
 unbelted serious injury and fatal crashes is greatest. When possible, the Safety Division will
 coordinate with the Contractor to determine these locations based on North Dakota (ND) crash
 data.
- Issue Citations **not warnings** for driving above the posted speed limits. This is to assure the integrity of the *Obey the Sign or Pay the Fine* message to the public. Each stop is an opportunity to educate the public on taking personal responsibility in driving behaviors and safety measures.
- Coordinate with the Safety Division to complete earned media requirements (pre- and post-news releases).

- Submit an electronic enforcement log sheet for participating officers by the date indicated in the schedule, "Enforcement Log Due Date." The report will include: (1) number of enforcement hours, (2) dates and times of enforcement, (3) number and type of citations issued, and (4) number of enforcement contacts/stops made.
- Submit a reimbursement voucher by the date indicated in the schedule, "Reimbursement Voucher Due Date."
- Work with other area law enforcement within the region to conduct multi-agency enforcement efforts to maximize the heightened enforcement of speeding laws during the enforcement period.

MEDIA SCOPE OF WORK

PROJECT NO. PHSPID2210-03-02

The Contractor will be responsible for the development and placement of media ads for the enhancement of impaired driving campaigns to specifically target the city of Fargo population. The Contractor must:

- Receive approval from the Safety Division before placement/distribution of any media materials using NDDOT funds.
- Meet closed captioning requirements for any ads developed for television.
- Include the Vision Zero logo on all media developed for this placement.

The Contractor will track and report frequency and coverage of media message.

Reporting

A detailed progress report and voucher will be submitted to the Safety Division within 45 days after the end of the month in which expenses occurred. A voucher format will be provided by the Safety Division. The progress report must include:

- 1. The timeline of the project.
- 2. The total amount of funds spent on the project.
- 3. An outline of what portion of the project the DOT funds were attributed to.

The Contractor must maintain copies of the media placement affidavits on file.

REPORTING AND AUDIT REPORTING/ALL PROJECTS

Reporting

The Contractor must submit the enforcement logs and reimbursement voucher(s) to the Safety Division per the schedule referenced in the previous OP, ID, UA, DD, and SC enforcement sections. Late reports may result in a delay in processing or a reduction in payment.

The Contractor must retain for a minimum of three years, copies of timesheets, payroll, agency work schedules, and any other supporting documentation.

An enforcement contact is defined as one traffic stop, which may include multiple enforcement actions with the occupants of a motor vehicle while conducting overtime enforcement under contract with NDDOT.

Because the OP, ID, UA, DD and SC enforcement programs are statewide efforts, participation by each contracted entity is critical to the success of the campaigns. If the Contractor is unable to fulfill any portion of the contractual scope of work, they must contact the Safety Division immediately.

Audit Reporting

A non-federal entity that expends \$750,000 or more during the non-federal entity's fiscal year in federal awards must have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of 2 CFR 200, Subpart F. A financial audit is sufficient if the non-federal entity expends less than \$750,000.

NDDOT RESPONSIBILITIES, REIMBURSEMENT, AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS/ALL PROJECTS

NDDOT Responsibilities

This Scope of Work will be monitored by the NDDOT's Program Manager. Oversight will include, but will not be limited to, desktop and on-site monitoring of program finances, operations, and performance. This will include identification and written notification of issues and/or concerns that could significantly affect the program's performance and outcomes to agents of the contracting agency in the community.

Based on federal grant requirements, NDDOT may revise the enforcement dates shown in Attachment 1. The Contractor will be notified by email and will receive a revised Attachment 1 that will identify the revised enforcement dates and due dates of enforcement logs and reimbursement vouchers.

Reimbursement

This contract will reimburse allowable expenses up to each project's total budget for costs incurred through completion of the scope of work and/or at the direction of the program manager. The Safety Division reserves the right to deny payment for unallowable expenses identified in the applicable cost principles.

Overtime wages will be reimbursed at the agency-approved overtime rate and mileage, if applicable, will be reimbursed at the state-approved rate (56 cents per mile).

At the close of the state fiscal year, which is June 30, enforcement logs and reimbursement vouchers must be submitted no later than July 15 for any services or purchases that took place on or before June 30. Vouchers received after July 15 may not be reimbursed. Please note: only equipment that has been received by June 30 is affected by this due date.

The final reports/vouchers for all projects are due no later than November 14, 2022. *Vouchers received after November 14, 2022, will not be reimbursed.*

Other Requirements

In accordance with 23 CFR Part 1300 Appendix C, the Contractor, as a representative of its political subdivision, requests the benefit of the NDDOT Safety Division coordination of paid media and marketing to capitalize on the high visibility enforcement and education model necessary to change driver behavior. The NDDOT Safety Division will coordinate paid and earned media statewide to complement the enforcement initiative outlined in this project agreement. The outreach may include the following: TV spots, radio spots, online ads, billboards, print ads, press releases, posters, flyers, and/or outreach events. These efforts will include local jurisdictions and will be coordinated statewide. By signing the contract, the Contractor signifies his/her understanding of the outreach component of the mobilization and approves the use of these educational techniques within his/her jurisdiction.

The Contractor is encouraged to follow the guidelines for vehicular pursuits issued by the International Association of Chiefs of Police that are currently in effect.

The Contractor shall not use the funds for supplanting. Funds for programs and services provided through this grant are intended to supplement, not supplant, other state or local funding sources. Supplanting is defined as replacing routine and/or existing state or local expenditures with the use of federal grant funds and/or using federal grant funds for costs of activities that constitute general expenses required to carry out the overall responsibilities of state, local, or federally-recognized Indian tribal governments.

Written and verbal warnings are not encouraged under any of the grant programs.

The Contractor is encouraged to use the E-Citation module within TraCS Web while conducting overtime enforcement activities through NDDOT grant funded programs. The Safety Division will monitor enforcement activities in TraCS. Upon request, those issuing paper citations or electronic citations in another program will be required to submit copies of citations to the Safety Division.

Dear Commissioners:

Water Utility staff is seeking sole source request approval for Suez Water Technologies (Suez) to add membrane area in the Ultrafiltration (UF) system of the Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP). This sole source request was approved by the City of Fargo (CoF) Finance Committee on September 27, 2021 (sole source form attached). This project is in the 2022 approved budget to be funded with American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act funding, which will not need to be paid back by CoF. The project cost is estimated at \$934,600.



Pumps and piping in the Ultrafiltration (UF) System in the Membrane Water Treatment Plant (MWTP). The UF System achieves EPA regulatory credit. This system removes particles from water before it is pumped through the Reverse Osmosis (RO) System to remove dissolved salts such as sulfates.

Purpose and Motive of MWTP Ultrafiltration Buildout Project

- Operations Cost Efficiency: This is good for rate payers. The 2019 MWTP has proven to be a more cost efficient treatment process compared to the 1997 Lime Softening WTP (1997 WTP). However, a base flow rate of water needs to be treated through the 1997 WTP for a variety of reasons. This project will allow for higher water flow rates through the MWTP in summer and should have a capital investment pay back of less than three (3) years.
- Maintenance benefit: The MWTP UF system is highly regulated to achieve Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulatory credit. Higher flow rates through the UF system reduce a regulatory credit calculation, approved by the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). This credit reduction is purely due to an increased water flow, a variable in the calculation. Also, membrane fiber breakage reduce this credit calculation and fibers need to be repaired. The combination of high water flow rates and fiber breakage is problematic from a maintenance urgency and workload perspective. This project will reduce urgency and allow for more scheduled maintenance instead of reactive maintenance related to broken membrane fiber repairs.

Reason and Justification for Sole Source

- <u>Ultrafiltration (UF) Components Not Universal</u>: Manufacturers of UF systems have unique system designs. Components and membrane modules are not interchangeable between different manufacturers. For Fargo, the UF manufacture (Suez) was competitively selected ahead of the full MWTP design due to equipment footprint criteria. Suez is the only provider for the UF components that may be installed in the Fargo MWTP and allow for EPA regulatory credit.
- Basis for Membrane Proposal Cost: Prior to full MWTP design in 2013, a proposal was received from Suez with a locked in 20-year membrane module replacement price with a defined method for inflation adjustments. While the current WTP Ultrafiltration Buildout project is additional membrane modules/area and not replacement, Suez is honoring the 2013 contact price with inflation adjustment as the basis for the current proposal. Therefore, the proposal seems fair and reasonable to the City of Fargo and Suez from a cost perspective with a contract defined cost calculation.

Water Utility personnel have a goal to complete the MWTP Ultrafiltration Buildout Project prior to May, 2022. This will allow for additional treatment cost saving in 2022 and beyond, which is good for rate payers. The degree of treatment cost reduction when comparing the 2019 MWTP and the 1997 Lime Softening WTP has dependence on the chemistry of the source water (Red River & Sheyenne River). Generally, the MWTP shows lower treatment costs over 98% of the time.

While the 1997 Lime Softening WTP is an excellent water treatment facility, another primary benefit of the MWTP (and the reason for its construct) is more consistency of water quality to customers. These are unregulated parameters such as hardness, Total Dissolved Solids, and taste/odor compound reduction.

Fargo intends to discontinue the use of Tower #3 at 1430 10th Street North and hereby gives Notice in accordance with paragraph 10 of said Lease of Termination of Lease, effective twelve (12) months after receipt of such notice by Tenant as evidenced by the return receipt. This lease can extend as long as service allows while having all AT&T equipment removed by August 31, 2023, after which Water Tower #3 will be decommissioned and removed.

Tenant shall, in accordance with paragraph 15 of the Lease, remove its personal property and fixtures within a reasonable time. All of Tenant's property must be removed no later than August 31, 2023. This is more than 12 months from the date of this Termination Notice. Failure to remove the equipment shall be deemed a breach of this Lease, causing Fargo to dispose of the equipment without further Notice to Tenant.





Improvement District No. BN-20-L1 is for the new construction of underground utilities, concrete pavement and incidentals on 37th Street South, 38th Street South and 63rd Avenue South.

Dakota Underground is the Prime Contractor for this project.

The concrete box culvert to service the ponds on either side of 38th Street South is planned to be a passage way for kayaks once the Sanford Sports Complex is constructed and operational. It was the intention of the plans and specs to include painting of the interior but was not addressed in the plans. The Contractor agreed to paint the structure at the same cost as the Pedestrian Box Culvert. All costs associated with the pond box painting is \$11,779.60. As plans for the Sanford Sports Complex progress, the Developer requested that the north driveway be installed with the City of Fargo Project. All costs associated with installing the driveway is \$8,415. On the northeast quadrant of the roundabout, the bull nose curb and gutter was installed per plan. Once installed, it was apparent that the placement was not in the correct location and required the removal and replacement of 30 linear feet of curb and gutter. All costs associated with the remove and replace curb and gutter is \$765. The proposed street light locations between 37th Street S and 38th Street S were moved due to storm sewer conflicts. The Contractor was required to relocate 3 street light locations with an associated cost of \$954.

The current interim completion date of September 1, 2021, was created in Change Order #1 to facilitate the construction of the proposed Sanford Site and the NDSCS Career Academy. Currently the Contractor is maintaining access to the NDSCS site without any issues or delays, and Sanford has chosen to delay their construction until 2022. To ensure safety within the construction area, Engineering Staff proposes to eliminate the interim completion and require all work originally required for interim completion to be complete by the new substantial completion date.

In addition, it is recommended that eight (8) additional calendar days should be added to the Substantial Completion date due to the additional work added to the contract as follows: three (3) additional days for the pond box culvert painting, two (2) additional days for installing the driveway, two (2) additional days for the removal and replacement of the curb and gutter, and one (1) additional day for relocating the street light bases.

Improvement District No. FP-19-A2 is the General Construction Contract for the Southwest Regional Pond – Phase 1 located south of 52^{nd} Avenue South and east of Cass County Drain 27.

The General Contractor (Zavarol & Sons, Inc.) has been delayed on this project due to easement acquisition delays and subcontractor (Northern Plains Contracting) material/supplier delays.

The Substantial Completion date is requested to be modified from September 15, 2021 to October 1, 2021. This extension will allow for the access road to the lift station to be constructed along with topsoiling & seeding along the road. Acquisition of a piece of land owned by Fred Hector prevented the access road from being constructed until after August 23, 2021.

Modifications to Milestone No. 2 will move the installation of lift station process piping, miscellaneous metals and the standby generator to March 1, 2022. Supplier delays have caused these materials to be delayed.

Time Extension Recommendation

Mr. Hasey:

RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. is requesting a modification to the contract Substantial Completion date. As this modification will also affect the electrical contract work being completed by Strata Corporation, we have combined these items into one recommendation. These items are discussed in more detail below.

TIME EXTENSION REQUEST

As outlined in the attached Request for Time Extension from RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. dated August 18, 2021, delays to the project progress due to material delays and acquisition of the Hector land has delayed the completion of the project. They are requesting that the Substantial Completion date for the project be extended to October 8, 2021 due to these delays.

RECOMMENDATION

After reviewing the contractors request and discussing the current delivery date of the lift station control panel, generator, process piping, and miscellaneous metals, we are recommending the following revisions to the contract.

Substantial Completion Date: In order to account for the delays to the concrete pours and associated site work adjacent to the lift station, we are recommending that the contract Substantial Completion date of September 15, 2021 be extended to October 1, 2021. The lift station control panel is scheduled to be delivered the week of September 13, 2021. This would allow sufficient time for these items to be installed and the associated site work around the lift station to be completed.

Milestone No. 2 Date: In order to account for the manufacturing delays of the lift station process piping, miscellaneous metals, and generator, we are recommending that these items be removed from Substantial Completion and placed under Milestone No. 2. At this time, they have not received a definite shipping date from the manufacturer for these items. Moving these items to Milestone No. 2 would allow sufficient time for delivery and installation of these items. The Milestone No. 2 date is currently March 1, 2022.

As stated above, the modification to the Substantial Completion date is being recommended for both the FP-19-A2 (General) and FP-19-A3 (Electrical) contracts.

Mike,

RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. is requesting an extension of the substantial completion date, as referenced in Addendum No. 4, for the above-referenced project due to the reasons outlined in the following.

On August 5th, 2021, RJ Zavoral & Sons was informed that the adjacent Hector-owned land acquisition was not yet finalized. We were directed by Houston Engineering to not pour concrete on this parcel of land until further notice, with the estimation of at least September 1st, 2021. Although other sections of the driveway could theoretically be poured prior to this date, it still creates a foreseeable delay in finishing the subsequent construction activities before the original September 15th date.

Additionally, the lift station subcontractor, Northern Plains Contracting, has experienced delays of various duration; although all parties were very diligent with submittals at the beginning of this project, local and national supply shortages in material and resources have persisted. Please see the below delays:

- a) Concrete Delay Order was placed for 6-17-21; Received 6-22-21: ADD 4 DAYS
- b) Wall Ductile Pipe Shortage Reformed for different walls sleeves 7-15-21: ADD 4 DAYS
- c) Lid Pour Ductile Pipe Shortage ADD 2 DAYS

The lid pour is scheduled for Friday, August 20th. However, since the structure cannot be entirely backfilled until the lid has reached "75% of the specified 28-day design strength," several contract items, including but not limited to: aggregate base, concrete driveway, generator pad, topsoil placement, seeding, mulching, landscaping, and fiber optic components, are unable to be performed or installed until proper cure has been achieved. Hence, the delays to Northern Plains Contracting shall be correlated to an extension of the substantial completion date expected of the prime contractor, RJ Zavoral & Sons, as well.

In an attempt to still make the original date, RJ Zavoral & Sons has put forth maximum effort in driving the schedule and mobilized back to site multiple times to complete small portions of work; however, it is evident that factors beyond our control will not allow this goal to be achieved.

We are requesting an extension of the substantial completion date of this project to Friday, October 8th, 2021, with the intent of all topsoil placement and seeding complete no later than October 1st, 2021. These dates are barring any further delays in material or supply, and execution of the land acquisition.



Regardless of the aforementioned issues, we also request the fence and gate shall be excluded from the substantial completion work scope and furnished/installed following the pumps. This is advised to mitigate the risk of damage during the installation and wiring of the pumps.

Furthermore, a significant process piping supply issue has become evident. Northern Plains Contracting ordered ductile piping on April 12, 2021, and had a scheduled delivery date for late June. To date, not one piece has been received. The most recent projection is mid-September, but this is no guarantee. Therefore, it is necessary these components also be considered for an exclusion from the substantial completion date.

RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. is requesting a modification to the contract Substantial Completion date. As this modification will also affect the electrical contract work being completed by Strata Corporation, we have combined these items into one recommendation. These items are discussed in more detail below.

TIME EXTENSION REQUEST

As outlined in the attached Request for Time Extension from RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. dated August 18, 2021, delays to the project progress due to material delays and acquisition of the Hector land has delayed the completion of the project. They are requesting that the Substantial Completion date for the project be extended to October 8, 2021 due to these delays.

RECOMMENDATION

After reviewing the contractors request and discussing the current delivery date of the lift station control panel, generator, process piping, and miscellaneous metals, we are recommending the following revisions to the contract.

Substantial Completion Date: In order to account for the delays to the concrete pours and associated site work adjacent to the lift station, we are recommending that the contract Substantial Completion date of September 15, 2021 be extended to October 1, 2021. The lift station control panel is scheduled to be delivered the week of September 13, 2021. This would allow sufficient time for these items to be installed and the associated site work around the lift station to be completed.

Milestone No. 2 Date: In order to account for the manufacturing delays of the lift station process piping, miscellaneous metals, and generator, we are recommending that these items be removed from Substantial Completion and placed under Milestone No. 2. At this time, they have not received a definite shipping date from the manufacturer for these items. Moving these items to Milestone No. 2 would allow sufficient time for delivery and installation of these items. The Milestone No. 2 date is currently March 1, 2022.

As stated above, the modification to the Substantial Completion date is being recommended for both the FP-19-A2 (General) and FP-19-A3 (Electrical) contracts.

RJ Zavoral & Sons, Inc. is requesting an extension of the substantial completion date, as referenced in Addendum No. 4, for the above-referenced project due to the reasons outlined in the following.

On August 5th, 2021, RJ Zavoral & Sons was informed that the adjacent Hector-owned land acquisition was not yet finalized. We were directed by Houston Engineering to not pour concrete on this parcel of land until further notice, with the estimation of at least September 1st, 2021. Although other sections of the driveway could theoretically be poured prior to this date, it still creates a foreseeable delay in finishing the subsequent construction activities before the original September 15th date.

Additionally, the lift station subcontractor, Northern Plains Contracting, has experienced delays of various duration; although all parties were very diligent with submittals at the beginning of this project, local and national supply shortages in material and resources have persisted. Please see the below delays:

- a) Concrete Delay Order was placed for 6-17-21; Received 6-22-21: ADD 4 DAYS
- b) Wall Ductile Pipe Shortage Reformed for different walls sleeves 7-15-21: ADD 4 DAYS
- c) Lid Pour Ductile Pipe Shortage ADD 2 DAYS

The lid pour is scheduled for Friday, August 20th. However, since the structure cannot be entirely backfilled until the lid has reached "75% of the specified 28-day design strength," several contract items, including but not limited to: aggregate base, concrete driveway, generator pad, topsoil placement, seeding, mulching, landscaping, and fiber optic components, are unable to be performed or installed until proper cure has been achieved. Hence, the delays to Northern Plains Contracting shall be correlated to an extension of the substantial completion date expected of the prime contractor, RJ Zavoral & Sons, as well.

In an attempt to still make the original date, RJ Zavoral & Sons has put forth maximum effort in driving the schedule and mobilized back to site multiple times to complete small portions of work; however, it is evident that factors beyond our control will not allow this goal to be achieved.

We are requesting an extension of the substantial completion date of this project to Friday, October 8th, 2021, with the intent of all topsoil placement and seeding complete no later than October 1st, 2021. These dates are barring any further delays in material or supply, and execution of the land acquisition.



Regardless of the aforementioned issues, we also request the fence and gate shall be excluded from the substantial completion work scope and furnished/installed following the pumps. This is advised to mitigate the risk of damage during the installation and wiring of the pumps.

Furthermore, a significant process piping supply issue has become evident. Northern Plains Contracting ordered ductile piping on April 12, 2021, and had a scheduled delivery date for late June. To date, not one piece has been received. The most recent projection is mid-September, but this is no guarantee. Therefore, it is necessary these components also be considered for an exclusion from the substantial completion date.

The project was bid May 12, 2021, the project was awarded to Border States Paving, May 17, 2021 and construction began June 2, 2021.

During construction of the project certain bid items increased due to situational changes.

Bid Item 2 Traffic Control-Type 1: Engineering added another set up for traffic control due to the addition of the south lane widening and the increased truck traffic during striping-\$2,790.00. Bid item 3 Flagging: Engineer requested added weekend watch person due to lane changes and high volume of traffic-\$2,337.50. Bid item 8 and 9 Storm Sewer: Existing pipe was found to be concrete instead of metal thereby increasing the project cost-\$6,610.00. Bid items 16-21 Paying: During construction we elected to remove more pavement that was in bad shape and we elected to go wider than the 5' shown on the plan at the tie in points in order to allow payer lay of the asphalt for a better finished product rather than hand lay. This resulted in increased costs of \$36,440.00 but a better finished product for the heavy truck traffic. Bid Items 26 and 27 Erosion Control: Are based upon actual field measurement of the areas disturbed to complete the project-\$5,180.00. Bid Items 28, 30, 31, 32, & 36 Pavement Marking: These item amounts are based upon actual measurement and we had increased cost due to interim striping with the addition of lane widening on the south-\$9,344.00. Bid item 33 and 34 Signing: This covers the cost to switch out an existing 36" stop sign and replace with a 48" sign requested by the County-\$611.20. Total change order cost is \$63,312.50 and is reasonable based upon use of bid pricing and as-built quantities.

Funding for this project will come from special assessments and sales tax funds. Engineering believes the prices provided are reasonable.

The project was bid April 28, 2021, the project was awarded to Dakota Underground and construction began May 10, 2021.

During construction, there were 5 items of added work due to encountered items. Item 1-replace interim driveway for fire access to warehouses off 46th Avenue North that was removed for storm sewer installation, \$11,104.20. Item 2-fill future 46th Avenue east of 37th Street North to 33rd Street North right of way to drain to inlets, \$3,852.50. Item 3-re-grade ditch along 37th Street North to drain better into new inlets, \$4,300.80. Item 4-adjust existing storm sewer manhole casting to match new asphalt in 33rd Street at 46th Avenue North, \$800.00. Item 5-standby time, during installation of the storm sewer in 46th Avenue North near 33rd Street North, Fargo had to shut off the water line feeding the area. We found that there was a bad gate valve in 37th Avenue North that resulted in the shutdown of water to the new Amazon facility. In order to allow Amazon to finish testing their fire lines we suspended the work of Dakota Underground one day and negotiated a standby crew cost of \$9,000.00.

The total cost of Change Order #2 is \$29,057.50. Funding for this project will come from Special Assessments. The added items were based upon negotiated amounts that resulted in savings over what was initially requested by the Contractor and Engineering believes the numbers are reasonable.

Nature & Scope

This project is for the replacement of the water main and services, sanitary main and sewer services, storm sewer, street reconstruction, sidewalks, and incidentals.

The project will be on 3rd Avenue North from 10th Street to 7th Street, on 7th Street North from 2nd Avenue to 4th Avenue, and on 8th Street North from 3rd Avenue to 4th Avenue. Work on 8th Street North will only include replacement of the water main and services.

Purpose

The existing water mains on 7th Street and 8th Street are CIP, which were installed over 80 years ago and are being replaced to minimize impacts and costs associated with breaks.

There is no water main on 3rd Avenue between 10th Street and 7th Street. We are installing new water main on 3rd Avenue, to improve service and network resiliency.

The existing sanitary sewer mains are VCP, which were installed over 60 years ago and are showing signs of deterioration. As part of this project, we will replace the sanitary sewer pipe that is showing signs of deterioration.

The street reconstruction is necessary because the existing street section has deteriorated significantly and has exceeded its life expectancy. Reconstruction will include concrete street paving, gravel base, curb and gutter, storm sewer inlets and leads, driveway approaches, and sidewalk.

The project will be funded by a combination of City Funds (Wastewater Utility funds and Water Utility Funds) and Special Assessments to the benefiting properties. Assessments will be applied per City policy.



PAVING AND UTILITY REHAB/RECONSTRUCTION

IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. BR-22-F

Nature & Scope

This project is for the replacement of the water main, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, street reconstruction, sidewalk replacement, and street lighting.

The project will be on 21st Street South from 13th Avenue to 9th Avenue.

Purpose

The existing water mains are CIP, which were installed over 60 years ago and are being replaced to minimize impacts and costs associated with breaks.

The existing sanitary sewer mains are VCP, which were installed over 60 years ago and are showing signs of deterioration. As part of this project, we will replace the sanitary sewer pipe.

The street reconstruction is necessary because the existing concrete street section has deteriorated significantly and has exceeded its life expectancy. Reconstruction will include asphalt street paving, gravel base, curb and gutter, storm sewer inlets and leads, driveway approaches, and sidewalk replacement.

The project will be funded by a combination of City Funds (Wastewater Utility funds, Water Utility Funds), and Special Assessments to the benefiting properties. Assessments will be applied per City policy.


