This year, the One Book, One Community reading project's title is the New York Times bestseller *Fly Girls: How Five Daring Women Defied All Odds and Made Aviation History* by Keith O'Brien.

Fly Girls is the previously untold story of five remarkable women who competed against men in the high-stakes national air races of the 1920s and 1930s. The women fought for the chance to fly and race airplanes – and in 1936, one of them would triumph, beating the men in the toughest air race of them all.
