Get Smitten with Reading!

Anything is possible between the pages of a book. Winter is a great time to read or listen to books, and the library invites you to get smitten with reading. Take part in the library's "Get Smitten with Reading!" 2022 Winter Reading Program for kids, teens, and adults. The free program runs from **Monday, Jan. 3** through **Sunday, March 6**, and readers of all ages can participate by reading (or listening to) books, attending events, and completing challenges.

The library aims to reach community members this season with a winter of engaging stories, creative activities, and events for all ages. The library's winter reading program will once again use Beanstack, an online service designed for readers of all ages to log the days and time they spend reading and the challenges they complete, to earn free prizes for their efforts. To get started and participate in the library's winter reading incentive program, register at **fargolibrary.beanstack.org** beginning Jan. 3. Online registration with Beanstack is accessible via web browser, or Apple/Android apps.

Reading logs and activity challenges are due on or before **Sunday, March 6**, to be eligible for prizes and prize drawings. Prize drawings will be held in mid-March.

COMING IN APRIL: "RED RIVER VALLEY KIDS READ" FEATURING *STORM WARNING* BY ELIZABETH RAUM

Twenty-five years ago, in April 1997, towns up and down the Red River Valley experienced what became known as the "flood of the century." The region had received a record-setting snowfall throughout the winter which resulted in an overwhelming spring snowmelt. The additional water, combined with a late season ice storm and more rain, overflowed the Red and many surrounding rivers.



In remembrance of the 25th anniversary of the 1997 flood, the Fargo Public Library, in partnership with the West Fargo, Moorhead, Grand Forks, and Leach (Wapheton) Public Libraries, will be featuring the book *Storm Warning* by author Elizabeth Raum throughout the month of April. Set in Ada, MN, this middle-grade novel follows a 12-year-old boy facing incredible challenges during the 1997 flood. A limited number of copies will be available at all three Fargo Public Library beginning April 1.

As part of the **Red River Valley Kids Read** event series, author **Elizabeth Raum** will visit the downtown **Main Library on Thursday, April 21, at 6:30 p.m.** Raum will share her experiences during the 1997 flood and what prompted her to write the story. The author of more than 160 books, many for educational and Christian publishers, Raum is a former teacher, elementary school and college librarian, and is currently a full-time writer.

In addition to the author visit, the library's Children's Department will hold a series of related events throughout the month of April to mark the 25th anniversary of the 1997 flood.
