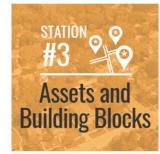
LET'S GET STARTED!

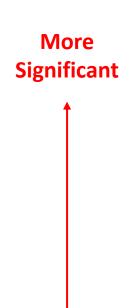






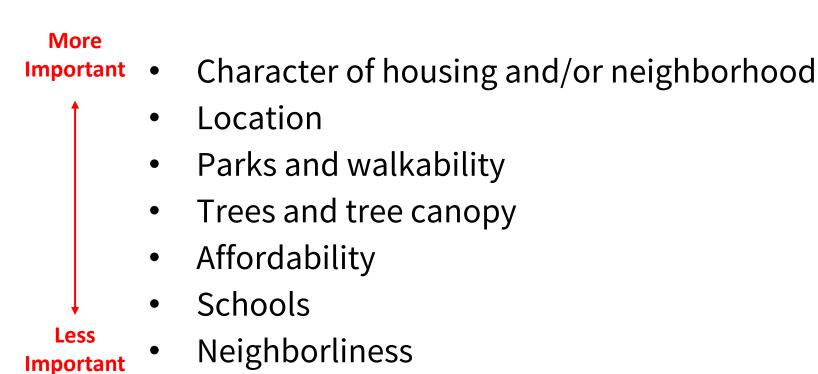


To what degree to do you think each of these issues is a problem?
