Join the staff and Friends of the Fargo Public Library in April and May as together we celebrate the success and achievements of the Fargo Public Library since our current Main Library building opened on April 29, 2009. What first began as a dream in 2004 of a new and bigger library to meet the needs of a growing city took shape a decade ago; now we are celebrating how that dream has become a successful reality!

How the Library Has Grown in 10 Years

Just how successful have the last ten years been for the Main Library? Here are some examples:

■ There have been 2,571,069 visits to the Main Library since April 29, 2009. If you lined up 2.5 million people shoulder to shoulder, the line would go from Fargo all the way to Seattle - a little over 1,200 miles away!

• Over 5,100,000 items have checked out of the Main Library in the past decade. If each of those 5.1

million items was a book that was an inch and a half thick, that book shelf would stretch from Fargo to Aberdeen, SD - 120 miles away!

While the Fargo Public Library has grown in service significantly over the past ten years, so has our city. Fargo now has over 33,000 more residents than it did in 2009. So we continue to strive to keep up with our community's growth by providing effective and efficient library services for all.
