## Summer Reading Program For All Ages

Are you ready for a great summer? What makes for a great summer? Great weather, great activities and the Fargo Public Library's annual Summer Reading Program, of course! The library's popular program for kids, teens, and adults is here and you are invited to take part. This annual program, which starts **Monday, June 3**, and runs through Saturday, Aug. 10, is for readers of all ages. Residents are invited to participate in this summer learning opportunity by reading and attending special events, storytimes, concerts, movies, and craft programs.

The **kids'** summer reading program theme is "A Universe of Stories," and lots of space-related activities and events are planned at all three library locations for the summer. Each week will feature new ways for kids to discover, learn, and read all summer long. **Teens (& tweens)** are encouraged to get involved at the library with their own summer reading program, also titled "A Universe of Stories." Teens are asked to read five (5) books (Note: 2 manga novels count as 1 book) during the program and turn in their booklogs before August 10 to earn prizes and have their names entered in the grand prize drawing at the end of the program.

All summer long, the library will offer events and activities for you and your family.

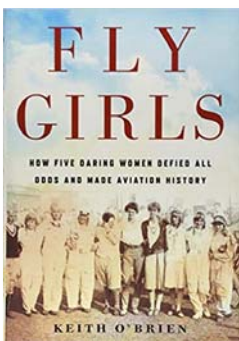
## FARGO HISTORY HUNT

## ONE BOOK ONE COMMUNITY 2019 TITLE IS *FLY GIRLS*



The Fargo, Moorhead and West Fargo public libraries, the Carl B. Ylvisaker Library at Concordia College, Livingston Lord Library at Minnesota State University Moorhead, North Dakota State University Libraries, Moorhead Community Education, the Historical and Cultural Society of Clay County and the Fargo Air Museum have selected the New York Times bestseller *Fly Girls: How Five Daring Women Defied All Odds and Made Aviation History* by Keith O'Brien as the 2019 One Book, One Community selection.

*Fly Girls* is the previously untold story of five remarkable women who competed against men in the high-stakes national air races of the 1920s and 1930s. The women – Florence Klingensmith, a high school dropout who worked for a dry cleaner in Fargo, North Dakota; Ruth Elder, an Alabama divorcee; Amelia Earhart, the most famous, but not necessarily the most skilled; Ruth Nichols, who chafed at the constraints of her blue blood family's expectations; and Louise Thaden, the mother of two young kids who got her start selling coal in Wichita – fought for the chance to fly and race airplanes – and in 1936, one of them would triumph, beating the men in the toughest air race of them all.

This year's One Book, One Community reading project launches in September and features an author visit, films, a book discussion and historical presentations as part of the event series.
