Summer is here and the Library's Tails and Tales Summer Reading Challenge promises lots of great books, and engaging challenges, along with virtual and in-person events and activities for all ages. The program runs **June 7 through Aug. 21.**

Starting June 7, we invite you to read every day and participate by completing challenges, earning badges, and attending events. It is easy to participate. This summer the Library is using Beanstack, an online reading tracker app, for kids, families, teens, and adults to track their reading goals and challenges. To get started, visit the library's Beanstack site at fargolibrary.beanstack.org, or download the app for Android or Apple. If you prefer a printed reading log, those are also available by request at any FPL location starting June 7.

All readers are encouraged to read (or listen to) books and complete challenges to earn chances to enter prize drawings. Reading logs are due on or before Saturday, Aug. 21, to be eligible for prizes and prize drawings. Drawings will be held in August.

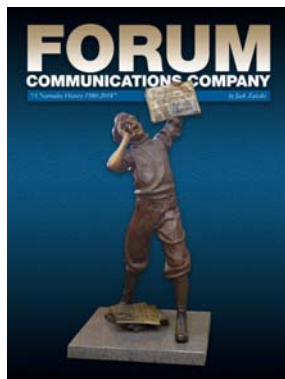

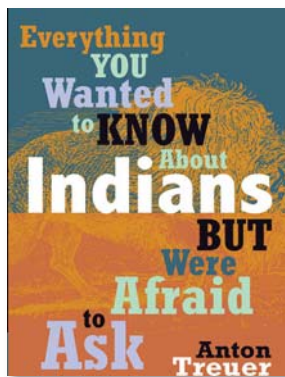

The Fargo Public Library offers bike locks for patrons to use while they visit the library. Bike locks can be borrowed at the circulation desk with a Fargo Public Library card in good standing (one bike lock per

card). Bike locks are due the same day as checkout and may be returned to any library book return. Bike locks cannot be put on hold or renewed, and do not accrue daily fines. The replacement cost for each bike lock is \$7. If any piece of the lock is not returned (key or cable), the patron will be charged the full replacement cost. Please note: Regardless of whether a library bike lock is used, the Fargo Public Library is not responsible for any lost, stolen, or damaged bicycles.

SUMMER STORYWALKS®

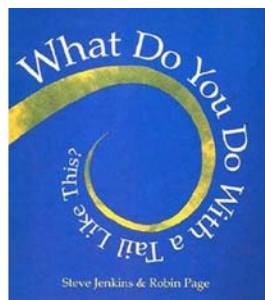

EXPLORE SOME OF OUR RESOURCES

NEWSPAPERS ON MICROFILM

It is interesting and fun to look at old newspapers – especially significant events in history. Fargo Public Library has The Forum on microfilm back to December of 1891. We have the Daily Argus back to 1879. The papers can be viewed and print copies can be made or articles saved to a USB storage device. Looking at old newspapers is the closest thing to time travel that we can do! The writing style, the fonts, and the nature of the articles change over the decades. The ads for and prices of goods are distinctive of a certain time. They wrote things in the past that we would not find in contemporary newspapers and vice versa. Also, obituaries are a key family history research tool. The Library has self-service microform viewers and copiers on the second floor of the downtown Main Library near the public computer area.
