

## Winter Read-A-Thon 2020

### Featuring a Harry Potter Exhibit and Themed Events

Read. Always. Morning, noon, and night! Cozy up with a good book and put an end to those winter blahs. Take part in the library's "Read. Always." 2020 Winter-Read-a-Thon for kids, teens, and adults. The program runs from **Monday, Jan. 6** through **Saturday, March 1**. To participate, pick up a book log at any Fargo Public Library location or print one from our website at [www.fargolibrary.org](http://www.fargolibrary.org) beginning Jan. 6. All readers are encouraged to read to earn chances to enter prize drawings. Book logs are due on or before **Sunday, March 1**, to be eligible for prizes and prize drawings. Prize drawings will be held in mid-March.

As part of this year's Winter Read-A-Thon, the Fargo Public Library, in partnership with UND's School of Medicine & Health Sciences, will host the traveling exhibit *Renaissance Science, Magic, and Medicine in Harry Potter's World*. Provided by the History of Medicine Division of the National Library of Medicine, this exceptional traveling exhibit will be on display at the **Main Library** from **Feb. 10 – March 21, 2020**.

Although a fantasy story, the magic in the Harry Potter books is partially based on Renaissance traditions that played an important role in the development of Western science and medicine. This exhibit explores the world of Harry Potter and its roots in Renaissance medicine, magic, and science. In addition, the library will provide six weeks of themed events for children, teens, and adults based on the magical world of Harry Potter!

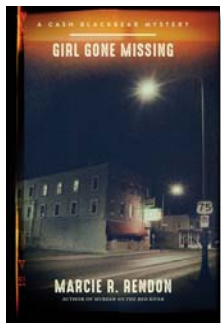

## ALEXANDER HAMILTON EXHIBIT: MARCH 31 – APRIL 28

Alexander Hamilton, one of America's most visionary founding fathers, is with us every day, not only in our wallets, on the \$10 bill, but also in the republic's most vital institutions. An exhibit honoring the statesman, scholar, and former Secretary of the Treasury will visit the **Main Library from March 31 to April 28**. *Alexander Hamilton: Immigrant, Patriot, Visionary*, a national traveling exhibition developed by the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History and made possible by the Rockefeller Foundation, will examine Hamilton's role during the Revolutionary War and Founding period (1774-1804) in creating the economic, constitutional, social, journalistic, political, and foreign policy templates for modern America. It will acquaint visitors with a statesman and visionary whose life inspired discussion and controversy and shaped the America we live in two hundred years after his death.

## YOUTH IN REVOLT: ALEXANDER HAMILTON AND COMING OF AGE IN THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION PRESENTATION APRIL 5

Join us as Donald Johnson, Assistant Professor of Early American History at NDSU uses the career of Alexander Hamilton and others, to explore how the American Revolution affected the lives of those who came of age during the political crisis that preceded it, the War that it led to, and the chaotic period that ensued.

At the dawn of the Revolution more than 1/3 of Americans were under the age of 24, and while older Revolutionaries like George Washington and Benjamin Franklin may have pioneered the ideology of rebellion, it fell to younger founders like Alexander Hamilton and James Madison to do much of the fighting and governing in the post-Revolutionary landscape. This presentation explores both how these peoples' lives were shaped by the Revolution and how those young people shaped the course of Revolutionary events.
