# Storytime Opportunities at the **Fargo Public Library**

Storytime is a special experience at the Fargo Public Library. Children's Staff delight in sharing their love of books and reading with young children. Through the use of age-appropriate stories, songs, and fingerplays in a group setting, the Children's Librarians help parents and caregivers learn how to foster early literacy skills to prepare their children for a lifetime of reading. The Fargo Public Library offers a range of storytime opportunities available for families and caregivers.

- Baby Rhyme Time is specifically planned for our youngest readers ages birth to 18 months and includes a scheduled play time after every storytime session. Baby Rhyme Time happens at the Carlson Library the first and third Thursday of every month beginning at 10 a.m.
- Fall Storytime invites children ages 2 to 6 to weekly events featuring stories, songs, rhythms, and rhymes. Fall Storytime takes place at all three Fargo Public Library locations. See inside for times and location dates.
- Kindergarten Success Storytime targets children ages 3 to 5 who are learning those important kindergarten readiness skills. Kindergarten Success Storytime occurs on the first Saturday of each month. Activities follow storytime and all children leave with a free book!
- Special storytimes are offered throughout the season and feature stories, activities, and crafts to celebrate books and reading.








#### **Family Puzzle Competition**






