AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS
25-1501, 25-1503, 25-1511, AND 25-1512,
OF ARTICLE 25-15 OF CHAPTER 25 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE,
RELATING TO DEFINITIONS, LICENSE-QUALIFICATIONS,
LICENSED PREMISES-REQUIREMENTS FOR, AND LICENSES-TERMINATION,
SUSPENSION, REVOCATION, AND SANCTIONS.

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in
accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City
shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said
home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict
therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to
implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Amendment.

25-1501. - Definitions.

In this article, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

1 26. "Mandatory server training" shall mean server training that has been approved by
2 the Fargo police department and/or its designee for ~~managers and employees~~ any

5 selling, identification verification, and admission and security involved in selling
6 alcoholic beverages at licensed liquor establishments, including restaurants. Mandatory server training applies to, but is not limited to, managers, servers,
7 security, bartenders, and door attendants, or any employee in the capacity to
8 determine compliance with applicable laws.

10 Section 2. Amendment.

11 25-1503. – License – Qualifications.

12 No license shall be issued to any applicant except as follows:

14 E. Mandatory server training (as defined by 25-1501(21~~26~~)) shall be required of all
15 liquor licensees. Mandatory server training shall be completed prior to participation
16 in the stream of service of alcoholic beverages as defined. Persons successfully
17 completing the approved class will receive a "server training certificate eard," which
18 will remain with that individual wherever employed. ~~The "server training certificate~~
19 ~~card" is not required to be carried on the person so long as the same can be produced~~
20 ~~at a later date.~~ The "server training certificate eard" must be renewed every three (3)
21 years on the anniversary date as shown on the said eard certificate. ~~For all new~~
22 ~~managers and employees not having previously received server training, there shall~~
23 ~~be a grace period of 90 days in which to successfully complete the approved class. On~~
each license renewal date, One month prior to license renewal date, the licensee shall
provide the city with a roster of employees and a copy of employees' server training
certificate as required by 25-1501 (26) evidencing current training status, which can
then be checked against the training records. If the licensee is found to be not in
compliance, license renewal for the upcoming year may be denied or delayed. Failure
to comply with this section may result in administrative or other penalties.

4 E. ~~Every holder of an alcoholic license in the city of Fargo shall implement a program of~~

7 ~~with the dispensing of alcoholic beverages must obtain and maintain a "server training~~
8 ~~certificate card". Said training must be completed within 90 days for current managers~~
9 ~~and employees. The "server training certificate card" is not required to be carried on~~
10 ~~the person so long as said card can be produced at a later date. The "server training~~
11 ~~certificate card" must be renewed every three (3) years by the anniversary date as~~

22 any time requested by any person authorized by the City to verify compliance may
23 result in administrative or other penalties.

17 Section 4. Amendment.

18 25-1512. – Licenses – Termination, suspension, revocation, and sanctions.

19 All licenses issued under the provisions of this article, unless otherwise specifically provided,
20 shall terminate on June 30th next following the date of issuance; provided, however, that any
21 license issued under the provisions of this article may, under certain circumstances, terminate
22 automatically or may be terminated, suspended or revoked by the commission.

10 Section 5. Penalty.

11 A person who willfully violates this ordinance is guilty of an infraction. Every person,
12 firm or corporation violating an ordinance which is punishable as an infraction shall be
13 punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000; the court to have power to suspend said sentence
14 and to revoke the suspension thereof.

15 Section 6. Effective Date.

16 This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and

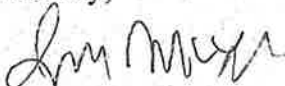
Enclosed for your approval is a resolution relating to the qualifications for the members of the board of health.

Fargo Municipal Code section 13-0204 provides that the board of health shall consist of one member of the Board of City Commissioners and other members shall be appointed with such qualifications as shall be determined by the board of city commissioners. At the October 17, 2022, meeting of the Board of City Commissioners, the City Commission passed a resolution which set forth the qualification for the board of health.

The enclosed resolution makes minor changes to the resolution passed on October 17, 2022. Specifically, the enclosed resolution provides the Board of City Commissioners with the authority to appoint up to nine members for the board of health. The previous resolution set the maximum at seven members. With a minimum of five members (set by FMC 13-0204) and a maximum of nine, depending on the amount of qualified applicants, the Board of City Commissioners will have the discretion to appoint anywhere from five to nine members to the board of health.

Suggested Motion: I move to receive, approve and file the resolution determining the qualifications for members of the board of health.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF FARGO:

WHEREAS, the electorate of the City of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Article 3(G) of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Fargo, North Dakota grants the City of Fargo power to provide for the adoption, amendment, and repeal of ordinances and resolutions, and regulations to carry out its governmental and proprietary powers and to provide for public health, safety, morals, and welfare, and penalties for a violation thereof; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 23-25 and previously applicable sections of the North Dakota Century Code provide that the City may establish and appoint a board of health.

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners, Fargo, North Dakota, pursuant to authority granted to it under Home Rule and North Dakota Century Code, has established a board of health.

WHEREAS, Section 13-0204 of the Fargo Municipal Code provides that the board of health shall have a minimum of five members, which shall be appointed for three (3) year terms. One member of the board of health shall be a current member of the board of city commissioners. Other members of the board of health shall be appointed with such qualifications as shall be determined by the board of city commissioners.

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2022, the Board of City Commissioners, Fargo, North Dakota, passed a Resolution to set forth the qualifications for the members of the board of health. The October 17, 2022, Resolution is attached as Exhibit 1.

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners, Fargo, North Dakota, has determined it desires to revise the qualifications for the members of the board of health previously set forth in the October 17, 2022, Resolution.

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners, Fargo, North Dakota, now repeals the October 17, 2022, Resolution which is attached as Exhibit 1 and wholly replaces it with this resolution which sets out the specific qualifications for members of the board of health.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONER,

1. The board of health shall consist of a minimum of five and a maximum of nine members, to be determined by the Board of City Commissioners based on the availability of qualified applicants.
2. One of these members shall be a current member of the board of city commissioners, Fargo.
3. One of these members shall be a current member of the board of the West Fargo City Commissioners.
4. One of these members shall be a current member of the Cass County Commissioners.
5. Two to six at-large members comprised of at least one healthcare provider, at least one with behavioral health experience, and those with extensive background in public health, environmental health, health education, or the healthcare industry.
6. All these members shall be appointed and approved by the board of city commissioners, Fargo.

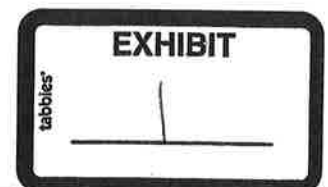

AMENDMENT TO
THE FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS AND ORDER

This **AMENDMENT** amends the **FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS AND ORDER** for the property located at 812 7th Street North, Fargo, North Dakota, 58102 (hereinafter “Subject Property”), issued on October 31, 2022 by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo (hereinafter “Board”).

WHEREAS, on October 31, 2022, a hearing was held before the Board regarding Subject Property, and at said hearing the Board declared Subject Property to be a “dangerous building”; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2022, Subject Property was sold to Brian Trauman (hereinafter “Property Owner”) by way of County Deed, which was recorded with the Cass County Recorder’s Office on November 22, 2022 as Document No. 1680253; and

WHEREAS, since ownership of the property had transferred after the Board issued its Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and before the expiration of the deadline time to appeal, the Board approved extending the original demolition deadline of December 30, 2022 to June 28, 2023 so that the new Property Owner may either make necessary repairs or demolish Subject Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, conditions, and agreements contained herein, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. That on October 31, 2022, the Board found that the building located on Subject Property (812 7th Street North, Fargo, North Dakota 58102) was a “dangerous building” and ordered its demolition on or before December 30, 2022.

2. Property Owner, Brian Trauman, has acknowledged this finding and waives any right to appeal.

3. Property Owner had requested an extension of time to either make necessary repairs to Subject Property so that it is code compliant and no longer considered a “dangerous building” by the opinion of the Building Official or demolish Subject Property by June 28, 2023.

4. The Board considered and approved this request on November 28, 2022.

5. All other Findings of Fact and Conclusions and Order previously entered on October 31, 2022 shall remain in full force and effect.

CITY OF FARGO RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFFICERS TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND WITHDRAWALS

WHEREAS, The City of Fargo, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of North Dakota, must designate depositories of the funds of the City of Fargo,

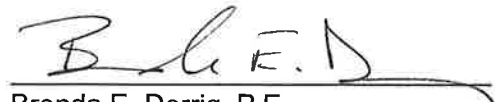

Multiple alignment options were evaluated to determine which one is the most cost effective while also minimizing construction impacts.

From this effort, it was determined that installing a force main from 44th Avenue South along the east side of Southeast Cass Water Resource District's (SE Cass) Drain 27 right of way down to City property and then over to 45th Street South would be the best alternative (alignment attached). Staff has worked with SE Cass on this alignment and they have recently granted the City an easement to allow for the installation of this force main on their property.

ACCESS EASEMENT
(Storm Sewer, Sanitary Sewer, and Water Main)

THIS EASEMENT is made this ____ day of _____, 2022, by the Southeast Cass Water Resource District, a North Dakota political subdivision, with a post office address of 1201 Main Avenue West, West Fargo, North Dakota 58078-1301 (the “District”); and the City of Fargo, a North Dakota municipal corporation, with a post office address of 225 - 4th Street North, Fargo, North Dakota 58102 (the “City”).

RECITALS

A. The District owns, operates, and maintains Cass County Drain No. 27 (“Drain 27”), a legal assessment drain; portions of Drain 27 are located within the City’s municipal boundaries.

B. The City wishes to construct, operate, and maintain storm sewer outfalls that will discharge into Drain 27, as well as a sanitary sewer force main and a water main upon, over, in, under, across, and through Drain 27, along with associated appurtenances (collectively, the “City Infrastructure”), all on property owned or controlled by the District.

C. The District has agreed to convey an easement to the City for purposes of the construction, operation, and maintenance of the City Infrastructure, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Easement.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained in this Easement, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which the parties acknowledge, the parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. **The City Infrastructure Property**. The District grants and conveys to the City a non-exclusive, permanent easement, including the easement rights described in this Easement, upon, over, across, and through the following real property in Cass County, North Dakota:

See survey and legal description attached as **Exhibit A**.

The property described above is the “City Infrastructure Property.” The District does not warrant

fee simple ownership of the City Infrastructure Property and only conveys those rights to the City permitted under North Dakota law that are consistent with the District's rights in the City Infrastructure Property.

2. **Easement Rights.** Under this Easement, the District grants to the City and the City's officers, employees, agents, representatives, consultants, and contractors a permanent and perpetual easement upon, over, in, under, across, and through the City Infrastructure Property for the following purposes: installing, constructing, inspecting, maintaining, reconstructing, altering, repairing, replacing, operating, improving, modifying, and removing the City Infrastructure; excavating, piling, storing, depositing, spoiling, spreading, and removing excavated dirt, soil, clay, silt, or other materials; moving, storing, and removing equipment, materials, and supplies; removing trees, underbrush, obstructions, and any other vegetation, structures, or obstacles from the City Infrastructure Property; and the right to perform any other work necessary and incident to the installation, construction, inspection, maintenance, reconstruction, alteration, repair, replacement, operation, improvement, modification, and removal of the City Infrastructure, together with all necessary and reasonable rights of ingress and egress to and from the City Infrastructure Property. The City is solely responsible for the installation, construction, inspection, maintenance, reconstruction, alteration, repair, replacement, operation, improvement, modification, and removal of the City Infrastructure at the City's sole cost.

3. **Drainage Priority and Use.** The parties understand and agree that Drain 27 is a public facility that provides drainage benefits and other important public benefits to Cass County and its residents, including the City and residents of the City, and further agree the District's use of Drain 27, including the City Infrastructure Property, as a drainage facility takes priority over any other use of the City Infrastructure Property, including the City's use of the City Infrastructure Property for the City Infrastructure.

4. **No Unreasonable Interference.** The District will not unreasonably interfere with the City's easement rights under this Easement. However, the District's priority use of Drain 27 for drainage, flood protection, or other emergency purposes may require and include temporary disruptions or interference with the City's interest in the City Infrastructure Property. The District will use reasonable care to avoid any damages to the City Infrastructure, associated appurtenances, and other storm sewer infrastructure; however, the District will not be liable or responsible for any damages resulting from any construction, cleaning, inspection, reconstruction, modification, operation, maintenance, repair, or improvement of Drain 27 by the District, its officers, agents, representatives, employees, consultants, or contractors. In the event any reconstruction, modification, or improvement of Drain 27 requires any modifications to the City Infrastructure, associated appurtenances, or other storm sewer infrastructure, the City will modify or relocate the City Infrastructure at the City's expense and, if necessary, the parties will amend this Easement for purposes of redefining the "City Infrastructure Property."

5. **Improvements and Repairs to the City Infrastructure Property.** Any improvements or repairs to the City Infrastructure Property are subject to the following:

a. Prior to the City's construction, reconstruction, or other improvements of the City's City Infrastructure, the City must provide plans and specifications to the District, and the District must first give prior written consent to the design of any construction or improvements; the District will not unreasonably withhold consent.

b. The City will operate and maintain the City Infrastructure and related appurtenances at the City's sole cost.

c. The City will obtain the District's prior written consent prior to commencing any structural repairs, modifications, or improvements to the City Infrastructure on or adjacent to the City Infrastructure Property that require excavation; the District will not unreasonably withhold consent.

d. The City will design and construct any and all improvements and required maintenance on the City Infrastructure in a manner that ensures adequate drainage of the City Infrastructure Property, with a finished grade that drains the City Infrastructure Property, and that does not result in ponding in or on Drain 27.

e. With the exception of the City Infrastructure and related appurtenances, the City will not construct any improvements in, upon, under, over, or across any portion of the City Infrastructure Property; the City will not place any fixtures, equipment, or other personal property on any portion of the City Infrastructure Property; the City will not construct or install, or allow construction or installation of, any utility facilities, lines, structures, or associated appurtenances on, over, in, under, through, or across the City Infrastructure Property; the City will not encumber any portion of the City Infrastructure Property; and the City will not otherwise alter any portion of the City Infrastructure Property without prior consent from the District; the District will not unreasonably withhold consent.

f. The City will repair the City Infrastructure Property and will repair or replace any of the District's structures, facilities, right of way, or any other property owned by the District damaged as a result of the City's construction, operation, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, replacement, reconstruction, and removal of the City Infrastructure or otherwise damaged as a result of the City's use, access, ingress, and egress granted under this Easement; the City will otherwise repair and return the City Infrastructure Property as nearly as practicable to its original condition following any disturbance or damages, at the City's sole cost.

g. The City will promptly cease any activity and remove any structure or obstruction that interferes with Drain 27 or the District's use of the City Infrastructure Property, at the City's sole cost.

6. **Term.** The rights granted under this Easement are permanent and will only terminate if necessary to protect the integrity of Drain 27; as necessary to comply with any laws, rules, regulations, requirements, or directives of any applicable federal or state agency with regulatory jurisdiction over Drain 27; or in the event of any default by the City not remedied within a reasonable time. In the event of any termination, the District will record an Affidavit of Termination with the Cass County Recorder's Office, and the City will remove any improvements from Drain 27, at the City's sole cost.

7. **Liability.** The City will be solely responsible for all claims, actions, administrative proceedings, judgments, damages, penalties, fines, costs, liabilities, interests, or losses, including costs, expenses, and attorneys' fees, arising out of or as a result of the construction, inspection, maintenance, operation, alteration, repair, replacement, reconstruction, removal, or use of the City Infrastructure by the City or the City's officers, consultants, contractors, agents, representatives, employees, or other invitees; any entry upon, use of, or access, ingress, and egress upon, over, or across the City Infrastructure Property by the City or the City's officers, consultants, contractors, agents, representatives, employees, or other invitees; or any act, error, or omission of the City or the City's officers, consultants, contractors, agents, representatives, employees, or other invitees, including any failure to perform under this Easement.

8. **Compliance with Laws.** The City, at its own cost, is solely responsible for promptly complying with all present and future laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, and obtaining all necessary licenses, permits, registrations, and/or approvals, from all applicable federal, state, county, and municipal governments and any other applicable governmental entities or political subdivisions, and their appropriate departments, commissions, boards, and officers, regarding the City Infrastructure or the City's other permissible use, access, ingress, and egress rights upon, over, or across any of the City Infrastructure Property.

9. **Forbearance.** The failure or delay of either party to insist on the timely performance of any of the terms of this Easement, or the waiver of any particular breach of any of the terms of this Easement, at any time, will not be construed as a continuing waiver of those terms or any subsequent breach, and all terms will continue and remain in full force and effect as if no forbearance or waiver had occurred.

10. **Governing Law.** This Easement will be construed and enforced in accordance with North Dakota law.

11. **Interpretation.** This Easement will be construed as if prepared by both parties.

12. **Severability.** If any court of competent jurisdiction finds any provision or part of this Easement is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, that portion will be deemed severed from this Easement, and all remaining terms and provisions of this Easement will remain binding and enforceable; the parties will reconvene negotiations to arrive, in good faith, at an agreement as to matters remaining undetermined as a result of any finding by a court of competent jurisdiction that any provision or part of this Easement is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable.

13. **Entire Agreement.** This Easement, together with any amendments, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties regarding the matters described in this Easement, and this Easement supersedes all other previous oral or written agreements between the parties.

14. **Assignment.** Neither party may transfer or assign this Easement, or any rights or obligations under this Easement, without the express written consent of the other party.

15. **Binding Effect.** The covenants, terms, conditions, provisions, and undertakings in this Easement, or in any amendment, will be binding upon the parties' heirs, successors, and permitted assigns.

16. **Modifications.** Any modifications or amendments of this Easement must be in writing and signed by the District and the City and must be recorded in the Cass County Recorder's Office.

17. **Headings.** Headings in this Easement are for convenience only and will not be used to interpret or construe its provisions.

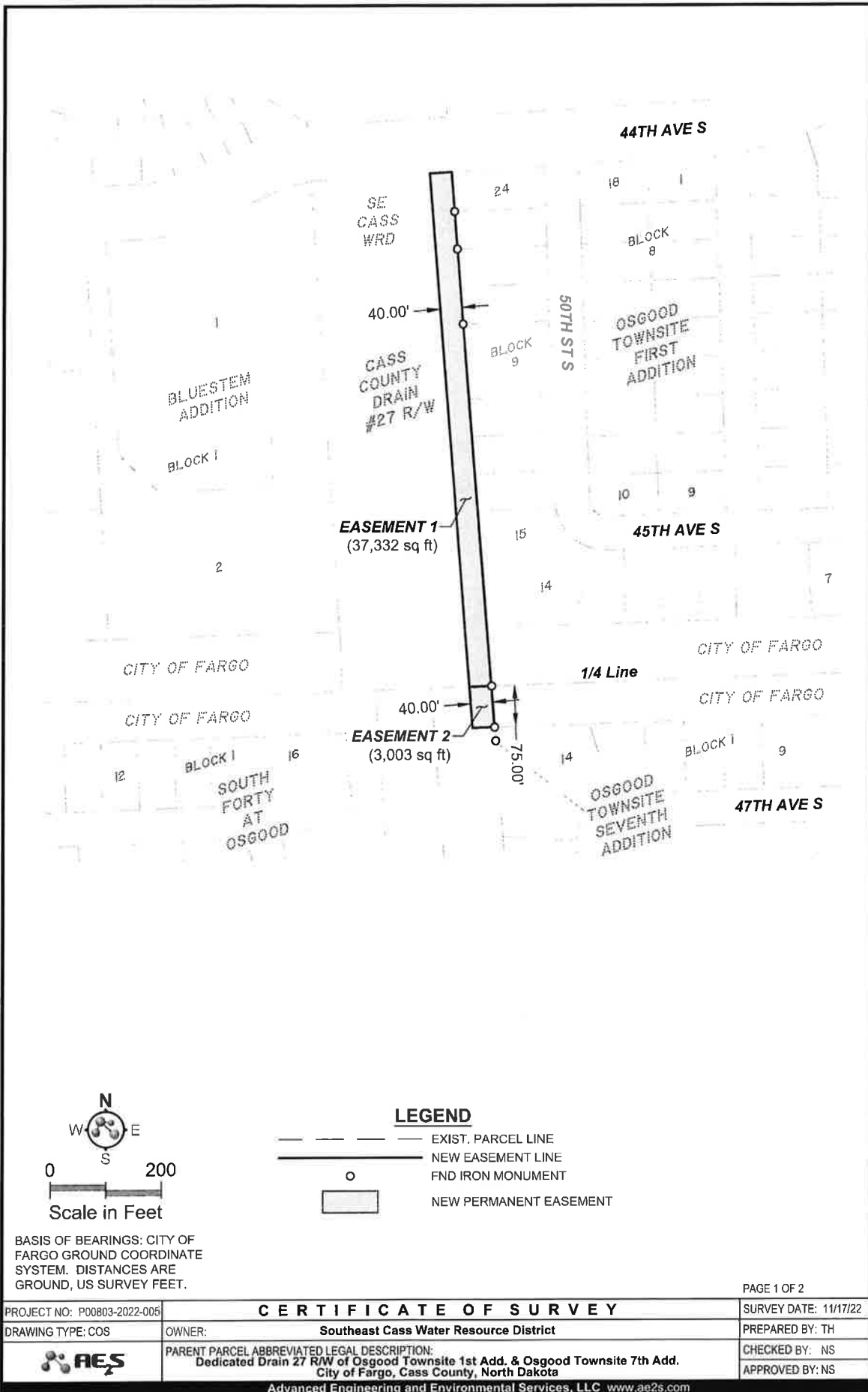

Dear City Commission:

The Engineering Department's current Master Service Agreements (MSA) with professional consultants are set to expire in February 2023. This MSA is utilized when Engineering needs assistance from professional consultants to aid in the development of capital improvement projects. This assistance is typically needed because we have either fully obligated our internal resources or we are in need of specialized technical assistance that our staff does not have. Engineering will continue to utilize the standard Request for Proposals process for projects when we have sufficient time (typically a minimum of 8 weeks) in the project development schedule. However, there are times when project scopes are smaller or time sensitive, and we have found that a MSA with a pool of qualified professional consultants allows us to be more responsive.

In addition to the MSA with professional consultants, Engineering also has existing MSAs with materials testing firms to complete testing of construction materials to confirm the City's Standard Specifications are met during construction. These MSAs are necessary since Engineering does not have the capability to complete all aspects of material testing and therefore require assistance for this testing of construction materials.

To meet our ongoing need, we advertised and received proposals from professional engineering, land surveying, land management, and materials testing consultants at the direction of the Public Works Project Evaluation Committee.

From the proposals we received, we are looking to build a pool of qualified professional consultants in each engineering category and enter into a three year Master Services Agreement with each consultant with the ability to extend the MSAs twice, each for an additional year. The pool is determined by the consultant's qualifications in each category. We considered the following three items in the selection of the pool:

1. Specialized experience or technical expertise of the organization and its personnel in connection with the categories they wish to be selected for.
2. Capacity of the organization to perform the work within time limitations, taking into consideration the current planned workload of the firm.
3. Past record of performance on contracts, including quality of work, timeliness, and cost control.

The following are examples of projects that we expect to use the consultants for:

Engineering:

1. Civil Engineering (New Development) – Planning and design of utilities and paving for new development. Planning of utilities for an entire development that will be designed and constructed in phases.
2. Civil Engineering (Replacement & Reconstruction) – Typically City staff led, but may use consultant for assistance with specialized technical tasks.
3. Civil Engineering (Water Resources) – Storm water master plan, InfoSWMM modeling, funding applications, and lift station design.
4. Civil Engineering (Structural Design) – Lift station and/or gate well design.
5. Transportation Engineering – Intersection control evaluation studies, peer design reviews, traffic impact studies, funding applications, traffic data collection, traffic signal design, and street light design.

6. Geotechnical Engineering – Soil investigation analysis for lift stations, pond locations, and design support.
7. Construction Engineering and Staking – Project Management, including onsite construction inspection and surveying.
8. Electrical Engineering – Lift station control systems.

Land Surveying:

1. Topographic Surveys – Preliminary surveys for new development or reconstruction projects.
2. Legal Descriptions – Prepare legal descriptions for acquisitions.
3. Plat Preparation – Prepare plat including the associated field work necessary to prepare the plat.

Land Management Services

1. Appraisals – Complete appraisals for full and partial property acquisitions and permanent and temporary easements. The appraiser must be certified in North Dakota (Certified – General) and must provide a demonstrated ability to provide appraisal services in full compliance with the Uniform Relocation and Real Properties Acquisitions Policies Act (aka The Uniform Act) and applicable North Dakota statutes.
2. Relocation Assistance – Serve the role as the relocation counselor on behalf of the City to manage relocation assistance of individual property acquisitions that qualify for relocation assistance under the Uniform Act. All relocation assistance shall follow the statutory requirements within the State of North Dakota.

Materials Testing

1. Construction – Completes testing of construction materials to confirm the City's Standard Specifications are being met.
2. Asbestos Testing – Collect, analyze, and provide written reports regarding the potential presence of regulated asbestos containing materials in structures slated for demolition.

When the necessity for a consultant arises, we will send out a scoping document to the appropriate consultants requesting a not-to-exceed quote and availability status. Staff will review the quotes and based on cost and availability will recommend a consultant for award.

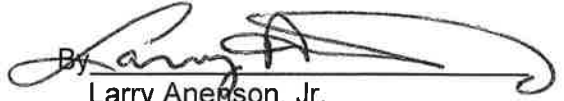

On December 12th, 2022, a demolition proposal for the buildings at the address of 924 5th St S, Fargo, ND 58103 of \$68,275.75 submitted by Pioneer LLC was accepted at the City of Fargo City Commission meeting.

SUGGESTED MOTION:

Accept and confirm the contract for demolition as drafted by the City Attorney and the Building Inspections Department.

AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY DEMOLITION

This AGREEMENT FOR PROPERTY DEMOLITION (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into between the **CITY OF FARGO**, a North Dakota municipal corporation, whose address is 225 4th Street North, Fargo, North Dakota, 58102 (hereinafter "City"), and **PIONEER LLC**, a North Dakota Limited Liability Company, whose address is 4041 36th Avenue South, Fargo, North Dakota 58104 (hereinafter "Contractor").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, covenants, conditions, and agreements contained herein, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. Contractor is hereby awarded the Contract to demolish **924 5th Street South, Fargo, North Dakota, 58103** ("Demolition Property"), in accordance with the attached Request for Proposals ("RFP") Specifications, attached hereto as Exhibit A. Contractor agrees to undertake and execute all work in a good, substantial and workmanlike manner, and to furnish all the materials, tools and labor necessary to properly perform and complete the work ready for use, in strict accordance with the RFP Specifications, Addendum No. 1 (attached hereto as Exhibit B), and Pioneer LLC Proposal Form (attached hereto as Exhibit C). In addition, Contractor must provide a Certificate of Insurance and Contract Bond or similar documents acceptable to the City; all of which are incorporated by reference and made part of this Agreement.

2. Contractor must abide by all applicable laws. Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City from and against any and all liability, damages, penalties, judgments, or claims of whatever nature arising from injury to person(s) or property upon the Demolition Property, including any person or property in or upon Demolition Property caused by the negligence of the Contractor or their servants or employees in carrying out or attempting to carry out this Agreement, and from claims made by laborers or others for injury sustained by reason of the negligence of the Contractor, their servants or employees, in the performance or attempted performance of this Agreement. Contractor further shall indemnify the City from damages sustained by depositing materials to public injury or to the injury of any person or corporation, or resulting from the use of any patented material, implement or process which may be employed in executing the work under this Agreement, including costs and expense of defense. Contractor shall be notified of the bringing of suit in such cases, and be permitted to defend the same, and City may withhold final payment of

this Agreement for the indemnity of the City. All property kept, maintained, or stored on Demolition Property shall be so kept, maintained and stored at the sole risk of Contractor.

3. Contractor shall commence work under this Agreement within thirty (30) days or at such other time as agreed after being instructed to do so in a written notice from the City. Contractor's failure to commence work as directed may be deemed a breach of contract, and the Contractor and surety shall be liable for the full amount of the Agreement. If, at any time during the prosecution of the work, in the opinion of the Inspections Building Official, Contractor is not employing the necessary resources to timely complete the Agreement, or performing in an unworkmanlike manner, City shall give Contractor and their surety five (5) days written notice to comply. Failure to comply may be deemed a breach of contract, and the Contractor and surety shall be liable on their bond for the full amount of the Agreement price. The notice provided for in this section may be served upon the Contractor by delivering the same to any person in charge of the work, or by leaving the same at the office of the Contractor in Fargo and upon the surety of the Contractor by leaving the same at the office of such surety in Fargo.

4. Neither the abandonment of this Agreement by the Contractor, as herein provided, nor the declaration by the City that the same is forfeited, nor the doing of the said work by the bidder, shall release the surety of the Contractor from liability under this Contract.

5. This Agreement has been made and entered into under the laws of the State of North Dakota, and said laws will control its interpretation. Any litigation arising out of this Agreement will be venued in State District Court in Cass County, North Dakota, and the parties waive any objection to venue or personal jurisdiction.

6. This Agreement constitutes the entire and complete agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior oral or written agreements between the parties. RE: CONTINUATION OF SUPPORT FOR CHURCHES UNITED FOR END OF 2022

In January 2022, the City Commission approved continuing the activity to support the Churches United womens emergency shelter which initiated during the pandemic. An agreement was executed in March 2022 for 2022 operations. We received a request to support increase labor costs for expenses in November and December. The funding is available in the ARP Sheltering allocation which was approved at the April 18, 2022 City Commission meeting, included was a sheltering assistance allocation in the ARP first allocation.

Labor costs for shelter staff has increased 130% above budget. To help cover increased labor costs, staff is recommending an additional \$100,000 for Churches United's operations for November and December 2022. Planning Department is requesting \$100,000 be transferred from ARP Sheltering to Churches United, Account #255-8540-409.38-45, project DS2150.

In additional to critical overflow sheltering, Churches United conducts its own fundraising to run several concurrent programs to prevent and end homelessness.

Recommendation:

Approve executing attached agreement amendment between the City of Fargo and Churches United to increase funding by \$100,000 for 2022.

**AMENDMENT #1 OF SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT
BETWEEN CITY OF FARGO (Grantor) AND
CHURCHES UNITED FOR THE HOMELESS (Subrecipient)**

In reference to the Subrecipient Agreement to undertake certain activities with Covid-19 grant funds, made by and between **City of Fargo** (Grantor) and **Churches United** (Subrecipient) and entered into on January 1, 2022, such agreement is hereby amended to include the following conditions:

Paragraph 1 is amended to state: "...and Churches United for the Homeless (the "Subrecipient"), a North Dakota non-profit organization whose DUNS number is DUNS #36-442-2857.

Paragraph 2 is amended to state: "WHEREAS, the City is willing to make available up to **\$450,000** for the purposes outlined herein, in particular to shelter low income and vulnerable populations, an increase of \$100,000 from the original agreement.

Paragraph 3 is inserted to state: "WHEREAS, the funds are from the City's Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) allocation of \$20,205,034 awarded by the US Treasury as Revenue Loss and Replacement Funds and obligated on March 11, 2021; CDFR #14.218; DUNS #07-026-5871. This award is not made for the purposes of research and development; and"

Part II. Budget & Use of Funds is amended to include the following:

The funds shall be used according to the budget submitted by the Subrecipient. The Subrecipient may revise its City funds up to 10% of the total grant amount per category, excluding administrative fee. Anything more will require approval from City staff, in writing.

Part III(A)(1) Maximum Amount is amended for the total amount to be paid by the City not to exceed \$450,000, an increase of \$100,000 from the original agreement.

Part V(B) Procurement/Purchasing Requirements is amended to state:

The City of Fargo's source of funds is from the federal allocation of Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF). These funds are reported to US Treasury as Revenue Loss and Replacement Funds. Monitoring and Reporting Guidance is referenced as the Uniform Guidance, 2 C.F.R. Part 200, and apply to SLFRF awards other than such provisions as Treasury may determine are inapplicable to the award and subject to such exceptions as may be otherwise provided. The 2022 Compliance Supplement also provided that the requirements of 2 C.F.R. Part 200 are applicable unless stated otherwise. As such, recipients are required to follow Subparts A, B, C, and F of the Uniform Guidance for expenses categorized under Expenditure Category 6 "Revenue Replacement." However, given the purpose and very broad scope of eligible uses of the revenue

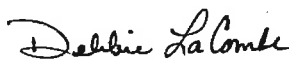

7. Best Practices for Collection and Use of Personally Identifiable Information

CUSTOMER AGREES TO ADDITIONAL MAINTENANCE TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The term of this agreement shall be no less than 60 months from the initial billing cycle date. Billing Cycles will commence on the fifth (5th) or the twentieth (20th) of the month, depending upon installation date. Service Fees will be prorated from the date of installation through the start of the first billing cycle. Contract shall automatically renew, for an additional twelve (12) months, at end of initial term, unless written notice of termination is provided by either the customer or Dealer at least forty-five (45) days prior to expiration of initial term of this agreement. Termination of agreement, prior to end of term, requires at least a forty-five day written notice. Upon termination notice, remaining contract balance is due and payable. This agreement shall not be assignable or transferable by customer without Dealer's v prior written consent. Dealer may terminate this agreement if Equipment is sold or transferred to a third party, and upon either event all remaining payments shall become immediately due and owing. DEALER reserves the right to adjust maintenance pricing, terminate this Agreement and/or assign the service of any equipment which has been relocated more than sixty (60) miles from Dealer's nearest Service Center, Equipment may not be relocated without the prior written approval of Dealer.

2. The pricing of this Agreement is based upon the number of clicks and/or the term of this Agreement. In the event of early termination by the Customer, all remaining charges shall become immediately due and owing. If this Agreement is calculated on a cost-per-click maintenance program, the early termination fee will be calculated according to the average of the actual usage from the beginning date of the Agreement, multiplied by the remaining months of the Agreement.

3. This Agreement does not cover network support beyond the specific equipment and included hardware listed on the front of this Agreement. All network support beyond the initial installation will be chargeable at DEALER's standard time and materials rates, unless covered by a separate network support Agreement.

4. The minimum monthly Maintenance rate, any billable excess clicks, and all applicable taxes on such charges or on services rendered, or parts supplied hereto, shall be due net ten (10) days from the date of the invoice. All Maintenance Agreements are reviewed annually and are subject to adjustment based upon service costs and/or manufacturer's price increases. Customer agrees OEM parts and supplies are not required provided the parts or supplies meet or exceed manufacturer's specifications.

5. All required preventive maintenance and emergency service necessary to keep the Equipment in efficient operating order will be performed by DEALER or its assigned Servicing Dealer during its regular business hours (8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays) at no additional cost to Customer provided that the Equipment is in good working order on the date of commencement of this Agreement.

6. Service calls for operator function (adding or changing supplies, auto gradation/color calibration, removing misfeeds or any other Customer responsibility) will be subject to a time and material service charge at DEALER's then current rate. Additional chargeable services include but are not limited to:

- a) Repairs resulting from causes other than normal use: Customer's willful act; negligence or misuse; Customer's use of supplies or spare parts which do not meet published specifications and which cause abnormally frequent service calls or service problems; accident, failure or variances of electrical power; failure to provide air conditioning, heat or humidity control as required; abuse, theft, fire, water, or any other damage resulting from uncontrollable causes.
- b) Subsequent repairs made when personnel other than those of DEALER or its assigned Servicing Dealer perform service.
- c) Transportation and relocation - repairs resulting from unauthorized relocation of equipment by anyone other than DEALER or its assigned Servicing Dealer. DEALER reserves the right to terminate this Agreement based upon damages to Equipment and to invoice Customer any and all remaining payments applicable to this Agreement.
- d) Work which Customer requests to be performed outside regular business hours.

During the month of November, Neighborhood Services continued to emphasize increased traffic enforcement in key areas around the city. In particular, officers focused on offenses considered. Grant funding from the ND Department of Transportation was used for overtime traffic details, with a focus on seat belt violations. Staffing improved and calls for service decreased during the month, so there was more time for traffic enforcement by officers. This resulted in an increase in citations over the previous month.

The following is a summary of the November activity:

- Total traffic stops in November 2022:** 697 (499 in October 2022; 493 in November 2021; 41% increase from last year)
- Total citations for November 2022:** 589 (495 in October 2022; 496 in November 2021; 19% increase from last year)
- Speeding: 107 (57 in October 2022; 86 in November 2021; 24% increase over last year)
- Exhibition Driving 2
- Careless Driving 1
- Racing 0
- Reckless Driving 2

2022 Year to Date:

- Total Traffic Stops: 6480 (compared to 9734 in 2021; 33% decrease from last year)
- Total Traffic Citations: 6489 (compared to 8949 in 2021; 27% decrease from last year)

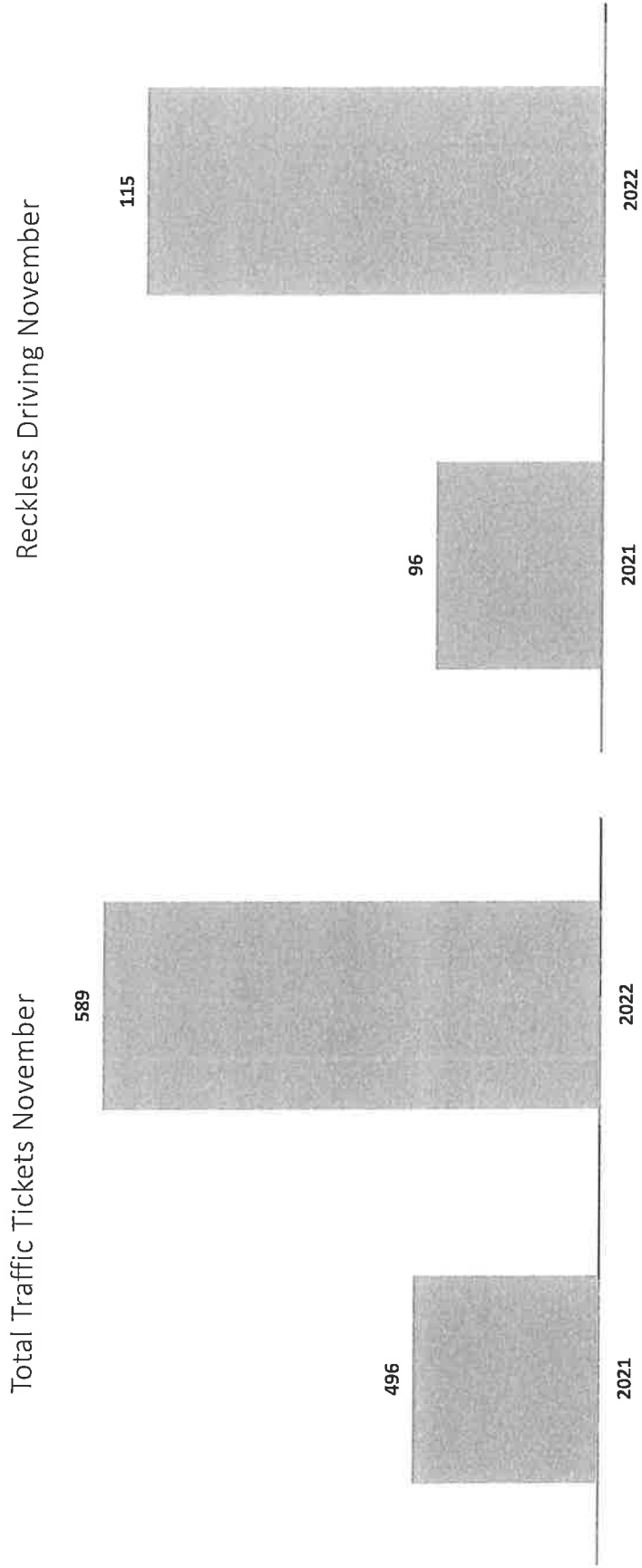

November Traffic Enforcement

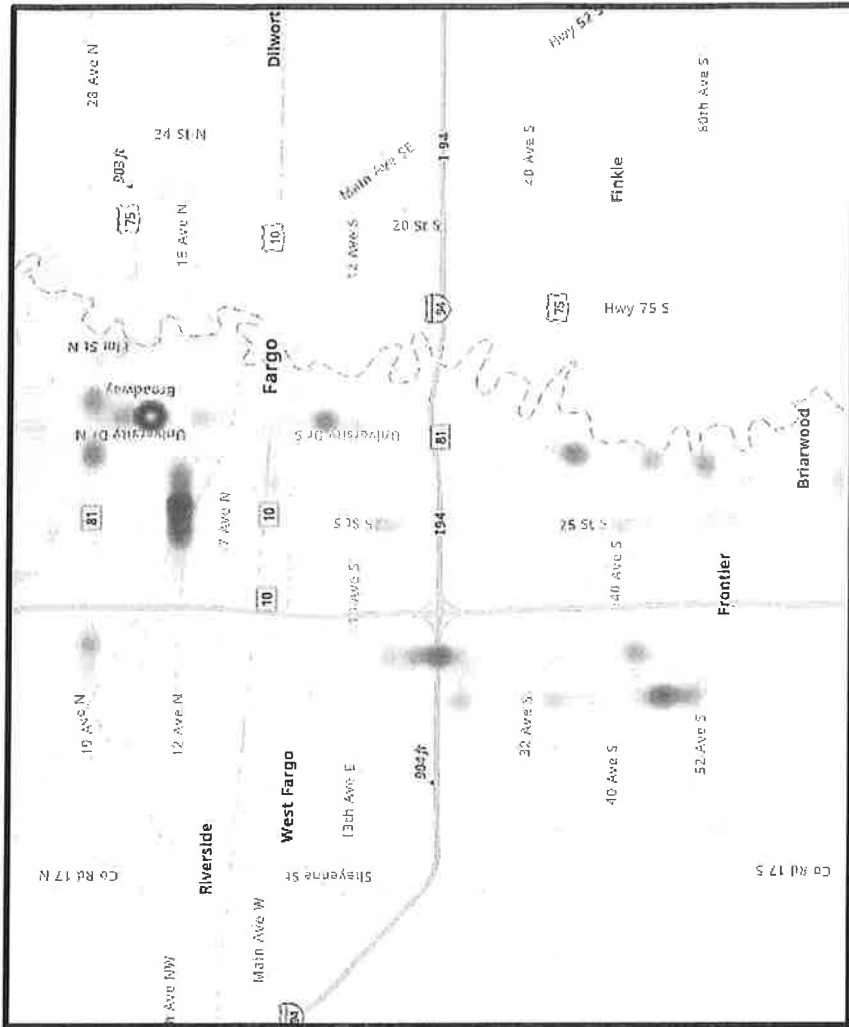
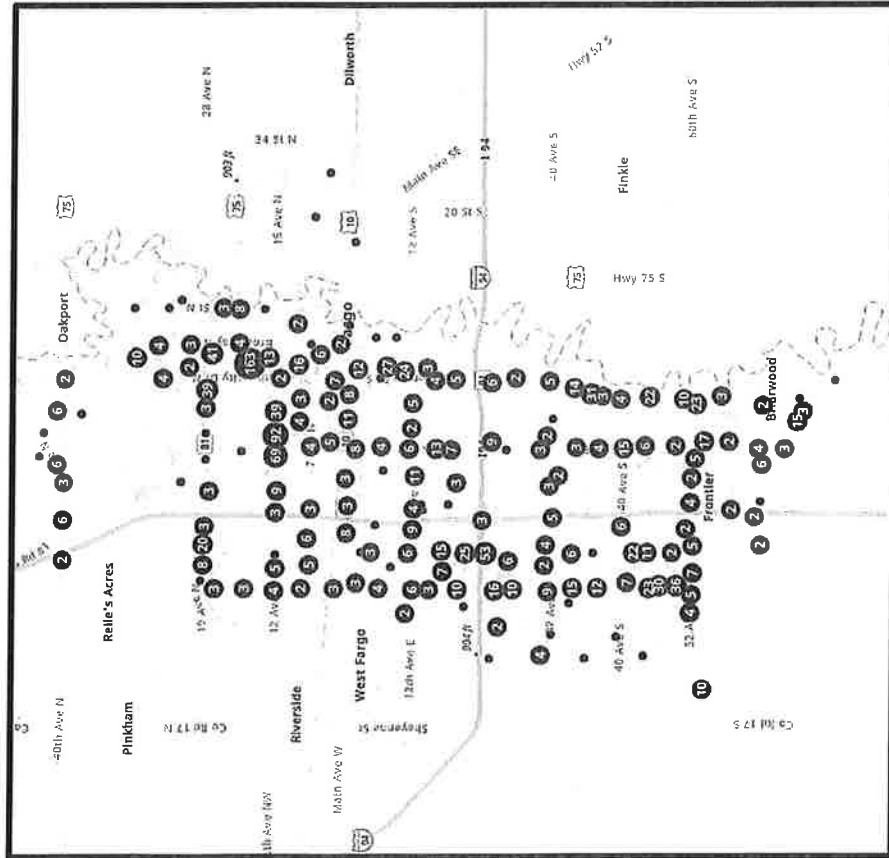


Traffic Tickets November

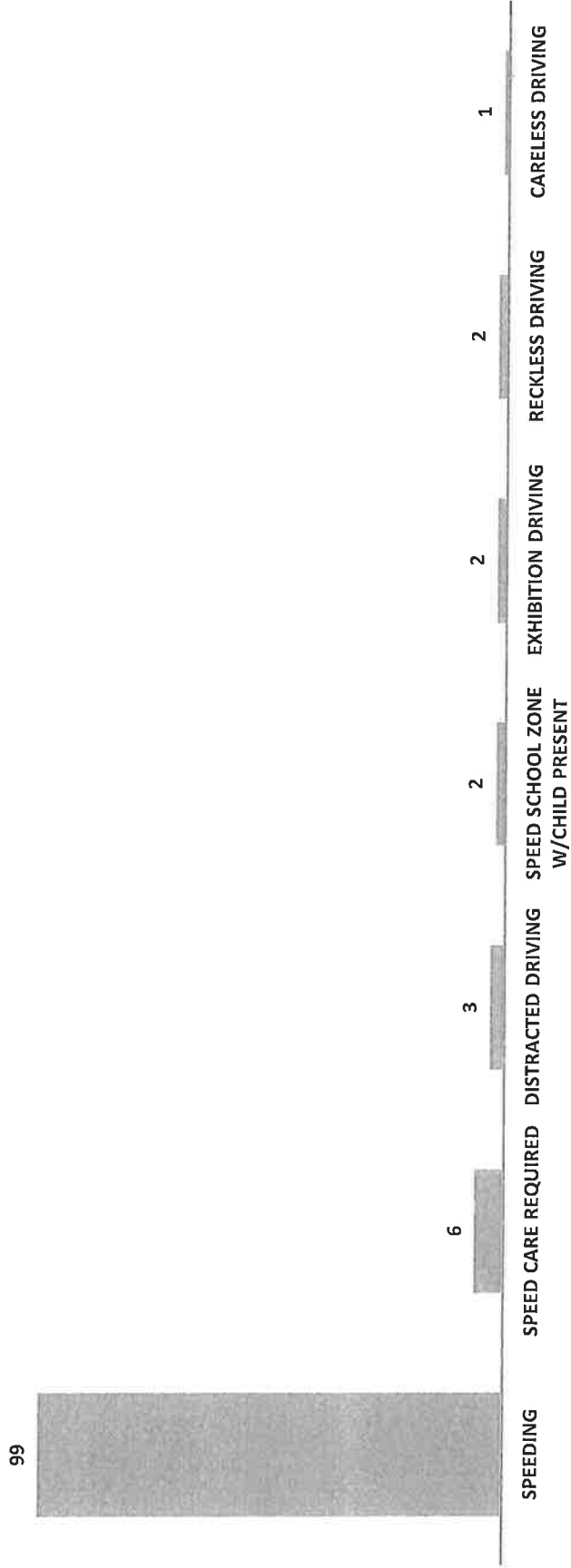

Citation Locations

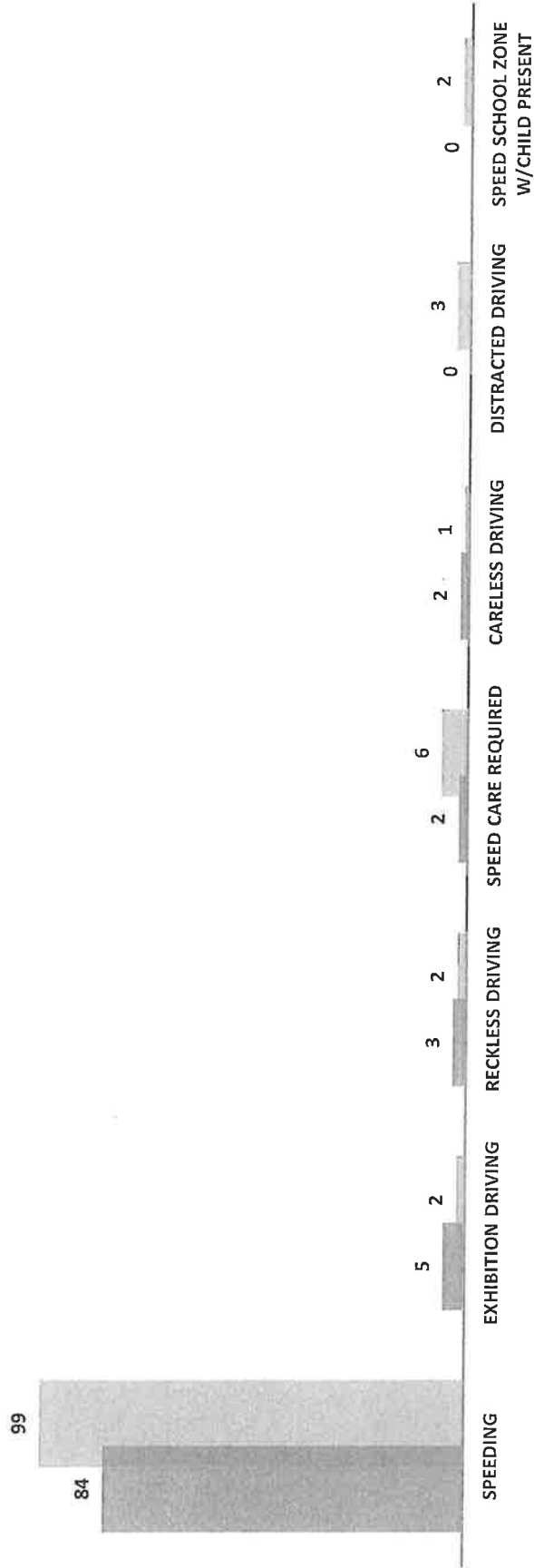


Dangerous Driving Tickets November

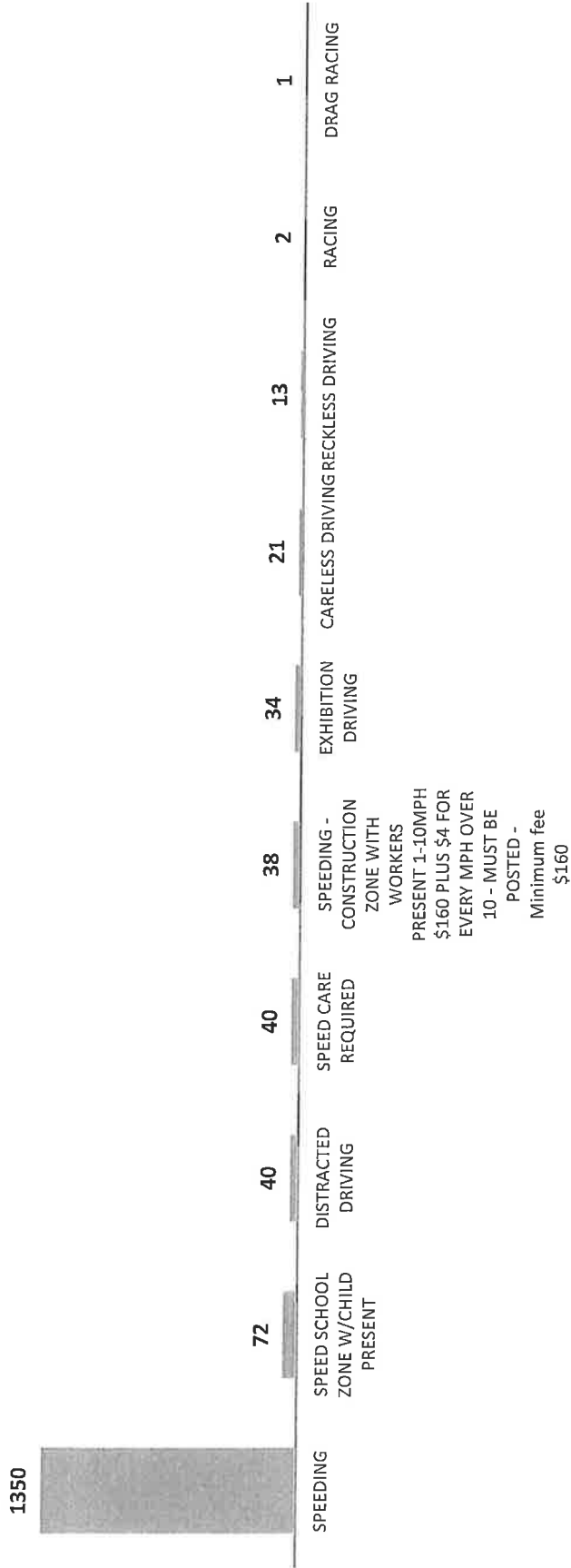

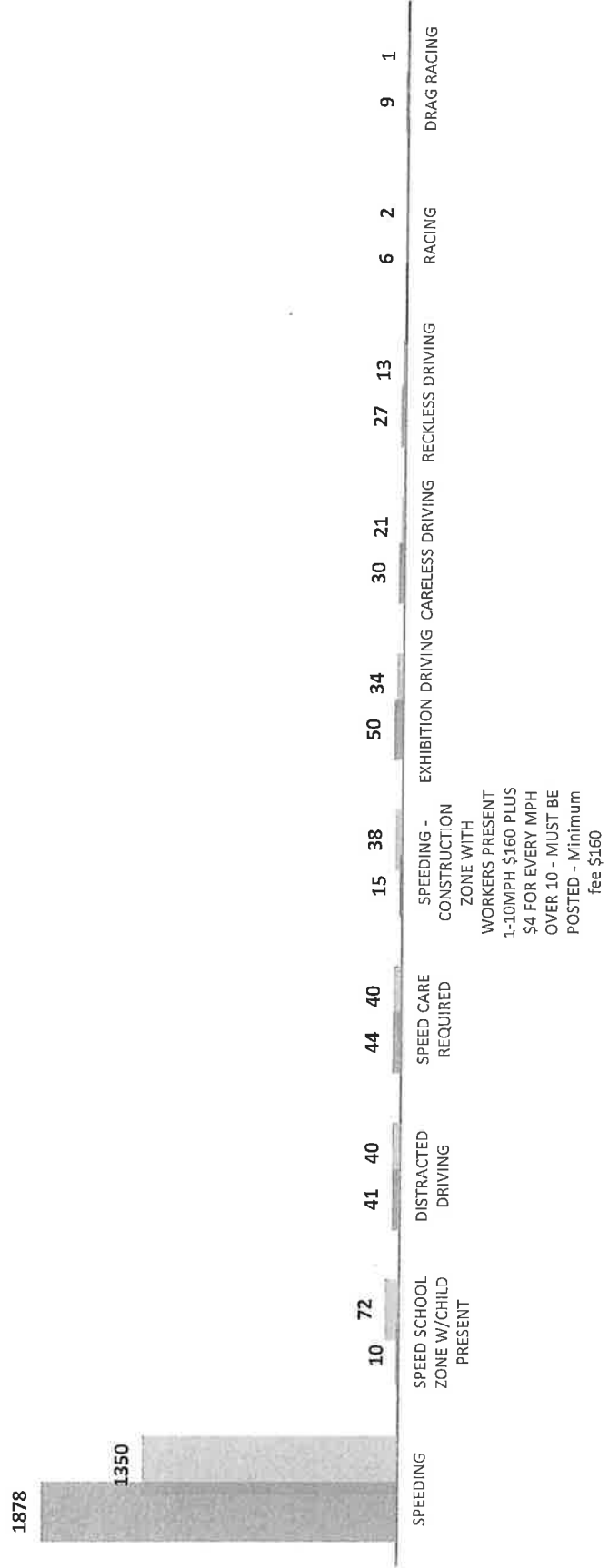
Dangerous Driving YTD

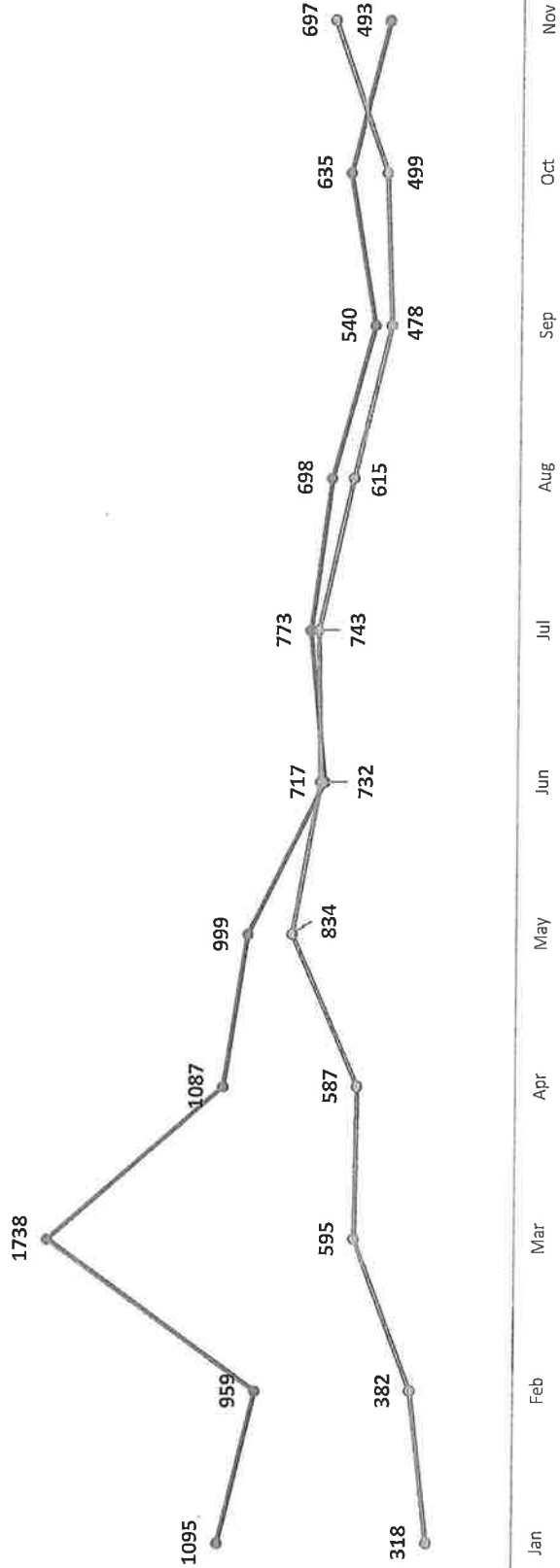
Dangerous Driving Yearly Comparison YTD

Traffic Stop Comparison

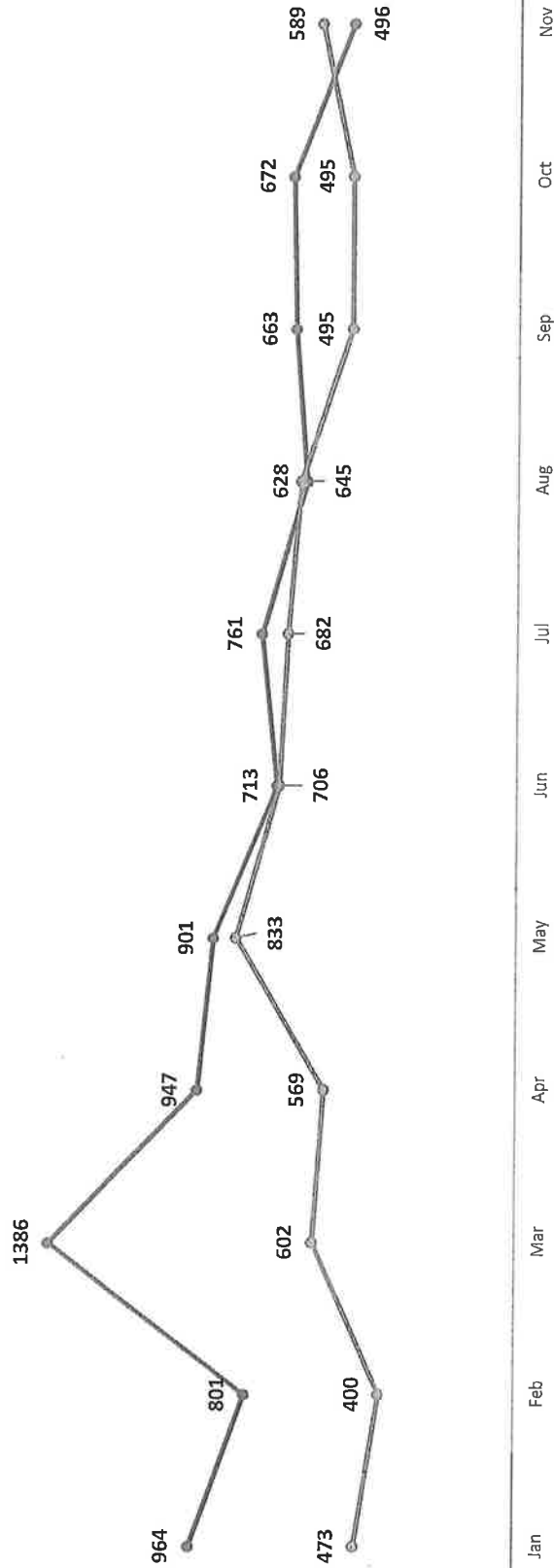
Traffic Stop Comparison

Traffic Citations Comparison

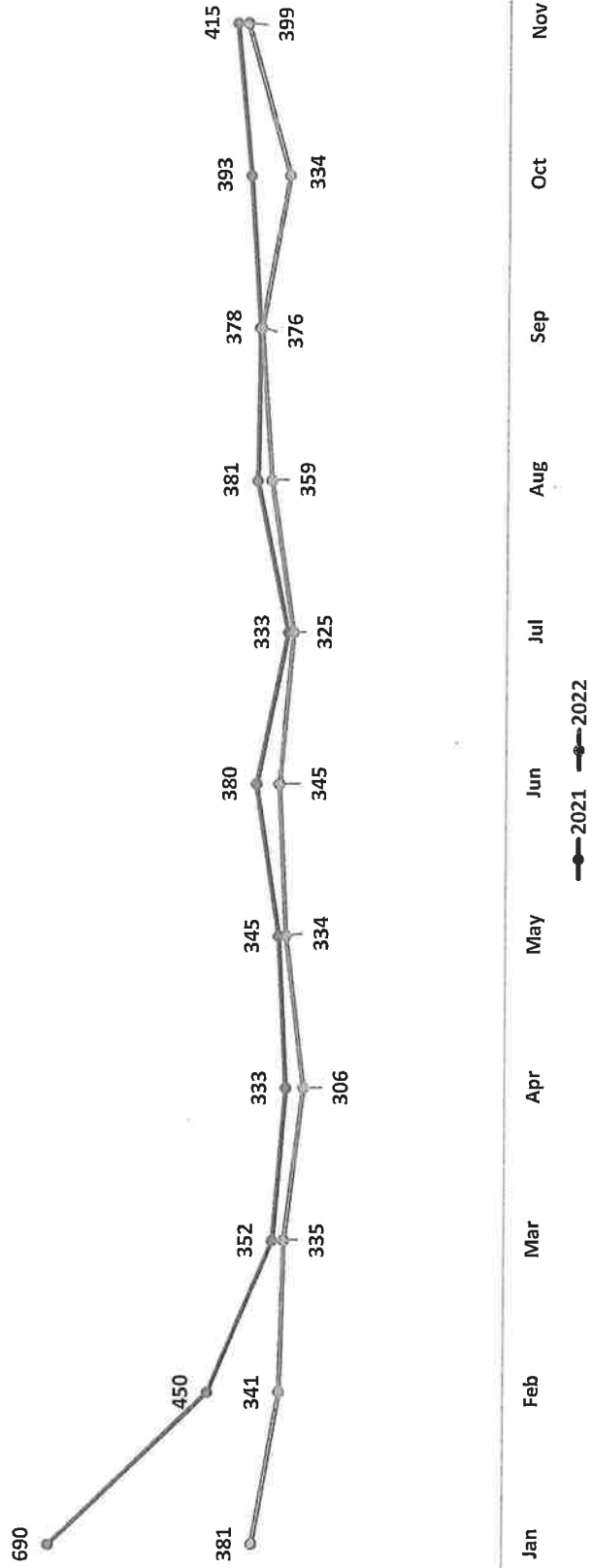
Traffic Citation Comparison

RE: Digital Whiteboard

In the Criminal Investigations Division, we recently moved our “war room” to the Intelligence Analyst Unit (IAU) area to better organize and plan major crime cases. We have been utilizing a large whiteboard for task lists, organizing crime trends and establishing the groundwork after a major incident. The whiteboard has been used extensively, and at time, we have needed to erase and dismantle our older cases in lieu of a newer case.

Sgt. Gnoinsky suggested the purchase of a digital whiteboard and he sent a link. I began looking into this possibility and contacted Gretchen Morlan with the City of Fargo help desk through Information Services. She researched the different possibilities and worked with a vender by the name of Connection Public Service Solutions.

That vender came up a great deal for government programs. The ViewSonic Bundle includes a 75-inch screen with mobile trolley card. This includes a webcam for training sessions and online demos. The system is also a computer, which will allow the unit to connect to the City of Fargo network and allow us to save files and revert to the same image at a later time without losing valuable information. The touchscreen is interactive

The attached quote is for \$3,546.76 and includes a five-year warranty. This system would enhance our IAU area and help work towards the goal of having a real-time crime center.

In addition, CIU members recently needed to attempt to find weapons possibly used in a homicide thought to be discarded

into the river. Investigators and detectives borrowed fishing magnets to help search for the weapons. On Amazon, Brute Magnetics has 1200 pound fishing magnets complete with rope and everything else needed to help Police Department quickly locate metallic items in water or elsewhere when needed. The attached sets are \$56.99 and we would like to order two sets of these for a total of \$133.98.

For these items, the total bill adds up to \$3,660.74. I recommend utilizing existing federal seized assets. Annually, we budget to use \$5,000 of federal seized assets, but there have been zero purchases since 2018 utilizing this resource. There is currently \$20,131 in the federal asset spending account.

Please consider these purchases to enhance investigation and organization of CID.

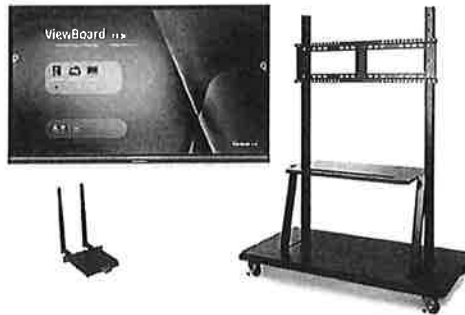

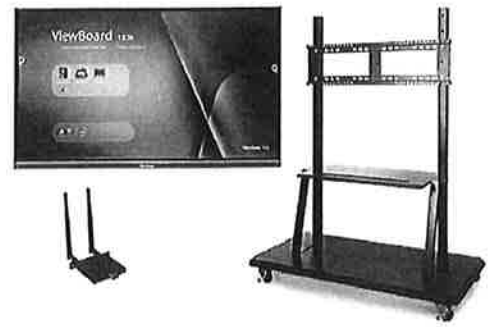

Construction bids were opened at 11:45am, local time, on Wednesday November 30, 2022 for Project WA2158, Fargo Regional Emergency Water Supply LS and Pipeline (See Bid tabulation). A total of five (5) bids were opened from contractors: four (4) for General construction and one (1) for Electrical Construction. The Engineer's letter recommending award is attached and Water Utility Staff suggests following the Engineer's letter.

This project is funded through a low-interest State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan. CC steel was the low bid at \$9,065,000 for the general construction and Johns Refrigeration & Electric Inc. was the low bid at \$365,950 for the electrical construction. The Engineer's estimate was \$10,000,000 and the bids came in below the estimated construction cost.

There are three major components in this project:

1. Installation of 3 high capacity pumps to transfer water from the Sheyenne River into Drain 27 that flows into the Red River.
2. The pump station has 3 expandable pump slots as the City of Fargo grows.
3. Replacing a small section of the Sheyenne pipeline with a history of breaks.

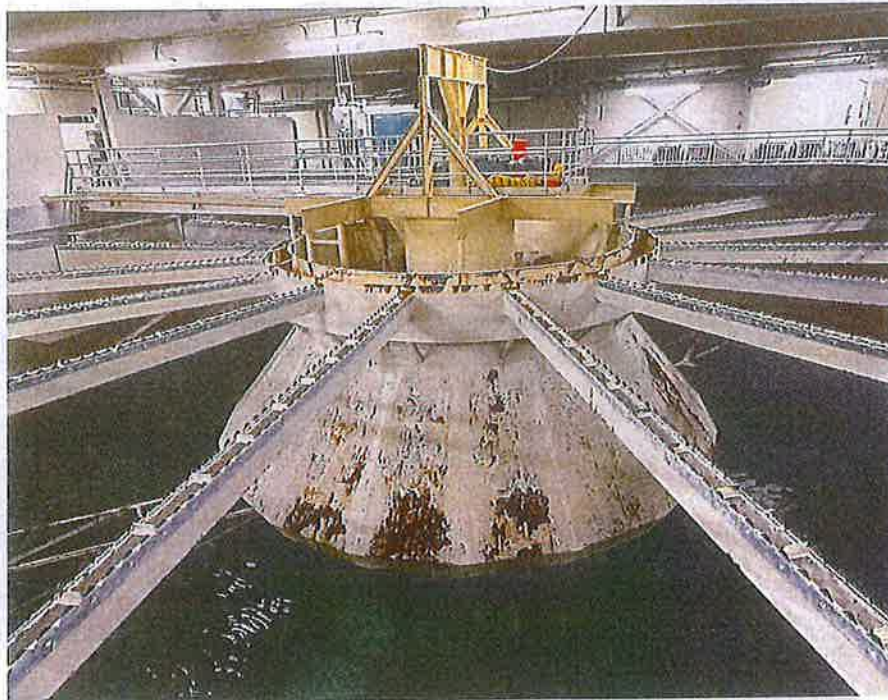

The Project entails rehabilitation of the primary softening basins in the Fargo LSWTP. This Scope of Services provides for the Construction phase services to support the replacement of the basin launders and rake arm and tower with stainless steel equipment; remanufacturing of the basin drives; modification to the basin turbines to allow access; and stripping, repairing, and painting of existing steel components. The following is a detailed breakdown of this Scope of Services to Water Consulting Task Order No. 22.

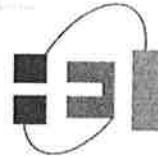
