AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ARTICLE 13-16 OF CHAPTER 13 OF THE FARGO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ANIMAL BOARDING FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to implement such authority by the adoption of this ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Enactment.

Article 13-16 of the Fargo Municipal Code is hereby enacted as follows:

ARTICLE 13-16 – BOARDING FACILITIES

Section 13-1601. Definitions.

As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following definitions apply:

"Boarding Facility" means any establishment, excluding private residences, operating for profit, where animals are kept, congregated, and/or housed, for a specific period, with the sole purpose of providing shelter and care of animals in return for a fee. A "Boarding Facility" does not include the temporary use of kennels by veterinarians, grooming establishments, or municipal pounds.

- 2. "Boarding Operator" or "Operator of a Boarding Facility" means any individual, firm, corporation, partnership, other business unit, society, association or other legal entity, or public or private institution which maintains, owns, or operates a boarding facility.
- 3. "Public Health Department" means Fargo Cass Public Health or any representative thereof.

Section 13-1602. Operation of a Boarding Facility—license required.

It shall be unlawful to operate a boarding facility without a license issued by the public health department.

Section 13-1603. Application; fee.

A boarding operator shall submit an application for a license to the public health department on a form provided by the public health department along with payment of a required license fee. License fees and fees for renewal thereof shall be established by resolution of the board of city commissioners. The application must include the name and complete mailing address and street address of the boarding facility along with any other information reasonably required by the public health department for the administration of this section.

Section 13-1604. License to operate boarding facility issued annually.

The license hereof shall be issued annually, January 1, by the public health department after a passed inspection. All licenses under the provisions of this article, unless otherwise specifically provided, shall terminate on December 31 following the date of issuance. License renewal notices will be mailed by the city auditor's office effective January 1 of each year and shall expire on December 31 of said year.

Section 13-1605. Regulation, inspection and enforcement.

The public health department is authorized to promulgate regulations creating minimum standards for boarding facilities, which regulations may be enforced by the public health department. In order to provide for the public health and safety, the public health department shall have authority to regulate and enforce the provisions stated herein concerning the use, operation, and maintenance of boarding facilities within the jurisdiction

of such department. The public health department shall have the authority to enter upon the premises of the boarding facility and inspect the facility as often as necessary to confirm compliance with the provisions of this article. In the event of a failure to comply with the provisions of this article, after due notice thereof, the public health department shall have the power to abate or cause a suspension of the use of the boarding facility license until such time as the same is, in the opinion of the public health department, no longer a hazard to public health or safety.

Section 13-1606. Display of license—license nontransferable.

A license issued pursuant to this article shall be displayed in a conspicuous location in the boarding facility for which the license is issued. A license issued pursuant to this article is non-transferable.

Section 13-1607. Appeals.

Any person aggrieved by a decision of the health department or one of its officials including without limitation an order or denial of an order or by the denial of a license, may appeal such decision by filing a notice of appeal with the director of public health. Appeals of final decisions made pursuant to the procedures of this article must be filed within 10 days of the date of the decision. Said appeal must be in writing and shall be submitted to the director of public health. The board of city commissioners shall consider the appealed decision as a new matter in a public hearing and, at the close of the public hearing, act to affirm or reverse the original decision.

Section 2. Penalty.

A person who willfully violates this ordinance is guilty of an infraction. Every person, firm or corporation violating an ordinance which is punishable as an infraction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000; the court to have power to suspend said sentence and to revoke the suspension thereof.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ESTABLISHING
A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM DURING THE STATE OF COVID-19
EMERGENCY PERTAINING TO THE OCCUPANCY OF EMERGENCY SHELTERS
IN CERTAIN NON-RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURES

WHEREAS, the electorate of the city of Fargo has adopted a home rule charter in accordance with Chapter 40-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that the City shall have the right to implement home rule powers by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, Section 40-05.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code provides that said home rule charter and any ordinances made pursuant thereto shall supersede state laws in conflict therewith and shall be liberally construed for such purposes; and,

WHEREAS, Article 9-07 of the Fargo Municipal Code incorporates, by reference, the provisions of the International Fire Code (the "IFC"), and Chapter 21 of the Fargo Municipal Code incorporates, by reference, the provisions of the International Building Code (the "IBC") and the International Existing Building Code (the "IEBC"); and,

WHEREAS, there exists a state of emergency, declared and established by proclamation of the mayor of the city of Fargo on March 16, 2020, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which state of emergency has been approved and extended by the board of city commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, the board of city commissioners hereby finds that appropriate COVID-19 health measures dictates the need for social distancing between individuals staying in emergency shelters within the community, therefore causing such shelters to drastically limit the number of individuals being able to use emergency shelters; that interim use of tents and other similar facilities is not sufficient during winter and winter-like weather; and, therefore, that there is a need for additional facilities to be adapted for use on a temporary basis for emergency shelter use; and,

WHEREAS, while Section 102.4 of the IFC, and Section 102.6 and 111.1 of the IBC and 101.2 and 101.4 of the IEBC, prohibit use of a commercial structure for residential use without conformance with the change-of-use requirements of Section 102.3 of the IFC and Section 101.2 of the IBC and Section 101.2 of the IBC; however, the board of city

commission finds that a temporary suspension of said requirements is necessary and appropriate, upon certain stated conditions providing for the safety of occupants so long as the COVID-19 state of emergency is in place; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners deems it necessary and appropriate to approve a temporary moratorium on the enforcement of certain aspects of the said "change-of-use" requirements so long as certain matters of safety are otherwise provided;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Fargo:

Section 1. Enactment.

- 1. <u>Moratorium</u>. To the extent that an emergency shelter is being established for occupancy in a building or structure permitted for use or occupancy but not for residential use or occupancy, but which building or structure is being proposed for use as an emergency shelter on an interim or temporary basis, such use may be allowed provided that the following conditions are met as approved by both the fire chief and the building official, said conditions being as follows:
 - A. The facilities must meet minimum egress and safety guidelines.
 - B. Fire watch is required. Awake and alert staff shall be present at all times.
 - C. A telephone or means of communication is required to be within 50ft. of area used as shelter.
 - D. The owner or building manager shall notify the fire department when the shelter is in use.
 - E. No smoking, cooking, candles or other open flames shall be allowed.
 - F. An evacuation map shall be posted in all rooms where sleeping could occur.
 - G. Listed and approved single station smoke alarms are required in all rooms and in the path of egress.

- H. Listed and approved single station Carbon Monoxide alarms are required on each level containing sleeping areas.
- I. The area or rooms used for sleeping shall be on the level of exit discharge. Where it is not possible to locate sleeping rooms on the level of exit discharge the sleeping areas shall comply with IFC Section 1030.
- J. The area used for sleeping shall have access to two or more egress doors to the exterior.
- K. The maximum occupancy, established by the approval of the fire chief and building official, shall not be exceeded at any time.
- 2. <u>Definition -- emergency shelter</u>. For purposes of this ordinance, "emergency shelter" means any facility, the primary purpose of which is to provide a temporary shelter for the homeless in general or for specific populations of the homeless and which does not require occupants to sign leases or occupancy agreements.
- 3. Effect of Moratorium Limitation of Enforcement. This moratorium as to the enforcement of certain regulations or ordinances of the City and to instruct, order and limit building code and fire code enforcement officials and officers, police officers and prosecutors of the City or any other law enforcement officers or agents to refrain from enforcing City ordinances contrary to the terms hereof and to refrain from charging or citing persons, firms or other entities accordingly and, furthermore, said instruction, order and limitation in enforcement shall survive the termination of this moratorium, whether such termination occurs by lapse of time or by affirmative act.

Section 2. Expiration Date.

This ordinance is effective through December 31, 2021, and shall thereafter be of no further force or effect, unless it is either extended or is sooner terminated by resolution of the board of city commissioners.

The Auditors Office has received a number of requests to temporarily suspend liquor licenses and waive the requirement to sell alcohol for a period until normal business operations resume. They are requesting an extension of the requirement to sell alcohol until June 30, 2021.

The following businesses are included in the request; Lucy's North China Cuisine, Nail Deluxe and VIP Room. In addition, Fargo Brewing has closed its south location and Hotel Donaldson has dropped the entertainment permit of their license.

Fargo Municipal Code section 25-1512 A 2 describes situations in which business has deemed to have ceased and the liquor license would be forfeited. The businesses listed are requesting an extension of that time period.

Recommended Motion:

Approve an extension until June 30, 2021 of the Lucy's North China Cuisine, Nail Deluxe and VIP Room liquor licenses.

On March 16, 2020, in conjunction with Mayor Mahoney's emergency declaration, the City began paying Emergency Paid Leave (EPL) to employees who were absent from work for reasons related to COVID-19 such as illness, quarantine or to care for a school or child care age child. In addition, EPL was utilized to support departmental continuity of operations plans which in some cases caused a reduction in scheduled hours for some employees. EPL was discontinued on October 4.

Due to the rising number of COVID-19 cases, several departments have, or are considering, activating their continuity of operations plan, which may include rotational staffing to minimize interactions. While many departments have staff who are able to productively and effectively work remotely, some positions are unable to work remotely due to the nature of the work. EPL will support continuity of operations plans for departments. In addition, EPL will cover employees who are not eligible for, or who have exhausted their entitlement under, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA).

The City of Fargo COVID-19 Emergency Paid Leave (EPL) Temporary Employment Policy is attached for your approval.

Under the Mayor's Emergency Declaration, which was issued on March 16, 2020, Emergency Paid Leave (EPL) will be available for employees whose work schedule is impacted by a continuity of operations plan, or who are absent from work due to COVID-19 related circumstances listed below.

EPL Under Continuity of Operations Plans

Employees who are scheduled to work less hours than their regularly scheduled hours per week under an approved departmental continuity of operations plan may be eligible for pay under EPL. Prior to approving paid leave hours under EPL, the manager must assess the employee's ability to productively perform work remotely and/or under a modified work schedule consistent with the continuity of operations plan. If these alternative work arrangements are not possible or have been exhausted, EPL may be utilized with the approval of the Department Head.

EPL for COVID-19 Related Absences

Employees who are absent for COVID-19 related reasons must first apply for leave under Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA). If the leave is qualifying, the employee will first be paid under FFCRA. Once the FFCRA leave entitlement (if any) is exhausted, or the leave is determined ineligible under FFCRA, the employee will be paid EPL under the following circumstances:

- 1. The employee is subject to a Federal, State, or local quarantine or isolation order related to COVID-19;
- 2. The employee has been advised by a heath care provider to self-quarantine related to COVID-19;
- 3. The employee is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and is seeking a medical diagnosis;
- 4. The employee is caring for an individual subject to an order described in (1) or self-quarantine as described in (2);
- 5. The employee is caring for his or her child whose school or place of care is closed (or child care provider is unavailable) due to COVID-19 related reasons; or
- 6. The employee is experiencing any other substantially-similar condition specified by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

Employees must follow departmental processes to communicate absences with their immediate supervisors. Prior to awarding EPL, the manager and employee must assess the employee's ability to productively perform work remotely and/or under a modified work schedule. If these alternative work arrangements are not possible, EPL may be utilized.

EPL is paid at 100% of the employee's regular rate of pay and does not draw from the employee's sick or vacation leave balances. Any employee with regularly scheduled hours may use this emergency leave, including temporary employees but excluding Civic and FARGODOME event staff who normally work on a per-event basis. EPL will only be paid up to a maximum of the employee's regularly scheduled hours per week. For example, if an employee regularly works 40 hours, is absent on Monday but then works 40 hours Tuesday through Friday, EPL would not be paid. There is no limit to the amount of EPL an employee is eligible to receive while this temporary policy is effective.

Any leave of absences for purposes other than the COVID-19 related reasons defined above would fall under the applicable policy (i.e. annual leave, sick leave, Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA), injury leave and military leave).





In September of 2019 the Fargo Fire Department was awarded \$188,550 as part of the FI 2019 SHSP annual grant. One item on that grant award was for the purchase of a Haz Mat ID Elite analyzer/Gas Chromatograph/Mass Spectrometer.

Members of the Fire Department Hazardous Materials Response Team solicited bids and conducted review of products that would meet the needs of the team. Three bids were received. Two of the bids provided a replacement of the monitor that was being replace. The third bid enhanced the capabilities of the team by providing additional features.

The committee recommends the purchase of the HAZ MAT ID Elite from Smith Detection Systems.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Approve the purchase of a Haz Mat ID Elite from Smith Detection Systems in the amount of \$71,749.95 from account 475-4045-412.74-10 from the FI 2019 SHSP Grant Account.

- 1. That this Notice is being given to you pursuant to Fargo Municipal Code, Article 21-04 concerning Dangerous Buildings.
- 2. That the building with which this Notice is concerned is commonly known as 1714 5 Ave S, and is located on that tract of land in the city of Fargo, more particularly described as follows:

Amerlands Addition, Block 1, Lot 4

(hereinafter referred to as "the building")

- 3. That an inspection was made of the building on 8/18/2020 by Bill Thompson, Building Inspector.
- 4. That the building inspector for the City of Fargo has found the building, consisting of a single-story, wood-framed structure to be a Dangerous Building within the standards set forth in the Fargo Municipal Code, Article 21-04, Dangerous Buildings and IPMC Code 108.1.5 concerning Dangerous Structures.
- 5. This building has been found to be a dangerous building by the building inspector. This notice is to remain on this building until it is repaired, vacated, or demolished in accordance with the notice which has been given the owner, occupant, lessee, or mortgagee of this building and all other persons having an interest in said building as shown by the records of the register of deeds of the county of Cass. It is unlawful to remove this notice until such notice is complied with. Source: 1952 Rev. Ord. 21-0404.
- 6. That the owner of the building must demolish the building within 30 (thirty) days from the date of this notice or obtain a permit to repair. To obtain a permit, see 'Conditions Found Statement' below.

- 7. That the building is unsafe and is a dangerous building in the following respects: See 'Conditions Found Statement' below.
- 8. The building is unsafe and constitutes a public nuisance pursuant to Fargo Municipal Code, Article 21-04 concerning Dangerous Buildings and Section 116 of the International Building Code as adopted by Article 21-0101 of the Fargo Municipal Code.
- 9. You are further given Notice that unless the building is demolished within the time period set forth herein, the City of Fargo will take such steps as are necessary to cause said building to be demolished pursuant to Fargo Municipal Code, Article 21-04 concerning Dangerous Buildings and the International Building Code and the owner will be assessed such costs as are provided for therein.
- 10. Order for vacation of building. The undersigned building official has determined that the building or structure must be vacated as required by Section 108.2 of the International Property Maintenance Code, 2018 edition. Therefore, it is hereby ordered that the building or structure shall be vacated immediately, and remain vacated, on this 27th day of August, 2020.
- 11. Order to secure building. The undersigned building official has determined that the building must remain secured. Therefore, it is hereby ordered that all means of entering the building remain secured to prevent unauthorized entrance. An inspector will continue to verify compliance. Failure to keep the building secured will result in the City of Fargo hiring an independent contractor to secure the building. All expenses for securing the building will be assessed against the property.
- 12. Application for Appeal. Section 111.1 of the International Property Maintenance Code states that any person directly affected by a decision of the *code official* or a notice or order issued under this code shall have the right to appeal to the Board of Appeals, provided that a written application for appeal is filed within 20 days after the day the decision, notice or order was served. 
